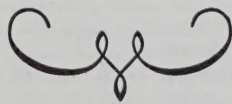

BUSINESS MEETING AT 8:00 P.M.

To the Inhabitants of the Town of WEBSTER in the County of MERRIMACK in said State, qualified to vote in Town Affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the GRANGE HALL in said WEBSTER on Tuesday, the 13th day of March, next at 1:00 of the clock in the afternoon to act upon the following subjects:

1. To choose all necessary Town Officers for the year ensuing.
2. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray town charges for the ensuing year and make appropriations of the same.
  - a. Town Officers' Salaries
  - b. Town Officers' Expenses
  - c. Election & Registration Expenses
  - d. Expenses Town Buildings
  - e. Reappraisal of Property
  - f. Police Department
3.
  - a. To raise and appropriate the sum of \$8,716.00 for operating budget of the Fire Department.
  - b. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$1,200.00 for a medical budget.
  - c. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$6,500.00 to rebuild engine #1 (1967 Ford) into a complete emergency and fire vehicle.
  - d. To see if the Town will vote to raise the sum of \$500.00 in matching funds under the Rural Development Act of 1972 Title IV Rural Fire Protection Funds.
  - e. To see if the Town will vote to give the Fire Department permission to put an addition on to the Fire Department's existing building at no expense to the Town.
  - f. To see if the Town will vote to keep the 1947 International Fire Truck as a parade piece.
  - g. To see if the Town will vote to salvage and put to use on other fire trucks the equipment off the 1947 International Fire Truck, and authorize the Board of Selectmen to sell by sealed bids the 1947 International Fire Truck cab, chassis, hose bed and midship pump. The Board of Selectmen would have the authority to accept or reject any bid. Proceeds from sale of the above would go into the General Fund of the Town.

4. To raise and appropriate such sums of money as may be necessary to defray town charges for the ensuing year for the following:
  - a. Planning & Zoning
  - b. Insurance
  - c. Civil Defense
  - d. Conservation Commission
5. To raise and appropriate such sums of money as may be necessary for the Health Department.
  - a. Franklin Visiting Nurses' Association
  - b. Sanitary Landfill
6. To raise and appropriate such sums of money as may be necessary for highways & bridges.
  - a. Town Road Aid
  - b. Town Maintenance
  - c. Street Lighting
  - d. General Expenses of Highway Department
  - e. Additional Highway Subsidy
  - f. Class V Maintenance (Duncan Fund)
7. To raise and appropriate the sum of \$1,600.00 for the support of the Town Library.
8. To raise and appropriate such sums of money as may be necessary for Public Welfare.
  - a. Town Poor
  - b. Old Age Assistance
9. To raise and appropriate the sum of \$400.00 for expenses for Old Home Day.
10. To raise and appropriate the sum of \$500.00 for the maintenance of the park and playground.
11. To raise and appropriate the sum of \$3,000.00 for the care of the cemeteries.
12. To raise and appropriate the sum of \$1,500.00 for Damages and Legal Expenses.
13. To raise and appropriate the sum of \$636.00 for the continuation of services to the Town through the Kearsarge Valley Area Center of the Community Action Program, Belknap-Merrimack Counties, Inc.
14. To raise and appropriate the sum of \$2,000.00 for interest on temporary loans.
15. To see if the Town will vote to appropriate \$6,500.00 for Highway Equipment and authorize the withdrawal of the amount required for this purpose from the Revenue Sharing Fund established under the provisions of the State and Local Assistance Act of 1972.



16. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$10,500.00 for the construction of an addition to the Selectmen's office to be used as a vault and records room.
17. To see if the Town will vote to appropriate the sum of \$2,366.00 for Future Building Capital Reserve Fund and authorize the withdrawal of this sum for this purpose from the Revenue Sharing Fund established under the provisions of the State and Local Assistance Act of 1972.
18. To see if the Town will vote to appropriate the sum of \$2,500.00 for Future Fire Equipment Capital Reserve Fund and authorize the withdrawal of this sum for this purpose from the Revenue Sharing Fund established under the provisions of the State and Local Assistance Act of 1972.
19. To see if the Town will vote to withdraw and expend from Future Building Capital Reserve Fund the amount of \$10,500.00 to be used as a budget setoff for the construction of an addition to the Selectmen's office for a vault and records room.
20. To authorize and empower the Board of Selectmen to borrow for the Town, by issuance of notes, a sum not exceeding \$130,000.00 in anticipation of taxes for the year 1979, said notes payable from said taxes within one year of issuance, and to authorize the Board of Selectmen to determine the rate of interest on such notes and to provide for the sale thereof.
21. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Tax Collector to accept pre-payment of taxes.
22. To see if the Town will vote to accept and expend any Federal or State funds, or private gifts and donations.
23. To see if the Town will vote to discontinue the Mutton Road bridge.
24. (By Petition) To see if the Town will vote to have a canine leash law.
25. (By Petition) To see if the Town will vote to enact and make part of the Webster Town Ordinances the following ordinance entitled "Control of Dogs"; to authorize and empower the Board of Selectmen to establish whatever rules and regulations it deems necessary to enforce this Ordinance; and further, to authorize and empower the Board of Selectmen to assess any and all costs as may be required to enforce this Ordinance against the Village District of Pillsbury Lake.

A. Definition of Terms. As used in this ordinance, unless the context shall otherwise indicate, the following terms shall be defined as herein-after set forth:

1. Dog . . . . . Any member of the family Canidae.
2. Owner . . . . . Any person, group, association, firm, corporation or organization maintaining, keeping, caring for, harboring or owning a dog.
3. At Large . . . . . Off the premises or property of the owner and not under the control of a responsible person and not confined within a vehicle.
4. Village District of Pillsbury Lake . . . . . That portion of the Town of Webster as contained within those boundaries indicated by a prominent red line as shown on a "Plan of Pillsbury Lake", being Plan #2128 recorded at Merrimack County Registry of Deeds.

B. At Large Prohibited. Dogs are not permitted to be at large within the Village District of Pillsbury Lake. The owner of a dog found at large within the Village District of Pillsbury Lake shall be in violation of this ordinance.

C. Impounding of Dogs. Any dog found at large without the premises or property of the owner and within the Village District of Pillsbury Lake may be restrained and impounded by the Webster Police Department. A dog so impounded may be confined in a suitable animal shelter for a reasonable period of time. An impounded dog not claimed by the owner, within seventy-two (72) hours after notice to the owner, if known, or if the owner is unknown within ninety-six (96) hours after impoundment, may be humanely disposed of by the Town of Webster or its designated agent.

D. Claiming Impounded Dogs. An owner or individual claiming a dog impounded by the Webster Police Department shall pay to the Town of Webster a fee of twenty-five dollars (\$25.00) plus five dollars (\$5.00) for each day the dog has been impounded.

E. License and Registration. The owner of a dog, kept, harbored, or maintained in the Town of Webster, shall license and register the dog as specified in Chapter 466 of the Revised Statutes Annotated of the State of New Hampshire.

F. Enforcement Procedure. The enforcement of this ordinance shall be the responsibility of the Police Department of the Town of Webster. The Chief of Police may, at his discretion, issue complaints alleging violation of this ordinance.

G. Penalties. Any owner found guilty of a violation of this ordinance may be punished by a fine of not more than fifty dollars (\$50.00), and each day in violation shall constitute a separate offense.

H. Fine Procedure. In addition to, or in lieu of impounding a dog found at large or otherwise in violation of this ordinance a police officer may issue to the owner of the dog a Notice of Ordinance Violation. The owner on receiving a Notice of Ordinance Violation may within ninety-six (96) hours of the date and time notice is given, pay to the Town, in full satisfaction of any penalty that could be assessed for violation of this ordinance, a penalty of twenty-five dollars (\$25.00).

I. Conflict with State Statutes. This ordinance is intended to include not only those state statutes specifically referred to be title and number, but also all those made a part of the law and they are hereby included under this section by reference.

26. To transact any other business that may legally come before this meeting.

AUDITOR'S OPINION

We have examined the financial statements of the various funds and groups of accounts of the Town of Webster, New Hampshire for the year ended December 31, 1978 listed in the foregoing table of contents. Our examination was made in accordance with generally accepted auditing standards, and accordingly included such tests of the accounting records as we considered necessary in the circumstances.

The Town of Webster has not maintained a record of its general fixed assets, and accordingly a statement of general fixed assets, required by generally accepted accounting principles, is not included in the financial report.

In our opinion, the financial statements listed in the aforementioned table of contents present fairly the financial position of the various funds and groups of accounts of the Town of Webster, New Hampshire at December 31, 1978 and the results of operations of such funds for the year then ended in conformity with generally accepted accounting principles applied on a consistent basis.

The supplemental schedules included in this report, although not considered necessary for a fair presentation of the financial position and results of operations of such funds and group of accounts, are presented primarily for supplemental analysis purposes. This additional information has been subjected to the audit procedures applied in the aforementioned examination of the basic financial statements and is, in our opinion, fairly stated in all material respects in relation to the basic financial statements taken as a whole.

As indicated therein, revenues in excess of estimates amounted to \$5,619, while appropriations exceeded expenditures by \$4,718, resulting in a 1978 budget surplus of \$10,337.

COMMENTS AND RECOMMENDATIONS

Town Clerk - Motor Vehicle Permit Fees Overremittance - \$500

Our examination of the Town Clerk's records revealed an overremittance of \$500 to the Town on account of motor vehicle permit fees collected in 1978. The major portion of this amount represents 1979 collections remitted in error. The balance represents personal funds of the clerk.

The discrepancy occurred primarily because of improper bookkeeping procedures. Presently, the remittances to the Treasurer cannot be traced to any particular entries recorded in the cash book. In this regard, in the future we recommend that the Town Clerk total the cash journal on a weekly basis and remit to the Treasurer accordingly.

Unexpended Antirecession Fiscal Assistance Funds - \$120

The federal government requires that antirecession fiscal assistance funds be used (appropriated, obligated or disbursed) within six months of their receipt. Inasmuch as these funds were received in January 1977, we recommend the respective federal agency be contacted relative to the disposition of the funds on hand at December 31, 1978.

We would like to extend our thanks to the officials and office staff of the Town of Webster for their assistance during the course of the audit.

NOTES TO THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTSSummary of Significant Accounting Policies

Note 1 - The following is a summary of significant accounting policies employed in the preparation of these financial statements.

Fund Accounting

The diverse nature of governmental operations and the necessity of determining compliance with legal provisions requires modification of accounting systems commonly used by commercial enterprises. Rather than establishing a single unified set of accounts to record and summarize all financial transactions, the accounts of the Town are organized on the basis of funds and account groups, each of which is considered a separate entity with self-balancing accounts that comprise its assets, liabilities, reserves, fund balance, revenues and expenditures, including interfund obligations and transfers.

Operations supplying the basic services of a general government nature which are controlled by legal budgets are accounted for in the General Fund and Special Revenue Fund.

In addition to the general category of operations listed above, a further distinction from accounting in commercial enterprises exists with respect to capital expenditures. Capital expenditures are required to be capitalized at historical cost in a General Fixed Asset Group of Accounts, primarily for control purposes. The Town has not maintained a record of its general fixed assets, and accordingly a statement of general fixed assets, required by generally accepted accounting principles, is not included in the financial report.

Fiduciary activities of the Town are accounted for in Trust Funds.

Basis of Accounting

The accounts of the General Fund, Special Revenue Funds, and Debt Service Fund are maintained and reported on a modified accrual basis. All other funds included in the financial statements are maintained and reported on the accrual basis.

Under the modified accrual basis of accounting, revenues are recorded when received in cash, except in cases where they are both measurable and available and therefore are resources which may be appropriated. Expenditures, except for interest on general long-term debt which is recorded when it becomes due, are recorded when certain goods or services are received and actual liabilities are incurred.

Investments in all cases are recorded at cost.

Article 18. Voted to use the Revenue Sharing Funds toward the cost of reappraisal of the Town. \$13,514. balance as of December 31, 1977 in Revenue Sharing Funds. This sum includes \$6,200. from prior year, which was disallowed last year.

Article 19. Voted to authorize the Tax Collector to accept pre-payment of taxes.

Article 20. Voted to transfer tax lien property to private owners by advertised sealed bids; the Selectmen to have the power to accept or reject any or all bids and sign and deliver suitable deed to successful purchaser. Hand vote - - - 52 Yes ----- 17 No

Article 21. Voted to accept and expend Federal Anti-Recession Funds (amount \$114.) To be used as payment to some unemployed person to work.

Article 22. Voted to accept and expend any Federal or State Funds or private gifts and donations.

Article 23. After much discussion, it was voted to pass over this article to discontinue the Mutton Road bridge. Much would depend on how Boscawen and Salisbury vote at their Town Meetings.

Article 24. Voted to accept the road from the intersection of Winnipocket Road to the east side of the berm. (Rte. 127-Putney Hill) Station 133 & 65T - Station 144 & OOT.

Article 25. Several persons asked that the Town Report next year include a detailed itemized statement of each department's expenditures throughout the year. There was a discussion of how the Town Reports were and will be distributed. It was voted that anyone who wishes may send a self-addressed, stamped (33¢) envelope to the Selectmen next year and a report will be mailed to them. Motion to put detailed lists of department expenditures in the Town Report was defeated 42 to 29. Benjamin Creighton suggested that a poll be taken of those present, in favor of or against the Panama Canal Treaty. A show of hands was 49 for keeping the Canal and 8 for returning it to Panama.

## ROAD AGENT'S REPORT

The reconstruction work on Winnapocket Road which was delayed last year because of the relocation project by the State on Rt. 127 was completed this year. Duncan Fund money was used on this project. The TRA work was done on Warner Road from the junction of Pond Hill Road to the junction of Lake Shore Road. Several roads were sealed including the two mentioned above, Pearson Hill Road from Williams Phelps' to the foot of the hill, Deer Meadow Road from Deer Meadow Brook to the Concord line, Deer Meadow Road from Hannah Dustin Drive almost to Howard Hook's, Little Hill Road from Casey's Corner to the former Little residence, a portion of Roby Road and Lake Shore Road was spot sealed.

The grader which was acquired last year through government surplus has proved most useful in grading roads. It was also used for placement of gravel on the TRA and Duncan Fund projects. For the total numbers of hours it was worked, it saved the Town approximately \$3,500.00 if a private grader had had to be hired.

Additional highway subsidy money, which was a new revenue in 1978 received from the State, was used in conjunction with TRA and Duncan Fund moneys on those projects. Law requires that this money be used for construction or reconstruction of Class IV and V highways.

The Highway Department is asking for a maintenance budget of \$45,000.00 this year due to increases in State Rates (which the Town voted to pay) for equipment and wages, and a general increase in the price of materials. We are asking for \$3,000.00 for general expenses due to increased costs and to purchase some tires for the grader.

Since I became Road Agent in 1971, one new plow and one new wing have been purchased. These two items are still in good condition, but older equipment is in very poor shape in spite of being constantly welded and repaired. We are asking for \$6,500.00 for the purchase of a new front plow, new wing, and plow frame and mount.

## FIRE CHIEF'S REPORT

The Webster Fire Department had two chiefs in 1978; Stan McLeod who resigned in February, with Bob Lake taking over as Acting Chief and then appointed as permanent Chief in July, with Dave Jones becoming Deputy Chief. The rest of the officers are as follows: Captain, Mike Jenovese; 1st Lieutenant, Daniel Creighton; 2nd Lieutenant, Ray Kimball; 2nd Lieutenant, Paul Welcome; Secretary-Treasurer, Gene Blake.

The training for 1978 consisted of a twelve hours extrication class, five weeks officer's training, eight hours cold weather school, forty-eight hours firefighter procedures, four weeks forest fire training, twelve weeks advanced first aid, plus weekly truck training at the station. Our emergency calls were as follows: two chimney fires, two structure fires, two electric wires down, five brush fires, two auto accidents, twenty-four medical emergencies, eight mutual aid calls to assist in structural fires, with an average response time of 3.9 minutes, an increase in calls of 26.5% over last year. The total man hours spent with the Fire Department were 2,162 hours.

The Fire Department has a very competent medical squad which includes two women, Carol Creighton and Cynthia Finlayson. They are also members of the Fire Department. The medical squad is constantly training to provide better medical service to the town.

The Fire Department is constantly striving to raise money to buy badly needed equipment. This year we held two raffles, one for a hind quarter of beef and one in November for six turkeys, with a profit for the two raffles of \$579.28. We also had a booth at the Hopkinton Fair, selling roast corn for a profit of \$457.79 and our annual lobster-clam bake realized a profit of \$1,001.72 for a total of \$2,038.79. The money was spent for the following: two rechargeable flashlights, two hose hangers, one 4½ inch double female connector, one 2½ inch ball valve, fifteen license plate signs, two pagers and two chargers (\$560.00), six coats, ten helmets, twenty pairs gloves and miscellaneous equipment (\$735.00), training schools (\$172.00). We received a portable generator through Civil Defense, a 2½ ton ten wheel vehicle through the State Forestry Service, which will be converted into our tank truck to replace our present tanker.

Equipment purchases through the town funds included one 45 watt mobile radio and one 2½ watt portable radio.

In July we attended a muster in Hopkinton where we competed against surrounding towns in fire fighting skills and won three out of four events.

It has been noted that on the basis of an evaluation and review of the Concord Area Mutual Aid System, by the New England Regional Office Public Protection - Department of the Insurance Services, recognition is being granted to the fully participating member communities for extended fire department protection to any property in Webster, within five miles of the Fire Department, effective August 15, 1978. This means a substantial savings on house insurance to most of the people in Webster.

REPORT OF DISTRICT FOREST FIRE CHIEF AND TOWN FOREST FIRE WARDEN

For more than 80 years, a cooperative effort between the State of New Hampshire and local forest fire authorities has created a forest fire prevention and suppression program that is recognized as superior throughout the United States.

Since the first forest fire laws were written in 1895, the state and local community governments have worked together to prevent and combat forest fires.

Today, 249 forest fire wardens and more than 1,800 deputy wardens are appointed every three years by the State Forester to work with the members of the State Forest Fire staff in this effort. State funds are used to pay one-half the cost of forest fire suppression costs incurred by local forest fire organizations, within pay rates established by the Governor and Council. State funds matched by local funds are used to purchase hand tools to suppress forest fires, to train local forest fire crews and in forest fire prevention work.

All outside burning, when the ground is not covered with snow, is permitted only after obtaining a written fire permit from your local Forest Fire Warden. Penalty for burning without a permit when one is required is a misdemeanor punishable by a fine up to \$1,000 or a jail term of up to one year or both.

Article 10. \$606. voted for the continuation of services to the Town through the Kearsarge Valley Area Center of the Community Action Program, Belknap-Merrimack Counties, Inc.

Article 11. Voted to raise and appropriate \$400. for expenses of Old Home Day.

Article 12. Following a discussion on this article the sum of \$500. was raised for the maintenance of the park and playground.

Article 13. \$3,200. voted for care of cemeteries (\$1,400. from Trust Funds and \$1,800. to be raised). So voted.

Article 14. \$18,400. voted for reappraisal of the Town by the Appraisal Division of the Department of Revenue Administration.

Article 15. After a lengthy discussion it was voted to allow the Fire Department to respond to all medical emergencies. Guidelines for procedure shall be established by the Fire Chief, Police Chief and Board of Selectmen.

Article 16. A motion to accept the article as read for \$1,500. for interest on temporary loans was withdrawn when it was mentioned there was a possibility of a late tax rate this year and \$2,000. might be needed. \$2,000. was voted.

1978 REAL ESTATE ASSESSMENTS

---

This booklet contains the names of the owners of real estate in the Town of Webster as of April 1, 1978.

The assessed valuations for this year were based by the Selectmen on appraisals made by appraisers employed by the Department of Revenue Administration. The 1978 assessment figure represents the appraised full value (sound value) of the property, the purpose being to equalize all individual assessments on this basis. Property record cards containing a description of each piece of property including the basis of the appraisal are on file at the office of the selectmen. These cards may be examined by any interested party.

If any property owner believes the assessment on his property this year is in excess of its full market value he may appeal to the Selectmen, in writing, for abatement within four months of the notice of his tax bill. Forms for this purpose may be obtained from the Board of Selectmen. Upon refusal of the Selectmen to make such abatement he may, within six months of the receipt of his tax bill, upon payment of a \$15.00 application fee, appeal to the Board of Taxation, State of New Hampshire, Concord, New Hampshire or in lieu of appealing to the Board of Taxation he may appeal by petition to the Superior Court of Merrimack County. An election by an applicant to appeal to the State Board of Taxation shall be deemed a waiver of any right to petition the Superior Court. In the case where an appeal is made to the State Board of Taxation, a review appraiser will be assigned to investigate the appeal or members of the Board of Taxation will review the property themselves.

For purposes of economy and efficiency the Board of Taxation will allow appeals made to it to accumulate until the six month period for filing has expired so that all properties may be examined at the same time. Examination will be made as soon thereafter as other commitments will permit.

It is called to your attention that interest at 9% per annum will be charged on all property taxes not paid by the due date specified on the tax bill and the filing of a request for review of assessment will not waive this penalty.
