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

#### WARRANT FOR TOWN MEETING

#### TOWN OF MADBURY, N. H.

March 12, 1963

To the Inhabitants of the Town of Madbury, County of Strafford, and the State of New Hampshire, qualified to vote in Town Affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town Hall in said Madbury on Tuesday, the 12th day of March, A. D., 1963, at 8:00 o'clock in the evening to act upon the following articles.

ARTICLE 1. To choose the following Town Officers:

A town clerk for the ensuing year.

A selectman for the ensuing three years.

A treasurer for the ensuing year.

A collector of taxes for the ensuing year.

Two auditors for the ensuing year.

A trustee of trust funds for the ensuing three years.

ARTICLE 2. To choose all other town officers.

- ARTICLE 3. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the selectmen to borrow money in anticipation of taxes.
- ARTICLE 4. To see if the Town will vote to raise \$319.12 for Class V highways to match the sum of \$2,127.44 to be contributed by the State.
- ARTICLE 5. To see what action the Town will take to raise and appropriate one thousand dollars (\$1,000)

to purchase a push frame and blade to be used for snow removal.

- ARTICLF, 6. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$100.00 for the Seacoast Regional Development Association.
- ARTICLE 7. To see if the Town will adopt the zoning ordinances recommended by the planning board.
- ARTICLE 8. To see if the Town will vote to adopt the recommended Building Regulations as authorized under Sections 2-5 inclusive Chapter 156, N. H. Revised Statutes Annotated, 1955.
- ARTICLE 9. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to appoint an Inspector of Buildings who shall hold office for a term of one year, and by vote fix and regulate his compensation as authorized by Section 1, Chapter 156, N. H. Revised Statutes Annotated 1955.
- ARTICLE 10. To see what action the Town will take on the proposed budget for the current year.
- ARTICLE 11. To see if the Town will vote to authorize and empower the Planning Board to approve or disapprove, in its discretion, plots showing new streets or the widening thereof, or parks, and upon adoption of this article it shall be the duty of the Town Clerk to file with the Registry of Deeds of the County of Strafford, a certificate or note showing that the said Planning Board has been so authorized, giving the date of authorization, as provided in Section 19-29 inclusive, Chapter 36 of the N. H. Revised Statutes Annotated, 1955.
- ARTICLE 12. To hear the reports of agents, auditors, committees or officers chosen, and pass any vote relating thereto.

ARTICLE 13. To transact any other business that may legally come before the meeting.

#### RECORD OF TOWN MEETING

March 13, 1962

ARTICLE 1. Balloting for town officers:

- For Town Clerk for the ensuing year, it was voted that the Moderator should cast one ballot for Edna P. Twombly. This being done, Edna P. Twombly was declared elected and the oath of office was administered by Kenneth S. Morrow, Moderator.
- For Treasurer for the ensuing year, voted that the the Clerk should cast one ballot for Joseph Cole. This being done, Joseph Cole was declared elected for the ensuing three years.
- For Treasurer for the ensuing year, voted that the Clerk should cast one ballot for John Printy, and this being done, John Printy was declared elected Treasurer for the ensuing year.
- For Collector of Taxes for the ensuing year, voted that the Clerk should cast one ballot for Dorothy S. Dugan, and this being done, Dorothy S. Dugan was declared elected Collector of Taxes for the ensuing year.
- For Auditors for the ensuing year, voted that the Clerk should cast one ballot for John Kelley and Eleanor Evans, and this being done, the two named were declared elected for the ensuing year.
- For Trustee of Trust Funds for the ensuing three years, voted that the Clerk should cast one ballot for E. A. Adams, and this being done E. A. Adams was declared elected for the ensuing three years.

- ARTICLE 2. Voted that the Selectmen be instructed to appoint all other necessary town officers.
- ARTICLE 3. Voted that the Selectmen be authorized to borrow a sum or sums not exceeding in the aggregate \$15,000 in anticipation of collection of taxes for the ensuing year, and to issue in the name of and on the credit of the town negotiable notes therefor, said notes to be paid in the current municipal year from taxes collected during the current municipal year.
- ARTICLE 4. Voted to raise and appropriate \$319.71 for Class V highways to match the sum of \$2,131.40 to be contributed by the State.
- ARTICLE 5. Voted to appropriate a sum not exceeding \$2,451.11 for the purpose of making improvements to the Class V roads within the Town; such sums to be raised through the issuance of bonds or notes under and in compliance with the provisions of Chapter 83, Laws of 1951 as amended by Chapter 31, Laws of 1955, and to authorize the Selectmen to determine the date and place of payment of such bonds or notes and to determine the rate of interest thereon, and to take such other steps as may be necessary to negotiate such bonds or notes as shall be to the best interests of the Town of Madbury.
- ARTICLE 6. Voted to raise and appropriate the sum of \$1,000 for construction of the Huckins Road.
- ARTICLE 7. Table Article to raise and appropriate the sum of \$70 for the Seacoast Regional Development Association.
- ARTICLE 8. Voted that the Town accept the gift of land known as DeMerritt Park, together with the stipulations contained in the deed given to the Town of Madbury, August 17, 1934, by the late Jennie M. DeMerritt.

- ARTICLE 9. Voted to approve a total budget of \$16,849.71 for the current year, exclusive of school appropriations.
- ARTICLE 10. To see what action the Town will take in changing any article of the Building Code. No changes made.
- ARTICLE 11. The report of Fire Chief, James Colprit was presented.
- ARTICLE 12. To transact any other business that may legally come before the meeting.

Voted that the Selectmen shall collaborate with the Planning Board to prepare a plan for the disposal of garbage and trash, present the plan at the Annual Meeting in 1963 and incorporate in the warrant for the 1963 meeting an article to provide the funds necessary to initiate the program and cover its operation for the ensuing year.

Then appeared the above-named officers elected under Article 1, and took the oath of office as required by law, before me, Edna P. Twombly, Town Clerk.

### FIRE DEPARTMENT REPORT

To the Citizens of Madbury:

The year 1962 was a year of average activity for the Madbury Vounteer Fire Department.

There was a total of twelve alarms, five of which were out of town. The most serious fire was at Mr. Bolstridge's house at the Demeritt Corner, occupied by the Pierce family. The fire was caused by lightning. The efforts of Mr. Pierce, and the response of the department kept the damage at a minimum.

The equipment is in good condition. The portable pump, radios, and a rear axle on the old truck were unexpected repairs.

The Annual addition of  $1\frac{1}{2}$ " hose is recommended this year.

The roof of the fire station was replaced last fall by members of the department. Shingles and roofing materials were donated by an interested citizen. The town supplied the material to reboard the roof.

The improvement of the station is at a standstill because of the lack of volunteers to help with the work.

For four months there were not enough members present to hold business meetings. The election of officers had to be postponed until January to obtain a quorum. This lack of interest is endangering the efficiency of the fire department. There are many men who could give some time to maintain this vital service to the town of Madbury. Even if you cannot be an active fire fighter, there is work you can do to relieve the ones who can fight fires. There is need of your presence and interest to raise the morale of the faithful few who have carried the burden for so long. For the year 1963 I ask your renewed interest and support that we may give better service, and improve our good fire record.

Your cooperation in obtaining permits for fires and incinerators is appreciated.
