TOWN WARRANT

To the Inhabitants of the Town of Hancock in the County of Hillsborough in said State, qualified to vote in Town Affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town Hall in said Hancock on Tuesday, the thirteenth day of March, next at nine of the clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects:

- 1. To choose all necessary Town Officers for the year ensuing.
- 2. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to de-

fray town charges for the ensuing year and make appropriations of the same.

- 3. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of two hundred dollars for white pine blister rust control, or take any action relating thereto.
- 4. To see if the Town will vote the sum of one hundred two dollars for the Monadnock Region, or take any action relating thereto.
- 5. To see if the Town will vote to paint the Town Hall, raise and appropriate money for the same, or take any action relating thereto
- 6. To see if the Town will vote to buy seats for the Town Hall raise and appropriate money for the same, or take any action relating thereto.
- 7. To see if the Town will vote to accept Town Road Aid and raise and appropriate the sum of \$665.13 or take any action relating thereto.
- 8. To see if the Town will vote to ratify and confirm the action of the Selectmen in having accepted the Gift from Louis B. Thacher, in the sum of approximately Five Thousand dollars.
- 9. To see if the Town will vote to accept from Louis B. Thacher, the deed of the so-called Ware land to be used and maintained for a Park.

- 10. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to convey by quit deed to Martin F. Mann, of Greenfield, N. H., all the Town's right and interest, if any, in and to a certain tract or parcel of land in said Greenfield, N. H., known as "Plain Land," which the Town may have acquired under and by virtue of the last will and testament of Emma Elizabeth Gipson late of said Greenfield, and execute and deliver said deed to Martin F. Mann; or take any action relating thereto.
- 11. To see what action the Town will vote to take in regard to a tool house and appropriate money for same or take any action relating thereto.
- 12. To see if the Town will vote to extend the water main. And install a fire hydrant on Dublin Road near the Dr. Ware Place, and raise and appropriate money for the same, or take any action relating thereto.
- 13. To see if the Town will vote to install a valve at the foot of Norway Hill, raise and appropriate money for the same or take any action relating thereto.
- 14. To see if the Town will vote to Adopt a By-law as requested by the State Forest Fire Warden, or take any action relating thereto.
- 15. To see if the Town will vote to allow a discount of one percent on property taxes, paid on or before thirty days after date of bill, or take any action relating thereto.
- 16. To see what action the Town will vote to take in regard to Civilian Defense, raise and appropriate money for the same, or take any action relating thereto.
- 17. To see what action the Town will vote to take in regard to the right-of-way to Norway Pond, as laid out by the Governors' Commission, raise and appropriate money for the same, or take any action relating thereto.
- 18. To see what action the Town will vote to take in regard to maintenance of the bathing beach or take any action relating thereto.
- 19. To see what action the Town will take in regard to the care and up-keep of the Common, or take any action relating thereto.
- 20. To see what action the Town will take regarding the water system, or take any action relating thereto.

- 21. To see if the town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to borrow money in anticipation of taxes, or take any action relating thereto.
- 22. To see what action the Town will vote to take in regard to laying out the new Cemetery, and appropriate money for the same, or take any action relating thereto.
- 23. To see what action the Town will vote to take in regard to the balance of the money from the sale of the (Ware) property
- 24. To see if the Town will vote to accept gifts and Legacies left in trust for the use of the Town, and take any action relating thereto.
- 25. To see what action the Town will vote to take in regard to Memorial Day and Old Home Week, raise and appropriate money for the same, and take action relating thereto.
- 26. To see if the Town will vote to maintain an advisory committee, or take any action relating thereto.
- 27. To hear reports of Auditors and Committees heretofore chosen and take any action relating thereto.
- 28. To transact any other business that may legally come before said meeting.
- 29. Shall the provisions of chapter 171-A of the Revised laws relative to playing games of beano be adopted in Hancock, or take any action relative thereto.

Years ago, when phonographs were nearly as new as television receivers are today, there was a record: "No News or What Killed the Dog." Ask anyone in Hancock what happened in 1950 and they would answer: "Nothing special,—oh! yes, the Fairfield's barn burned." Little by little other events would be

recalled, a few mildly dramatic, most, just little things.

The little things add up to Hancock sharing the hollow prosperity experienced by the entire country as part of the, so far, minor tragedy of the Korean War. No one from Hancock saw service fighting the Communists but nine entered the Services—Gavin Campbell, Bill Hanson, Ralph Hill, Bruce Kierstead, Herbert Werden (these two were High School graduates last June) John Smith, Vernon Woods, Raymond Duguay and his brother Norman. A civil defense organization was brought into being headed by Reg Hubbard assisted by Col. Boyce. There was talk of atomic bombs, refugees from cities coming to the country—it was all unsettling; yet the even tenor of our ways was unaltered, as world statesmen sparred.

Marriages took place, the first being that of Bud Fuller in January, but there were others, Joan Gunther, Barbara Clark and Mrs. Warner and there were births. Vital statistics are less interesting than are events where citizens gather and have fun. The Community Concert, guided by Mrs. Witham, made neighboring towns wonder how Hancock could do it (we, of course, won't tell) and an innovation—dancing on the village green—helped raise funds for the collapsing Historical Building, the amount raised attesting its success. Pies, cakes and covered dishes tripped in and out (empty) from the Grange, the Vestry

and the strengthened Historical Building as the regular town

organizations met at their appointed times.

At the Town Hall there was square dancing, there were children's parties and school plays and here the citizens assembled at the annual Town Meeting with Moderator Karl Upton as usual assuring fair play. One Warrant was noteworthy: "To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to purchase the Addison C. Ware estate." The Town approved and at the end of the year found themselves in possession of Juggernaut Pond as an auxiliary water supply to boot, a sum nearly as large as that authorized, in the bank. Sale of unwanted portions of the estate much more than equalled the outlay, and there will be timber to sell in the future. A cash surplus, a beauty spot and, above all, water in abundance when needed, this is what Selectmen Adams, Pickering and Quinn achieved. They were less successful with the roads, which require more money than the Town sees fit to authorize.

With 426 on the check list only 252 showed up in November to reelect Governor Adams. Two years ago with 412 entitled to

vote, 305 entered the Town Hall and marked a ballot. Although Federal census shows a loss of population since 1940 our check list is larger. No one quite knows why. New places have been built,—five this year—old ones restored and none have fallen down. Main Street was never more beautiful although the need for a zoning ordinance to keep it that way still lacks majority support.

The Quasts may not have been the first to have television but their aerial folded over in the wind more often than the others. The big wind of November 25th—the biggest since the hurricane of 1938—did no serious damage but our pastor, Dr. Billing on Norway Hill was not the only one who felt his house weave and heard his shingles flap. Tragedies this year came not from wind but from fire—the Fairfield's young son was lost: and from a railroad crossing—where Waldy Stahl met death.

I asked Dell Eva down at the telephone exchange what had happened in 1950 and she said: "Why, we had several good speakers at the Woman's Club (I forget which ones she mentioned) and there are over a hundred members." "But," I insisted, "didn't anything more dramatic happen?" She thumbed through her diary to no avail. I asked a few other alert citizens with no greater success. 1950 must have been a normal sort of year, that is, when things are going abnormally well.

The present enrollment for grades 7-8 is 16, grades 9-12, 41. The teachers at the Elementary School remain the same as last year. In the High School changes occurred just as school opened in September, 1950. Headmaster Campbell was called

back into the Air Force and Mrs. Shirley LaBounty Burt resigned because of her health. Mr. Campbell's place as Headmaster was taken by Mr. Paul H. Farris of Franklin, N. H., who took over the teaching schedule of Mrs. Burt and Mrs. Grace H. Campbell was employed to take over the teaching assignment of Mr. Campbell. These changes caused surprisingly little disturbance to the smooth running of the school.

B. PROGRAMS AND METHODS

Again this year all teachers and school nurses in this Supervisory Union spent a full week (November 6-10) of hard work at a workshop planned jointly by the teachers and superintendent. This year, two subjects were studied: (a) The Unit Method of Instruction in the Elementary School and (b) Guidance in the Secondary School. Again the workshop was staffed by the Harvard-Boston University Extension Service. These workshops are proving to be exceedingly helpful to all participants in their search for better understanding of children and better ways of guiding them toward happy, integrated wholesome living.

PART III. SCHOOL PLANT

The installation of the new warm air heating system for the school has greatly improved the conditions under which the pupils and teachers work, and is expected to result in some economy in fuel.

The painting of the walls on the second floor has helped the

general appearance of the lunch area noticeably.

New window shades have been installed in the primary room and a few of the best of the old shades have been put up in the lunch room.

The greatest need still unmet is for suitable desks and chairs for the primary room and desks for the upper grade room. The present equipment is unsatisfactory from several points of view:

- 1. All desk tops are much too small for the demands of modern methods.
- 2. Upper grade desks are fastened to the floor so do not lend themselves to rearrangement for varying needs.
- 3. Upper grade desks have been repaired repeatedly.
- 4. Primary desks are not properly designed to meet the needs of correct bodily posture and growth of children.
- 5. All desks have too little book storage space.
- 6. All desks are so dark in color as to produce eye strain.

PART VI. REPORT OF SCHOOL NURSE

The following is the report of the routine Health work carried on in the Hancock Schools by the Medical Inspector, Dr. Fredericka Moore, assisted by the school nurse. The program consists of physical examinations, weighing and measuring, vision and hearing tests and general inspection for all students.

The registration of pre-schoolers takes place in the Spring. Parents or representatives are present at that time. A Health card is on file for each student. First-aid cabinets are checked from time to time. Visits are made to the schools frequently by the school nurse. Students having symptoms of communicable diseases are excluded from school, in compliance with the regulations of the State Board of Health. Notices are sent to parents of children having defects. Home visits are made by the school nurse, when necessary.

The Tuberculin Patch Test has been administered (available to all students) by the County Tuberculosis Association nurse, Mrs. Mildred Aiken, R. N., and chest x-rays have been taken when necessary by Mr. Alden, technician for the association. Corrections of defects are made through: Dental clinics conducted by Dr. C. Temple Lawrence at his office, dental corrections and treatments by own dentists, tonsellectomies by own surgeons, eye clinics by Dr. Leroy Ford of Keene, N. H., and vision corrections by own eye specialists.

This department would like to call to your attention the article in the N. H. Educator, by Dr. Mary Atchison of the State Board of Health recommending further facilities—which would enable children to be helped with speech defects or difficulties, visual and hearing defects, and a vital and dynamic program for dental cares in rural communities.

The Medical Inspection department wishes to express its appreciation to the local American Red Cross for sponsoring the dental clinics and the Sight Conservation Consultant Department of Public Welfare for assisting with necessary eye corrections. The N. H. Tuberculosis Association and the County Tb. nurse and technician for conducting Tuberculin tests and chest x-rays. We also thank the parents for their cooperation, the Supt. of Schools and Board of Education, Principals and teachers, dentists and doctors and all who assisted in any way in conserving the health of the children of the Hancock schools.

- 7. To choose Agents, Auditors, and Committees in relation to any subject embraced in this warrant.
- 8. To see what sum of money the district will raise and appropriate for the support of schools, for the salaries of school district officials and agents, and for the payment of statutory obligations of the district, and to authorize the application against said appropriation of such sums as are estimated to be received from the state equalization fund together with other income; the school board to certify to the selectmen the balance between the estimated revenue and the appropriation, which balance is to be raised by taxes by the town.
