Report of School Board.

The school board respectfully submits the following report for the year ending Feb. 14, 1903.

In the death of Mrs. Elsie M. Sargent the school board lost a very efficient member and the town a faithful officer. The board were fortunate in securing the services of Miss Abbie F. Cram to fill the vacancy caused by the death of Mrs. Sargent.

The work of the schools for the year has, on the whole, been very satisfactory. Several of the teachers have been teaching the same schools that they taught last year, with the same satisfactory results.

In No. 1 Miss Ethel Hadley continued her school, and her work was of the same high order that it had previously attained. At the end of the winter term the work of her scholars in declamation was excellent. This was especially true among the younger pupils.

In No. 3 Miss Annie Curtis taught. Miss Curtis is a teacher of large experience, and that, together with her natural aptitude for the work, enabled her to teach an exceptionally good school.

In No. 5 Miss Florence M. Chauncey taught a very satisfactory school. The parents in that district have expressed the wish that she may be continued as their teacher for another year.

In No. 6 Miss Blanche M. Bullard has been the

teacher. Miss Bullard was inexperienced when she began her school, but her work shows a thoroughness and care, which leaves no doubt as to her success.

In No. 7 Miss Elizabeth M. Desilets was again the teacher. She was obliged to close her winter school at the end of the second week on account of illness. Miss Desilets is one of our most popular teachers and it is to be hoped that illness will not oblige her to give up her chosen calling.

At No. 4 Lyndeborough Miss Annie M. Senter kept two terms of eight weeks each. Miss Senter's school was small, but it showed evidence of care and ability in the teacher.
