TOWN WARRANT

THE STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

(SEAL) To the inhabitants of the Town of Sunapee, in the County of Sullivan, in said State, qualified to vote in Town Affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at I. O. O. F. Hall, in said Sunapee on Tuesday, the 12th day of March, next, at ten of the clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects:

Article 1. To elect a Town Clerk for the year ensuing.

Article 2. To hear the reports of the Selectmen, Treasurer, Auditors, Agents and Committees or other officers heretofore chosen and pass any vote relating thereto.

Article 3. To elect one Selectman for three years and all other necessary Town Officers for the year ensuing and pass any vote relating thereto.

Article 4. To see what sum of money the Town will raise to pay the outstanding debts and interest on its notes and bonds and pass any vote relating thereto.

Article 5. To see what sum of money the Town will raise for Town Officers' Salaries for the year ensuing and pass any vote relating thereto.

Article 6. To see what sums of money the Town will appropriate for Town Officers' Expenses, Election and Registration, Repairs of Town Buildings, Police and Health Departments, Bathing Beach and Town Dump and pass any vote relating thereto.

Article 7. To see what sum of money the Town will raise to repair Highways and Bridges for the year ensuing and pass any vote relating thereto.

Article 8. To see what sum of money the Town will raise or appropriate for the general expenses of the highway department, including Road Oil, and pass any vote relating thereto.

Article 9. To see if the Town will vote to raise Two Thousand Five Hundred Dollars, (\$2,500.00) provided the State will give Five Thousand Dollars, (\$5,000.00) for Special Road Construction, to be expended on the Edgemont Road and pass any vote relating thereto.

Article 10. To see if the Town will accept State Aid for construction of the Class 2 Road, known as the Sunapee-Grantham Road, raise and appropriate or set aside for said purpose the sum of \$1,208.50, or will accept State Aid for construction of Class 5 Roads and raise and appropriate or set aside for said purpose the sum of \$509.97 and pass any vote relating thereto.

Article 11. To see what sum of money the Town will raise for Snow Removal and Sanding and pass any vote relating thereto.

Article 12. To see what sum of money the Town will raise for the construction of a proposed road leading to the homes of William Rollins, Eugene H. Rollins and Victor Gregory and pass any vote relating thereto.

Article 13. To see what sum of money the Town will raise or appropriate for the support of its Town Poor or unemployment relief and pass any vote relating thereto.

Article 14. To see what sum of money the Town will raise for Electric Lights and pass any vote relating thereto.

Article 15. To see what sum of money the Town will raise to maintain its Fire Department and pass any vote relating thereto.

Article 16. To see what sum of money the Town will raise to maintain its Public Library and pass any vote relating thereto.

Article 17. To see what sum of money the Town will raise for the support of the District Nurse Association and pass any vote relating thereto.

Article 18. To see what sum of money the Town will raise for the care of its Cemeteries and pass any vote relating thereto.

Article 19. To see what sum of money the Town will raise to continue assistance to our Doctor and pass any vote relating thereto.

Article 20. To see what sum of money the Town will raise or appropriate for the maintenance of the Water Department, including debt and interest, and pass any vote relating thereto.

Article 21. To see if the Town will allow a discount on taxes paid on or before June 15th of 2% and on or before September 1st of 1% and pass any vote relating thereto.

Article 22. To see if the Town will instruct its Selectmen to hire money in anticipation of Taxes and pass any vote relating thereto.

Article 23. To see if the Town will vote to purchase what is known as the Woodsum Steamboat Company's wharf and land at Georges Mills, now owned by the Woodsum Steamboat Co., raise or appropriate money for the same and pass any vote relating thereto.

Article 24. To see what sum of money the Town will raise to assist the Fish and Game Club to advertise Lake Sunapee and pass any vote relating thereto.

Article 25. To see what sum of money the Town will raise to maintain a Skating Rink, for recreational purposes, on Sunapee Harbor, (so-called), and pass any vote relating thereto.

Article 26. To see if the Town will vote to instruct the Selectmen to purchase compensation and liability insurance for the Fire, Water and Highway Departments and raise or appropriate money for the same and pass any vote relating thereto.

Article 27. To see if the Town will vote to adopt the provisions of the Municipal Budget Act and pass any vote relating thereto.

Article 28. To transact any other business that may legally come before said meeting.

ENGINEERS' REPORT OF FIRE DEPARTMENT

We hereby submit our annual report for the year ending Jan. 31, 1935:

The apparatus and other property of the department are in as good condition as last year and, as far as we know, ready for service. Owing to the fact that the Town appropriated more money for the year, the department was able to make some improvements and get things that were much needed. One was the procuring of rubber coats, thus protecting the men from getting wet and perhaps from spoiling a good suit of clothes. The changing of the chemical tanks to a booster pump and tank on Hose No. 2 was a change for the better, we think, doing away with acid, which was very bad if it came in contact with anything. The other improvement was laying a new floor in the station. There were 500 feet of 2½ in. and 500 feet of 1½ in. hose bought for the year. We think it a good plan to get some new hose each year, as the old hose is sure to go bad at a fire or testing.

We have been fortunate during the year as to the number of fires, but unfortunate in the financial part. There were six bell alarms and five stills. Of the bell alarms, there were three that were total losses, totaling \$15,500.00 of taxable property, total value on buildings involved, \$21,500.00, insurance paid, \$24,845.00.

SUPERINTENDENT'S REPORT

To the Sunapee School Board:

I herewith submit the annual report of the superintendent of schools.

Attendance

The attendance last year was very satisfactory. Moreover, the pupils arrived on time for the most part, the cases of tardiness being very few.

School Work

The school appears to the visitor like a well-regulated workshop. The attitude of both teachers and pupils makes possible a high type of work. The standard of the school is shown, for example, by the tests which are given each year to the seniors in high school. These tests include the fundamental subjects,—English, grammar, spelling, reading, arithmetic and geography, as well as general ability. Last year out of 102 schools taking the test only 12 showed greater general ability than our seniors; only 13 showed greater achievement in silent reading ability; only 13 showed greater achievement in English forms. It is noteworthy that the score in English forms last year was 30 points higher than that of 1933 and 51 points higher than in 1932. It is clearly evident that our school is accomplishing its purpose. In fact, this is the first year for several years that our seniors were above the standards, as well as the state average, in all the tests.

Our graduates in higher institutions are all doing successful work—in some cases outstanding work.

All but one of last year's graduates from the eighth grade entered high school. It is expected that all of the present eighth grade will go on to high school. That shows excellent holding power for the school.

Miss Aldrich, who teaches hygiene in grades 6, 7 and 8, is devoting one or two periods each week to physical exercises (setting-up exercises, basketball, marching, folk-dancing) in the gymnasium. This is for both boys and girls. It is an excellent plan to supplement textbook study of health with some practical physical exercise. Miss Fleming and Miss Ashley are

continuing the folk-dancing classes, which include about a dozen pre-school children.

There has been no change in the corps of teachers between last year and this, except in the position of supervisor of music. Miss Vanda Sanguinetti resigned and her place has been taken by Miss Alice Todd of New London, a graduate of Oberlin College.

Finances

The School Board has managed the finances of the school district with great care and economy. At the same time, however, no really essential supplies, books, or equipment have been denied the pupils.

The estimated expenditures for next year are almost exactly the same as the budget for the present year, as voted last March.

No major repairs are anticipated except re-building the walk from the school building to the information booth.

On January 1, 1935, the sixth payment of \$3,500 on the bonded was made, leaving a balance due of \$49,000.

I greatly appreciate the friendly spirit of cooperation which I have experienced in my work with the School Board and teachers.

THE STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

To the inhabitants of the School District of Sunapee qualified to vote in district affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the I. O. O. F. Hall in said District on Tuesday, the twelfth day of March, 1935, at one-thirty o'clock in the afternoon to act upon the following subjects:

Article 1. To choose a Moderator for the ensuing year.

Article 2. To choose a Clerk for the ensuing year.

Article 3. To choose a member of the School Board for the ensuing three years.

Article 4. To choose a Treasurer for the ensuing year.

Article 5. To choose one or more Auditors and such other Officers and Agents as the voters may judge necessary.

Article 6. To hear and act upon the reports of the School Board, Treasurer, Auditors and Committees heretofore chosen.

Article 7. To see if the District will vote to make any alterations in the amount of money required to be assessed for the ensuing year for the support of public schools and the payment of the statutory obligations of the district as determined by the school board in its annual report, namely \$20,672.63. The school board recommends that \$1,500.00 of the June 30, 1935 surplus be used in reducing the above amount, leaving a total of \$19,172.63 to be assessed.

Article 8. To see if the district will vote to raise and appropriate \$3,500.00 to be paid on outstanding bonds and \$2,008.12 to pay interest on outstanding bonds.

Article 9. To see what action the district will take in regard to rebuilding the walk from the school building to the old school grounds and grading across the flat to the highway, and to see what sum of money the district will raise for this purpose.

Article 10. To transact any other business that may legally come before said meeting.
