# WARRANT FOR TOWN MEETING TOWN OF MADBURY, N. H.

MARCH 13, 1962

To the Inhabitants of the Town of Madbury, County of Strafford, and State of New Hampshire, qualified to yote in Town Affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town Hall in said Madbury on Tuesday, the 13th day of March, A. D. at 8:00 o'clock in the evening to act upon the following articles.

ARTICLE 1. To choose the following Town Officers:
A town clerk for the ensuing year.

A selectman for the ensuing three years.

A treasurer for the ensuing year.

A collector of taxes for the ensuing year.

Two auditors for the ensuing year.

A trustee of trust funds for the ensuing three years.

ARTICLE 2. To choose all other town officers.

ARTICLE 3. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the selectmen to borrow money in anticipation of taxes.

ARTICLE 4. To see if the Town will vote to raise \$319.71 for Class V highways to match the sum of \$2131.40 to be contributed by the State.

ARTICLE 5. To see if the Town will vote to appropriate a sum not exceeding \$2451.11 for the purpose of making improvements to the Class V roads within the Town: such sums to be raised through the issuance of bonds or notes under and in compliance with the provisions of chapter 83, laws of 1951 as amended by chapter 31, laws of 1955, and to authorize the Selectmen to determine the date and place of payment

of such bonds or notes and to determine the rate of interest thereon, and to take such other steps as may be necessary to negotiate such bonds or notes as shall be to the best interests of the Town of Madbury.

- ARTICLE 6. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$1,000.00 for construction of the Huckins Road.
- ARTICLE 7. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$70.00 for the Seacoast Regional Development Association.
- ARTICLE 8. To see what action the Town will take on accepting the Demeritt Park.
- ARTICLE 9. To see what action the Town will take on the proposed budget for the current year.
- ARTICLE 10. To see what action the Town will take in changing any article of the building code.
- ARTICLE 11. To hear the reports of agents, auditors, committees, or officers chosen, and pass any vote relating thereto.
- ARTICLE 12. To transact any other business that may legally come before the meeting.

#### RECORD OF TOWN MEETING

March 14, 1961

#### ARTICLE 1. Balloting for town officers:

For Town Clerk for the ensuing year, it was voted that the Moderator should cast one ballot for Edna P. Twombly and, this being done, Edna P. Twombly was declared elected. The oath of office was administered by Moderator, Kenneth S. Morrow.

For Selectman for the ensuing three years, it was voted that the Clerk should cast one ballot for Harry C. Cheney, Jr., this being done, Harry C. Cheney, Jr., was declared elected.

For Treasurer for the ensuing year, John W. Printy had 20 votes and was declared elected.

For Collector of Taxes for the ensuing year, voted that the Clerk should cast one ballot for Dorothy S. Dugan and, this being done, Dorothy S. Dugan was declared elected.

For Auditors for the ensuing year, voted that the Clerk should cast one ballot for John L. Wedick and John I. Kelley and, this being done, the two were declared elected.

For Trustee of Trust Funds for the ensuing three years, voted that the Clerk should cast one ballot for Georgia G. Armitage and, this being done, Georgia G. Armitage was declared elected.

- ARTICLE 2. Voted that the Selectmen be empowered to appoint all other necessary town officers.
- ARTICLE 3. Voted that the Selectmen and Town Treasurer be authorized to borrow a sum or sums not exceeding in the aggregate \$7,500 in anticipation of the collection of taxes for the ensuing municipal year, and to issue in the name of and on the credit of the town negotiable notes therefor, said notes to be paid in the current municipal year from taxes collected during the current municipal year. Vote: Yes, 27.
- NRTICLE 4. Voted to raise \$321.42 for Class V highways to match the sum of \$2,142.79 to be contributed by the State.
- ARTICLE 5. Voted to raise and appropriate the sum of \$1,000 for construction of the Huckins Road.
- ARTICLE 6. Tabled article to raise and appropriate the sum of \$70 for the Seacoast Regional Development Association.
- ARTICLE 7. Tabled article to raise and appropriate the sum of \$200 for the purchase of new fire hose. Mr. John S. Elliott offered to donate \$200 for the purchase of hose and the meeting voted a rising vote of thanks to Mr. Elliott for his generosity.
- ARTICLE 8. Voted to raise and appropriate the sum of \$1,100, to remodel the Fire House.
- ARTICLE 9. Voted not to raise money to purchase a push frame and blade to be used for snow removal.
- ARTICLE 10. Approved a total budget of \$18,780 exclusive of school appropriations.

ARTICLE 11. Report of Building Code Committee presented.

Charles S. Jennison, chairman of the committee on town hall alterations, presented the report of the estimates prepared by the committee with a recommendation that the project should not be attempted. Voted to accept the report.

Fire Chief, James Colprit, gave the annual report of the Volunteer Fire Department.

ARTICLE 12. The selectmen announced the appointment to the Planning Board of the following persons: Ernest Colprit, Richard Bromley, Wesley Pierce, Charles Jennison, Jesse James and Eileen Corrow.

Voted to recommend to the Volunteer Fire Department that the wooden building at the rear of the fire station be torn down.

Voted to recommend that the next annual town meeting be held in the evening.

# FIRE DEPARTMENT REPORT

To the Citizens of Madbury:

The Madbury Fire Department has been active through the past year, striving to maintain its fire fighting potential, and to improve the fire station.

The main effort for the past six months has been in finishing the meeting room above the truck stalls. The room, which is 90% finished, is 16 x 32 feet, with three windows in the dormer. There is provision for a flush toilet and lavatory to be added at a future date. The floor is plywood, the walls of knotty pine sheetrock, and the ceiling of celotex tile. The cost of the addition is \$1100 from the town, \$400 of Fire Department funds, and over 250 hours of volunteer labor. This room will be available for Town Officers' meetings, and other town groups, as well as Fire Department meetings.

It is planned to have an Open House at a future date so all may have an opportunity to inspect our improved quarters.

Our fire fighting equipment is in good condition. While there are some improvements that would be desirable, our most pressing needs are, the annual addition of hose, and more volunteers.

Our thanks for your cooperation in the past year, and if you cannot be a fire-fighter you can help us by:

- Proper care of your heating and electrical appliances.
- 2. Have your incinerator conform to our regulations.
- 3. Obtain a permit for outdoor fires.
