

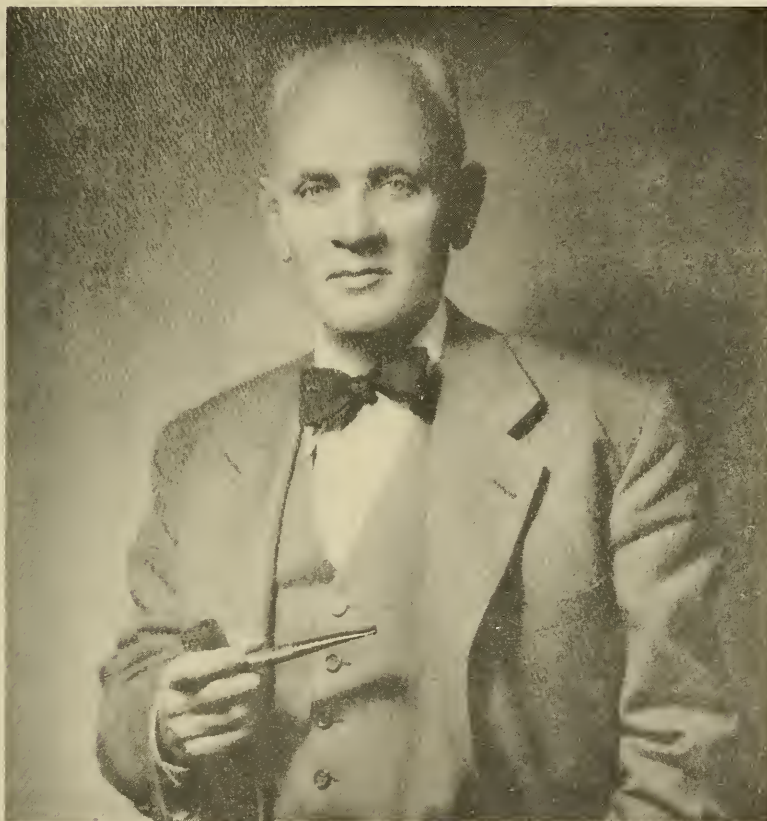

CARLTON M. SHERWOOD

1895 - 1970

World War I called Carlton M. Sherwood from studies at the University of Buffalo to service in combat area with the American Expeditionary Force.

Following the Armistice he devoted several years to serving non-profit organizations in field work, financial management, and general executive direction.

In 1936 he was invited to join Pierce, Hedrick & Sherwood in New York City. He later became sole owner of this company and was President at the time of his death.

He served as moderator for the Town of Deering.

In 1940 he spent many hours with the Water Resources Board in Concord, N. H. with plans for the reconstruction of the Deering Dam. The old dam had been destroyed by the 1938 hurricane.

His substantial services to the Deering Church began in 1926 and lasted until his death in 1970. He was Financial Chairman of the Committee that raised the money to build the Parish House that is now named Sherwood Hall in his memory.

TOWN WARRANT

To the inhabitants of the Town of Deering, in the County of Hillsborough, in said State, qualified to vote in Town affairs, Greetings:

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town Hall in said Deering on Tuesday, the 4th day of March next, at one of the clock in the afternoon to act upon the following subject:

Article 1. To choose all necessary Town Officers for the ensuing year. Polls will open at 1:00 P.M. and will remain open until 7:00 P.M. (The Polls may be continued to be open following the above hour by vote of the Meeting, but may not be closed before the hour of 7:00 P.M. - RSA 39:2)

Additionally, you are hereby notified to meet at the Town Hall in said Deering on Thursday, the 6th day of March next, at seven of the clock in the evening to act on the following Articles (RSA 39:2a).

(All Articles hereinafter are submitted by the Selectmen unless otherwise noted.)

Article 2. To see if the Town will vote to accept the reports of the Town Officers, Agents, Committees, and Auditors for the year 1974.

Article 3. To see if the Town will vote to raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray Town charges for the year 1975 and to make appropriations of and for the same, or to take any other action relating thereto.

Article 4. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$7,500. for Town Officers' salaries and \$7,000. for Town Officers' expenses, and to authorize the Treasurer to pay each Selectman \$1,000. per year, or to take any other action relating thereto.

Article 5. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$450. for election and registration expenses, or to take any other action relating thereto.

Article 6. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$2,800. for the upkeep of the Town Hall and other Town buildings, and purchase office equipment, or to take any other action relating thereto.

Article 7. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$233. for White Pine Blister Rust Control as authorized under the provisions of RSA 223, or to take any other action relating thereto.

Article 8. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate a sufficient sum of money to implement any or all of the options listed in the Building Committee Report as printed in the Town Report, or to take any other action relating thereto.

Article 9. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$1,800. for Social Security payments for Town employees, or to take any other action relating thereto.

Article 10. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$7,500. for the Police Department, or to take any other action relating thereto.

Article 10a. To see if the Town will vote to provide that the Chief of Police be elected at the annual Meeting of the Town, under the provisions of RSA 41:47, such action to be effective with the annual Meeting of 1976. (Submitted by petition.)

Article 10b. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$4,000 for the Fire Department, or to take any other action relating thereto.

Article 11. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$1,500. for Tree Trimming particularly along the narrow roads, or to take any other action relating thereto.

Article 12. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$2,850. for Insurance, or to take any other action relating thereto.

Article 13. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$1,000. for Damages and Legal Expenses, or to take any other action relating thereto.

Article 14. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$3,500. for contributions to neighboring Towns which permit the use of their refuse disposal facilities by Deering Residents and for trash removal, or to take any other action relating thereto.

Article 15. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$25. for Vital Statistics, or to take any other action relating thereto.

Article 16. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the following sums for Highway purposes: (1) \$14,000. for Summer roads; (2) \$17,500. for Winter roads; (3) \$11,500. for the general expenses of the Highway Department; and (4) \$9,000. for road sealing, or to take any other action relating thereto.

Article 17. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to apply for, contract for, and accept grants of Federal or State aid relative to disasters or civic improvement, or both, as may be available, and to do all things necessary to carry out this Article, or to take any other action relating thereto.

Article 18. To see if the Town will vote to authorize withdrawal from the Revenue Sharing Fund established under the

provisions of the State and Local Assistance Act of 1972 for use as set-offs against budget appropriations in the amount indicated; and, further, to authorize the Selectmen to make pro-rata reductions in the amounts if estimated entitlements are reduced or pro-rata increases in the amounts if the estimated entitlements are increased, or to take any other action relating thereto.

Article 19. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$5,000. for the Capital Reserve Fund for Highway Equipment, or to take any other action relating thereto.

Article 20. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$1,170.66 to secure Town Road Aid (State share \$7,804.42), or to take any other action relating thereto.

Article 21. To call to the attention of the Town that the sum of \$8,000. to meet the annual payment for repairs to the Longwoods Road must be raised as previously authorized, under the provisions of RSA 33:2.

Article 22. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$1,100. for Street Lighting, or to take any other action relating thereto.

Article 23. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$35. for the Library, or to take any other action relating thereto.

Article 24. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sums of \$1,800. for Town Poor, \$1,200. for Old Age Assistance, and \$750. for Aid to Permanently and Totally Disabled, or to take any other action relating thereto.

Article 25. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$721. as a contribution to the Concord Mental Health Center, Inc., or to take any other action relating thereto.

Article 26. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$200. for the support of the Hillsboro Rescue Squad, or to take any other action relating thereto. (Submitted by Petition.)

Article 27. To call to the attention of the Town that a County Tax will be levied on the Town, and it is estimated that the sum of \$15,000. as shown on the Budget for this anticipated levy will be required.

Article 28. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$343. for membership in the Monadnock Region Association, or to take any other action relating thereto.

Article 28a. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$70. for the Monadnock Regional Bicentennial Committee to enable it to act as a regional coordinator for the celebration of the 1976 Bicentennial, or to take any other action relating thereto.

Article 29. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$200. for the care of Cemeteries. (Required by Statute - RSA 289:5 & 6)

Article 30. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$200. for the current operating expenses and projects of the Conservation Commission, or take any other action relating thereto.

Article 30a. To see if the Town will vote to accept the gift of a parcel of land, containing one and one half (1½) acres, more or less, bordering Center Brook from Herve Aucoin and place the same under the management and control of the Conservation Commission under the provisions of RSA 36-A:4, or to take any other action thereon. (Submitted by Conservation Commission)

Article 30b. To see if the Town will vote to accept the gift of a parcel of land, containing thirteen (13) acres, more or less, adjacent to the Gregg lot, so-called, from the Deering Association and place the same under the management and control of the Conservation Commission under the provisions of RSA 36A:4, or to take any other action thereon. (Submitted by the Conservation Commission)

Article 31. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$200. for Civil Defense, or to take any other action relating thereto.

Article 32. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$500. for continuing and making corrections to the Tax Map, which is required by RSA 31:95a, or to take any other action relating thereto.

Article 33. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$500. for Interest on long term notes, or to take any other action relating thereto.

Article 34. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$200. for the current operating expenses of the Planning Board, or to take any other action relating thereto. (Submitted by the Planning Board)

Article 35. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$415. to continue membership in the Central New Hampshire Regional Planning Commission, or to take any other action relating thereto.

Article 36. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$650. for the purpose of purchasing building materials for the Fire House to be installed by Volunteer Fire Depart-

ment labor or other volunteer labor, or to take any other action relating thereto.

Article 37. To see if the Town will vote to express the sense of the Meeting on planning an appropriate celebration for the National Bicentennial in 1976, or to take any other action relating thereto. (Submitted by the Bicentennial Committee.)

Article 38. To see if the Town will vote to adopt the provisions of RSA 31:105 and thereby indemnify and save harmless Town employees or agents from claims arising out of their employment with the Town, or to take any other action relating thereto.

Article 39. To see if the Town will vote to adopt the following Ordinance:

FLOOD PLAIN BUILDING CODE

In order to comply with the eligibility requirements for the National Flood Insurance Program, and to advance public safety, encourage the appropriate use of land, conserve private property values, and preserve the general welfare of the Town, the Town of Deering hereby adopts the following ordinance under RSA 31:39:

1. The Selectmen or their appointed Building Inspector shall review all building permit applications for new construction or substantial improvements to determine whether proposed building sites will be reasonably safe from flooding. If a proposed building site is in a location that has been a flood hazard, any proposed new construction or substantial improvement (including prefabricated and mobile homes) must (1) be designed (or modified) and anchored to prevent floatation, collapse, or lateral movement of the structure, (2) use construction materials and utility equipment that are resistant to flood damage, and (3) use construction methods and practices that will minimize flood damage.
2. No building or structure located in a flood plain, as designated by the Department of the Army, Corps of Engineers shall hereafter be erected, moved, or structurally altered until a permit has been obtained from the Building Inspector.
3. Whoever violates the provisions of this code shall be fined for each offense a sum not to exceed \$50. Each day that said violation continues shall be deemed to be a separate offense.

Article 39a. To see if the Town will vote to approve the following resolution concerning the National Flood Insurance Program:

Whereas, the Town of Deering has adopted and is enforcing a building permit ordinance, and

Whereas, the aforesaid ordinance prohibits any person from constructing a structure or building without first obtaining a building permit from the Selectmen, and

Whereas, the Selectmen or their appointed Building Inspector must examine all plans and specifications for the proposed con-

struction when application is made to them for a building permit,
NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ENACTED by the Town Meeting of
Deering as follows:

1. The Town Meeting recommends that the Planning Board amend their regulations pertaining to the flood hazard area to assure that (1) all proposals are consistent with the need to minimize flood damage, (2) all public utilities and facilities, such as sewer, gas, electrical, and water systems are located, elevated, and constructed to minimize or eliminate flood damage, and (3) adequate drainage is provided so as to reduce exposure to flood hazards; and

2. The Town Meeting recommends that the Planning Board amend their regulations pertaining to the flood hazard area to require new or replacement water supply systems and/or sanitary sewage systems to be designed to minimize or eliminate infiltration of flood waters into the systems and discharges from the systems into flood waters, and require on-site waste disposal systems to be located so as to avoid impairment of them or contamination from them during flooding, pursuant to N.H. RSA 36:21.

Article 39b. To see if the Town will vote to approve the following resolution concerning the National Flood Insurance Program:

Whereas, certain areas of the Town of Deering are subject to periodic flooding from STREAMS, RIVERS, and LAKES, causing serious damages to properties within these areas; and
Whereas, relief is available in the form of Federally subsidized flood insurance as authorized by the National Flood Insurance Act of 1968; and

Whereas, it is the intent of this Town Meeting to require the recognition and evaluation of flood hazards in all official actions relating to land use in the flood plain areas having special flood hazards; and

Whereas this body has the legal authority to adopt land use and control measures to reduce future flood losses pursuant to N.H. RSA Chapter 31, 36, 156. 156A,

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that this Town Meeting hereby:

1. Assures the Federal Insurance Administration that it intends to enact and maintain in force for those areas having defined flood hazards, adequate land use and control measures with effective enforcement provisions consistent with the criteria set forth in Section 1910 of the National Flood Insurance Program Regulations; and

2. Vests the Selectmen with the responsibility, authority, and means to:

(a) Delineate or assist the Administrator, at his request, in delineating the limits of the areas having special flood hazards

on available local maps of sufficient scale to identify the location of building sites.

(b) Provide such information as the administrator may request concerning present uses and occupancy of the flood plain.

(c) Cooperate with Federal, State, and Local agencies and private firms which undertake to study, survey, map and identify flood plain or mudslide areas, and cooperate with neighboring communities with respect to management of adjoining flood plain in order to prevent aggravation of existing hazards.

(d) Submit on the anniversary date of the community's initial eligibility an annual report to the Administrator on the progress made during the past year within the community in the development and implementation of flood plain management measures.

3. Appoints the Selectmen or their appointed Building Inspector to maintain for public inspection and to furnish upon request a record of elevations (in relation to mean sea level) of the lowest floor (including basement) of all new or substantially improved structures located in the special flood hazard areas. If the lowest floor is below grade on one or more sides, the elevation of the floor immediately above must also be recorded.

4. Intends to take such other official action within its powers as may be reasonably necessary to carry out the objectives of this program.

Article 39c. To see if the Town agrees to participate in the National Flood Insurance Program by directing the Board of Selectmen to complete the eligibility application and submit the required information to the Federal Insurance Administration.

Article 39d. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to appoint a Building Inspector, and further, to authorize the said Selectmen to set an appropriate salary for this office and prescribe such duties as said Building Inspector may be expected to perform, and raise and appropriate the sum of \$1,000. for the salary and expenses of this office, or to take any other action relating thereto.

Article 39e. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to amend the Building Permit Ordinance so that it will apply to all new building construction and/or substantial improvements thereof, and to further authorize the Selectmen to increase the fee for said Building Permit to \$5. for each application, or to take any other action relating thereto.

Article 40. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to sell or otherwise dispose of the scrap metal (old plows, blades, beams, etc.) that has accumulated over the years, or to take any other action relating thereto.

Article 41. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to auction property taken by Tax Collector's Deeds.

Article 42. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to borrow money in anticipation of Taxes.

Article 43. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to apply for, contract for, and accept grants of Federal or State aid, or both, relative to the detection, deterrence, and apprehension of crime or criminals, or both, or to take any other action relating thereto.

Article 44. To see what photograph or picture the Town will vote to place on the cover of the next annual Report, or to take any other action relating thereto.

Article 45. To see if the Town will vote to close (subject to gates and bars) that section of Wolf Hill Road between the spot where Wolf Hill crosses the Brook and where it passes under the power line at the top of the steep hill, making the section of Wolf Hill Road from the juncture with Fisher Road dead end at the Brook and From Rte. 149 dead end at the power line. (Submitted by petition)

Article 46. To transact any other business that may legally be brought before this meeting.

SELECTMEN'S REPORT

Inflation and material shortages have been the most serious and continuing of the problems your Board of Selectmen has had to face during the past year. Even so, Town expenses in 1974 were less than appropriations by \$3,185. Looking forward, the available economic predictors suggest continued inflation and shortages in 1975 coupled with the unemployment which accompanies the current recession. This pessimistic economic outlook makes for difficult budgeting; for, on the one hand, the Board must estimate sufficient funds to pay for needed Town services; while, on the other hand, the budget must be kept as low as possible to reduce our citizen's tax burden. Consequently a very considered and cautious attitude toward the 1975 Town budget is reflected in the warrant articles which are herewith commented upon:

Article 4: The amount estimated for Town Officers' salaries has been reduced \$500.

Article 5: The amount estimated for Election and Registration expense has been reduced \$250. Some uncertainty is created by whether or not the Durkin/Wyman senatorial contest will necessitate a special election.

Article 8: The necessary sums to be "raised and appropriated" will have to be moved from the floor at Town Meeting since estimations of the costs that any of the options the Building Committee has suggested were unavailable as this Report went to print. The Board wishes to thank the Building Committee for their work and the excellent report they submitted.

Article 10: If we expect to continue with a part time police chief, the Board feels that \$7,500. is a sufficient appropriation. However, there is considerable indication that the Town needs full time police protection. This matter should be discussed. If it is the sense of the meeting that a full time chief be appointed, then we estimate that a minimum budget of \$14,000. should be adopted.

Article 12: An increase of \$150. to cover anticipated increases in insurance costs is estimated.

Article 14: The charge for using the Hillsboro Landfill by Deering residents is a flat \$3,000. fee. This was the only condition which the Hillsboro Board of Selectmen would accept. The additional \$500. estimated in this Article is the cost to the Town to collect and haul trash and refuse away.

Article 16: Only modest increases in the amounts estimated for highway purposes are proposed. The largest increase is in "General Expenses" since this is the account in which we are experiencing the steepest inflationary increases.

Article 17: The words "civic improvement" have been added to this article to enable the Town to obtain any funds that might

assist our Building Committee's proposals or otherwise improve the Town.

Article 18: We propose using \$11,000. to help reduce Town taxes.

Article 20. Town Road Aid will continue to be expended on North Road. Currently we are working on the Clement Hill end as per our long-range plans.

Article 21: This is the last of the long term debt the Town has to pay off.

Article 22: Inflation has pushed the cost of this Article to \$1,100.

Article 25: The Board of Selectmen does not support this article.

Article 27: The current proposed budget of Hillsborough County indicates that \$15,000. will be our levy. This amount could very well be increased.

Article 28: The Board of Selectmen does not support this article.

Article 30A and B: While the Board of Selectmen has no objection to the Conservation Commission accepting these properties, we feel that we have a duty to point out that if so accepted, the Town will lose the tax income on these properties and consequently the tax burden for other property owners will be proportionately increased.

Article 39A-E: This article is to obtain National Flood Plain Insurance for our citizens owning property in flood plain areas. Because of required hearings involved, the Board of Selectmen suggest that this article be taken up at an adjourned Town Meeting.

Article 40: The Board of Selectmen would like to clean up the Town Commons area and dispose of unused/unusable scrap that has accumulated over the years.

Article 44: A picture of the new Fire House has been suggested for the cover of our next annual report.

The Board of Selectmen, on behalf of the Town, wishes to express their gratitude to all and sundry who helped to make the Fire Station possible.

Our heartfelt thanks to Mr. Daryl McQuirk who donated the land and to Mr. William Dumais, Chief Fire Warden, who supervised the construction of the fire house.

We also wish to express our sincere thanks to the members of the Volunteer Fire Department, residents and out-of-towners who volunteered their time and efforts in making the new fire house a reality.

BICENTENNIAL COMMITTEE REPORT

Deering celebrated its two hundredth anniversary with a bang as the 14th Continental Army from Fort Devens fired their cannon on the common at the conclusion of the parade following the flag raising ceremony. This was but one small part of a well diversified program.

The committee's first project was to design and procure a suitable medal. We were fortunate in having John Hunter accept the chairmanship of the medal committee. By early afternoon of Old Home Day 200 silver, 200 pewter, 150 goldplated and 700 bronze medals had been sold. Thanks to Dick Withington the auction of 22 of the medals brought more than anticipated with the number 1 silver medal bringing \$102.50.

On Friday, August 9th, Tom Rush gave two concerts, at 6 and 8 P.M. to a packed house for both performances. We are greatly indebted to Tom for his generosity in providing his services without charge. The proceeds from his concerts and from the medal sales made the bicentennial a financial success.

On August 10th the younger children enjoyed a program run by Mrs. Anne Carew, Mrs. Villa Ramsay and Tom Copadis, ably assisted by many others of their committee. Later in the day a summer town meeting was moderated by George Wolf with the Selectmen doing a fine job of answering questions from the floor. That night Mrs. Dorothy Wood and her committee held a square dance for a large and enthusiastic group. Previously this committee had run a series of square dance lessons which were so popular they may well be resumed this summer.

Mrs. Daniel K. Poling did an incredible job of researching, writing, recruiting personnel and directing our Historical Promenade. By the time she had finished rounding up the cast and other essential workers we wondered if there were any Deeringites left for the audience. However, both nights opened to a jam-packed house and they loved every minute of it. Our sincere thanks to all who participated. The committee is planning to reproduce the material from which the promenade was written since our Town Historian, Mrs. Marjorie Heath had spent countless hours digging through the records and assembling the data.

Saturday, August 17th was Old Home Day. It began with a typical Bill Dumais parade led by Governor Thomson, followed by the American Legion, the Hillsboro-Deering Band, several fire departments, two yoke of oxen, several beautiful horses, antique cars, a military unit in colonial uniforms, and many others. We sincerely appreciate the time and effort contributed by our friends who made this parade so successful. Ceremonies on the common followed the parade after which general activities commenced. The Deering Fire Department barbecued chickens which the Deering Lake Association served with a delicious

meal. Carl Hammond and his gang from the lake are to be commended for a tough job well done. A bus tour of the town was very popular but an unscheduled rain dampened the band concert and curtailed afternoon activities. The day ended with the Bicentennial Ball chaired by Bill Dumais and well attended in spite of the weather.

On Sunday a bicentennial service was held at the church, a fitting finale to our celebration.

At the first meeting the committee agreed that we did not want to make this a commercial venture but we did want to make more than bare expenses. We decided that any surplus should go to our Deering Volunteer Fire Department. We started with \$353.30 from the Old Home Day account. We have now put \$500 back into this account, paid the Town \$200 for extra insurance coverage, and \$600 for extra police costs. The balance of over \$1,500 is available to the Volunteer Fire Department to purchase articles not normally covered by the Town budget.

The committee had hoped that our celebration would help unite the Town. We feel that that aim was accomplished. We sincerely appreciate the hard work and help which came from all parts of Town, from summer and year-round people, from young and old and from any out-of-towners. Thank you all.

N.H. REGIONAL PLANNING COMMISSION

At Town Meeting in 1973 Deering voted to join the Central New Hampshire Regional Planning Commission. The Commission had been in existence since 1970. Naturally none of the studies started prior to our joining included Deering. In 1973, because of many studies under way and a turnover in top staff personnel, little new work was started. However, the Commission assisted our Conservation Commission in getting a \$750 grant from the Ford Foundation. In 1974 a staff member prepared for the Planning Board a "land use" map, a "soils" map and an "open space" map. More could have been done if your representatives had had more time to work with the staff. In 1975 the Commission plans to assist Deering in the preparation of a Town Plan, a project in which we certainly need expert advice and technical assistance.

The Commission's Program for the fiscal years 1975-1977 leans heavily to local assistance, mostly on an "as requested" basis. The staff is there, ready, willing and able to give the Selectmen, Planning Board, Conservation Commission and other Town personnel technical guidance and assistance that will permit them to meet local problems as they arise and to effect just and satisfactory solutions to them.

Besides funds from member communities the Commission receives funds from other sources, primarily from the State and Federal government. Some Federal funds can go only to member communities. The Commission has been able to reduce the 1975 per capita assessment by 10% in spite of the planned increase in local assistance. Your representatives feel certain that Deering is making a sound investment by maintaining membership in the Region.

Your representatives serve without pay and at no expense to the Town. We take pride in representing Deering and thank you for the privilege of serving you.

PLANNING BOARD REPORT

Regular meetings of the Deering Planning Board were held on the second Wednesday of every month except for the month of August when the Bicentennial events and the preparation thereof necessitated cancellation of the scheduled meeting. A special meeting late in July was held to take care of the immediate business of the Board.

Two additional meetings were held in September for the purpose of a thorough study by the Board of the Subdivision Regulations of the Town. From this study, the Planning Board presented to the Townspeople at a Public Hearing, proposed changes to the Subdivision Control Regulations. The changes to the Regulations were unanimously approved by the Board on January 16, 1975.

A joint meeting with the Town Selectmen and the Conservation Commission was held for the purpose of discussing the Town Dump problem.

Mr. Ernest Johnson resigned from the Planning Board. Mr. David Feather was appointed to the Board to complete his term. Dr. James Carew was elected Chairman, Mr. Willis Merrill, Vice Chairman and Ms Beverly Yeaple Secretary for the year.

CONSERVATION COMMISSION REPORT

Four of the five roads proposed for Scenic designation by the Conservation Commission were approved by the voters at the Town Meeting on March 7. They are as follows: Glen Road, Wolf Hill Road, Fisher Road and Dickey Hill Road.

The Commission sponsored a "Clean-up Day" in May. About 78 adults and children, from every part of Deering cleaned the roadsides of cans, bottles and other debris. After truckloads of rubbish were taken to the dump, a lunch was served to the workers at the Parish House by the Commission. We hope this will be an annual event.

A very successful dried flower contest was sponsored by the Commission as a part of the Bicentennial activities. 136 varieties of Deering flowers were presented by 15 children whose ages were from 5 to 15 years.

Marguerite Dutton and Villa Ramsay attended the annual state meeting of Conservation Commissions in Keene in November. Its theme was *Community Action; The Art of Implementation*.

The Commission has completed a project funded by the Ford Foundation. This project was designed to identify threatened scenic and natural resources of the town, to identify anticipated development in cooperation with the Deering Planning Board and to identify scenic and natural resources within the town in cooperation with the Central N.H. Regional Planning Commission. This study is to be used to determine if there is a conflict between scenic and natural resources and anticipated development areas. A result of the study is a brochure containing a map of Deering delineating town and state owned land, rivers and streams, wetlands, slopes and heights of land. This brochure is being sent out to all Deering taxpayers.

The Commission believes the addition of the Sleeper lots to the Gregg lot would enhance the latter by providing additional wild life habitat and serving as a buffer zone. The Commission hopes the town will see fit to accept this generous gift from the Deering Association, as well as the Aucoin lot, a gift from Herve Aucoin.

HEALTH OFFICER'S REPORT

Water samples were taken from various locations on Deering Lake on August 20. Results showed that some samples meet New Hampshire Class A standard for public water supply before treatment and normal for inland waters free of sewage pollution. Remaining samples showed the water to be New Hampshire Class B, suitable for bathing.

The analysis of the water did show an increase in Coliform bacteria in some parts of the lake. It is hoped that this increase was caused by the lack of rainfall during the summer months.

However, the increased Coliform bacteria should be a warning signal to all using the lake of possible impending pollution and the necessity of avoiding or eliminating any pollution-causing source.

Several areas where violations of the health standards were observed within the community were visited and, in most cases, appropriate corrective action was taken.

The Health Officer found the Town Beach and picnic area at the dam badly in need of policing, with barrels continually overflowing during the summer months. The matter was brought to the attention of the Selectmen on June 18. It is imperative that someone be appointed or hired by the Town to police the area regularly, in order that the objectionable and hazardous accumulation of trash will not recur.

Again, those subdividing land to build homes are reminded that approval for septic systems must be made first by the New Hampshire Water Supply and Pollution Control Commission.

All are urged to protect Deering's natural beauty by observing rules of proper rubbish disposal.

REPORT OF THE FOREST FIRE WARDEN AND DISTRICT CHIEF

In New Hampshire forest fire control is a cooperative State-Town program. The town Forest Fire Warden, appointed recommendation of the Selectmen and the State's District Forest Fire Chief is responsible for fire suppression and other related duties. The State shares equally with the town in the cost of most forest fires except illegal and careless fires which are charged to the responsible party. The State further provides fire detection services, prevention programs, fire training for town wardens and crews and back up equipment for fire suppression.

By authority of the State, the Town Forest Fire Warden controls all outside burning in his town, except backyard cooking fires. Any person wishing to kindle a fire when the ground is not covered with snow, must obtain a fire permit, free of cost, from the Town Forest Fire Warden. No permits shall be issued for fires between 9.00 a.m. and 5:00 p.m. unless it is raining, except for commercial purposes.

Please be careful when using fire, remember it can be an extremely useful tool when under control but once allowed to run wild it can become a disastrous and devastating force. Only you can prevent a forest fire.

HISTORIAN'S REPORT

Deering's most important event of 1974 occurred January 17 when the Town of Deering started its third century as an incorporated town; the original charter of incorporation having been granted January 17, 1774 by Royal Governor John Wentworth. This original charter is one of our prized possessions.

Much work and research was entailed in the program commemorating the event. The principal events celebrating our bicentennial took place between August 9 and August 19 with two concerts by Tom Rush, two dances, two presentations of an historical pageant featuring people and events in the town's life, and a Bicentennial Old Home Day complete with parade, chicken barbecue, band concert and other features ending with the Bicentennial Ball. On Sunday a colonial style church service was held at Deering Community Church, the building depicted on our bicentennial medals and trivets.

An exhibit of copies of old snapshots of Deering homes, people and events was on display in the Town Hall on Old Home Day along with a 4-H exhibit. The Town Hall and Library (old Center School) were decorated with red, white and blue bunting.

Material for a series of articles in the Messenger was gathered from various sources. The Messenger published closest to January 17 wished Deering a Happy Birthday and contained copies of many of our earliest documents - the charter, town bounds, petition for incorporation, etc. In mid-August the Messenger published a 48-page supplement with a map of Deering showing the sites of its schools, cemeteries and other points of interest. This contained many of the pictures which were on display on Old Home Day along with stories of Deering. These Messenger supplements and Bicentennial trivets are still available.

Working on the bicentennial celebration brought many of us new acquaintances among our townspeople and sparked an interest in town history since some old documents came to light. It is hoped that a Deering Historical Society may soon be formed to continue interest in our town.

TOWN HISTORIAN

TOWN BUILDINGS COMMITTEE REPORT

The committee, to date, has held five meetings to evaluate the existing town buildings and make recommendations for future conversion and or expansion.

Three options were considered:

- Option 1 Conversion of the rear third of the second floor of the Town Hall into office space for town officials, conference rooms and storage and toilet facilities.
- Option 2 Conversion of the town garage into offices and conference rooms, toilet and storage facilities and the addition of a new town garage.
- Option 3 Erection of a new building on the Hotel Lot which would contain offices, conference rooms and toilet and storage facilities.

The committee found that the library was adequate for current use and that the building was in an acceptable state of repair.

A survey of the Town Hall indicated that certain repairs are imperative for the preservation of the building.

- 1. Roof - west side, re-shingled
- 2. Sill - south side, replaced
- 3. Basement door, re-built or replaced
- 4. Installation of fire door and steps at rear of building

It is the suggestion of the committee that the above options be considered at the annual meeting of the town. Estimates will be presented at that time. Due to the present economic situation no firm bids can be obtained so far in advance of any proposed construction.

Recommendations of the Committee:

- Option 1 Conversion of the Town Hall
 - 1. Insulation of outside walls and installation of storm windows
 - 2. Drywall sheathing on outer walls and on partitions
 - 3. Partitioning and insulation of existing toilet facilities in basement
 - 4. New forced hot air heating plant, zoned to heat toilet facilities, offices and/or town meeting hall.

The committee does not recommend this option due to its location on the second floor and thus is not readily accessible to all of the public.

- Option 2 Conversion of the Town Garage
 - 1. Conversion of the existing garage into town offices,

conference rooms, storage and toilet facilities.

2. 40' by 52' addition to rear of present building for new town garage.

3. Zoned forced hot air heating plant.

The committee recommends this as the most feasible option. Town offices etc., would be readily accessible to the public and the building would also house town equipment.

Option 3 Erection of New Building on the Hotel Lot

This does not appear feasible at the time for it would entail construction of a new building, septic system, well, access road and parking space.

Future Considerations recommended by the committee;

1. Insulation of the entire Town Hall building
2. Installation of storm windows
3. Erection of a pole shed adjacent to new town garage for storage of future equipment, salt, sand and other supplies
4. New heating plant for Town Hall

MINUTES OF THE 1974 TOWN MEETING

A legal meeting of the inhabitants of the Town of Deering qualified to vote in Town Affairs was called to order at 1:00 P.M. on March 5.

Article 1. To choose all necessary Town Officers for the ensuing year. Total ballots cast: 159.

Selectman for three years — Roland Cote, 84 - Thomas Allen, 66

Tax Collector — Brenda Bruyneel, 100 - Doris Beane, 57

Town Clerk & Treasurer — Clara T. Rich, 152

Trustee of Trust Funds 3 years — Edna S. Yeaple, 140

Trustee of Trust Funds 2 years — Eleanor Fitzpatrick, 140

Library Trustee 3 years — Peggy Nugent, 140

Library Trustee 1 year — Virginia Bittenbender, 134

Auditors — Marjorie Heath, 142 - Dorothy Wood, 144

On March 7 at 7:00 P.M. Articles 2 through 45 were voted. The

meeting was opened with a Salute to the Flag and a Prayer.

Article 2. It was moved that the Town ratify the 1973 action of the Selectmen in prepaying \$16,000 of town notes of the 1972 issue. It was moved that the reports of the Town Officers, agents, and auditors for the year 1973 be accepted with the following amendments. 1. Debt service item under budget, actual expenditures previous year 1973 be shown as \$36,000 instead of \$11,000. 2. Payment of debt under statement of appropriations should be shown as \$37,000 instead of \$20,000. 3. Decrease of surplus-change in financial condition under balance sheet be shown as an increase in deficit of \$12,776.62 instead of \$205.92.

Article 3. It was moved that any motion to reconsider any article except for technical reasons be ruled out of order. It was voted to raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray Town charges for the year 1974 and to make appropriations of and for the same. Mr. Bittenbender pointed out that the proposed budget would require an increase of \$42,000 in the 1974 tax commitment, or about an increase of \$4.00 to \$5.00 per thousand in the tax rate; and that the proposed additional levy of \$163,000 would cause an additional increase of \$2.50 to \$3.50 per thousand resulting in a potential increase in the rate of \$6.50 to \$8.50 per thousand of valuation.

Article 4. It was voted to raise and appropriate the sum of \$8,000 for Town Officers' salaries and \$7,000 for Town Officers' expenses and to authorize the Treasurer to pay each Selectman \$1,000 per year.

Article 5. It was voted to raise and appropriate the sum of \$700 for election and registration expenses.

Article 6. It was voted to raise and appropriate the sum of \$2,500 for the upkeep of the Town Hall and other Town buildings and purchase office equipment.

Article 7. It was voted to rescind article 7 of the Town of Deering 1973 Warrant - To raise and appropriate the sum of \$5,000 for remodeling, refinishing and equipping the interior of the Town Hall on the first floor and in the rear, for the provision of adequate Town Offices.

Article 7a. Negative vote on \$3,000 for remodeling and refinishing Town Hall for adequate Town Offices.

Article 8. Amended to read as follows: It was voted to establish a five (5) member Public Buildings Committee, two (2) members to be appointed by the Selectmen, two (2) members to be appointed by the Planning Board, One (1) member to be appointed by the Town Moderator, and to raise and appropriate the sum of \$500 to fund said committee.

Article 9. It was voted to raise and appropriate the sum of \$1,200 for Social Security payments for Town Employees.

Article 10. It was voted to raise and appropriate the sum of \$7,500 for the Police Department, and \$4,000 for the Fire Department.

Article 11. It was voted to raise and appropriate the sum of \$1,500 for tree trimming, particularly along narrow roads.

Article 12. It was voted to raise and appropriate the sum of \$2,700 for Insurance.

Article 13. It was voted to raise and appropriate the sum of \$1,000 for Damages and Legal Expenses.

Article 14. It was voted to raise and appropriate the sum of \$1,500 for contributions to neighboring towns which permit the use of dumps by Deering, and for trash removal.

Article 14a. It was voted to ratify the following ordinance. Be it resolved and ordained that at a regular meeting of the Board of Selectmen on Monday, September 10, 1973, the Board has issued an ordinance prohibiting the dumping of garbage or refuse on or around the Town Commons and Town Buildings. This ordinance is effective immediately. The public take notice. Violators will be prosecuted to the full extent of the law.

Article 15. It was voted to raise and appropriate the sum of \$25 for Vital Statistics.

Article 16. It was voted to raise and appropriate the following sums: Highway purposes, (1) \$13,000 for summer roads; (2) \$17,000 for winter roads; (3) \$9,500 for general expenses of the Highway Department; and (4) \$9,000 for road sealing.

Article 17. It was voted to authorize the Selectmen to apply for, contract for, and accept grants of Federal or State aid relative to disasters or both as may be available, and to do all things necessary to carry out this article.

Article 18. It was voted to authorize withdrawal from the Revenue Sharing Fund established under the provisions of the State and Local Assistance Act of 1972 for use as set offs against budget appropriations in the amount indicated; and further, to authorize the Selectmen to make pro-rata reductions in the amounts if estimated entitlements are reduced. as amended.

Article 19. It was voted to raise and appropriate the sum of \$5,000 for Capital Reserve Fund for highway equipment.

Article 20. It was voted to raise and appropriate the sum of \$1,175.54 to secure Town Road Aid.

Article 21. It was recalled to the attention of the Town that the sum of \$8,000 to meet the annual payment on the Reconstruction of Bridge No. 103/053 on Reservoir Road and repairs to the Longwoods Road must be raised as previously authorized, under the provisions of RSA 33:2.

Article 22. It was voted to raise and appropriate the sum of \$850 for street lighting.

Article 23. It was voted to raise and appropriate the sum of \$35 for the Library.

Article 24. It was voted to raise and appropriate the sums of

\$1,200 for Town Poor, \$900 for old age assistance and \$750 for aid to Permanently and Totally Disabled.

Article 25. Negative vote on purchasing a fire proof safe for tax maps and other records.

Article 26. It was voted to change the sign and billboard ordinance to read as follows, Be it resolved and ordained that all billboards and signs advertising businesses, products, etc. located outside of Deering may be approved by the Selectmen and the Planning Board. Any Deering resident wishing to erect a commercial sign/signs for his business in Deering shall submit plans for such sign/signs to the Selectmen for approval. Such signs, if approved by the Selectmen will be limited in number and size as well as being in keeping with the decorum of the landscape.

Article 27. It was recalled to the attention of the Town that a County Tax will be levied on the Town, and it is estimated that the sum of \$14,000, as shown in the budget will be required.

Article 28. Negative vote on the Monadnock Region Association.

Article 29. It was voted to raise and appropriate the sum of \$200 for the care of Cemeteries.

Article 30. It was voted to raise and appropriate the sum of \$200 for current operating expenses and projects by the Conservation Commission.

Articles 30A through 30E. It was moved that the Town endorse in principle the concept of scenic roads, and make Articles 30a through 30e, special order of business at the recessed session of this meeting to be held on June 6, 1974, and that the Conservation Commission and town counsel report at that time as to whether any financial reimbursement to the Town might be jeopardized, and that appropriate action be taken under RSA Chapt. 586 & 253.

Article 30F. It was voted to permit the Conservation Commission to accept any Foundation Grant, if application is approved.

Article 30G. It was voted to raise and appropriate the sum of \$250 to be used with matching funds from a Ford Foundation Grant.

Article 31. It was voted to raise and appropriate the sum of \$200 for Civil Defense.

Article 32. It was voted to raise and appropriate the sum of \$1,500 for continuing and making corrections to the Tax Map.

Article 33. It was voted to raise and appropriate the sum of \$450 for interest on Long-term loans.

Article 34. It was voted to raise and appropriate the sum of \$200 for the current expenses of the Planning Board.

Article 35. It was voted to continue membership of the Regional Planning Commission.

Article 35a. It was voted to raise and appropriate the sum of \$433 as the Town's share for the studies and operation of the Central New Hampshire Regional Planning Commission. These funds will be used for financing the staff, operating expenses, planning studies, technical assistance, and other programs of the

Commission. These funds may be used in conjunction with other State and Federal funds available for planning purposes.

Article 36. It was voted to accept by deed a lot of land less than one acre situated on Old County Road near the intersection of the Bowen School Road from Daryl McQuirk for the purpose of building a fire house and to raise and appropriate the sum of \$200 for surveying costs and legal expenses incurred in transferring said lot.

Article 36a. It was voted to raise and appropriate the sum of \$7,500 for the purpose of purchasing building materials for a 28' X 40' building to be used as a fire house, and to be erected by Volunteer Fire Department labor and other volunteer labor.

Article 37. It was voted to carry over Article 37 of the Town of Deering's 1973 Warrant, which was "to see if the Town will vote to authorize the Board of Selectmen to sell and convey by quit-claim deed, under such conditions and to such persons as the Board may consider proper, the property known as the Old Deering School House site at or near the intersection of the Old Francetown Road with the Homestead Road, containing 0.23 acres, more or less, so that the transaction may be made in the future."

Article 38. It was voted to adopt the provisions of RSA 31:105, and thereby indemnify and save harmless Town employees or agents from claims arising out of their employment with the Town.

Article 39. By a manifest negative vote The Australian ballot system for the election of Town Officers was not adopted.

Article 40. It was voted to raise and appropriate the sum of \$2,500 to empower the Selectmen to negotiate for and, if necessary, purchase options to buy any suitable land in the Town of Deering for the purpose of constructing and maintaining a Sanitary Land-fill Disposal area.

40a. It was voted to consider the matter of a Sanitary Disposal Area as a special order of business at a recessed session of this meeting to be held on June 6, 1974 and to see what sums of money the Town will then vote to appropriate under the provisions of the Municipal Finance Act. RSA 33.

Article 41. It was voted to authorize the Selectmen to auction property taken by Tax Collectors Deed.

Article 42. It was voted to authorize the Selectmen to borrow money in anticipation of taxes.

Article 43. It was voted to authorize the Selectmen to apply for, contract for, and accept grants of Federal or State aid relative to the deterrance of crime or criminals, or both, and to do all things necessary to carry out this article.

Article 44. It was voted to place Carlton Sherwood's photograph on the next annual report.

Article 45. It was voted to have "The agenda and minutes of

the Selectmen's meetings and the minutes of the Planning Board meetings be published in the Hillsboro Messenger."

It was voted to adjourn until the recessed meeting June 6, 1974 at 7:00 P.M.

Article 40. It was voted to raise and appropriate the additional sum of Four Thousand Dollars (\$4,000.00) to be used with the unexpended funds previously raised and appropriated under Article 40 at the Town Meeting March 5, 1974, for the purpose of joining the Bennington Sanitary Land-fill disposal area and that the Town authorize the Selectmen to do whatever is necessary to complete a contractual agreement between the town of Deering and the town of Bennington, or between the town of Deering and any other towns involved in the Bennington sanitary land-fill disposal area, for the purpose of the town of Deering and its citizens using the town of Bennington's disposal area, and in the event the Selectmen are unable, or deem it unwise, to conclude such an agreement that the town authorize the Selectmen to expend the funds raised and appropriated under Article 40. to join the Hillsboro sanitary land-fill disposal area for the fiscal year July 1, 1974 to June 30, 1975 on a fee basis.

Article 30A. It was voted to designate the Glenn Road, from Peter Wood Hill Road to East Deering Road, as a "scenic road" under the provisions of RSA 253:17 & 18.

Article 30b. It was voted to designate Wolf Hill Road, from Rte. 149 to Old County Road, as a "scenic road" under the provision of RSA 253:17 & 18.

Article 30c. Amended as follows: It was voted to designate Fisher Road, from Zoski Road to D. Poling's, as a "scenic road" under the provisions of RSA 253:17 & 18.

Article 30d. It was voted to designate Dickey Hill Road, from Rte. 149 to Clement Hill Road, as a "scenic road" under the provisions of RSA 253:17 & 18.

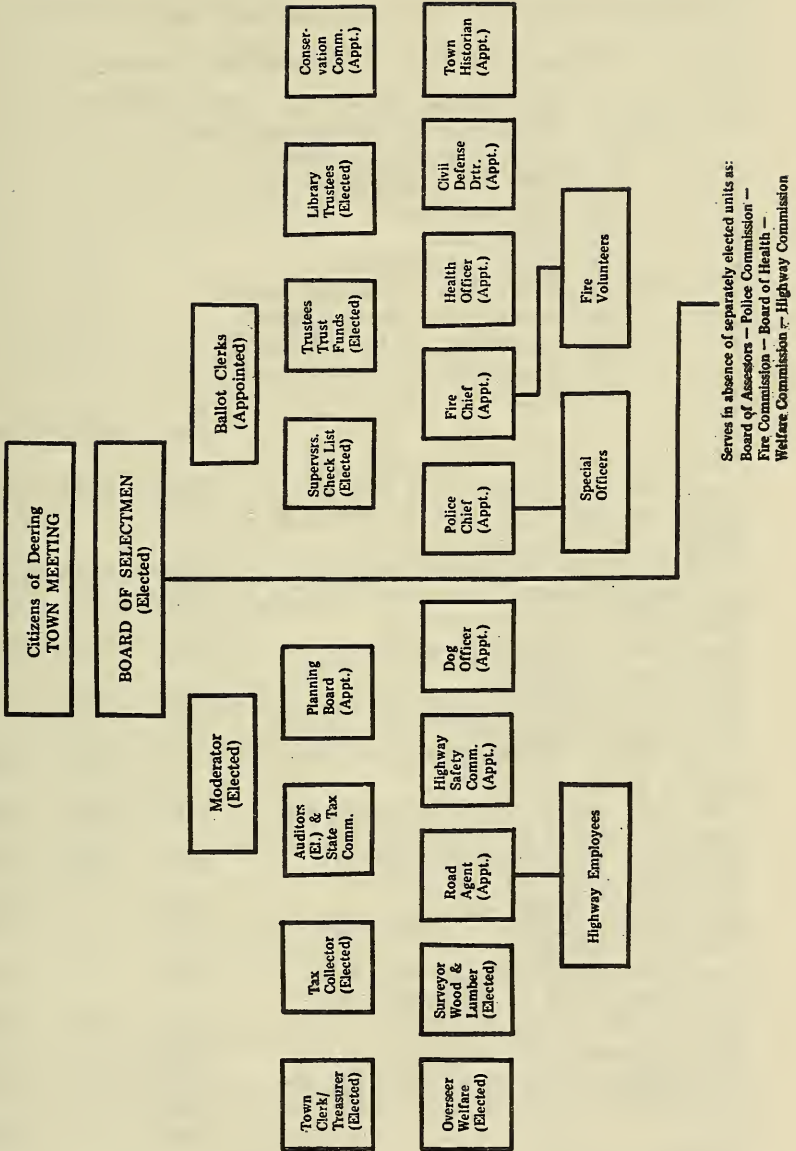
Article 30e. It was voted to not change Reservoir Road to a "scenic road."
