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TOWN WARRANT

THE STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

To the Inhabitants of the Town of Fremont in the County of Rockingham, in said State, qualified to vote in Town Affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town Hall in said Fremont on Tuesday, the Fourteenth day of March, next at ten of the clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects:

1. To choose all necessary Town Officers for the year ensuing.

2. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray town charges for the ensuing year and make appropriations of the same.

3. To hear the report of the Budget Committee and to take such action under the proposed budget as the Town deems necessary.

4. To see if the Town will vote to appropriate the sum of \$175.00 for the purchase of a "Walkie-Talkie" radio transceiver for the Police Department.

5. To see if the Town will vote to change the purpose of the capital reserve fund heretofore established by vote of Town Meeting March 13, 1956, for the construction of highways and bridges to the acquisition of fire fighting apparatus and equipment.

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6. To see if the Town will vote to appropriate and spend toward the purchase of a 500 gallon pumper truck for the Fremont Fire Department the sum of \$10,400.00; of this amount, \$5,000.00 to be withdrawn from the capital reserve fund and \$5,400.00 to be raised by taxation; the balance of approximately \$3,600.00 necessary to purchase said equipment to be paid by the Fremont Firemen's Association.

7. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to sell at private sale or public auction property acquired by Tax Collector's Deed.

8. To see if the Town will vote to take title to the streets in the Duston Development known as Riverside Drive and Sunny Lane from John M. Duston and Levi E. Duston, such taking title to be dependent upon the said streets being put in condition by the developers to meet the specifications for streets in the Land Subdivision Regulations of the Town of Fremont relative to width, road bed construction and intersections.

9. To see if the Town will vote to sell to Louis Bouchard for the sum of \$125.00 a strip of land fronting approximately 50 feet on Route 107 adjoining land of said Bouchard and bounded on the west by a line extending parallel to the existing property line of said Bouchard from Route 107 to property of Richard Kelly, this piece to be in addition to the 20 foot strip authorized for sale to said Bouchard by vote of Town Meeting, March 3, 1956. 10. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to borrow money in anticipation of taxes.

11. To see what action the Town will take by ballot on the following question: "Shall the provisions of Chapter 171-A of the Revised Laws relating to playing Beano be adopted in the Town?"

12. To transact any other business that may be deemed necessary.

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REPORT OF THE FIRE CHIEF

The Department answered twenty-four calls during 1960. Several of these calls were to the Town Dump. Many times, under proper conditions and by an authorized person, fires are set there to clean-up and for sanitary reasons, but some are set by unknown persons, without permission at dangerously dry periods.

The Department is still inconvenienced by children playing with telephones and calling the fire emergency number.

Our annual carnival was a success despite rain which caused a postponement.

I am glad to report that the school runs a fire drill each month.

The interior of the fire house addition is progressing as to the matter of wiring and finish work. We are grateful to Mr. and Mrs. George Marcotte for their generous gift of the land upon which the addition is built.

We are hoping that the town will see fit to help the Fire Association purchase a new Class A Pumper. By this purchase a substantial insurance savings on family residences, plus the added protection of such a pumper would ensue. Also, at the present time — at all points where we have an adequate water supply — we do not have a pump large enough to supply a large volume of water under high pressure. We are saddened this year by the passing of Ernest LeClair—one of our Association members of long standing.

Prevention Is Your Business

Carelessness, HUMAN CARELESSNESS, causes 9 out of 10 forest fires. Each year 200,000 fires burn over 30 million acres in the United States. This represents 5 percent of our nation's woodlands being wasted each year. Every fire takes its toll. Floods follow; stream flow is affected; timber, buildings, grazing and wildlife are destroyed — all because MANY are CARELESS with fire in and near woodland. This can be remedied, YOU can put an end to this shameful waste! PREVENTION is YOUR business!

YOU, whether you be a farmer, homemaker, business or professional man or woman, municipal, state or federal official, clerk or woodsman can play an important part in the continuing and vital prevention program.

First — by setting a good example YOURSELF — being sensible and complying with the necessary laws and regulations governing the use of fire in and near woodlands.

Second — by using YOUR individual influence in your community and valued council with others in insisting and encouraging them to do likewise.

The following simple rules may be used as a guide both for YOU and for them.

 Before burning, secure a permit from your local forest fire warden — the law requires it.

- 2. Be sure to properly supervise your burning don't leave it.
- 3. Make certain your fire, camp or debris, is DEAD OUT before leaving it.
- 4. Don't throw down lighted matches, cigars or eigarettes or from moving vehicles — make sure they are out — use your ash tray.
- Don't burn at home use your town dump and save yourself much possible difficulty, both personal and financial.

THE STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

To the Inhabitants of the School District in the town of Fremont, N. H. qualified to vote in district affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town Hall in said district on the thirteenth day of March 1961, at eight o'clock in the evening to act upon the following subjects:

1. To choose a Moderator for the coming year.

2. To choose a Clerk for the ensuing year.

3. To choose a Member of the School Board for the ensuing three years.

4. To choose a Treasurer for the ensuing year.

5. To determine and appoint the salaries of the School Board and Truant Officer, and fix the compensation of any other officers or agent of the district.

6. To hear the reports of Agents, Auditors, Committees, or Officers chosen, and pass any vote relating thereto.

7. To choose Agents, Auditors and Committees in relation to any subject embraced in this warrant.

8. To see what sum of money the district will raise and appropriate for the support of schools, for the salaries of school district officials and agents, and for the payment of statutory obligations of the district, and to authorize the application against said appropriation of such sums as are estimated to be received from the state foundation aid fund together with other income; the school board to certify to the selectmen the balance between the estimated revenue and the appropriation, which balance is to be raised by taxes by the town.

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9. To see if the School District of Fremont will vote with the other Districts of Supervisory Union No. 14 to provide for the services of a Helping Teacher as provided in R.S.A. 186:11, XXII, XXIII, XXIV; as amended 1957, R.S.A. 252:2.

10. If the above vote is in the affirmative to see if the District will raise the sum of \$518.52 for salary, transportation, retirement and social security.

11. To see if the School District of Fremont will vote to establish a capital reserve fund for school building purposes, these funds to be made available at such time as the district may decide to build, or add to their present facilities; and to see if the district will vote to permit the school board to contribute to this reserve fund any surplus money that might be available at the close of this school year.

SUPERINTENDENT OF SCHOOLS REPORT

I would like to take this opportunity to thank the people of Fremont for their continued support of their educational program. It is very important at the present time to be vitally concerned about the youth of this community and continue to support education. For this reason then I would like to mention a service if Fremont were to accept in the future would greatly enhance the type of education the children would receive. I am referring to a part time guidance program that will assist teachers and parents of this community. Test data, strengths and weaknesses, and other related information will do much to help all children be a better student in our schools.

I therefore urge you to consider seriously the provision for one in the near future.

Reference is made again this year to the questions brought to your attention last year in my report to you; mainly the type of education you expect and the type you are willing to support. We still need to reduce class size to 25 or 30. We still need a program of studies. We still need a basic series in our subject areas. In addition one of the greatest needs in this Union is still help at the Union level. This is in relation to the position of Superintendent. It is unreasonable to expect anyone to fulfill all the obligations this person should fulfill as Superintendent of Schools and properly care for all the communities that are expected to be cared for in this Union. I feel it necessary to again this year request and emphasize the need for a Helping Teacher. In looking over our needs listed last year it is noted that some of them have been fulfilled. For example, we are rapidly progressing toward a program of minimum essentials and a program of studies. We have improved our basic series in the subject areas. We have evaluated and made changes and are now using a new report card. We have developed and have only recently put into use a permanent record system that is universal throughout the Union. There is being offered an inservice training program for teachers, insignificant as it is at the present time, we are providing courses to improve teaching ability.

In conclusion I would like to offer to you as parents and citizens a challenge. Let us all search ourselves and others to determine what type of school is most desirable, ask ourselves if our school presently fits these requirements, and if not attempt to create change so that it will.

SCHOOL HEALTH REPORT

To: Mr. Wade, School Board Members, and Citizens of Fremont

I am happy to report that for the first time in the history of the schools of our Union we have available the services of a speech therapist. Because Speech Therapy is a young field, this type of therapist is not available to many school systems. Speech defective children are much more numerous than we might suspect, and investigation shows that only one-sixth of them are being given the remedial instruction that they must have if they are to be helped. The response from most parents and from the P.T.A., sponsors of the program, has been enthusiastic. It is my hope that Speech Therapy will become an integral part of the school program.

Because of family responsibilities, our school doctor has had to give up her school connections on a regular basis. In spite of this, she has kindly offered to help with individual needs.

The position of Public Health Nurse no longer exists in this area. This means that preschool clinics will be discontinued unless individuals or groups in the community plan and initiate such action.

Other health services aimed at maintaining and improving the health of school children are being carried on as usual.
