

THE STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

To the inhabitants of the Town of Thornton in the County of Grafton in said State, qualified to vote in Town Affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at Town House in said Thornton on Tuesday, the 9th day of March, next, at nine of the clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects:

- 1. To choose all necessary Town Officers for the year ensuing.
- 2. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray town charges for the ensuing year and make appropriation of the same.
- 3. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise for highways and bridges for the ensuing year, and make appropriation for same.
- 4. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise for State Aid Construction, and make appropriation for same.
- 5. To see if the town will approve the acquisition by the United States Government of approximately 325 acres of land situated in the town, forming additional purchase units of the White Mountain National Forest, and described as follows

Starting at a point in the Thornton-Campton town line where Mad River crosses said town line and which is also a point in the proclaimed Forest boundary.

- 6. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise for libraries, above what the law requires.
- 7. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise for Memorial Day.
- 8. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise to fight the White Pine Blister Rust, and make appropriation for same.

- 9. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise for care of poor.
- 10. To see if the town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to administer and dispose of any real estate acquired by town through tax collector's deeds.
- 11. To see if the town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to hire money in anticipation of taxes.
- 12. To see what percent discount the town will vote to allow on taxes paid on certain dates.
- 13. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise for improvement of cemeteries.
- 14. To choose Agents, and Committees in relation to any articles in the Warrant, and hear reports of any heretofore chosen.
- 15. To see if the town will vote to change the flooring on West Thornton bridge and make appropriation for same.
- 16. To transact any other business that may legally come before this meeting.



- || \$ 5.00 per \$1,000.00 of equalized valuation must be raised for elementary schools to qualify for state aid. The net assessment must contain this amount in addition to funds raised for high school maintenance and other statutory requirements.

REPORT OF SUPERINTENDENT OF SCHOOLS

Ladies and Gentlemen of the School Board and Citizens of the Thornton School District:

I hereby submit my third annual report as Superintendent of schools. The statistical report for the year 1935-1936 follows this report. The supervisory comment covers the period from my last report to the present.

The matter of damages by the highway at the West Thornton school was adjusted by the committee appointed by the district meeting and a commission appointed by the state. The able committee devoted considerable time and thought to the adjustment and the final settlement of \$601.25 would seem to be about all the district could reasonably expect.

Miss Jane Hounsell resigned her position at the Center school during the summer and Miss Barbara Pombrio was appointed teacher at that school. Otherwise, the teachers of the district are the same as last year.

The work of the schools is motivating well in my opinion. What achievement shall determine passing rank is not always easy to determine. If the passing rank is placed conveniently low so that all pupils receive flattering marks, soon many children are doing very little and tax payers properly complain that appropriations are being dissipated. On the other hand, if the passing grade is too high children become discouraged and motivation is slower. After all children come to school to learn and not to get marks. A child should be in that grade where he can successfully do ordinary work with a reasonable amount of effort. In the determining promotions it is not so much a question of whether a child has completed his grade, as to whether he can reasonably be expected to do successful work in the advanced grade. Parents while properly mindful of the temporary disappointment of nonpromotion should take the long range view of the school

life of the child and see that to promote an unprepared child might be a very unkind and unwise procedure.

The project method of teaching has become a fixture in the public school system of the country. This does not sacrifice the fundamentals and in fact when properly conducted strengthens them. Teachers are not all equally adapted to project teaching. Some teachers and very good teachers—use it sparingly, but, by far the greater number of progressive teachers use it more or less with marked success, and anyone seriously advocating its complete elimination would return to the "horse and buggy" era of education.

It is my earnest recommendation that the West Thornton and Center schools be painted this coming summer. Thousands of people are in the beautiful Pemigewasset Valley during the summer and are very likely to form favorable impressions of a town which keeps up its school properties, particularly when neighboring towns are doing it. There is a trend of responsible and dependable people settling in New Hampshire towns and "the valley" has everything to offer.


