To the Inhabitants of the Town of Lee, in the County of Strafford, in said State, qualified to vote in Town Affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at Town house in said Lee, on Tucsday, the twelfth day of March, next, at ten o'clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects:

1. To choose all necessary Town Officers for the year ensuing.

2. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray town charges for the ensuing year, and make appropriation for same.

3. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for the maintenance of highways.

4. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for the maintenance of State Aid Highways.

5. To see if the Town will raise one thousand dollars (\$1,000) towards the construction of the Trunk Line Road and authorize the Selectmen to borrow from the State (agreeably to House Bill No. 310) the balance necessary to complete this Trunk Line.

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6. To see if the Town will vote to raise a sum of money necessary to secure State Aid on the State Road, so called, as provided in Joint Resolution No. 16.
