### **TOWN WARRANT**

To the inhabitants of the Town of Grantham, in Sullivan County, qualified to vote in Town affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town Hall in said Grantham on Tuesday, the sixth of March next, at ten o'clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects:

Article 1. To choose by ballot and major vote, for the ensuing three years:

One (1) Selectman One (1) Trustee of the Trust Funds Two (2) Trustees of the Public Library For the ensuing year: Two (2) Auditors

Article 2. To vote to authorize the Selectmen to appoint a Police Officer and/or Health Officer; and to appropriate one thousand dollars (\$1,000) for same; to be used for salary, expenses and equipment purchases.

Article 3. To choose one or more Highway Agents, and all other necessary Town Officers, Agents and Committees, and to pass any vote relating thereto.

Article 4. To see if the Town will vote to apply for Town Road Aid and raise the sum of \$347.88 for the same, with the State contributing \$2,319.88.

Article 5. To see if the Town will vote to raise the following salaries to the following amounts:

Selectman (Chairman)	from \$300 to \$400
Selectman (Second)	from \$250 to \$350
Selectman (Third)	from \$200 to \$300
Town Clerk	from \$50 to \$100
Town Treasurer	from \$80 to \$150
Supervisors	

For Primaries & Elections to \$15 each meeting; supervisors meetings to remain the same at \$2.50 each meeting.

Article 6. To see if the Town will vote to appropriate

two hundred dollars (\$200) for the use of the Planning Board; such sum to be taken from Town Officers' Expenses.

Article 7. To raise and appropriate such sum of money as may be necessary to defray Town Charges.

Article 8. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate \$661.44 to become a member of the Newport Area Public Health Nursing Association.

Article 9. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate a sum not to exceed \$800 to continue the services of the Newport Ambulance Service.

Article 10. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of twenty-five dollars (\$25.00) for the purpose of publicizing and promoting the natural advantages and resources of the Town together with other Towns in the Dartmouth-Lake Sunapee Region.

Article 11. To see if the Town will vote to petition the State Tax Commission to have an audit made by the Division of Municipal Accounting and make an appropriation to cover the expense of such audit.

Article 12. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate \$250 for the care and maintenance of Cemeteries.

Article 13. To see if the Town will vote to form a committee of three for a "Solid Waste Disposal Study Committee". This Committee to work toward the establishment of a solid waste disposal system to comply with the State laws which will become effective in 1978. Said committee to present a preliminary report at 1974 Town Meeting.

Article 14. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate one thousand dollars (\$1,000.) to be placed in the Trust Fund for the New Dump.

Article 15. To see if the Town will vote to make the operation of the Town Dump a responsibility of the Road Agent.

Article 16. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for the care and maintenance of the Town Dump.

Article 17. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of one thousand dollars (\$1,000.) for the purpose of painting the outside of Dunbar Library.

Article 18. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of thirty-five hundred dollars (\$3,500.) for the use of the Volunteer Fire Department.

Article 19. To see if the Town will vote to appropriate one thousand dollars (\$1,000.) for new equipment for the Fire Department and authorize the withdrawal of the amount required for this purpose from the Revenue Sharing Fund established under the provisions of the State and Local Assistance Act of 1972.

Article 20. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of three thousand dollars (\$3,000.) to have an Aerial Survey Map System made.

Article 21. To see if the Town will vote to instruct the Selectmen to dispose of any tax acquired properties in any manner they deem advisable.

Article 22. To see if the Town will vote to raise six hundred dollars (\$600.) to defray the costs of street lighting.

Article 23. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for the maintenance of the Dunbar Library and the Librarian's salary.

Article 24. To see if the Town will vote to raise the sum of two thousand dollars (\$2,000.) to be placed in the New Truck Trust Fund.

Article 25. To see if the Town will vote to purchase a new Town Truck by authorizing the Selectmen to withdraw the balance of funds from the Revenue Sharing Fund; to withdraw the funds from the New Truck Fund and to borrow any balance needed on a Short Term Note.

Article 26. To raise and appropriate such sum of money deemed necessary for the repairs of highways and bridges.

Article 27. To raise and appropriate such sum of money deemed necessary for Winter Maintenance of Town Highways. Article 28. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate a sum of money to be used for Old Age Assistance, Town Poor and the distribution of Surplus Food.

Article 29. To see if the Town will vote to instruct the Selectmen to hire money if necessary in anticipation of taxes.

Article 30. To hear the reports of Officers, Agents and Committees heretofore chosen and pass any vote relating thereto.

Article 31. To transact any other business that may legally come before this meeting.

# GRANTHAM SCHOOL ANNUAL DISTRICT MEETING

#### March 8, 1972

Meeting was opened at 3:00 P. M. to act on Art. 1. Polls closed at 7:30 P. M. and the meeting recessed to count ballots. Ballot clerks were Eleanor Reney, Paul Romaine, Kenneth Barton, Stanley Graf with the moderator and clerk. The following results were read by the moderator.

School Board for three years: Stanley Graf 1, Allen Walker 1, Robert Osgood 2, Robert Hubbard 40, Shirley Curtis 20, Mary Traegde 2, Robert Hubbard was elected.

School Board for 1 year: Hollis French 1, Robert Hubbard 3, Mary Traegde 6, Warren Benoit 55, Shirley Curtis 3, Warren Benoit was elected.

Treasurer: Thomas Willis 1, Eleanor Reney 1, Bernice Howe 63, Kenneth Barton 1, Bernice Howe was elected.

Moderator: Kenneth Barton 1, Robert Osgood 52, Ralph Howard 1, Donald Barton, Jr. 1, Robert Osgood was elected.

Auditors: Everett Reney 1, Stanley Graf 7, Shirley Curtis 2, Joey Holmes 1, Fred Kidder 1, Barbara Mutney 23, Janis Hastings 21, Richard Howard 1, Ralph Howard 1, Barbara Mutney and Janis Hastings elected.

Clerk: Elwin Kimball 1, Janis Hastings 66, Janis Hastings elected.

There were 70 votes cast. Ella Reney offered the following motion: In as much as N. H. Laws require a five hour voting period, it seemed sensible to open the meeting at 3:00 P. M. and since the School Boards error was one of omission, not of commission, I move that the business of the past five hours be declared a legal part of this March 8, 1972, meeting and that we proceed with the rest of the proposed warrant. Seconded by Kenneth Barton. Affirmative vote.

Art. 2: Ella Reney moved that Art. 2 be accepted as written. Seconded by Peter Galien. Affirmative vote.

Art. 3: Shirley Curtis requested that the District not take action on Art. 3 until articles 4 & 5 are acted on because they affect Art. 3. Seconded by Peter Galien. Affirmative vote.

Art. 4: Motion to pass over made by Stanley Graf, seconded by Alfred Holmes. Negative vote. Motion by Kenneth Barton to accept as written amended by Eila Hautaniemi to read: That the District vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$8,262.75 to cover the deficit in the In-State Tuition Account for 1971-72 school year and to authorize the selectmen to make the money available before June 30, 1972. Seconded by Mary Traegde. The motion to move question by Alden Pillsbury, seconded by Wilfred Hastings. Affirmative vote.

Art. 5: Motion to pass over by Alfred Holmes, seconded by Stanley Graf. Negative vote. Following resolution offered by Mary Traegde: That the School District vote to authorize the School Board to enter into a 5 year contract with Jan-Car Leasing Inc. to provide pupil transportation for the School District and to utilize the \$2,500.00 realzed from the sale of the school bus to reduce the amount to be raised by local taxation. Seconded by Shirley Curtis. Motion made by Shirley Curtis to vote by ballot. Seconded by William Willis. Total votes cast 54, yes 43-no 12. Article accepted. Motion made by N. Day and seconded by Robert Hubbard to accept count as taken.

Art. 6: Mary Traegde offered following resolution: That the District vote to utilize the sum in the Capital Reserve Bus Fund to reduce the amount needed to be raised by local taxation. Seconded by Aleene Hastings. Affirmative vote.

Motion maded by Everett Reney to go to article 10. Seconded by Robert Hubbard. Affirmative vote.

estimated to be received from the State and Federal governments together with other income; the School Board to certify to the Selectmen the balance, which balance is to be raised by taxation by the district. Seconded by Eila Hautaniemi. Stanley Graf made a motion to amend to read \$63,042.00, not seconded. Motion made by Stanley Graf and seconded by Alden Pillsbury to vote by ballot. Affirmative vote. Amendment made by Kenneth Barton to submit another figure if this one is defeated. 58 votes cast, 19 yes, Amendment is lost. Warren Benoit presented a 39 no. figure of \$72,500.00 including Teacher Aide as a motion. Seconded by Reginald Field. Motion made to move the question, seconded by Kenneth Barton. Affirmative vote. Motion made and seconded to vote by ballot. Amended by Alfred Holmes and seconded by Stanley Graf to vote on another figure if the \$72,500.00 is lost. 55 votes cast, yes 42, no 13. Figure of \$72,500.00 is accepted.

Art. 7: Motion by Amah Howard to pass over, seconded and affirmative vote.

Art. 8: Eila Hautaniemi offered a resolution to accept Art. 8 as written, seconded by Mary Traegde. Affirmative vote.

Art. 9: Motion by Amah Howard to raise \$500.00 to paint exterior of Grantham School. Seconded by Eleanor Reney. Affirmative vote.

Art. 11: Motion to adjourn made by Amah Howard, seconded and affirmative vote.

# **REPORT OF THE**

#### SUPERINTENDENT OF SCHOOLS

To: The School Board and citizens of the Grantham School District, we respectfully submit our annual report.

#### FOREWORD

Career education has become a major priority with both National and State educational leaders. It is my firm belief that it should be a major local priority.

What is career education? Career education places primary emphasis upon learning about the individual's role in the world of work and upon his preparation for a lifetime career. In other words, career education is really education preparing today's youth for their adult life. At the elementary school level (K-6), community resources are utilized to increase each child's awareness of the occupations in his community. Some career education activities include visiting people who work in the local community and having community members come into the school to talk with students about their work. The child begins to realize that each working member of the community has a life style that is rewarding to the individual as well as productive to society.

Career education also emphasizes the awareness of each child of his strengths and weaknesses. Teachers must be aware of the strengths and weaknesses of each individual and plan activities which will overcome weaknesses as well as help the individual recognize his strengths. The school must provide a broad range of activities to make the skill subjects mean something to each child.

During the middle school years, each student begins to set realistic goals for himself based upon his knowledge of his strengths and weaknesses. During these years the student begins to make a commitment to the kind of educational program he wants in high school.

Having determined his capabilities and having established goals for himself, the student approaches high school with definite learning expectations. During the high school years, the student makes choices based upon his interests and his abilities. College, vocational / technical schools or entry into the world of work are options among which he may choose based upon his own goals and abilities.

Career education is the development of an attitude about life—an attitude that promotes the idea that doing a job to the best of one's ability is a noble goal. Career education is taking pride in one's self, realizing that excellence is a goal worth attaining, and realizing that there are rewards for doing the best job possible.

We hope to develop attitudes which will encourage the individual to take pride in himself and his work. We feel that by increasing the student's awareness of a wide variety of occupations and of the basic dignity of all work (whatever it may be), that the student will be able to overcome the serious dilemma which faces many young people when they find themselves out of high school (and sometimes out of college) without really knowing what they want to do. If parents, the community, and the school work together in developing good attitudes toward careers, this dilemma can be prevented. This is a major goal of career education.

## INSTRUCTION PROGRAM

With the resignation in April 1972 of Mr. and Mrs. Richard Welles, the Grantham School had the good fortune of securing the services of Mrs. Underhill and Miss Edwards to carry on the instructional program. In addition, Mr. Anderson was employed as an aide to the teaching staff. These three people have developed a good school program for the school children of Grantham. They need your support and cooperation as they continue to provide improved programs for your children.

Upon the recommendation of the Title I Advisory Committee, the reading program was continued for a fourth year. This program is funded under Title I of the Elementary and Secondary Education Act. The program is under the direction of Mrs. Diane Rochford, who is providing help to children who are having difficulty with reading.

# COMMUNITY PLANNING

We were pleased to hear that a comprehensive planning committee has been formed in the town which will include School District interests. The need for planning is critical since the town will continue to grow and comprehensive community services will have to be provided. It is our opinion that this committee has an extremely important function to perform and should commence as soon as possible.

#### STATE AID

Next year we are anticipating approximately the same amount in sweepstakes and AREA aid as in this year's budget. Sweepstakes money is used as income to help reduce the local tax assessment. AREA aid is used to reduce the tuition payment for children attending the Lebanon AREA Schools, Sweepstakes and AREA aid are the only state monies coming to the District next year.

#### BUDGET

The proposed budget for the coming school year 1973-74 is \$82,345.02 compared with \$79,055.00 for the present school year. In addition, a sum of \$6,126.12 was raised to cover the deficit in the In-State-Tuition Account for the 1971-72 school year. This amount was raised under the 1972-73 budget increasing the total appropriation to \$85,131.72.

# WARRANT

Two special articles are included in this year's warrant which require your careful consideration. One asks for an appropriation to replace sills under a portion of the school building and the other asks for an appropriation for improving the two bathrooms at the school.

#### CONCLUSION

Appreciation is extended to all who have given their time, talent and energy to promote a better school program for the children of Grantham.

We especially thank the School Board and the professional staff for devoting many hours toward improving the instructional program in the Grantham Village School.

# **REPORT OF SCHOOL NURSE**

New Hampshire State Law now requires all children entering school for the first time to have a complete physical and immunization for Measles, Rubella (German Measles), Diptheria and Tetanus, Polio Vaccine, and a TB test within one year prior to school entrance. The law was legislated to provide better health protection for all school children.

The Matching Fund Dental Program was not adequate to take care of all the children who requested dental care this year. Although other monies were allocated to help the situation, it was impossible to find a dentist who had the time to complete this work. Dr. Chris Armen has indicated that he is willing to continue doing dental work for the Grantham School next year, although he has found it necessary to drop other schools from his schedule. I am hopeful we will be able to continue the dental program in Grantham.

Dr. Thomas Brown of Lebanon will give school physicals in January, 1973. Parents are invited to attend the examinations and should feel free to discuss the results of his findings.

I wish to thank the teachers, parents, and students for their fine cooperation. Special appreciation is extended to the volunteer drivers who made the dental program pessible.
