## TOWN WARRANT

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### THE STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

To the inhabitants of the Town of Ossipee qualified to vote in Town affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the hall of the Ossipee Group Y. M. C. A. Inc., in said Town, on the second Tuesday of March, next, at ten o'clock in the forenoon to act on the following articles:

ARTICLE 1. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to hire money in anticipation of taxes.

ARTICLE 2. To see if the town will vote to petition the State Tax Commission to have an audit made by the division of Municipal Accounting, and to make an appropriation to cover the expense of such an audit.

ARTICLE 3. To see if the Town will vote to pay the chairman of the board of Selectmen a salary of \$275.00 per year.

ARTICLE 4. To see if the Town will vote to pay the Selectmen five dollars per day for time spent in making appraisal of timber lands as required by statute, this sum to be in addition to their regular salary and only for the year 1944.

ARTICLE 5. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for the ensuing year the following sums for the following purposes:

1. For Town Officers' Salaries	\$1500.00
2. For Town Officers' expenses	700.00
3. For Election and Registration expenses	550.00
4. For Municipal Court	270.00

5. For Town Hall	50.00
6. For Police Department	50.00
7. For Fires	600.00
8. For Health Nurse	1300.00
9. For Huggins Hospital	400.00
10. For Vital Statistics	25.00
11. For Summer Highways	3900.00
12. For Health Department	50.00

ARTICLE 6. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$50.00 to provide for additional fire protection due to the war emergency.

ARTICLE 7. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$50.00 to provide watchmen and additional police protection due to the war emergency.

ARTICLE 8. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$50.00 for the use of the town health officer and the board of health due to the war emergency.



ARTICLE 9. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$136.00 to the Lakes Region Association of New Hampshire to assist in planning and development of the town and for the issuance and distribution of printed matter and news paper and magazine advertising calling attention to the resources and natural advantages of the town, in cooperation with other towns in the Lakes Region.

ARTICLE 10. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$200.00 for the eradication of White Pine Blister Rust.

ARTICLE 11. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$200.00 to be expended on the road back of the cottages on the Ham shore, so called, at Ossipee Lake, provided that said sum is not to be expended unless a legal highway is laid out in back of said cottages.

ARTICLE 12. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$100.00 to be expended on the road over Pine Hill, so called.

ARTICLE 13. To see if the Town will vote to erect an Honor Roll to carry the names of members of the armed forces from the Town of Ossipee, and to appropriate money for the same.

ARTICLE 14. To choose a Selectman for three years, Town Clerk, Treasurer, Highway Agents, Tax Collector, Auditors, Library Trustee, Cemetery Trustee, and all other officers and agents required by law for the ensuing year. The Polls to remain open until six o'clock in the afternoon.

ARTICLE 15. To see if the Town will vote to alter the hours during which the polls shall remain open.

ARTICLE 16. To transact any other business that may legally come before said meeting.

## REPORT OF SUPERINTENDENT OF SCHOOLS

To the School Board of Ossipee:

This report is submitted to you after only two weeks in your Union. I am particularly pleased to begin work here as it brings me back to a part of New Hampshire with which I am somewhat familiar. I anticipate a great deal of pleasure from being your Superintendent of Schools.

School supervision in Union 36 has been upset the last few months because of the changes in superintendents. Much of the responsibility which is normally the administrator's has had to be assumed by the school board members. They and the teachers are to be commended for the fine conditions that have been maintained in the schools.

Ossipee has been fortunate in having the following teachers this year: Mr. Phil Bennett, Headmaster of High School, Miss Kathleen Chandler and Miss Davina Croall assisting; Mrs. Preston Smart, grade 1; Miss Esther Todd, Intermediate; Miss Mary Hubbard, grades 7-8; Mrs. Linnie Giles, grades 2-3; Mrs. Ethel Whiting, West Ossipee; Mrs. Lillian Godfrey, Moultonville; Mrs. Leda Knapp, Ossipee Corner; and Mrs. Alice Loud, Water Village. Extreme scarcity of teachers makes us wonder how all positions will be filled for the school year 1944-1945. This year, former teachers felt a sense of patriotic duty to return to the profession when local conditions became critical. I assume that it will be from this group that many districts will find faithful teachers.

I would recommend that work be done on the roof and interior of the Ossipee Corner school. It is also essential that new toilets be installed for the West Ossipee School. Citizens of Ossipee undoubtedly recognize the fact that the costs of maintaining schools are rising along with the increased cost of everything

else. Taxes, living conditions, and the great scarcity of teachers have necessitated increased salaries; the cost of materials and labor makes all kinds of repairs higher, and other expenses have risen proportionally.

It seems extremely important during these times of unsettled conditions that the best education possible in reading, writing, arithmetic and citizenship be maintained. This necessitates an unusual amount of effort, thought and patience on the part of citizens, teachers and pupils. It is only through the cooperation of all concerned that the generation now growing up can be given an adequate education.
