TOWN WARRANT

To the inhabitants of the town of Marlow in the county of Cheshire in said State, qualified to vote in town affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at Jones Hall in said Marlow on Tuesday, the 10th day of March, next, at ten of the clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects:

- 1. To choose all necessary Town Officers for the year ensuing.
- 2. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray town charges for the ensuing year and to make appropriations for the same.
- 3. To raise or appropriate such sums of money as may be necessary for the maintenance of the poor.
- 4. To see if the town will apply for Class Five Money known as T.R.A. and raise the sum of \$338.29 required by the state.
- 5. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary for the repairs of highways and bridges.
- 6. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary for the town library.
- 7. To raise and appropriate such sums of money as may be necessary for the observance of Memorial Day.
- 8. To see if the Town will authorize the selectmen to borrow money by temporary loans in anticipation of taxes.
- 9. To authorize the tax collector to give two per cent cash discount on all property and personal taxes for payments made within 30 days after the date of tax bill, and empower the collector to appoint a deputy collector.

- 10. To see if the town will vote to raise such sums of money as may be necessary to improve town cemeteries.
- 11. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$33.00 for the Monadnock Region Association.
- 12. To see if the Town will authorize the selectmen to sell or administer all real estate acquired by the Town through Tax Collector Deeds.
- 13. To see if the Town will vote for the white pine blister rust control, and raise or appropriate the sum of \$200.00 for same.
- 14. To see what action the Town will take to raise and appropriate \$100.00 for the Elliot Community Hospital.
- 15. To see what action the Town will take in regard to those items in the Town budget not covered in the preceeding articles.
 - 16. To see if the town will vote to accept Trust Funds.
- 17. To see if the town will vote to authorize a committee of three, to be selected by the chair to prepare a zoning plan for the Town and regulations therefor, and to raise and appropriate not more than the sum of \$200.00 for expenses thereof.
- 18. To see if the town will vote to accept the provisions of Chapter 51, Revised Laws of 1942 as amended relative to zoning the Town of Marlow.
- 19. To see if the Town will elect a Zoning Board of Adjustment in accordance with paragraph 57, Revised Laws of 1942.
- 20. To see if the Town will vote to accept the plan and regulations recommended by the committee.
- 21. To hear the reports of officers, agents and committees heretofore chosen, and to pass any vote relating thereto, and to transact any other business that may legally come before said meeting.

To the inhabitants of the school district of the town of Marlow qualified to vote in district affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet in Jones Hall, in said district on the 10th day of March, 1952, at 2:00 o'clock in the afternoon to act upon the following subjects:

- 1. To choose a moderator for the coming year.
- 2. To choose a clerk for the ensuing year.
- 3. To choose a member of the school board for the ensuing three years.
 - 4. To choose a treasurer for the ensuing year.

- 5. To determine and appoint the salaries of the school board and truant officer, and fix compensations of any other officers or agents of the district.
- 6. To hear the reports of agents, auditors, committees, or other officers chosen, and pass any vote relating thereto.
- 7. To choose agents, auditors, committees, or other officers in relation to any subject embraced in this warrant.
- 8. To see what sum of money the district will raise and appropriate for the support of schools, for the salaries of school district officials and agents, and for the payment of statutory obligations of the district, and to authorize the application against said appropriation of such sums as are estimated to be received from the state equalization fund together with other income; the school board to certify to the selectmen the balance between the estimated revenue and the appropriation, which balance is to be raised by taxes by the town.
- 9. To see if the district will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$500.00 as a deficiency appropriation to cover additional high school tuition expenses.
- 10. To see what sum of money the district will vote to raise and appropriate to add to the amount already raised to build a porch at the entrance of the Marlow School or consider other action relating thereto.
- 11. To transact any other business that may legally come before this meeting.

To the School Board and Citizens of Marlow:

I herewith submit my annual report as superintendent of your school.

This year the handwriting program has been changed. Manuscript writing is taught in grades one and two, and in one semester of grade three. Cursive handwriting is introduced in the second semester of grade three.

The testing program was formerly centered at the sixth-grade level. Now it is planned to give achievement tests at each grade level and to give ability tests at three different points in the pupil's progress through the grades. The results of the testing program should be of considerable assistance in determining how well we are succeeding in our educational program.

The P. T. A. deserves a hearty "Thank you" for providing the moving picture projector for use in the school.

Since operational costs continue to rise, educational expenses cannot escape this current trend, and will therefore reflect this trend.
