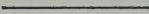

THE STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

To the Inhabitants of the Town of New Durham in the County of Strafford, in said State qualified to vote in Town Affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town Hall in said New Durham on Tuesday, the 10th day of March, next at twelve of the clock, to act upon the following subjects:

Article 1. To choose all necessary town officers for the year ensuing.

Article 2. To choose a Delegate to the Constitutional Convention.

Article 3. To vote on the question, "*Shall sweepstake tickets be sold in this city or town?*"

And you are hereby further notified to meet at said Town Hall in said New Durham at seven o'clock in the afternoon to act upon the following subjects:

Article 4. To raise and appropriate such sums of money as are necessary to defray the expenses of town government for the ensuing year in accordance with the recommendations of the budget committee.

Article 5. To see if the town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to borrow such sums of money as may be necessary to pay current expenses in anticipation of taxes.

Article 6. To see if the town will vote to discontinue winter plowing in the usual way on the following roads: Valley Road and Cross Road.

Article 7. To see if the town will vote to install Mercury Vapor Light at Route 11 and Ridge Road and Route 11 and Carrie York as approved by the budget committee.

Article 8. To see if the town will vote to authorize the Fire Commissioners to sell old Dodge truck.

Article 9. To hear report of Committees appointed in 1963.

Article 10. To see if the town will vote to allow the Selectmen to acquire land for new dump.

Article 11. To see if the town will vote to take \$2,000.00 from Shirley Fund to acquire and prepare new dump. This will reduce appropriation from 1964 taxes.

Article 12. To see if the town will vote to give the Highway personnel 1 week vacation with pay for each 5 years of continuous service.

Article 13. To see if the town will vote to accept the School House by Deed from the School Board and raise and appropriate \$1.00 to pay for same.

Article 14. To see what action the town will take in regard to disposal of School House.

Article 15. To transact any other business that may legally come before the meeting.

CIVIL DEFENSE REPORT

In June of this year, after the resignation of C. Vaughn Overman as Civil Defense Director, George E. Bickford was appointed to fill the vacancy.

Many of our volunteers assisted in different activities at the Street Fair such as traffic duty, first aid, communications, etc.

The County radio net was activated this fall and this Town checks into headquarters at Dover each Tuesday evening.

Four people have completed the Civil Defense Radiological Course and are qualified as monitors. Equipment will arrive soon and be installed in two stations for the purpose of checking the amount of radioactive fall-out in the area, if necessary. More persons could be used in this particular field and it is an interesting Course for anyone to take. If twenty persons were interested it could be held in town. Otherwise, anyone wishing to take it could contact the Director for information on joining in with another town for the Course.

A room in the town hall has been made available and renovated where many of our emergency supplies may be stored.

Thanks to any and all who have helped this year. Anyone who is interested in helping in the future, please contact your Director or Deputy Director.

This past year has been rather difficult for the Library. In March the Librarian, Rev. C. The Bookmobile from the N. H. State Library called on May 7, July 16, October 9, 1963 and January 6, 1964, leaving approximately 200 books each time for the elementary school and Library. The Bookmobile staff has been most cooperative. In addition, we have purchased books to add to our permanent collection.

Our only regret is that the facilities are not used more by the townspeople. There is much excellent fiction, besides the classics, non-fiction, reference works and periodicals available and the room is open from two to four o'clock on Saturdays, other times by request.

REPORT OF THE FOREST FIRE WARDEN AND YOUR DISTRICT CHIEF

During the past year New Hampshire faced the greatest forest fire threat to its woodlands in more than sixty years. The continued drought brought home to our citizens, as never before, the potential threat of destructive fires to their beautiful and valuable forests, homes and livelihood. In true American tradition of meeting a common threat by volunteer effort, this fire danger was minimized by active prevention, patrol and a relinquishing of personal rights for the common good. It was the greatest demonstration of public cooperation ever experienced by those responsible for local and state fire control. The ready forces of volunteer fire services kept the losses low. For their effort and public response the general fire service expresses its heartfelt thanks for a job well done.

Prevention, however, is not just an activity for the bad fire years. It must be practiced until it becomes a part of our public conscience — a habit. Just plain carelessness with fire causes too many of our fires.

The following practices and suggestions will help:

1. Always have a permit for outdoor burning and burn within the terms of the permit and in a safe place. Burn late in the afternoon when the wind is down or on rainy or damp days. Check your fire and if winds develop extinguish it promptly.
2. Carry your rubbish to the public dump — it's safer. A neglected backyard incinerator causes many fires.
3. Never discard a lighted cigarette or match. Make this a year round habit regardless of the safety of your surroundings.
4. Children caused fires are now a major concern. Keep matches away from them and teach them to respect fire and not make it a subject of play.

Let's all join with "Smokey the Bear" and "Keep New Hampshire Green" and growing in 1964.
