TOWN WARRANT THE STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

To the Inhabitants of the Town of New Durham in the County of Strafford, in said State qualified to vote in Town Affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town Hall in said New Durham on Tuesday, the 12th day of March, next at twelve of the clock, to act upon the following subjects:

Article 1. To choose all necessary town officers for the year ensuing and a Delegate to the Constitutional Convention.

> And you are hereby further notified to meet at said Town Hall in said New Durham at seven o'clock in the afternoon to act upon the following subjects:

Article 2. To raise and appropriate such sums of money as are necessary to defray the expenses of town government for the ensuing year in accordance with the recommendations of the budget committee.

Article 3. To see if the town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to borrow such sums of money as may be necessary to pay current expenses in anticipation of taxes.

Article 4. To see if the town will vote to discontinue winter plowing in the usual way on the following roads: Valley Road and Cross Road.

Article 5. To see if the town will vote to pay the Tax Collector $\frac{3}{4}$ of 1% of all tax monies collected as the annual fee for collection of same. If Bill in Legislature (House Bill 170) is passed, authorizing payment of taxes in two installments rather than one, the fee shall be 1%.

Article 6. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$3,500.00 to continue tar road on the South Wolfeboro-Middleton Road in the town of New Durham. Said tar to be put on either end of New Durham of which the Selectmen and Road Agent see fit. Article 7. To see if the town will authorize the work to complete the construction of a "hard-top" on the road leading from the Middleton line to the Wolfeboro line known as Kings Highway, and to authorize Selectmen to negotiate with County, State, and Federal governments for any available financial aid, and to further authorize them to borrow on long term notes such monies as approved by the Budget Committee to complete said road in 1963. (By petition.)

Article 8. To see if the town will vote to purchase the Jones Bridge so called for the sum of one dollar (\$1.00)with the condition that the abutters have the right to pass and repass at will from the beginning of time to the end of the world. (By petition.)

Article 9. To see what action the town will take with reference to the money realized in 1962 from the sale of the book entitled "The History of New Durham" by Ellen Cloutman Jennings. (By request.)

Article 10. To see what action the town will take with reference to the money remaining from the New Durham Bi-Centennial Celebration of 1962. (By request.)

Article 11. To see if the town will authorize the formation of a committee to investigate the feasibility of zoning regulations for the Town of New Durham and to report their findings to the next Town Meeting for any appropriate action. (By request.)

Article 12. To see if the town will authorize the Selectmen to change the street lights as follows:

Remove the one across from Alonzo Bickfords to pole by Post Office and reinstall with large area light.

Remove the one from in front of Louis Monchamps to pole beside Fire Station and reinstall with large area light.

Replace the one at corner of Merrymeeting Road with area light.

Replace the one at corner of Ridge Road and Main Road with area light.

The cost not to exceed \$110.00 and raise and appropriate same.

Article 13. To see if a street light will be added by home of Alice Miles (By request.)

Article 14. To see if the town will vote to authorize or request the Moderator to appoint a committee of 5 to explore the feasibility of establishing a water supply in New Durham where possible.

Article 15. To transact any other business that may legally come before the meeting.

CIVIL DEFENSE REPORT

Your Civil Defense organization is on the alert for any emergency and we feel that the citizens of the town are willing to cooperate to the best of their ability when called upon to help one another.

Due to the reorganization on the State Level the towns have been asked to check up on their local plans and organization. We have done this and thus continue to be eligible to receive consideration for such government surplus supplies as are available.

The efficiency of our organization was tested when we called for help at the time of our Bicentennial celebration and we were quite pleased with the result. The auxiliary police assisted by the Citizen's Band radio units of Alton and New Durham did a remarkable piece of work in controling the traffic the two days necessary. Our First Aid unit was on duty both days and we are sorry to say, their services were needed for an auto accident near the Town Hall. We are glad they were on hand and were so efficient though. We appreciate the services of the Fire Department personnel for driving the Civil Defense truck on a number of errands.

We used the telephone fan-out system to inform the townspeople of a public meeting at the time of the Cuban Crisis to answer the many questions that were being asked concerning our local Civil Defense plans. We are keeping up to date as best we can and will keep the citizens informed.

LIBRARY TRUSTEES' REPORT

Due to the illness of Mrs. Overman the service which was rendered last year has been curtailed so the hours reported last year have been decreased to only $2\frac{1}{2}$ hours per week regular opentime at the Library. However, Mr. Overman has let it be known that he will open the Library at any time he is in town for the benefit of the local readers with special attention given to students who need reference material.

Quite a few extra hours have been put in at the Library by Mr. Overman and several helpers in "weeding" out of date and irrepairable books to get ready for a collection of new books authorized by the voters at town meeting. Mr. Overman and his sister, Mrs. Hogan, attended a special workshop sponsored by the State Library to receive instruction in "weeding" and book selection. This was an all day conference and Mr. Overman was given time off from the State Library in order to be more efficient in the Town Library. After the weeding was done, the Extension Librarian came to New Durham and went over the books being considered for discard to see if any should be kept for any reason, then the trustees looked over the group and made the final decision. We wish to thank the several young people who spent time "keeping store" for the book sale this summer. They were paid a small sum for their efforts depending on how much time they spent on the job.

The Trustees and Mr. Overman spent several hours selecting new books and we feel that we have been able to obtain a good selection for our readers which we hope will be used by many more than before. We also received a grant of \$100 from the State Aid fund which we ordered through the State Library. (This was not ordered until January of 1963 so does not appear in this 1962 report).

Now that we have quite a few books in the fiction collection and they are in fairly good shape we feel that our efforts should now be turned towards the Children's collection and the Non-fiction section.

We wish to express a special thank you to Mrs. Janet Berry and Mrs. Mildred Swett for their assistance in cataloging the non-fiction books.

It is with a feeling of pride and gratitude that your Bicentennial Committee submits this report of its efforts to put on a suitable and memorable celebration in honor of the 200th anniversary of the granting of New Durham's charter, which took place on December 7, 1762.

The committee, appointed by the Selectmen, included Rev. C. Vaughn Overman, chairman, Mrs. Irving E. Jennings, secretary and Mrs. Irene Wentworth, treasurer, and they met several times during the summer and fall of 1961 to discuss plans. Sub-committees were appointed and the real work began in March, 1962 after the Town voted to contribute \$250.00 toward the expenses.

There were thousands of miles driven, hundreds of telephone calls made, hours of writing, typing, talking, planning, decorating, cooking, ordering, transporting and, at long last, on the 18th of August, 1962, the most beautiful day of a cool, rainy summer, the celebration began.

Hundreds of people lined the main street to applaud a huge parade with four big bands and half a hundred entries which opened the festivities, followed by congratulatory remarks by town officials and our guests of honor: Mr. Andrew Jarvis, representing Gov. Wesley Powell; Mr. Victor Cardosi, representing Senator Norris Cotton; Senator Maurice J. Murphy and Congressman Chester Merrow.

There was plenty of good food, games for the children, a bus tour of scenic and historic sites, an Art exhibit, an Antique exhibit, tea, a barbequed chicken supper, movies and a block dance. Only a power failure put an end to a long and exciting day.

On Sunday, August 18, special and well-attended services were conducted by Rev. C. Vaughn Overman at the historic Church on New Durham Ridge with Dr. J. Duane Squires as guest speaker. In the afternoon the Merrymeeting Lake Association put on its annual water carnival with great success.

A well-filled and interesting souvenir program was very profitable and a small book, "The History of New Durham, N. H.", written especially for the event by Mrs. Jennings, was on sale. On the general committee were the Selectmen, Roy W. Berry, Harry W. Nutter and Elmer Smith; F. Everett Dyer, Parade; Robert A. Nixon, Games; Mrs. Robert A. Nixon, Program; Mrs. F. Everett Dyer, Jr., Refreshments; Mrs. William H. Nehring, Art Exhibit; Mrs. Irving E. Jennings, Antiques; Mrs. Cecil M. Pike and Mrs. Clifford Smith. Others who served in important capacities were Joseph Berry, Mrs. Everett Rogers, Mrs. Robert Bickford, Mrs. Samuel Cardinal, Mrs. Arnold Hayes, Mr. and Mrs. Leon Hayes, Mrs. Tracy Laney, Mrs. Edward Smith, Mrs. Ralph Richardson and Mrs. Frank Moulton.

We are grateful for the interest and generosity of our neighboring towns, whose efforts in our behalf were so rewarding, and to the many townspeople who contributed time, effort, material and donations.

A scrapbook containing pictures, souvenirs, letters and a detailed financial report of the celebration has been compiled and may be seen at the Library.

The small town of New Durham put on an overwhelmingly successful celebration to honor its founding in 1762, one which will live long in our memory, and we are happy and proud to have had a part in it.
