The election of Town Officers will be held Tuesday, March 5, 1974, from 1:00 P.M. to 7:00 P.M. (Article 1), and the business meeting of the Town from Article 2 forward will be held Thursday, March 7, 1974, beginning at 7:00 P.M., both at the Town Hall in Deering (by authority of vote of the Town at the 1972 Annual Meeting). While non-resident taxpayers are not authorized to vote, they will be welcome at the business session of the Town Meeting on Thursday, March 7.

On the front cover is a reproduction of the face of the Bicentennial Medal. It is patterned after the Town Seal, showing the church in Deering Center. The seal itself could not be used since it is erroneously inscribed "Incorporated 1775." Research reveals that the seal was made in 1927, but no reason for the error has been found. The Town Charter shows that the Town was incorporated on January 17, 1774.

The reverse of the medal, reproduced on the outside back cover, depicts a farmer plowing a hillside field with oxen; a cabin with woods and hills represents the type of terrain in the Town. The inscription reads "Early Settler Ebenezer Locke, Fired the First Shot of American Revolution." Mr. Locke, born in 1734, is said to have discharged the first gun at Lexington, Mass., upon the British troops, April 19, 1775. He and his family settled in Deering soon after the Revolution. He died here in 1816 and is buried in the Goodale Cemetery in North Deering.

TOWN WARRANT

To the inhabitants of the Town of Deering, in the County of Hillsborough, in said State, qualified to vote in Town affairs, greetings:

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town Hall in said Deering on Tuesday, the 5th day of March next, at one of the clock in the afternoon to act upon the following subject:

Article 1. To choose all necessary Town Officers for the ensuing year and Delegates to the Constitutional Convention. Polls will open at 1:00 P.M. and will remain open until 7:00 P.M. (The polls may be continued to be open following the above hour by vote of the meeting, but may not be closed before the hour of 7:00 P.M. — RSA 39:2.)

Additionally, you are hereby notified to meet at the Town Hall in said Deering on Thursday, the 7th day of March next, at seven of the clock in the evening to act upon the following articles (RSA 39:2a). (All articles herein after are submitted by the Selectmen unless otherwise noted.)

Article 2. To see if the Town will vote to accept the reports of the Town Officers, Agents and Auditors for the year 1973.

Article 3. To see if the Town will vote to raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray Town charges for the year of 1974 and to make appropriations of and for the same, or to take any other action relating thereto.

Article 4. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$8,000 for Town Officers' salaries and \$7,000 for Town Officers' expenses, and to authorize the Treasurer to pay each Selectman \$1,000 per year, or to take any other action relating thereto.

Article 5. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$700 for election and registration expenses, or to take any other action relating thereto.

Article 6. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$2,500 for the upkeep of the Town Hall and other Town buildings, and purchase of office equipment, or to take any other action relating thereto.

Article 7. To see if the Town will vote to rescind Article 7 of the Town of Deering 1973 Warrant, which was "To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$5,000 for remodeling, refinishing and equipping the interior of the Town Hall on the first floor, in the rear, for the provision of adequate Town offices," or to take any other action relating thereto.

Article 7a. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$3,000 for remodeling, refinishing, and equipping the interior of the Town Hall for the provision of adequate Town Offices, or to take any other action relating thereto.

Article 8. To see if the Town will vote to establish a five (5) member Public Services Building Committee, two (2) members to be appointed by the Selectmen, two (2) members to be appointed by the Planning Board, one (1) member to be appointed by the Town Moderator, and to raise and appropriate the sum of \$500 to fund said Committee, or to take any other action relating thereto.

Article 9. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$1,200 for Social Security payments for Town employees, or to take any other action relating thereto.

Article 10. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$7,500 for the Police Department and \$4,000 for the Fire Department, or to take any other action relating thereto.

Article 11. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$1,500 for tree trimming, particularly along narrow roads, or take any other action relating thereto.

Article 12. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$2,700 for Insurance, or to take any other action relating thereto.

Article 13. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$1,000 for Damages and Legal Expenses or to take any other action relating thereto.

Article 14. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$1,500 for contributions to neighboring towns which permit the use of their dumps by Deering residents and for trash removal, or to take any other action relating thereto.

Article 14a. To bring to the attention of the Town that the Board of Selectmen instituted an Ordinance as follows:

“Be it resolved and ordained that at the regular meeting of the Board of Selectmen on Monday, September 10, 1973, the Board has issued an ordinance prohibiting the dumping of garbage or refuse on or around the Town Commons and Town Buildings. This Ordinance is effective immediately. All citizens of Deering take Notice. Violators will be prosecuted to the full extent of the law.” And to see if the Town will vote to ratify said Ordinance or to take any other action relating thereto.

Article 15. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$25 for Vital Statistics, or to take any other action relating thereto.

Article 16. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the following sums for Highway purposes: (1) \$13,000 for summer roads; (2) \$17,000 for winter roads; (3) \$9,500 for the general expenses of the Highway Department, and (4) \$9,000 for road sealing, or to take any other action relating thereto.

Article 17. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to apply for, contract for, and accept grants of Federal or State aid relative to disasters, or both, as may be available, and to do all things necessary to carry out this Article, or to take any other action relating thereto.

Article 18. To see if the Town will vote to authorize withdrawal from the Revenue Sharing Fund established under the provisions of the State and Local Assistance Act of 1972 for use as set-offs against budget appro-

priations in the amount indicated; and, further, to authorize the Selectmen to make pro-rata reductions in the amounts if estimated entitlements are reduced, or to take any other action hereon:

Article 19. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$5,000 for the Capital Reserve Fund for highway equipment or to take any other action relating thereto.

Article 20. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$1,175.54 to secure Town Road Aid (State share \$7,836.95), or to take any other action relating thereto.

Article 21. To recall to the attention of the Town that the sum of \$8,000 to meet the annual payment on the Reconstruction of Bridge No. 103/053 on Reservoir Road and repairs to the Longwoods Road must be raised as previously authorized, under the provisions of RSA 33:2.

Article 22. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$850 for street lighting, or to take any other action relating thereto.

Article 23. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$35 for the library, or to take any other action relating thereto.

Article 24. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sums of \$1,200 for Town Poor, \$900 for Old Age Assistance, and \$750 for aid to Permanently and Totally Disabled, or to take any other action relating thereto.

Article 25. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$2,500 for the purpose of purchasing a fire-proof storage safe to contain the tax map and other records, or take any other action relating thereto.

Article 26. To see if the Town will vote to change the sign and billboard ordinance to read:

SIGN & BILLBOARD ORDINANCE

“Be it resolved and ordained that all billboards and signs advertising businesses, products, etc. located outside of Deering shall be approved by all the Selectmen and the Planning Board. Any Deering resident wishing to erect a commercial sign/signs for his business in Deering shall submit plans for such sign/signs to the Selectmen for approval. Such signs, if approved by all Selectmen, will be limited in number and size as well as to being in keeping with the decorum of the landscape,”
or to take any other action relating thereto.

Article 27. To recall to the attention of the Town that a County Tax will be levied on the Town, and it is estimated that the sum of \$14,000, as shown in the budget for this anticipated levy, will be required.

Article 28. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$321 for support of the Monadnock Region Assn., or to take any other action relating thereto.

Article 29. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$200 for the care of Cemeteries. (Required by Statute.)

Article 30. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$200 for current operating expenses and projects by the Conservation Commission, or to take any other action relating thereto.

Article 30a. To see if the Town will vote to designate the Glen Road, from Peter Wood Hill Road to East Deering Road, as a "scenic road" under provisions of RSA 253:17 & 18.

Article 30b. To see if the Town will vote to designate Wolf Hill Road, from Route 149 to Old County Road, as a "scenic road" under the provisions of RSA 253:17 & 18.

Article 30c. To see if the Town will vote to designate Fisher Road, from Deering Center to D. Poling's, as a "scenic road" under the provisions of RSA 253:17 & 18.

Article 30d. To see if the Town will vote to designate Dickey Hill Road, from Route 149 to Clement Hill Road, as a "scenic road" under the provisions of RSA 253:17 & 18.

Article 30e. To see if the Town will vote to designate Reservoir Road, from Deering Center to the Dam at Deering Lake, as a "scenic road" under the provisions of RSA 253:17 & 18.

Article 30f. To see if the Town will permit the Deering Conservation Commission to accept a Ford Foundation Grant, if application is approved, to be used towards Town planning.

Article 30g. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$250 to be used with matching funds from the Ford Foundation Grant.

(Articles 30 through 30g are submitted by the Conservation Commission, who request that each item be voted upon separately.)

Article 31. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$200 for Civil Defense, or to take any other action relating thereto.

Article 32. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$1,500 for continuing and making corrections to the Tax Map, which is required by RSA 31:95-a, or to take any other action relating thereto.

Article 33. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$450 for interest on long-term loans, or to take any other action relating thereto.

Article 34. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$200 for the current operating expenses of the Planning Board, or to take any other action relating thereto. (Submitted by Planning Board.)

Article 35. To see if the Town will vote to continue membership of the regional planning commission, now organized and named the Central New Hampshire Regional Planning Commission. This Commission has membership of more than ten municipalities and has jurisdiction over the planning

region delineated by the Office of State Planning. The objective of the Commission is to plan for and encourage regional planning analysis, provide consensus on major problems of regional concern, and to assist in the effectuation of projects within, and which extend beyond, the boundaries of a particular town.

The Commission has only the authority conferred on it by Chapter 36:45-53, RSA 1955, and is advisory to local governments within the Region. Members of the Commission shall be appointed by the Selectmen in accordance with State Law. Two representatives will be appointed from Deering, N. H.

Article 35a. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$433 as the Town's share for the studies and operation of the Central New Hampshire Regional Planning Commission. These funds will be used for financing the staff, operation expenses, planning studies, technical assistance, and other programs of the Commission. These funds may be used in conjunction with other State and Federal funds available for planning purposes.

Article 36. To see if the Town will vote to accept by deed a lot of land less than one acre situated on Old County Road near the intersection of the Bowen School Road from Daryl McQuirk for the purpose of building a fire house and to vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$200 for surveying costs and legal expenses incurred in transferring said lot, or to take any other action relating thereto.

Article 36a. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$7,500 for the purpose of purchasing building materials for a 28' x 40' building to be used as a fire house and to be erected by Volunteer Fire Department labor and other volunteer labor, or to take any other action relating thereto.

Article 37. To see if the Town will vote to carry over Article 37 of the Town of Deering's 1973 Warrant, which was "To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Board of Selectmen to sell and convey by quit-claim deed, under such conditions and to such persons as the Board may consider proper, the property known as the Old Deering School House site at or near the intersection of the Old Francestown Road with the Homestead Road, containing 0.23 acres, more or less," so that the transaction may be made in the 1974 calendar year, or to take any other action relating thereto.

Article 38. To see if the Town will vote to adopt the provisions of RSA 31:105, and thereby indemnify and save harmless Town employees or agents from claims arising out of their employment with the Town, or take any other action relating thereto.

Article 39. To see if the Town will vote to adopt the Australian ballot system for the election of town officers, effective with the election of town officers at the Town Meeting in March, 1975 (RSA 59:71, 59:72, 59:74, 59:75, 59:76, and the pertinent provisions of RSA 56), or to take any other action relating thereto. (Submitted by Planning Board.)

Article 40. To see if the Town will vote to authorize and empower the Selectmen to negotiate for and, if necessary, purchase options to buy any suitable land in the Town of Deering for the purpose of constructing and

maintaining a Sanitary Landfill Disposal area and other uses incident thereto, or to take any other action relating thereto. (Action on this Article will be taken up at an adjourned session to be held on Thursday, June 20, 1974.)

Article 41. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to auction property taken by Tax Collector's Deeds.

Article 42. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to borrow money in anticipation of taxes.

Article 43. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to apply for, contract for, and accept grants of Federal or State aid relative to the detection, deterrence and apprehension of crime or criminals, or both, and to do all things necessary to carry out this Article, or to take any other action relating thereto.

Article 44. To see whose photograph the Town will vote to place on the cover of the next Annual Report.

Article 45. To transact any other business which may legally be brought before this meeting.

SELECTMEN'S REPORT

Expenses for 1973 were less than appropriations by approximately \$14,900; and, due to the current shortages and inflation, we expect expenses will continue to rise sharply in 1974. Where all this will end is anybody's guess, but the uncertainty it creates is reflected in the cautious budgeting in the Warrant Articles which are herewith commented upon:

Article 4: we propose an increase in the Selectmen's salaries from \$500 to \$1,000 per year for each Selectman—the Chairman to receive the same salary as his fellow Selectmen. It is our belief that each Selectman shares equally in the duties and responsibilities of office. In general, the increase in Town Officers' salaries is due partly to the proposed change in Selectmen's salaries and partly due to salary payments billed after the close of the fiscal year, causing the payment to become a part of the 1974 appropriation. The Town Officers' expenses are increased from \$5,500 to \$7,000 because of the rising costs of printing, newspaper notices, paper, mailing, office supplies, etc., which are paid out of this appropriation.

Article 5: 1974 is an election year which brings with it increased costs for election and registration.

Article 6: heating the Town Hall is becoming more and more expensive. We plan to refinish the Meeting Hall floor and to purchase perhaps 50 new folding chairs, since at present we do not have a sufficient number to accommodate our citizens who attend Town Meeting or those expected to participate in our Bicentennial Celebration.

Article 7: the vote at the 1973 Town Meeting to remodel the Town Hall on the first floor for adequate Town Offices raised fears in the minds of many of our citizens that the stage might be destroyed, and they forthwith presented us with a petition to withhold such modifications. We honored their petition and decided to approach the 1974 Town Meeting with a request to rescind the previous vote and in its place to reappropriate \$3,000 of the original \$5,000 to remodel, refinish, and equip the Town Offices where they presently are—on the second floor.

Article 8: creates a formal Building Committee with sufficient funding to make surveys, secure technical aid, and to make recommendations for a Public Services Building, the recommendations to be presented at the 1975 Town Meeting.

Article 10: we cannot any longer expect our police officers and firemen to furnish the protection our Town so badly needs for \$2.00 per hour. Both the police and the fire department appropriations are raised to include the increased hourly costs, and, in the case of the police department, to include the increased costs of patrolling.

Article 13: we anticipate increased costs for legal expenses as we attempt to either jointly agree with a neighboring town to share its disposal area or to construct a facility of our own.

Article 14: although it is doubtful if we can expect to share the Hillsborough disposal area after July 1, 1974, we will still have to contribute to its costs for the portion of the year that we continue to use it. Hillsborough has estimated that costs will be substantially higher.

Article 16: we are requesting only modest increases in the costs of Summer and Winter road maintenance, and a very small increase in General Highway expenses. Road sealing costs are very much higher since the cost of petroleum products has more than doubled.

Article 17: This article simply gives us the right to accept disaster aid without the necessity of calling a special Town Meeting.

Article 20: is to secure Town Road Aid (TRA) to help defray the cost of improving North Road.

Article 25: purchasing a fire proof safe or storage cabinet would safeguard the many valuable and important Town documents now having little protection from fire or theft.

Article 26: the sign ordinance is changed so that our citizens will have an avenue of request and will not be summarily denied the right to discreetly advertise their involvement in out-of-town services or products as part of their businesses.

Article 28: At this time we see little reason to support this Article.

Article 30: of necessity we must bring to the attention of the Town that changing a road to a "scenic road" causes the Town to lose a portion of the Highway Subsidy allotment which is based on the number of miles of roads in the Town and at the same time increases the cost and difficulty of highway maintenance—a double blow—increasing highway expenses. Thus we do not support these changes.

Article 32: the Tax Map is a continuing effort as transfer changes and corrections must be made. We are fortunate to have such a fine map acquired at a very modest cost.

Articles 36, 36a: the \$7,500 includes building materials, excavation, and concrete.

Article 38: the Town employees and officials need protection from lawsuits directed at them through no fault of their own for carrying out their duties for the Town.

Article 40: the Town will have to either construct its own disposal area or find a neighboring town willing to accept our refuse at their dump. The latter seems unlikely, and we would like to negotiate to secure a suitable parcel of property for a sanitary land-fill disposal area. This Article also permits adjournment to June 20, 1974, at which meeting any proposal can be acted upon by the citizens of our Town.

Article 43: under this Article the Town may accept and expend grants from the Crime Commission.

Any Article not specifically commented upon we feel is self explanatory.

We would like to thank the many fine Citizens of Deering who have gone out of their way to assist and advise the Board of Selectmen throughout the year, and we hope that they will continue their cooperation in 1974.

DEERING PLANNING BOARD REPORT

The Deering Planning Board met eleven times from March, 1973, through February, 1974, including two joint meetings with the Board of Selectmen and one joint meeting with the Henniker Planning Board. In addition, there were four Public Hearings relative to subdivisions.

Mr. Robert Nugent and Ms. Beverly Yeaple were appointed to the Board by the Selectmen for five-year terms, and Mr. Ernest Johnson was appointed for a four-year term. Dr. James M. Carew was elected Chairman; Mr. Willis Merrill, Vice Chairman; and Ms. Beverly Yeaple, Secretary, for the coming year.

A total of thirteen subdivisions were considered by the Board, eleven of which were approved with two still pending. The continued increase in the number of subdivisions requires more than 75% of the Planning Board's time, leaving little opportunity for other important projects.

Comprehensive Town planning remains a prime consideration of the Board. Mr. Robert Nugent was appointed to study plans for a zoning ordinance for the Town of Deering. This study, along with inspecting the Town buildings and Town Common, have been and will be part of our immediate concerns, as time permits.

The question of the Town Dump must be resolved by the Town before July 1, 1974. Suggestions for solutions to the problem, resulting from a Joint Meeting with the Selectmen, will be presented to the Town at Town Meeting.

Suggestions and opinions concerning the future of the Town are always welcome from Deering taxpayers!

CONSERVATION COMMISSION REPORT

The Commission accepted with genuine regret the resignations of two long-time and hard-working members, Mrs. Jeanne Bartlett and Mr. Robert Nugent. We were fortunate to persuade two equally capable citizens to serve as replacements—Mrs. Marguerite Dutton and Mrs. Villa Ramsay.

During the year we focused our attention on several issues relative to Deering's natural assets. A summary of our actions follows:

1. Agreed to prepare and subsequently started an appropriate map of Deering for the Bicentennial observance.
2. Sponsored Miss Linda Wilson of West Deering as a participant in the Conservation Camp at Bear Brook.
3. Prepared and submitted a request for funds from the Ford Foundation to assist in examining and cataloging Deering's potential. Our intentions are to make known those areas which may require protection from development.
4. Discharged the necessary prerequisites to requesting the approval of five additional roads as "scenic."
5. Initiated plans for a Botanical Contest among Deering's young people in conjunction with the Bicentennial.

We thank the citizens of Deering for continuing to allow us to represent our mutual interests in matters natural. The Commission earnestly solicits support, suggestions, and offers to improve and maintain Deering's uniqueness.

HEALTH OFFICER'S REPORT

Once again, water samples taken from Deering Lake on September 3, 1973, showed the water to be very pure. Most samples tested came within the United States Public Health Service standard for drinking water after treatment. All samples met the New Hampshire Class A standard for public water supply before treatment; i.e., normal for inland waters free of sewage pollution. Therefore, everyone can take great pride in their successful efforts in continuing to maintain such high standards.

The Health Officer visited several areas where violations of the health standards were observed, and in most cases appropriate corrective action was taken.

AGAIN: Those subdividing land or purchasing land to build homes are reminded that approval for septic systems must be made first by the New Hampshire Water Supply and Pollution Control Commission.

As we approach our Bicentennial Celebration, all are urged to protect Deering's natural beauty by observing rules of proper rubbish disposal.

CIVIL DEFENSE DIRECTOR'S REPORT

The Director participated in one rescue operation, one Civil Defense Alert, and filed all necessary reports to the state.

The DUKW (amphibious personnel carrier) was returned to the State Civil Defense Headquarters. The lack of suitable launching areas, coupled with the high cost of insurance and fuel, were deciding factors in returning the vehicle. However, plans are continuing to develop a modest fire fighting capability on Deering Lake. Lake residents have donated a gasoline powered water pump and 100 feet of fire hose. More hose and a nozzle have been promised. Boat and sport shops have been and are continuing to be contacted for the donation of a 12 to 14 foot metal boat on which to mount the equipment. The ultimate goal is to have such a fire boat operational to contain a conflagration until the arrival of professional fire fighting equipment.

Three metal desks were obtained through the State Civil Defense in order that the Police Chief, Fire Chief, and Civil Defense Director might file certain forms, reports and reference papers at the Town Hall.

REPORT OF THE FOREST FIRE WARDEN AND DISTRICT CHIEF

The New Hampshire Forest Fire Service is represented in every town, city or unorganized place in our state by the forest fire warden. Anyone wishing to kindle an outside fire when the ground is not covered with snow must first obtain the written permission of the fire warden. Except for cooking fires, no fire can be kindled between 9:00 A.M. and 5:00 P.M. unless it is a commercial or industrial burn or it is raining. The fire warden is assisted in his work by the District Forest Fire Chief, who works for the Department of Resources and Economic Development Forest Fire Service.

Fire prevention was, again this year, the most important part of the Forest Fire Warden's job. Fire statistics show the need, with 72% of the fires caused by smoking, debris burning and children. Smokey the Bear is an important prevention tool, but he still needs much help from the public. Parents should warn their children of the hazards of playing with matches. Children tend to forget that a lighted match held in their hands is a potential forest fire.

HISTORIAN'S REPORT

Looking forward to Deering's Bicentennial Celebration this summer, your Historian has spent many hours in the Deering Library and the New Hampshire Historical Society in Concord going through old Town Reports, newspapers, historical references, etc., getting material for the pageant, which will be a highlight of the Bicentennial Celebration in August.

Many interesting things have been noted. Among them: the addition of a new steeple to the Center Church in the 1890s, the fact that Deering bands played at fairs throughout Hillsborough County in that same period, that the fishing in the Reservoir was excellent, that young men came by bicycle from Boston to Deering to spend some time at the Belleview Hotel (the hotel at the Center which was destroyed by fire in 1892), that Deering young people went to Boston and other cities to work, that freight was received at and shipped from the West Deering Station (which was served by many daily trains), that socials were frequent throughout the year (some having to be postponed on account of snowstorms). Wolf Hill Grange was active, sheep dotted the hillsides with their many open fields, a large amount of farm produce was sold in Hillsboro's grocery stores, and crates of blueberries went to Massachusetts cities.

As noted in earlier reports, Deering's population and activity dwindled from the Civil War to World War I, and it has increased rapidly since World War II. It is hoped that it will not lose its small town identity by overpopulation and too much building, but a modest increase has been desirable.

MINUTES OF THE 1973 TOWN MEETING

A legal meeting of the inhabitants of the Town of Deering qualified to vote in Town Affairs was called to order at 1:00 P.M. on March 6.

Article 1. To choose all necessary Town Officers for the ensuing year.

On March 8 at 7:00 P.M. Articles 2 through 45 were voted. The meeting was opened with a Salute to the Flag and a prayer. It was unanimously voted that no article be passed over.

Article 2. It was passed without dissent to accept the reports of the Town Officers, Agents, and Auditors for the year 1972 as read.

Article 3. It was voted to raise and appropriate such sums of money as may be necessary to defray Town charges for the year 1973.

Article 4. It was voted to raise and appropriate the sum of \$5100.00 for Town Officers' salaries and \$5500.00 for Town Officers' expenses and authorize the Treasurer to pay to each Selectman \$500.00 per year and the Chairman of the Board of Selectmen \$250.00 annually as a supplement. Passed without dissent.

Article 5. It was voted to raise and appropriate the sum of \$400.00 for election and registration expenses.

Article 6. It was voted to raise and appropriate the sum of \$2000.00 for the upkeep of the Town Hall and other buildings and purchase of office equipment.

Article 7. It was voted to raise and appropriate the sum of \$5000.00 for remodeling, refinishing, and equipping the interior of the Town Hall on the first floor, in the rear, for the provision of adequate Town Offices and toilet facilities for the Selectmen, obtaining three bids and publishing same.

Article 8. It was voted to resubmit to the Building Committee recommendations for construction of a Public Services building, the Committee to come up with more definite plans at the next Town Meeting.

Article 9. It was voted to raise and appropriate the sum of \$900.00 for Social Security payments for Town employees.

Article 10. It was voted to raise and appropriate the sum of \$5000.00 for the Police Department and \$3500.00 for the Fire Department.

Article 11. It was voted to raise and appropriate the sum of \$1000.00 for tree trimming and cutting, particularly along narrow roads.

Article 12. It was voted to raise and appropriate the sum of \$2700.00 for insurance.

Article 13. It was voted to raise and appropriate the sum of \$750.00 for damages and legal expenses.

Article 14. It was voted to raise and appropriate the sum of \$500.00 for contributions to neighboring towns which permit the use of their dumps by Deering residents and for trash removal.

Article 15. It was voted to raise and appropriate the sum of \$25.00 for Vital Statistics.

Article 16. It was voted to raise and appropriate the sums of (1) \$12,000.00 for summer roads, (2) \$15,000.00 for winter roads, (3) \$9000.00 for the general expenses of the Highway Department, and (4) \$7500.00 for road sealing.

Article 17. By a 2/3 vote, it was voted to raise and appropriate the sum of \$4000.00 in addition to the originally authorized \$7500.00 as its share of the cost of reconstructing Bridge No. 103/053 on Reservoir Road, and to request Town Bridge Aid from the State of New Hampshire for the balance. All under the provisions of New Hampshire R.S.A. 242, such sums having been raised by the issuance of notes under the authority of the 1972 Town Meeting.

Article 18. It was voted to authorize withdrawal from the Revenue Sharing Fund established under the provisions of the State and Local Assistance Act of 1972 for use as sit-offs against budget appropriations in the amount indicated; and further, to authorize the Selectmen to make pro-rata reductions in the amounts if estimated entitlements are reduced. Passed without dissent.

Article 19. It was voted to raise and appropriate the sum of \$5000.00 for the Capital Reserve Fund for highway equipment.

Article 20. It was voted to raise and appropriate the sum of \$1177.22 to secure Town Road Aid (State share \$7851.47).

Article 21. The \$25,000.00 figure was amended to \$10,000.00 to be

raised and appropriated in total to resurface, drain, and rebuild Manselville Brook Bridge and the road between the railroad tracks at the north end of Long Woods Road, and to be put up for bids. Amendment passed.

Article 22. It was voted to raise and appropriate the sum of \$700.00 for street lighting.

Article 23. It was voted to raise and appropriate the sum of \$35.00 for the Library.

Article 24. It was voted to raise and appropriate the sums of \$1200.00 for Town Poor, \$900.00 for Old Age Assistance, and \$750.00 for Aid to the Permanently and Totally Disabled.

Article 25. It was voted to raise and appropriate the sum of \$1000.00 for interest on long term loans.

Article 26. It was recalled to the attention of the Town that the sum of \$11,000.00 in payment of TRA notes must be raised under the provisions of RSA 33:2, with the note that most of the latter is provided for in TRA commitments.

Article 27. It was recalled to the attention of the Town that a County Tax will be levied on the Town and it is estimated that the sum of \$13,000 as shown in the budget will be required.

Article 28. Not voted to support the Monadnock Region Association.

Article 29. It was voted to raise and appropriate the sum of \$200.00 for the care of cemeteries.

Article 30. It was voted to raise and appropriate the sum of \$200.00 for current operating expenses of the Conservation Commission.

Article 31. It was voted to raise and appropriate the sum of \$200.00 for Civil Defense.

Article 32. It was voted to raise and appropriate the sum of \$4500.00 to complete the Tax Mapping of the Town as required by RSA 31:95a.

Article 33. It was voted to express the sense of the Meeting, and to direct, if statutorily appropriate, the Deering Old Home Day Association to use its existing funds in the support of the Deering Bi-Centennial Activity.

Article 34. It was voted to increase the membership of the Planning Board from five (5) to seven (7) members (RSA 36:4).

Article 35. It was voted to become a member of the Regional Planning Commission, now organized and named the Central New Hampshire Regional Planning Commission. The Commission has membership of more than ten municipalities and has jurisdiction over the region delineated by the Office of State Planning. The Commission has only the authority conferred on it by Chapter 36:45, 53, Revised Statutes Annotated 1955, and is advisory to local governments in the region. Members of the Commission shall be appointed by the Selectmen in accordance with State law.

Two representatives shall be appointed from Deering, N. H.

Article 35-A. It was voted to raise and appropriate the sum of \$414.00 as the Town's share of the studies and operation of the Central New Hampshire Regional Planning Commission. These funds will be used for financing the staff, operation expenses, planning studies, technical assistance and other programs of the Commission. These funds may be used in conjunction with other State and Federal funds available for planning purposes.

Articles 36 and 36-A. To become a member of the Southern Regional Planning Commission and vote money for same was voted down.

Article 37. It was voted to authorize the Board of Selectmen to sell and convey by quit-claim deed, under such conditions and to such persons as the Board may consider proper, the property known as the old Deering School House site, at or near the intersection of the Old Francestown Road, containing 0.23 acres, more or less.

Article 38. Negative vote on Meals on Wheels program.

Article 39. It was voted not to adopt the Australian Ballot System but to continue the present form of elections.

Article 40. It was voted to designate Old County Lane as a "Scenic Road" under provisions of RSA 253:17.

Article 41. It was voted to authorize the Selectmen to auction property taken by Tax Collectors Deeds.

Article 42. It was voted to authorize the Selectmen to borrow money in anticipation of taxes.

Article 43. It was voted not to change the name of the 2nd New Hampshire Turnpike to Cork Plains Road.

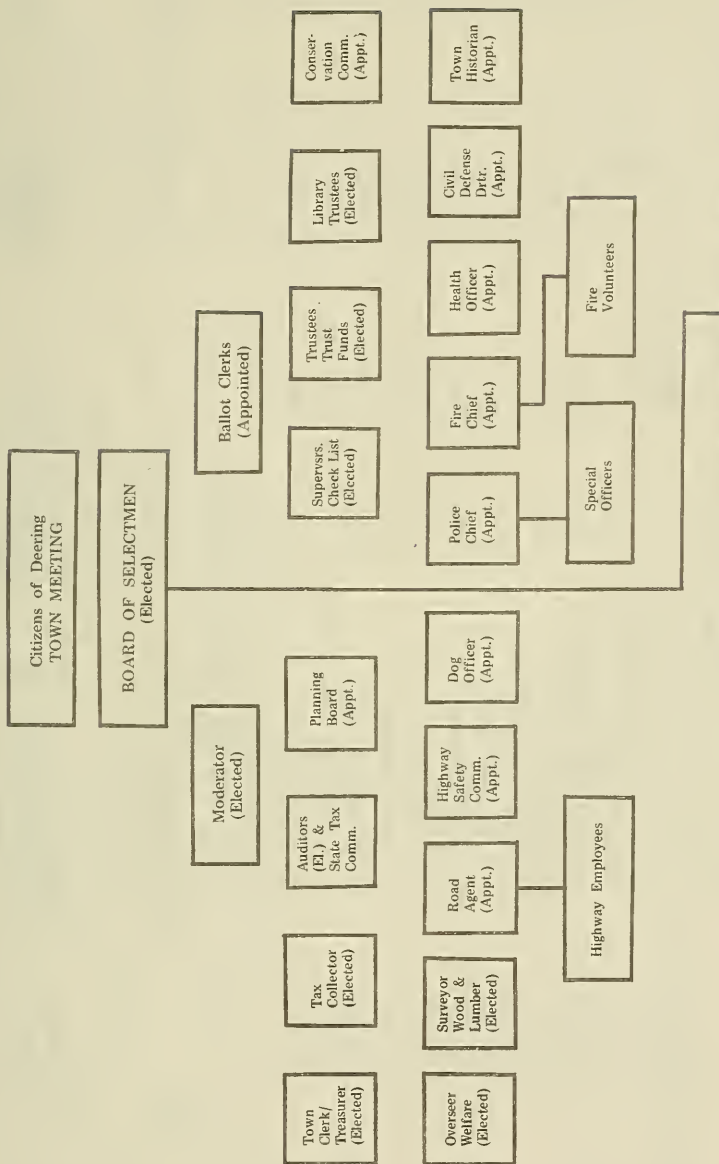
Article 44. It was voted to have as a cover for the next Annual Report a tribute to the 200th Anniversary.
