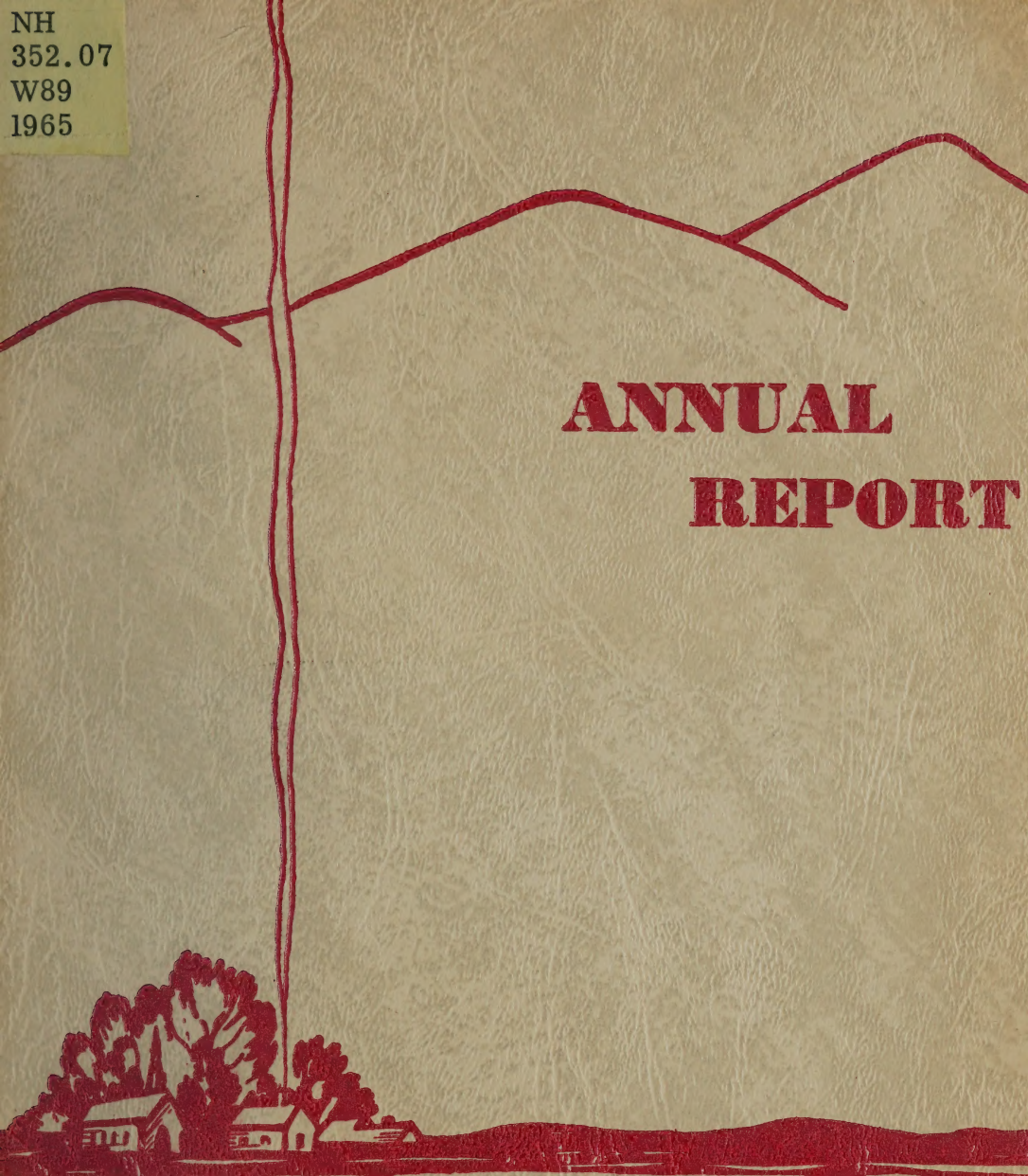

THE STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

To the Inhabitants in the Town of Woodstock, in the County of Grafton in said State, qualified to vote in Town Affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town House in said Woodstock, on Tuesday, the 8th day of March next, at nine of the clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects:

1. To choose all necessary Town Officers for the year ensuing.
2. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray town charges for the ensuing year and make appropriations of the same.
3. To see if a discount of 3% will be allowed on taxes paid on or before the first of September or a later date to be set by the Selectmen and if the sum of twenty cents shall be added to each poll tax not paid on or before September 15th.
4. To see if the Town will vote to accept the budget as posted.
5. To see if the Town will vote to allow the Selectmen to sell Property taken on tax titles.
6. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to borrow money in anticipation of taxes.
7. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$200.00 for advertising in the White Mountain-93 Association.
8. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$250.00 for support of the Kancamagus Ski Area.
9. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$1,000.00 to place in a capital reserve fund for the purchase of a new fire truck.

10. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to file in behalf of the Town an application (in form and manner required by the United States and in conformity with Public Law 560, 83rd Congress, as amended), and do whatever else may be required to obtain an advance, made by the United States to the Town of Woodstock, New Hampshire, to defray the cost of an engineering investigation, report and preliminary plans for an overall program for the collection and treatment of sewage.

11. To transact any other business that may legally come before this meeting.

**PUBLIC HEALTH AND
SCHOOL NURSING SERVICE
LINCOLN-WOODSTOCK AREA**

Total house calls in the area—1,045. This number consisted of the following types: Communicable diseases and suspects, 60; Medical and injury cases, 289; Chronically ill, 250; New mothers, 15; Infants under one month, 33; over one month and preschoolers, 28; Crippled Children's services, 33; unclassified visits, i. e. Welfare and Social Service visits, 340; Conferences with Preschoolers to diagnostic Clinics, 3; under therapy, 2.

Through the Bureau of Dental Health Services, a clinic for pre-school children was conducted. At these Clinics a Dental Hygienist inspects and cleans the teeth, then an application of fluorine is applied, fluorine being an agent which helps in the prevention of tooth decay in this age group. The hygienist instructs the mothers as to the care of the teeth. Thirty-eight preschoolers attended. Conferences with case workers from state and county welfare departments, 26 and professional meetings attended, 4.

Visits to schools in the District, 268. Athletic physicals were done on all students of the senior and junior high school by Dr. Ralph Parker of Franconia. Nurses examinations were carried out in the elementary grades. The Heaf Test for the detection of T. B. was given to the students in grades one and four in the elementary schools, grade 8 in the junior high and grade eleven in the senior high. Chest X-rays were taken if the results of this test required such. Several attended a chest clinic which was being held in Plymouth at this time. These programs are carried out through the N. H. T. B. Health Association.

This year the School Health Services of the N. H. State Department of Health, recommended booster shots against Tetanus and Diphtheria. This was for

grades one and four in the elementary schools, and grade 8 in the junior high school and grade twelve in the high school.

Our Christmas Program was again this year, substantially aided by all of the organizations in town, students in the junior and senior high school, the Littleton Lodge of Elks, The Sisters of the Atonement. The high school home economics classes did a fine piece of work by cooking and donating cakes and cookies. For this cooperation and all help during the year, we express our thanks.

REPORT OF THE FOREST FIRE WARDEN AND DISTRICT CHIEF

Most of us who live in New Hampshire and the thousands of vacationists who visit us every year love the State for the variegated woodlands that encircle our clean lakes and clothe the hills and mountains. Most of us appreciate these values, but still there are enough careless people among us to cause over 880 grass and woodland fires to start in 1965. True this was a much dryer than normal year but this should have meant the use of extra care. Fortunately the fire fighting forces have held the line against such careless acts. It is up to each one of us to be ever mindful that a spark or flame is a potential fire.

WE MUST ALL BE CAREFUL:

1. To teach our children the danger in lighting matches.
2. To never discard lighted smoking material from a car or while walking through fields or woods.
3. To safely dispose of rubbish, preferably at the town dump. If you must burn rubbish or brush:
 - a. Always get a permit to burn from the warden.
 - b. Start your fire late in the day after 5:00 P. M.
 - c. If burning a field or brush, have equipment and adequate help on hand. The heat from your fire creates its own draft to spread fire.

Our carelessness with fire is costing our State and Towns thousands of wasted dollars in suppression and hundreds of acres of destroyed woodlands. Yours never to enjoy.

County Rural Areas Development Committee, Coos County Planning Committee, Carroll County Rural Areas Development Committee, N. H. Ski Operators Association, White Mountains Region Industrial Council, the Coos, Carroll and Grafton Counties Community Action Program. The association with these many groups has been mutually helpful in developing new projects and programs in the north country.
