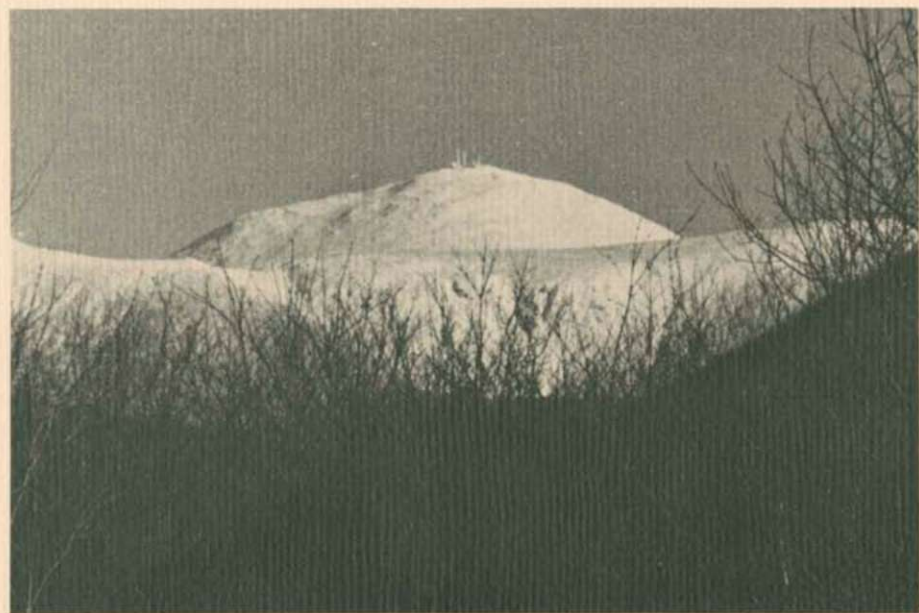

The polls will be open from 8:00 A.M. to 5:00 P.M.

To the inhabitants of the Town of Hart's Location in the County of Carroll, State of New Hampshire, qualified to vote in Town affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the Varney Residence in said Hart's Location on Tuesday, March 8, 1994 at 5:30 P.M. to act upon the following subjects:

- Article 1. To choose all necessary Town Officers for the year ensuing.
- Article 2. Shall the town accept the provision of RSA 33:7 providing that any town at an annual meeting may adopt an article authorizing indefinitely, until specific rescission of such authority, the selectmen to issue tax anticipation notes?
- Article 3. Shall the town accept the provisions of RSA 31:95-b providing that any town at an annual meeting may adopt an article authorizing indefinitely, until specific rescission of such authority, the selectmen to apply for, accept and expend, without further action by the town meeting, unanticipated money from a state, federal, or other governmental unit or a private source which becomes available during the fiscal year? This authorization will remain in effect until rescinded by a vote of the town meeting.
- Article 4. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of Two Thousand dollars (\$2,000) to be added to the Town Revaluation Capital Reserve Fund previously established. The Selectmen recommend this appropriation.
- Article 5. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of Five Hundred dollars (\$500) to be added to the Town Hall Capital Reserve Fund previously established. The Selectmen recommend this appropriation.
- Article 6. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of Five Hundred dollars (\$500) to be added to the Burke Road Capital Reserve Fund previously established. The Selectmen recommend this appropriation.
- Article 7. To approve the Town Budget for the ensuing year and make appropriations of the same.
