STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

To the Inhabitants of the Town of Bristol in the County of Grafton in said State, qualified to vote in Town affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town House in said Bristol on Tuesday, the eleventh (11) day of March next, at nine of the clock in the forenoon to act upon the following subjects:

1. To choose one Selectman for three years, and choose all other necessary Town officers for the year ensuing, and to bring in your votes for the election of Delegates-at-Large, Alternate Delegates-at-Large; District Delegates, Alternate District Delegates to the National Conventions of the Democratic and Republican parties, to be held for the purpose of nominating party candidates for President and Vice-President of the United States.

2. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray town charges for the year ensuing, and make appropriation of the same.

3. To see what sum of money the Town will raise for the support of Highways and Bridges for the year ensuing, and make appropriation of the same.

4. To see if the Town will raise money for the maintenance of the State Aid and Trunk Line Roads for the year ensuing, and make appropriation of the same.

5. To see if the Town will vote to raise the sum of one hundred and fifty (\$150.00) dollars for the observance of Memorial day for the ensuing year, and make appropriation of the same.

6. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise for the Maintenance of Sidewalks for the year ensuing, and make appropriation of the same.

7. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise for the Maintenance and Constuction of Sewers for the year ensuing, and make appropriation of the same.

8. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to appoint instead of electing a Police Officer for the year ensuing.

9. Agreeably to vote of the Town at the Annual March meeting, March 8, 1921, to elect five (5) members for the Budget Committee for a term of three years.

10. To see if the Town will vote to raise money for the support of Band Concerts, and make appropriation of the same, and elect or appoint a committee with authority to make such expenditures.

11. To see if the Town will vote to accept the provisions of Chapter 155, Laws of 1921, relative to building or rebuilding any Bridge, on any Trunk Line, Cross State or any designated State Aid Highway in said Town of Bristol, if accepted and adopted, raise and appropriate, such sum of money as may be deemed necessary for any Bridge or Bridges the Town may designate.

12. To see what action the Town will take relative to building New Bridge on Lake street, located north of the Paper Mills of the Mason-Perkins Paper Co., and raise and appropriate money for the same.

13. To see if the Town will vote to apply for Federal Aid in construction of New Bridge referred to in Article 12.

14. To see if the Town will vote to raise, instead of setting aside from the regular Highway Money, the sum required by law, for purpose of permanent improvement on some designated piece of Town Highway, approved by Town Officials, and make appropriation of the same.

15. To see if the Town will vote to accept Trunk Line Aid for construction, and raise the sum of twenty-three hundred and sixty-one (\$2,361.00), and make appropriation of the same.

16. To see if the Town will vote to accept Federal Aid Re-construction (Sunapee Lake Road), and raise the sum of seven thousand (\$7,000.00), and make appropriation of the same.

17. To see if the Town will vote to raise the sum of four hundred (\$400.00) dollars for the control of White Pine Blister Rust, and make appropriation of the same.

18. To transact any other business that may legally come before said meeting.

MINOT SLEEPER LIBRARY—REPORT OF TRUSTEES

To the Inhabitants of the Town of Bristol:

The Trustees hereby submit a brief report of matters pertaining to the library for the past year. It has been well patronized, eleven hundred thirty-eight persons having availed themselves of the privilege of the reading and reference department, with nine thousand, four hundred fifteen books loaned from the circulating department.

About two hundred volumes in all have been added to both departments, about one-half being juveniles, the remainder mainly fiction and valuable works of history and travel. The earlier works of Dr. Fred Lewis Pattee are largely or wholly out of print. Anyone having a copy of any of these to spare will confer a favor by donating the same to the Library.

The following magazines may be found on the reading tables, viz: American, American Boy, American Forests and Forestry, Atlantic, Asia, Century, Christian Century, Current Opinion, Daughters of the American Revolution, Garden, Geographic, Granite Monthly, Harper's, Ladies' Home Journal, Literary Digest, Moody Monthly, Nature Magazine, Our Dumb Animals, Our World, Outlook, Pictorial Review, Popular Mechanics, Travel, World's Work, Youth's Companion, largely contributed from the Day-Jackman fund, a few being the gift of individuals. Contributions of valuable books will be gladly received. Out of date books, unless rare or otherwise valuable are not needed, as there is no room for them in the building.

A two-story annex to the present building is very much needed. In view of the very large expenditure which hereafter will be required of the town for the support and maintenance of schools, highways and bridges, the outlook for help in that direction is indeed gloomy.

The chief hope lies in the idea that some one of our present or past citizens or friends of Bristol will make a generous contribution during life and erect a sufficient annex or addition to the present building, which will be a pleasure to himself and of lasting value to the patrons of the library, or else that numbers of the above will make a bequest in their wills which may be used either for the erection of this addition or for purchase of books or generally for both of said purposes. At the recent annual meeting of the Trustees Mrs. Mary A. Dodge was reelected Librarian.

REPORT OF SUPERINTENDENT OF SCHOOLS

To the School Board of Bristol Town and Bristol Union
School Districts:

I submit herein my second report as superintendent of schools.

This report will cover the school year of 1922-23, and the first eighteen weeks of the current year, 1923-24.

TOWN DISTRICT

By starting the schools the last week of August we were able to get in a full year of thirty-six weeks. This is a feat to be proud of when one remembers the severe winter of last year and that the roads most of the time were nearly impassable. This, however, does not mean there were 180 actual school days.

The average half days the three schools were in session was 338 2-3. The average half days on which there was no school was 21 1-3. In a school year of 36 weeks with no time lost the number of half days is 360. Each school lost, due from one cause or another, about three days apiece. While it probably would not be advisable to adopt a year of 180 school days, I hope the number of days lost can be lessened. A School Calendar printed elsewhere in this report has been adopted with this end in view.

Repairs

The Dolloff school has been put into a good state of repair. The interior has been sheathed and a new black-board purchased; a shed capable of holding a year's supply of wood built. A good dry closet, properly ventilated, was also built. To complete this work the building should be painted. This particular building can then be kept in a good state of repair with only a small outlay yearly.

The toilet facilities at the Lake school are in a very bad state. Something will need to be done soon. The blackboards at both the Lake and Falls schools should be replaced by new ones. Artificial slate can be purchased at a small cost and is much better than the ones now in use.

UNION SCHOOL DISTRICT

The year, 1922-23, will probably be remembered as the last in the old building, a building that had served the community long but had reached the point of not serving it well.

The building took care of 234 pupils, and during the year it was found necessary to break up the fifth and sixth grades and have two teachers do the work of one. Consequently the lower room of the small building was put into shape and Mrs. Daisy Merrill engaged to teach the sixth grade.

Tuition Pupils

An effort was made to determine who were the non-resident and who were the resident pupils. After a good deal of difficulty it was found that nine pupils were enrolled as tuition pupils in the elementary schools. Tuition in nearly every case was collected either from

the parent or town. Five pupils in the high school were enrolled as non-resident pupils. Tuition of these pupils in every case was paid by the school district in which they lived. Tuition for all of these pupils amounted to a considerable sum.

The per cent. of attendance for the year was 91.2%. Five pupils succeeded in getting to school every day and not being late.

There were 19 visits made by the school board members, 307 by citizens, and 167 by the superintendent.

1923-24

A brief report of the current year might not be out of place at this time. At the writing of this report eighteen weeks have gone by, a period which might be termed as the transition period. Because of the work being done on the building it was necessary to find other quarters. When once started conditions were far from ideal. Both teachers and pupils co-operated wonderfully well and the work went along very smoothly. Weather conditions helped us amazingly and it was at

the end of this period that we were seriously handicapped. Below is the per cent. of attendance by grades during this period:

These figures show that the teachers and pupils made an extra effort to overcome a condition far from ideal.

Three new grade teachers were added to the teaching force: Miss Myla Cavis, Grade I; Miss Mildred Fenton, Grade III; and Miss Avis Nye, Grade VII.

High School

The work of the high school was enlarged by the introduction of a third year. Nine of last year's sophomores report as juniors. The enrollment is now thirty-eight. Three courses are offered. A third teacher was added to the faculty to take care of the commercial work. Miss Mura Eastman of Newport, N. H., was engaged for this purpose. Miss Ruth Cheney of Manchester was elected to teach French and Latin.

One week has been spent in the new building. All the inconveniences undergone during the first eighteen weeks have become a mere memory.

I wish to thank all with whom I have come in contact for their co-operation. The work has been very pleasant.
