### TOWN WARRANT

### THE STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

To the Inhabitants of the Town of Grafton in the County of Grafton in said State, qualified to vote in Town Affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town Hall in said Grafton on Tuesday, the seventh day of March, next, at nine of the clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects:

- 1. To choose all necessary Town Officers for the year ensuing.
- 2. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray town charges for the ensuing year and make appropriations of the same.

### ADDENDUM TO WARRANT

2(a). To vote by secret ballot on the Land Usage Ordinance proposed by the Planning Board.

### POLLS CLOSE AT 6 P.M.

Business meeting on all other articles to begin at 2 P.M.

- 3. To hear the report of the Budget Committee and act thereon.
- 4. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the following sums of money for their respective purposes as listed below:

(1)	For the control of White Pine Blister Rust	\$	50.00
(2)	For Old Home Day		50.00
(3)	For Improvement to Huff Beach		50.00
(4)	For Tree Removal and Railings	1,	100.00
(5)	For Patching and Oiling Roads	2,	00.000

(6) For an Emergency Highway Appropriation under the control of the Selectmen

(7) For Refurbishing the Town Hall

- 5. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$14,000.00 for the purpose of maintaining highways and bridges.
- 6. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$1,151.56 and thereby receive \$7,677.04 from the State for Town Road Aid.
- 7. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to borrow money in anticipation of taxes.
- 8. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to convey any real estate acquired by Tax Collectors Deed.
- 9. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$1,000.00 to be placed in the Capital Reserve Fund for the future acquisition of Highway Equipment, and to continue to raise and appropriate this amount annually.
- 10. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$300.00 to pay for the services of a clerk/book-keeper to assist the Selectmen in the performance of official duties for the fiscal year 1972-73.
- 11. Pursuant to a petition of ten or more legal voters: To see if the Town will vote to authorize and empower the Planning Board to Approve or Disapprove in its discretion new subdivisions and plats thereof showing streets, or the widening thereof, parks or other powers granted by Sections 19-29, Chapter 36 of the New Hampshire Revised Statutes annotated 1955. Upon the adoption of this article, it shall be the duty of the Town Clerk to file with the Registry of Deeds of the County of Grafton, a certificate or note showing

that the Planning Board has been so authorized as provided in Section 19, Chapter 36 of the NHRSA, 1955. On adoption of the article it shall further be the duty of the Town Clerk to issue all certificates of failure when the Planning Board shall fail to take action as provided in Chapter 36, Sections 19-29 inclusive.

- 12. Pursuant to a petition of ten or more legal voters: To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Moderator to appoint a Town Hall Committee, consisting of five citizens, one of which shall be a member of the Board of Selectmen, one of which shall be a member of the Planning Board, to study the Town Hall and Lot, determine required alterations, modifications or improvements if necessary to adequately serve the needs of the Town and report to the Town not later than January 1, 1973 of its findings and recommendations.
- 13. Pursuant to a petition of ten or more legal voters: To see if the Town will vote to accept the road leading in back of Kilton Pond as a town road from where the town road now ends to the cottage of Eugene Beard, and assume the summer and winter maintenance of the same.
- 14. Pursuant to a petition of ten or more legal voters: To see if the Town will vote to apply hard surfacing or widen and improve the section of road, commencing at William's Hill, south, to Robinson's Corner, and widen and improve the section of road from Robinson's Corner, northwest, up Prescott Hill to Carpenter's Corner a stretch of road constituting approximately 3 miles in all. Funds for the work to be drawn from State Road Aid, or such other sources as available for this purpose, to be done after the Height of Land Road.
- 15. Pursuant to a petition of ten or more legal voters: To see if the Town will vote to direct the Board of Selectmen to conduct the business of the annual town meeting (other than conducted by ballot) beginning at 7:30 P.M. on the day

of the annual town meeting, to take effect in 1973 and each year thereafter.

- 16. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$2,000.00 for culverts.
- 17. To see if the Town will vote to pay one-half  $(\frac{1}{2})$  the 1971 property taxes by June first, 1972 and the balance due when the tax bills for 1972 are sent.
- 18. To take any vote to transact any further business that may legally come before said meeting.

### REPORT OF THE FOREST FIRE WARDEN and DISTRICT CHIEF

#### LEST WE FORGET - IT CAN HAPPEN HERE

Disastrous forest and brush fires that destroy hundreds of homes are more prevalent on the West Coast with their dry seasons and strong dry hot winds, but 25 years ago this Fall is the anniversary of a disaster that devastated large areas of northern New England, leaving villages in ashes with rows of cellar holes and chimneys in a number of summer vacation home locations. Many lives were lost on that destructive day of October 23, 1947, and nothing could stop the wind-driven flames.

It is true that such conditions are unusual for New Hampshire but they happened once, they can happen again. The fuel for fires is all around us. All it takes is a firebrand. Only by cultivating a habit of carefulness with fires at all times can we meet the challenge of protection when dry conditions prevail. Please let these reminders be your guide:

- 1. Never, either when walking, riding or driving- discard a firebrand a lighted match or a glowing cigarette.
- 2. Always obtain a permit for any outside burning. The burning of household rubbish is not permitted if your town has rubbish collection. Burning of grass or garden litter can be dangerous. See your warden first.
- 3. If you camp or picnic, be sure open fires are allowed and if they are, put them *dead out* when leaving.
- 4. Most Important Instruct your children in the danger of the lighted match. A lighted match and dry grass or forest litter is a dangerous combination which leads to destructive loss and can lead to tragedy.

The past year — 1971 — was a favorable year for the control of fires. There were too many fire starts in some towns.

We thank those who remembered and ask others to heed Smokey's message.

#### MASCOMA AREA HEALTH COUNCIL

The Mascoma Area Health Council, ending its second full year of service to Canaan, Enfield, Grafton and Orange, reports that during the calendar year 1971 its visiting nurses made 1,353 calls at the homes of area residents for nursing service and health promotion. In addition, the Council provided free of charge for all pre-schoolers of the Towns 3 immunization clinics, 1 clinic for the testing of hearing and vision, and 5 well child conference clinics (at which each child received a full physical examination by a doctor or pediatrician). Defects and deficiencies discovered in the course of these clinics were discussed with parents and referred to further testing and treatment. The Council is at present maintaining a schedule of one free well child conference clinic each month, with a goal of having each child examined regularly from birth to school age.

The Council, founded in 1969, employs two nurses, who share the work load to give the area the equivalent of one full time nurse, maintaining a public health program and home nursing service. Mrs. Gertrude Clark, R.N., of Grafton, and Mrs. Toni Sadowsky, R.N., of West Lebanon, are the present nurses. Mrs. Clark has been with the Council since early in its history. For the first two years of its existence the Council was aided by a Grant from the State of New Hampshire to cover the salary of one of the two nurses. The four Towns served have contributed on the basis of population. It appears that the State Grant will not be available for the coming year.

The Council maintains its office at Mascoma Valley Regional High School, with its own telephone (632-7234). Its services are available to all, regardless of ability to pay. It is dependent on, and grateful to, the Methodist Churches of Canaan and Enfield and St. Mary's Catholic Church of Enfield, which have provided space for its clinics, and to Mascoma Valley Regional High School for its office space there. A pamphlet describing the Council and its work and services is available on request.

#### Town of Grafton, New Hampshire

#### LAND USAGE ORDINANCE

#### SECTION I — GENERAL CONDITIONS

- 1.1 This ordinance is designed to insure the health, safety and general welfare of the residents of the Town of Grafton. Its intention is to protect the value of property, and to encourage the present and future development of the Town.
- 1.2 This ordinance shall not apply to any existing usage of land or subdivision thereof or any existing buildings or structures to the extent to which they were used or in existence at the time of adoption of this ordinance.
- 1.3 Subsequent to the adoption of this ordinance the minimum lot size within a new subdivision for any land usage shall be one acre.
- 1.4 A permit issued by the Board of Selectmen shall be required to erect any building or structure, or to set in place any trailer or mobile home.
- 1.5 Amendments to this ordinance may be made following similar procedures undertaken for its adoption in accordance with NHRSA 31.63a, and b.
- 1.6 On enactment of this ordinance the Selectmen shall appoint a Board of Adjustment as provided for in the NHRSA, Chapter 31.66. The Board shall follow those duties and procedures as outlined in NHRSA Chapter 31.67-89.
- 1.7 Commercial or industrial usages of land shall not be undertaken unless they are approved by the Planning Board as provided for in Section II Para. 2.3 of this ordinance.

1.8 This ordinance shall not apply to land usage or structures associated with agricultural activities.

#### SECTION II - PERMITS

- 2.1 The fee for a compliance permit shall be \$5.00 for any new construction, either dwelling or accessory building, or \$2.00 for an addition or alteration to an existing structure. The fee shall be apportioned one-half to the Land Administrator and one-half to be retained by the Town to cover the necessary expenses incurred during the administration of this Ordinance.
- 2.2 The application for a land usage compliance permit shall be accompanied by a plot plan, indicating clearly and accurately the location, intent, and scope of land use.
- 2.3 Application for permit shall be filed with the Town Selectmen, who shall in turn direct such applications to the Planning Board for appropriate action. Action indicating approval or disapproval shall be taken by the Planning Board within a reasonable period of time, but in no case later than 90 days following the date of filing.

#### SECTION III — ENFORCEMENT AND ADMINISTRATION

- 3.1 A land use administrator shall be appointed for a term of three years by the Selectmen. He shall administer and enforce this Ordinance literally and shall not have the authority to permit a land usage which does not conform therewith. The land use administrator shall constitute a public agency as provided for in the NHRSA, Section 48, Para. A:3 sub. (c). The land administrator shall enforce the Statutes of the State of New Hampshire as they apply to the control of pollution and environmental conditions in conjunction with the Town Ordinance.
- 3.2 No person shall undertake land usage or construction in the Town of Grafton without an approved permit, issued

by the Selectmen. A copy of each permit shall be filed with the Selectmen and a suitable placard will be issued for posting at the land usage site.

- 3.3 Violators of this ordinance shall be fined an amount of \$50.00 for each offense. No action may be brought unless the alleged offender has received at least seven days' notice by certified mail that a violation exists. Each day that a violation is continued shall constitute a separate offense. Fines collected shall be paid one-half to the Town General Fund and one-half to the administrator.
- 3.4 The Selectmen shall institute in the name of the Town any action, injunction, or other process as required to abate, restrain, or correct a land use or construction which violates the ordinance.
- 3.5 Interested parties may appeal a decision or action taken or failure to act, by filing a notice of appeal with the Board of Adjustment. Notice must be filed within 30 days of the date of such decision or act and a copy shall be filed with the Selectmen. The appeal procedure shall be as outlined in Chapter 31:66-89, NHRSA 1955.
