TOWN WARRANT

To the Inhabitants of the Town of Tamworth in the County of Carroll in said State, qualified to vote in Town Affairs

You are hereby notified to meet at Town House in said Tamworth on Tuesday, the Thirteenth day of March next, at ten o'clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects:

- 1. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray town charges for the ensuing year and make appropriations for the same. \$6500. is approved by the finance committee.
- 2. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for repairing highways and plowing snow for the ensuing year. \$5700. approved by your committee.
- 3. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for sanding roads. \$800. is approved.
- 4. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for repairing and building bridges. \$1000. approved.
- 5. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for Memorial Day observance. \$25.00 Approved.
- 6. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise and appropriate in addition to the amount required by law for the support of the Town Library. The sum recommended to be raised as a whole is \$250. Approved.
- 7. To see if the town will vote to authorize the selectmen to borrow money in anticipation of taxes.

- 8. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$1000 for repair of road equipment, road maintenance and general highway. Approved.
- 9. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$1000, for the support of the Tamworth Community Nurse. Approved.
- 10. To see if the town will vote to authorize the selectmen to distribute the inventory blanks at the time they examine and apprise taxable property.
- 11. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for Tarvia. \$2500. approved.
- 12. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise and appropriate to improve and tarvia the Cleveland Hill. \$1000. approved.
- 13. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for upkeep and maintenance of the Tamworth Fire Precinct. \$500. Approved.
- 14. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for upkeep of the Wonalancet Fire Precinct, \$100. Approved.
- 15. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$166.00 to the Lakes Region association which is 1/100 of 1% of the assessed valuation. For the purpose of publicizing and promoting the natural advantages and resources of the town, together with other towns in the Lakes Region. Approved.
- 16. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$200.00 for white pine blister rust control to be spent in cooperation with the State Forestry and Recreation Department. Approved.
- 17. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$300.00 to be divided equally among

the three road agents for cutting bushes on the road side. Approved.

- 18. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$25.00 for the upkeep and care of shrubs and plants around the Town Buildings. Approved.
- 19. To see if the town will vote to authorize the selectmen to administer or dispose of any real-estate acquired by the town through tax collector's deeds.
- 20. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for Laconia Hospital, North Conway Hospital, and Huggins Hospital. The sum recommended by your committee is \$100. to Laconia Hospital and \$25. each to the other two. Approved.
- 21. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$145.00 for firemen's insurance, in compliance with the Public Laws of the State of New Hampshire, Section 4 chapter 146, Paragraph 16. Approved.
- 22. To see if the town will vote to purchase two \$1000.00 Government Bonds, and Resolved, that the Selectmen be, and hereby are, authorized to transfer the eight thousand dollars (8000) of surplus now invested in war bonds, together with two thousand dollars (2000) additional from the unimcumbered surplus of the town to the Trustees of Trust Funds, to be held by said Trustees as a Capital Reserve Fund, the same to be used for such of the purposes designated in section 1, Chapter 160, of the Laws of 1943, as some future town meeting may by vote determine. Approved.
- 23. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$757.66 for town road aid, the state contributing the sum of \$3030.64. Approved.

- 24. To see if the town will vote to support United States membership in a general system of international cooperation, such as that proposed at the Dunbarton Oaks Conference, having police power to maintain the peace of the world.
- 25. To choose all necessary Town officers for the year ensuing.
- 26. To see if the town will vote to keep the polls open until six of the clock in the afternoon.
- 27. To transact any other business that may come legally before said meeting.

NO ONE is exempt from helping to win the war! EVERYONE, regardless of age, has his or her place in the overall effort! Some men, because of age, are called upon to bear arms; man ships, submarines and planes: minister to the injured and maintain morale. Women, in large numbers, are serving with the armed forces as nurses and members of the several womens' military organizations — WACS, WAVES, SPARS, etc. War industry has taken millions of men and women whose accomplishments have been the marvel of the world. Civilians at home are doubling up on their activities because of the shortage in manpower, purchasing bonds, assisting in numerous patriotic undertakings, maintaining home morale and, on the whole, carrying on with a cheerfulness and determination that is typically American. Yet, despite the time, thought and effort we are all putting into the war effort in general, we are, true to our peculiar American characteristics, heedless and careless about many important things and one of these is FIRE as it relates to our forests.

Much harm can be done the war effort because of our carelessness with fire. Lumber has gone to war in a BIG WAY! Our New Hampshire forests are contributing their full share insofar as manpower permits. Fire, the greatest enemy of the forests, destroys, during each of these critical years, hundreds of acres of valuable trees that could contribute to the war effort. Forest fires disrupt the war's business by taking men from their important work in industry and on the farm and reduces production of necessary war materials and food. Forest fires require the and on the farm and reduces production of necessary spending of much money and material that might otherwise be diverted into vital war channels. Forest

fires are, for the most part, unnecessary and avoidable for ninety-eight percent of such fires are, annually, the result of human carelessness — yours and mine. This can and should be remedied — NOW! YOU can HELP THE WAR EFFORT by PREVENTING FOREST FIRES! The rules of the game are simple.

- 1. Always be careful with fire in or near woodlands.
- 2. Comply with regulations governing the use or starting of fires there. Remember
 - a. You need written permission from your local forest fire warden for debris burning fires when the ground is not covered with snow.
 - b. Be sure your match, cigar, cigarette and pipe ashes are OUT before dropping them.
- 3. Be fire-minded NOW as never before; be careful; caution others to be careful; be cooperative and thus help your warden, your town, your nation and yourself!

TAMWORTH FIRE PRECINCT

There were 19 fires in town during the year 1944, including one brush fire that was serviced by the West Ossipee department. Losses were as follows:

- 9 Chimney Fires. no damage.
- 5 Brush Fires. burning over about 5.20 acres of land.
 - 4 Dwelling Fires. causing damage of \$149.
- 1 Fire. destroying 14 Factory Buildings, causing damage of about \$75,000.

Causes of fires: Chimneys, 9; Children and matches, 3; Overheated stoves or chimneys, 3; Lightning, 1; Defective electric motor, 1; Unknown, 1.

The fire loss, due to the conflagration at the South Tamworth Industries, was the greatest the town has experienced in many years. The fire department is greatly undermanned, and it is urged that all persons should do what they can to assist the volunteer department at all fires.

Application was made to the Federal Government for the loan of a 500 gallon pump, but no action was taken on our application.

The town lost about \$225 worth of fire hose at the South Tamworth fire. The insurance company has paid this loss in full.

A statement of value of apparatus and equipment is included in the list of the town's assets.

Considerable new equipment was purchased during the year, but no more hose than was necessary for replacement.

REPORT OF SUPERINTENDENT OF SCHOOLS

To the School Board of Tamworth:

In submitting my second annual report I consider our most critical problem the employment and retention of qualified and experienced teachers. The acute manpower shortage throughout the country is being keenly felt in the employment of teachers. The reports indicate, unless a favorable change in world conditions occurs, that it will be more difficult to hire teachers for the school year 1945-46 than it was for the current year.

We have the following teachers in the Tamworth District: Joseph Bragdon, Headmaster, Tamworth High School; Marion Pelaggi, High School; Edwin Blackey, Grades 5-8; Zoe Head, Grades 1-4; Elizabeth Sutherland, Bemis, Grades 5-8; Elva Bickford, Bemis, Grades 1-4; Hazel Bragdon, Chocorua; Eleanor Grace, Downs; Hazel Whiting, Whittier; Dr. Edwin Remick, School Physician.

The State Grange at their annual meeting in Laconia pointed out the need for keeping well-trained and experienced teachers in New Hampshire. Their recommendation stated that "all available means" be used "to keep our teachers in New Hampshire rather than losing them to other states that offer higher salaries soon after they are well established in our schools."

Dental care was available for all pupils in the schools last spring and plans are being made for this important work to continue.

This war-torn era is straining the foundations of our social institutions for the boys and girls even more than for the adults. The future of America lies in the development of a strong, industrious character in each boy and girl. This is the great challenge to every parent and teacher. The recent report of the Governor's committee on vocational education said, "The schools must help man to learn both to make a living and to make an art of living."
