#### SELECTMEN'S REPORT

1985 has been a year of significant growth and change in our busy community. At long last, in appropriate coincidence with Hampstead's official celebration, the Fire Department-sponsored Christmas parade, the official dedication and open house of the new central fire facility was held. The event attracted nearly 5,000 people, with more communities than ever before participating in the parade of multi-colored engines, floats and organizations. Ribbon cutting ceremonies were followed by warmly-received and appreciated refreshments and inspection of all equipment, including the newly-purchased tanker and Rescue Vehicle.

1985 also saw a small, but well-received, revival of the Memorial Day parade, a tradition we hope to see grow and prosper in the future. The Scots Highlander Bagpipe Band, along with the Hampstead Middle School performed an excellent concert, followings remarks by Rev. Robert Dobson, Marshal Frank Cotter and State Senator William Bartlett.

Work has begun on renovation of the former firehouse, which will soon become the first permanent home of the Hampstead Police Department. This should be completed by late spring of 1986.

The Town Office Building, Meeting House and Library all received new coats of paint, and all generally agree that these improvements have had great positive impact on the appearance of our already beautiful community.

Distribution of butter, cheese, powdered milk and flour took place at various times during the year in cooperation with the Rockingham Community Action Program. Also in cooperation with various county and state agencies, highway litter was removed from all streets in Hampstead and surrounding communities, and we express our gratitude and commendations for a job well done.

One of the most significant changes in the nature of town operations has been the closing of the land-fill area and the signing of a contract with Cate Rubbish Removal of Raymond to assume responsibility for weekly pick-up of trash. This operation has worked more smoothly than most might have anticipated, but only the future will tell what this immense change will mean in terms of services and tax dollars. State-mandated regulations have had significant effect on what we as town officials can do in this area, and work constantly progresses as we meet with surrounding communities with similar problems.

The Civic Club of Hampstead has generously volunteered to assume responsibility for the care and scheduling of the Memorial Gymnasium, on of the busiest facilities controlled by the town. This will greatly enhance and improve conditions both in and around this valuable town asset.

Hampstead has at present one full-time police officer, added early this year. Even with this new expense, plus the approval of several thousands of dollars in special articles and quite a number of unanticipated emergencies, we are proud to have realized a tax increase of only \$1.31 per thousand for the year. This can only be attributed to steady but controlled growth, and a good deal of hard and efficient work by many people.

Space prevents the many more changes and additions made to enhance our town, but let it suffice to say that Hampstead will continue to prosper, especially with the cooperation of so many dedicated volunteers and employees, whose every action appears directed to making this community the best of its kind.

Our thanks to all, again, who because of space, remain nameless, but to whom we owe an immeasurable debt of gratitude.

#### REPORT TO THE TOWN — 1985

In 1985 the Board reviewed 46 proposals. There were thirteen site plans for new businesses or additions to existing businesses. Nineteen subdivisions were submitted for approval. There were 173 lots approved and 59 were released to be built upon. Woodland Pond, a major subdivision consisting of 89 lots and four roads was approved. None of these lots have been released to be built upon. Ten lots in previously approved subdivisions were also released. The Board approved eleven plans showing lot line revisions.

These plats are on file in the Town Clerk's Office and in the Office of the Planning Board. This office is open for the public on Monday and Wednesday from 10 to 12 each morning. The Code Enforcement Officer also receives a copy of each plat approved. The original inking is recorded at the Registry of Deeds in Exeter, NH.

Meetings of the Planning Board at which Public Hearings are held take place on the first Monday of each month. A worksession is scheduled on the third Monday and other meetings can be scheduled as needed. All meetings are open to the public and begin at 7:00 PM.

## POLICE DEPARTMENT REPORT

The year 1985 was one of continued progress for your Police Department. In November, F. Carl Rogers was graduated from the N.H. Police Standards and Training Council Academy to become your first certified full time Police Officer. In December work was started on renovations to the old Fire House which will hopefully become our new home in 1986. These accomplishments will aide us in our continuing endeavors to provide services to you the people of Hampstead.

A total of 121 motor vehicle accidents were investigated; this is an increase of about 15% due to the sharp increase of traffic through our town. Eight burglaries, seven motor vehicle thefts, sixteen missing persons (14 located) and three assaults were recorded. This is a slight decrease from previous years yet we are very happy as our population has increased greatly so this is actually a much greater decrease. False alarms continued to be a problem as we responded to 118 home and business alarms which proved to be false. This not only costs each taxpayer but increases the risks to your Officers. If you have an alarm system please make sure it is working properly and have continual checks by your alarm company.

Calls for services showed a marked increase, again due to our rapid population growth.

Many thanks to all Town Officials, other Departments, you the people and especially to our Officers and their families for the many sacrifices that they make so that we may better serve you.

## REPORT TO THE TOWN — 1985

Hampstead enjoyed relatively low damage due to fires in 1985. Good equipment and proper training have served the town well. Several structure fires were stopped with minimum fire or water damage. Each fireman knows his job and reacts to the situation found at the fire scene as he has been trained to do. This eliminates a loss of time due to confusion and minimizes property damage.

Repeatedly we have seen that smoke detectors provide an early warning to homeowners which results in the quickest alarm to the fire department. This saves lives and homes. We urge everyone to put in reliable smoke detectors and make sure they are operating correctly and that the batteries are good.

Part of our training program is participating in mutual aid drills with the surrounding towns. This summer we hosted a mutual aid live burn at the Huggins house on Central Street. Using condemned buildings for this type of training allows the new as well as the veteran firefighters to experience the heat, smoke and fury of an actual fire. The tactics of firefighting have to be practiced so they are effective when they are needed. The video camera is used to film these training sessions and later reviewed. This allows constructive criticism after the smoke has cleared. Both the fire department and the rescue squad employ this technique for training.

The new tanker-pumper arrived in November, this replaces Tank 7. This truck, Tank 6, is a Class A tanker which will be used for transporting water and pumping as a water supply truck or serving as an attack truck at a fire scene. It is a custom designed chassis with an all aluminum body for long service life. We have already used it several times in Town, as well as in mutual-aid fires with our neighbors.

A number of woods and grass fires this year were due to improper disposal of stove ashes. Hot ashes, either wood or coal, should be stored outside in a covered metal container until they have cooled to a temperature that is not a fire hazard. Ashes stored in a mound or bucket will retain heat for several days. One structure was heavily damaged by fire and smoke which was the

direct result of hot ashes not being disposed of properly.

Early spring saw the construction started on the new fire station. Howard Construction moved along through the building process at a good pace and by late summer the members of the fire department were able to begin the interior painting. We also provided all the labor to paint and finish off the meeting room upstairs. A special thanks has to go to the Board of Selectmen for their support and help in procuring money to complete the fire station. Two men, Bill Cross and Roy Lesure who have special expertise in the fields of electronics and telephone systems, donated many hours setting up these special systems. We feel that Hampstead has one of the best fire stations in the area and the cost was reasonable.

We have just completed the first full calendar year with the Derry Fire Department providing the dispatching for Hampstead. This is one of the most important functions of any emergency service. A mistake in relaying information form the calling party to the responding personnel could be fatal. The Board of Engineers feels that Derry provides Hampstead with the highest caliber of service available.

This past year we worked with the Hampstead Police on two lost person searches. Both were brought to a successful conclusion in a very few hours. A tip for parents would be to familiarize their children with the area in which they live.

When Hampstead was brushed by hurricane Gloria the Rescue Squad and Fire Department were ready and worked in co-operation with Civil Defense Director Kinney. An emergency shelter was set up at the Middle School and manned by school personal and members of the Rescue Squad for the duration of the storm. Nesan, Inc. made a front end loader and an operator available to us which we used to clear trees off houses. East Coast Lumber sent a truckload of plywood to the firehouse to be used to close up damaged buildings. During a time of need, it is good to know that this community pulls together.

# REPORT OF TOWN FOREST FIRE WARDENS AND STATE FOREST RANGER — 1985

Between July 1984 and June 1985, we experienced more forest fires throughout our state than in in year in the last 50. Two of the leading causes of the 1,605 fires were children and fires kindled without written permission of a Forest Fire Warden. Both causes are preventable, but only with your help.

Please help our town and state forest fire officials with forest fire prevention. Contact your Forest Fire Warden for more information.

Enforcement of state timber harvest regulations is the responsibility of State Forestry officials. Our state has excellent timber harvest regulations; however, your assistance is needed.

If you know of a logging operation and suspect a state timber harvest law may be violated, call your Forest Fire Warden.

If you own forest land, you will become responsible for the timber tax payment starting April 1, 1986. This is a change in the Timber Tax Law that will impact all forest landowners. Contact your Board of Selectmen for timber tax forms.

It has been a very busy year for your Rescue Squad.

In March we received our long awaited new Frontline Rescue

Vehicle. After several weeks of outfitting and debugging,

it was put in service as our prime response vehicle. The

older rescue vehicle is now kept in the station as backup

for a second simultaneous call or a call serious enough to

require additional equipment.

In October we moved to our new quarters in the new fire station. We now have our own office and a storeroom for medical supplies and training equipment.

In December we received part of the Hurst Jaws-of-Life system. In just several weeks they were used to extricate motor vehicle victims on two occasions.

In 1985 we responded to 174 calls for medical assistance which involved treating 208 people. The breakdown was as follows:

# 1986 TOWN WARRANT TOWN OF HAMPSTEAD, N.H.

To the Inhabitants of the Town of Hampstead in the County of Rockingham in said State, qualified to vote in Town Affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the Memorial Gymnasium in said Hampstead on Tuesday, the 11th day of March, next at ten of the clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects:

- 1. To choose all necessary Town Officers for the year ensuing.
- 2. To choose all necessary School Officers for the year ensuing.
- 3. To see if the town will vote to amend Article II of the Zoning Ordinance by adding: "All lots proposed for development in the Town of Hampstead shall be rectangular in shape whenever possible."

Recommended by the Planning Board.

4. To see if the town will vote to amend Article XIX of the Zoning Ordinance by deleting the words "The BOCA Basic Building Code, Eighth Edition, 1981" wherever they appear and substituting therefore the words "The BOCA Basic National Building Code, Ninth Edition, 1984" wherever they appear and making the appropriate text changes to correspond with the 1984 edition.

Recommended by the Planning Board.

- 5. To see if the town will vote to amend the Zoning Ordinance by:
  - A. Amending Article X to read:

**PROLOGUE:** In order to insure the provision of a variety of housing opportunities, especially for the young and the elderly of Hampstead, the erection of multiple unit dwelling structures shall be permitted within Zone A.

TRACT SIZE: Any tract for development of multiple unit dwelling structures shall have a minimum of ten contiguous acres.

**DEVELOPMENT CRITERIA:** Such multiple unit dwelling development proposals shall have a minimum of twenty dwelling units.

**LOT SIZE:** Minimum lot sizes for multiple unit dwelling structures shall be based upon soils capability for adequately treating domestic wastewater, without adversely affecting adjacent wells, surface water or otherwise compromising the residential quality of life.

**DENSITY:** Density shall be one third of the density calculated when using the procedures and standards set forth in the regulations established by the New Hampshire Water Supply and Pollution Control Commission, Administrative Rules, Ch. WS 1000.03, 1000.04, and 1000.05.

**SOIL TYPE DETERMINATION:** Determination of on site soil conditions shall be required of the applicant and shall be determined by a qualified soil scientist as designated by the Rockingham County Conservation District.

**SETBACKS:** Every multiple unit dwelling structure shall be located not less than 100 feet from the nearest pre-existing public right-of-way. Every multiple unit dwelling structure shall be set back from the property lines at least 50 (fifty) feet.

**SCREENING:** Abutting properties shall be protected by appropriate screening of the adjacent multiple unit dwelling structures, as required by the Planning Board.

**APPROVAL:** The final approval of the subdivision for multiple unit dwelling structures is subject to and conditional upon site plan and subdivision review by the Planning Board. It shall be the responsibility of the Code Enforcement Officer to insure that the conditions and/or restrictions of this ordinance have been fulfilled.

**HEIGHT:** No dwelling shall be built to a height of more than two and one-half stories.

B. Amending Article XX, Section 4 to read:

Multiple Unit Dwelling Structure: A building or portion thereof containing two or more dwelling units occupied exclusively for residential purposes, but not including trailers or mobile homes, however mounted, or commercial accommodations for transient occupancy.

Recommended by the Planning Board.

- 6. To see if the town will vote to amend the Zoning Ordinance by:
  - A. Amending Article II, Section VIII, replacing B2, B3, and B4 with:
    - 2. Accessory use: Home Occupation. A permit for a home occupation shall be allowed in the residential zone by special exception from the Board of Adjustment if the occupation complies with the following:
      - a. A proposed occupation shall be incidental and secondary to the use of the property as a dwelling and shall not change the residential character of the premises.
      - b. No home occupation shall take place in a multi-family dwelling unless exempted from permit requirements.
      - c. The occupation may be carried on by the occupant's immediate family residing at the location and by not more than two additional employees.
      - d. There shall be no physical evidence of equipment or materials visible to abutters outside the dwelling.
      - e. No home occupation that may be obnoxious or injurious by reason of the production or emmission of odor, dust, smoke, refuse matter, fumes, noise vibrations, or similar conditions, safety of the community or lending to its disturbance or annoyance shall be allowed.
      - f. A permit to operate a home occupation shall be issued to the owner only and is not transferable to a subsequent owner.
      - g. The applicant shall complete and sign a form that sets forth the nature of the home occupation and provides details of the business and scope of operation. This may include any of the customary home occupations such as dress making, millinery, or the work of any member of a recognized lawful profession, as well as an occupation such as builder, carpenter, mason, painter, plumber, tinsmith, upholsterer, or machinist who lives and maintains a home on the premises or buildings thereon in connection with his trade.
      - h. Home occupations in which neither customers nor vehicles come to the location where the business activity takes place and at which no sign is displayed, and agricultural activity, including farming are exempt from permit requirements.
      - i. Nature of permit:
        - 1. All permits for Home Occupations shall be issued by the Board of Adjustment.
        - 2. Prior to the issuance of a permit, the Board of Adjustment shall hold a public hearing and abutters will be notified of the time and date of the hearing by certified mail, such letter to include a description of the home occupation applied for and its location.
        - 3. Before a permit is granted, a mandatory building inspection shall be made by the town if the public is to be served at the proposed location. In addition, the Board of Adjustment may require a formal site plan review by the Planning Board prior to issuance of a permit if deemed necessary.
        - 4. No more than one business permit can be in effect for one location.
        - 5. A permit is valid only for the owner occupant and location for which it is issued.
        - 6. Periodic inspections of the home occupation premises may be required subsequent to the issuance of a permit in order to confirm compliance with the conditions of the original special exception granted. If, in the opinion of the Building Inspector and/or Board of Adjustment, the business practices originally set forth and defined in the initial approval have changed, it shall revoke the permit that was issued. Permit holders whose permits are revoked may make application to the Board of Adjustment for a new permit on changed circumstances of the business.
        - 7. All current home occupations will have one year to comply with this regulation.
  - B. Amending Article XX to add:

Home occupation. Shall mean the accessory use of the dwelling and/or lot for business nature conducted by the owner thereof which is clearly secondary to the dwelling use for living purposes,

and which does not change the character thereof and is not detrimental to the adjacent properties or neighbor.

**School:** An educational institution for children. Day care centers and nursery centers are excluded from this definition for the purposes of this ordinance."

Recommended by the Planning Board.

7. To see if the town will vote to amend the Zoning Ordinance to include Recreation Camping areas and add:

All recreational vehicles, tents and camp shelters shall be located in an approved campground, and shall comply with the requirements of the State of New Hampshire. Nothing herein shall prevent land from being utilized, maintained or operated as a recreational campground, provided that the campground meets the following requirements: All campgrounds shall conform to the following standards:

- a. All campgrounds shall be permitted to operate only from April 15 through November 15.
- b. Campsites and facilities shall be no closer than 500 feet from an existing residence.
- c. Before any campground can be constructed, entrances and exits will be established with the following minimum characteristics:
  - 1. They will be a minimum of 25 feet wide.
- d. Before any campground can be constructed, a buffer zone of 500 feet from lot lines for the entire perimeter of the parcel shall be maintained in its natural state. In the absence of natural screening, additional buffer zone requirements may be imposed by the Planning Board.
- e. Campground sign(s) will conform to a maximum of 9 square feet and be limited to one sign for each entrance.
- f. Site Plan Review and approval by the Planning Board shall be required.

Prior to the granting of an Occupancy Permit, written approval of the State Board of Health shall be furnished certifying that all facilities for water supply, toilets, sewage disposal, and solid waste disposal comply with the Board's requirements.

Permitted Accessory Buildings in a camping area shall be limited to the following:

- a. An office for the manager and staff of the campground and an office providing adequate First Aid facilities, both of which may be in a dwelling or service building.
- b. A service building, not to exceed 1,500 square feet of gross floor area, which may contain equipment and supplies, recreation rooms, and a shop for convenience goods primarily for the occupants of the campground, provided that no advertising device is visible from a street or from adjacent lots.
- c. A service building or buildings for toilets and shower facilities.
- d. Service buildings to accommodate bathers at beach or pool sites.
- e. Additional requirements may be imposed by the planning board for any other buildings or structures incidental to the recreational aspects of the campground.
- f. No accessory building shall be located closer than 500 feet from lot lines and 300 feet from the water.

By petition.

Recommended by the Planning Board.

8. To see if the town will vote to construct and furnish an addition to, and to make associated renovations to the present Town Library; and authorize the town to issue bonds or notes pursuant to NH RSA 33 in the amount of Four Hundred and Twenty Five thousand dollars (\$425,000) to pay for said construction, furnishing and renovation expansion program.

9. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray town charges for the ensuing year and make appropriations of the same.

- 13. To see if the town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to dispose of by public sale any real estate acquired by the town through Tax Collector's deeds, excluding those parcels of real estate which the Conservation Commission recommends for retention in the best interest of the town, as provided in RSA 80:42a.
- 14. To authorize the Library Trustees to accept, expend and apply any gifts or donations made to the Trustees for the purpose of building, furnishing, or renovating the existing library, as set forth in article 11 and to make application for and to receive and spend in the name of the town library any grants or other funds as may now, or hereafter, be forthcoming from Federal, State, local or private agencies that would be of benefit to this library expansion program.
- 15. To see if the town will vote to expend from Revenue Sharing funds the sum of \$5,000.00 to be added to the \$2,500.00 voted in 1985 for the purchase of furniture for the new Police Station.

- 16. To see if the town will vote to expend from Revenue Sharing funds the sum of \$2,500.00 for lights and sirens for the police cruisers. Recommended by the Budget Committee.
- 17. To see if the town will vote to expend from Revenue Sharing funds the sum of \$20,000.00 for the purchase of an IBM System 36 computer to replace the current system 23.

To see if the town will vote to oppose the burial, storage, transportation and production of high level radioactive waste in the town of Hampstead and State of New Hampshire; and to call upon Congress to conduct an independent investigation with full public participation into the feasibility and prudence of the US Department of Energy's (DOE's) present plan to dispose of radioactive waste and into the DOE's competence to carry out such a plan.

By petition.

- 35. To see if the town will vote to adopt the provision of RSA 72:37 for the exemption for the blind from property tax. This statute provides that every inhabitant who is legally blind shall be exempt each year from the property tax on a residence to the value of \$15,000.00.
- 36. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$5,000.00 for reappraisal of town property.

INVENTORIES are mandatory. They must be filed with the Selectmen on or before April 15th. Forms are distributed by mail.

VETERANS should understand that it is their responsibility to request forms for tax exemption. The Green Card is a permanent record and must be filed only once. However, in order to receive the exemption each year, the Inventory must be filled in, signed and in the hands of the Selectmen before April 15th.

ELDERLY EXEMPTION APPLICATION. For persons over 65 who think they may be eligible and who have not received the exemption before, forms may be obtained from the Selectmen and returned by April 15th. The Green Card is a permanent record and must be filed only once. However, in order to receive the exemption each year, the Inventory must be filled in and in the hands of the Selectmen before April 15th.

THE SELECTMEN meet in their office in the Town Office Building on the second and fourth Monday of each month at 8:00 PM.

THE PLANNING BOARD Regular Meeting is held on the first Monday of every month at 7:00 PM.

THE BOARD OF ADJUSTMENT meets on the first Thursday of every month at 7:00 PM.

### **AUDITOR'S REPORT**

For the first time, the firm of Lawrence B. Martin, Certified Public Accountant, was retained by the Town of Hampstead to conduct the annual audit for the year ending December 31, 1985.

Copies of Mr. Martin's bound report are available at the Town Office during normal business hours.





The Hampstead Library, like other town departments, has felt the increase in population in an already cramped building. Approximately 51% of the townspeople are active card holders, with 341 new registrants (either single membership or family) causing a 38% increase in registrations over the prior year. Circulation was 22,902 items, of which 54% were adult, 46% children. This is an increase over 1984 of 17%. People using the library for a variety of services increased by 20%. Fewer programs were offered so that the childrens' room need not be closed during peak study times, and our opening now on Monday afternoons helps to distribute available seating for in-house study. These additional hours also help us to meet minimum requirements for a town of our population set by the N.H. Public Library Standards. Unfortunately, many services that a library of today should offer can be offered only on a small scale or not be offered at all. For example, we are far behind in our ability to use the statewide computer network for research and information retrieval and interlibrary loan.

Work is progressing on the cataloguing of the fiction collection, although we cannot devote the necessary time to it. Our goal is to complete this task by March of 1987. We have, however, inventoried our non-fiction holdings in the adult area.

We appreciate the support of the many town organizations. The Mother's Club continues to conduct our pre-school story hour and to present gifts of "Birth Day" books. They have also donated monies to the Library Improvement Fund for future use in the children's area. The Lioness Club has given additional books on tape, which are enjoyed by many patrons, and many townspeople have donated books and magazines to the library collection. The Garden Club continues to care for our window boxes. We especially thank Elsie Miller, Elaine David, and Margaret Noonan for their hours of working in the library.

Exhibits this year were displayed by Pam Hartung (stained glass);

Becky Rooney (storybook dolls); the Unified Arts classes of the

Hampstead schools; Donna Tilton's art students; Douglas Keyerleber

(Indian memorabilia); 4-H; local quilters; and by resident photographers

and artists. Programs were conducted by Susan Hastings (sewing); Rev.

Robert Dobson (covered bridges); N.H. Cooperative Extension(nutrition);

Jackie Sakash (transfer painting); Pam Hartung (cut 'n pierced lamp
shades); Kathe Cussen (sceence story hour) and Adele Trested (monthly

workshops for children).

The summer reading program was most successful and Glowia Rothe led the pre-school story hours, with Adele Trested conducting special craft programs.

The Friends of the Library, led by Gloria Lanning, had a very rewarding year. They sponsored the summer reading programs, Hollyhock Thrift Shop, the pass to the Boston Museum of Fine Arts, and a Christmas Walk. At no cost to the town, the Friends donated the money for the preliminary architectural sketches for the proposed addition to the library.

Mrs. Rooney, the staff, and the Trustees continue to attend local, regional, and state meetings, as well as professional enrichment work-chops for the benefit of the library. We continue to have access to items not owned by our library through Inter-library loan from the State Library and the Merri-Hill-Rock Library Cooperative, of which we are a member.

Efforts by the Board of Trustees to ensure the soundness of the building and the fulfillment of all necessary responsibilities charged to them through the N.H. State Library Laws has consumed a great deal of their time. Their thoroughness and conscientiousness is a vital element in the operation, functioning, and growth of your town library.

The Building Committee has met nearly every week for the past year and a warrant article for an addition to the library will be presented

at the March meeting. To insure adequate library services now and in the future, we encourage you to vote for this addition.

We were sorry to accept the resignation of Marianne Crowell and happy to welcome Judi Crowley and substitutes Barbara McIntire and Jhan Hennessey. Sally Hartikka and my assistant B. Joyce Miller maintain a high level of service and we will all continue to try to service the community in every way possible.

## TOWN REPORT FROM DERRY VISITING NURSE ASSOCIATION

The Derry Visiting Nurse Association has proudly served the Town of Hampstead since 1973. The following and many other factors combine to continually demand that this agency be effective and flexible in responding to your community's home care needs.

a rapidly growing population earlier hospital discharges longer life spans and an aging population escalating costs of health care increasing emphasis on on prevention New Hampshire tradition of self reliance

The Derry VNA has a long proven record of serving participating communities with professional excellence and human caring. Services are offered under three major areas as follows.

ACUTE CARE SERVICES including acute nursing, physical therapy, occupational therapy, speech therapy, home health aide services, and other specialized services.

DAILY SUPPORT SERVICES including maintenance nursing, homemaker services, home health aide services, respite care, chore services, in home day care, and other specialized services.

HEALTH PROMOTION SERVICES including well child clinics, immunization clinics, expectant parent classes, new born visits, senior health clinics, public screening services, health promotion classes, worker health, home visits, and other services.

The total value of all services delivered by DVNA in Hampstead last year was over \$52,248. For every dollar allocated by your town to DVNA, town residents received \$5.56 worth of service. Town allocations for DVNA are used in the following ways.

Town funding allows the agency to access Medicare, Medicaid, block grants, Title XX and state funding. Town allocations are used to make up loses or deficits in these funding sources. The deficits in these funding sources are growing larger with each year.

Federal funds, insurance and grants usually are restricted to specific categories of illness, age, income, and for time period. Increasingly, people who need services simply do not fit those specific eligibility categories. Town funds are used to subsidize services to these people.

Town funding supports the overall quality of life in this area of the state by emphasizing human dignity, independence, healthy life styles, self reliance, community networking, and family values.

# TOWN REPORT OF THE NEWMARKET REGIONAL HEALTH CENTER

The Newmarket Regional Health Center will complete its fifteenth year of service in the Spring of 1986. The Newmarket Regional Health Center operates two medical offices, one in Newmarket and the other in Raymond, the Lamprey River Clinic. Both facilities provide general medical care, preventive health services, community outreach, social services and short-term counseling with referral to area mental health agencies.

In January the new facility of the Lamprey River Clinic opened on Route 27 in Raymond. The new 6,200 sq. ft. facility will allow the Health Center to provide more services in a spacious and modern facility to the residents of the Raymond area. The renovation and expansion of the Newmarket center is scheduled to begin in the Spring of 1986.

In 1985, Edward Benoit, M.D., a family practitioner, joined the staff as did Cynthia Rasmussen, M.D., an obstetrician/gynecologist. Other members of the medical staff include Sarah Oxnard, M.D., Karen Brainard, M.D., Michael Lewis, PA-C., Barbara Janeway, M.S.N., A.R.N.P. and Anne Fawcett, A.R.N.P. The medical team also includes registered nurses, medical assistants, and community health workers. The Health Center is affiliated with the Exeter Hospital where patients needing hospital care are admitted.

The Health Center offers a Prenatal Program under the direction of Dr. Rasmussen, which includes prenatal, delivery and postpartum care. In addition, the Health Center offers nutritional counseling and prenatal classes.

The community health workers coordinate a school health program and preventive screening clinics to detect potential health hazards. They hold informative workshops and act as liaisons between the medical providers and patients.

The Newmarket Regional Health Center also operates a Self-Care Program for the Elderly in conjunction with the Occupational Therapy Department of the University of New Hampshire. The purpose of this program is to enable the elderly to stay in their home setting as well as to maintain a quality of life and independent status within their community. The focus of the program is to provide self-care skills before disability occurs and to anticipate problems with functional activities. The Newmarket Regional Health Center continues to operate the Senior Citizen Transportation Program. Three of the five buses are equipped with hydraulic lifts to

provide services to the handicapped. The transportation service enables senior citizens to remain independent, self-sufficient and active by providing the means to needed services, including medical, food shopping and recreational trips. #### FAMILY MEDIATION PROGRAM REPORT

Family Mediation of Southern Rockingham County has continued to provide essential, cost-effective services to the communities of Atkinson, Danville, Hampstead, Kingston, Newton and Plaistow during 1985. The program serves as a juvenile court diversion program for juveniles and their families who are experiencing conflict at home, at school or in the community. It also operates as an effective alternative to court-ordered placements of juveniles.

In 1985 the program worked with fifty-six area juveniles and their families. Services provided included not only mediation but referrals, case management, advocacy and crisis intervention. Funded by the six communities and the Hampstead-Timberlane United Fund, the program is able to offer these services to any area juvenile and family free of charge. As a direct result of this, many families have utilized the program successfully, resolving issues without the need for court intervention and/or possible placement of the juvenile outside of the home. Placements not only affect the family and community financially, but emotionally as well.

At this time I would like to acknowledge the tremendous work being accomplished by the program's mediators and Board of Directors, all of whom are area residents who give their time and efforts voluntarily. The success of their program is firmly based on their concern and dedication to preserving families in their communities, and without them this program could not function.

We look forward to another year of involvement with local families and hope that area residents will continue to support the work being done by this program.

#### 1985 ANNUAL REPORT

The main focus of the Conservation Commission in 1985 was the identification and continued protection of town wetlands due to a dramatic increase in development. Nancy Rendall, Environmental Consultant, was contracted to locate, map and evaluate town wetlands exceeding one acre in size or smaller parcels exhibiting unique biological, historical or educational characteristics. One hundred fifteen such areas were identified. A detailed map (1 to 500'scale) was a product of this study and will be utilized by the town Planning Board, Conservation Commission and N.H. Wetlands Board for continued protection of our wetland areas. The second phase of this project is an in-depth evaluation of fifty-two wetland parcels.

Sixteen Dredge and Fill applications were processed by Conservation Commission members, with on-site inspections, follow-up reports to the N.H Wetlands Board, Planning Board and Code Enforcement Officer, and attendance at appropriate hearings.

The Hampstead Conservation Area trails were in constant use due to an increase in public awareness. Educational classes were provided for area nursery schools, the Readiness class at Hampstead Central School and selected elementary school students from neighboring towns. Participants in Project Conserve, sponsored by the Society for Protection of N.H. Forests, learned field trip techniques using the trail system as an outdoor classroom. Annual maintenance of the Hampstead Conservation Area included trail mowing, mowing of selected fields on a rotational basis, completion of trail marker installation and general "clean-up" following Hurrican Gloria.

Tom Neff, Consulting Forester, has provided us with forest management plans for the Moore and Coombs lot and the Town Forest. Boundary surveys and forestry plans were completed for three East Hampstead timbered parcels.

We again co-sponsored the annual Fishing Derby at Shop Pond with the Hampstead Civic Club with matching fish donated by the N.H. Fish and Game Dept. Additional thanks to the Hampstead Mothers Club for their donation. This year two hundred seventy one youngsters registered.

work has begun on a Conservation Land Inventory for Hampstead, which, when completed, will include map, location, description and management plan for each parcel of conservation/town land. Results will be published in notebook format enabling public lands to be enjoyed by residents.

Seminars attended by Conservation Commission members include, 'Soils and Interpretation of Test Pit Data, 'Conservation Commission Effectiveness, and 'Methods of Mapping Wetlands.'

The Commission received the "Outstanding Tree Farmer" award for 1985 at the annual meeting of the N.H. Association of Conservation Commissions.

This year we have made important progress in the identification and protection of town wetlands while actively pursuing established Commission undertakings.

The Hampstead Historic District Commission is happy to report the completion of the mini-kitchen in the Olde Meeting House, with special thanks to Ken and Mary Clark for their extra push to get it finished the night before our annual Thanksgiving Commemorative Service, Sunday, November 24. Also, for the Clark's denation of a refrigerator, newly refinished.

The Thanksgiving service was well attended, with Rev. Bob Dobson of the Hampstead Congregational Church, conducting the service. The antique pump organ, restored this year by Ken and Dot Parker and George Moore, was dedicated. Bill and Louise Putnam, Farmington, N.H., formerly of Hampstead, who originally donated the organ ten years ago to the now inactive Hampstead Historical Society, attended, along with their children, Bill, Jr., of Plaistow, Sandy Simons of Derry, Mary Sue Loring of Stafford, and Christine Housel of New Durham.

Very special thanks go to Carol and Richard Emerson of Emerson Avenue Greenhouses, for their donation of two beautiful Christmas wreaths for the front doors of the Olde Meeting House. Unfortunately, someone else saw their beauty as they were "removed" the day after the Santa Claus parade.

The first wedding to be held in the Olde Meeting House, in well over 100 years, took place on Saturday, October 5, 1985, when Kim Parker, son of Commission members Ken and Mrs. Parker, was married.

In December, the commission purchased three second-hand display cases so we will now be able to exhibit some of the historical memorabilia, which will be the 1986 project. The artifacts have been stored in cardboard boxes since they were removed from the Historical Society's room in the Town Office Building.

As the former Central Fire Station building is in the Historic District, we were consulted by the police station building committee about the building's facade. The building facade has been designed in consideration of the historical nature of the Olde Meeting House. The windows and doors have been selected to have the "small pane" look and the building will be sided with clapboards, painted white. Hopefully, the building committee will remember the Williamsburg blue doors to blend with the Olde Meeting House.

As in the past years, the building is used for Sunday services by the Advent Christian Church, and at other times by various clubs and individuals, including Hampstead Gardening Club, Women's Resource Center for registrations, Hampstead Lions Club for Miss Hampstead interviews, a wedding reception, Hampstead Recreation Commission for meetings with Senior

Citizens, the Junior Order of Mechanics, and the Conservation Commission.

The 241 year old Olde Meeting House is open to residents, free of charge, for meetings, showers, weddings and receptions, and may be reserved by calling 382-6375.

The Olde Meeting House, built in 1745, is on its original site and is a building the residents should be proud of. The Paul Revere, Jr. bell in the steeple is the only one we know of in existence, and the steeple, erected in 1792, is the only one of its design left standing in the Granite State.

As a tradition of many years standing, the Paul Revere, Jr. bell may be tolled by residents at midnight on the eve of the Fourth of July when the doors to the steeple are opened. It is also rung prior to the Thanksgiving service and on other special occasions.

The past year was a quiet one for the commission, but we will continue to oversee our historical building.

A thank you to everyone for donations, support and cooperation. Please enjoy the Olde Meeting House.

#### SOLID WASTE COMMITTEE REPORT

Hampstead's trash disposal has gone through quite a change this year - with so many more to come! And we will all be paying more in the future for a service we all take for granted each Wednesday.

The status of solid waste disposal is changing in New Hampshire, as it is throughout our country. Environmental awareness, the never ending groundwater contamination problems, and our growing "disposal" society are creating a crisis. Where do we put our solid wastes?

Several years ago, the New Hampshire State Legislature and the New Hampshire Water Supply and Pollution Control Commission enacted laws and regulations designed to protect us from pollution problems. These laws require strict standards for landfills - the historical method of waste disposal.

However, enforcement of these laws will end Hampstead's low-cost disposal in Kingston's landfill. A privately-owned facility, the landfill is now being evaluated for compliance with pollution and other regulations. It is expected that the state may close the facility within 1-2 years.

Currently, our options to Kingston are few -- and expensive. Bids for solid waste disposal at other facilities (received this past August) show that costs could double or triple. Disposal costs could increase by \$100,000 to \$200,000 each year!

Given these potential costs, the state has mandated that all towns in the state form Solid Waste Management Districts. By joining with other towns, Hampstead can get "the best deal" for solid waste disposal, similar to the concept of a cooperative buying service. The larger solid waste volume of a District will result in lower costs for our solid waste disposal.

Southeastern Rockingham County Solid /Sanitary Waste Management was created by thirteen towns, including Hampstead. The District membership is charged with developing plans for solid/sanitary waste disposal. Our plan will take about 2 years to create, and will include both solid waste and septage disposal plans for the next 15 years or more. Your Solid Waste Committee unanimously supports the District concept. We hope that you will support Town Meeting authorization to continue this work.

The first major change to Hampstead's solid waste disposal occurred with the "dump" closure this year. Restricted use of the facility was proposed by the Committee and endorsed by the Board of Selectmen because of increased pick-up, haul and disposal costs. We realize that the "dump" was convenient to many -- but we believed that full use of our curbside pick-up service was even better! We hope that you understand that regulations regarding hazardous waste disposal (yes, even paint wastes) also added to our reasons for restricting access. The semi-annual "dump" hours will permit your disposal of items not allowed for curbside disposal. Convenient hours for leaf and brush disposal are also provided.

We have been pleased with your cooperation in implementing these changes.

We have appreciated the opportunity to serve the Town. Please be assured of our continued efforts to minimize the town's costs for safe solid waste disposal.

### ANNUAL REPORT — 1985 REPORT OF THE PRINCIPAL

This year's report will address itself to the past, present, and the future as it relates to the Central and Middle Schools.

Tragedies related to people we have known and loved have touched all of us. Mr. Bernard Bartnicki, Mr. "B", veteran Hampstead teacher, died this past Summer after a courageous battle with cancer. The fact that he was chosen to be a recipient of a liver transplant, primarily because of his positive outlook on life, was, and continues to be, an inspiration to all of us. His colleagues and his many former students fondly remember and sadly miss Bernie.

The growth of Hampstead for the past two years has most certainly had an impact upon the Hampstead Schools and the growth of the other communities that send students to Pinkerton Academy in Derry for their high school education.

We have had to add staff to help educate the increasing number of students in the past two years. The School Board is constantly aware of changing needs and has authorized the needed staff. The budget for 1986-1987 has been constructed with a view towards increased needs. In the critical area of staffing our schools, the School Board has considered a three year plan and is budgeting for same. We need additional staff in administration, teaching staff, and support personnel, (aides, custodians, etc.).

Perhaps the most encouraging news that I can give, is that we have been coping quite well with growth, and indeed, have profited by the ideas and enthusiasm of new students and staff. By the way, the most graphic example of growth that I can give you is that the Central School student population has grown by a third in just three years.

Standardized achievement test results, in grades three through eight, and accountability test results at grades four and eight, continue to be well above national norms. Information and statistical data from Pinkerton Academy about the achievement of Hampstead students continues to be encouraging.

The communication with Pinkerton Academy personnel, as it relates to the continuing education of our students, remains a high priority. Last Spring the entire Middle School staff spent a day at the Academy visiting classes and talking with former students. Thirty Pinkerton Academy teachers visited our school for the day while school was in session. We learned a lot from each other. Next year, we hope to have a day of workshops when all of the

sending districts and Pinkerton Academy staff get together to continue the dialogue at the teacher-to-teacher level.

We also have had some noneducational matters to contend with that impact upon our operation. The Middle School roof is in the process of being redone. It is interesting to note, with today's technology, that the new roof is made of rubber and is stretched and sealed over the existing roof, much like wall-to-wall carpeting is installed over a tile floor. Fortunately, we did not lose any class time due to the leaks.

The Central School continues to be bothered by water supply problems. We no longer can continue to use the well that services the town hall. The other well has a higher than preferred level of sodium chloride. It appears as though we will need to spend considerable money to either improve the quality of the water or establish a new well. The one day of school that we lost this winter was due to a worn out pump. We continue to use bottled water for drink-ing purposes.

It is not surprising, with so many new parents moving into the district, that a P.T.A. has been formed. This new organization will benefit the children by enabling us to further strengthen the relationship between home and school. The volunteer teacher aide program that is about to emerge, is eagerly awaited by the staff. Interested parties can get more information by contacting either school office.

Last year's Annual School District meeting authorized the establishment of a program for gifted and talented children. Mrs. Patricia Howard is the co-ordinator of a program entitled Ventures, which is designed to meet the needs of a wide variety of students at all grade levels. A modest start has been made to date.

The Middle School has initiated a more formal program of discipline based upon a philosophy that has not changed. The new program features a better record keeping system, but perhaps, more importantly, emphasizes good student behavior, as well as dealing with inappropriate behavior.

I want to thank parents for their cooperation in calling the school whenever their child is absent. Parents have been so helpful that the secretaries no longer need volunteer help to check up on absent children. The parents who help the children, through their efforts with the Music Boosters and Athletic Club, are also greatly appreciated.

The new ballfield, provided by the Civic Club, should be operational this year on the Middle School grounds. It will be a welcome addition to our school facilities.

In closing, I would like to thank the Hampstead School Board, the Superintendent of Schools and his staff, the staff at both schools, Mr. Robert Grosso, our first Facilities Manager, the children, their parents, and the general public for the support that they have given to me and the "schools" this past year.

### SCHOOL WARRANT State of New Hampshire

To the Inhabitants of the School District of the Town of Hampstead, qualified to vote in District affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the Hampstead Middle School in Hampstead, New Hampshire on the tenth day of March, 1986 at 7:30 in the evening to act upon the following articles:

- 1. To see if the District will vote to appropriate the sum of One Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$100,000) as a supplemental appropriation for the 1985-86 fiscal year, Ninety Thousand Dollars (\$90,000) of such sum to be raised by taxes, and the remaining Ten Thousand Dollars (\$10,000) to be derived from an anticipated surplus in that amount in the 1985-86 fiscal year.
- To see what sum of money the District will vote to raise and appropriate for the payment of salaries of school district officials and agents and for payment of the statutory obligations of the District.
- 3. To see if the District will raise and appropriate Fifteen Thousand Dollars (\$15,000) to pay for engineering and other planning expenses related to future site and building needs at all grade levels.
- 4. To see if the District will vote to establish a Capital Reserve fund under the provisions of New Hampshire RSA 35:1 for the purpose of future school building and site development and to raise and appropriate One Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$100,000) for this purpose.
- 5. To see if the District will raise and appropriate Eight Thousand Dollars (\$8,000), such additional amount necessary to complete the partitioning of the Hampstead Middle School Cafeteria.
- 6. To see if the District will vote to authorize the School Board to apply for, accept and expend, without further action by the School District Meeting, money from the state, federal or other governmental unit or a private source which becomes available during the 1985-86 school fiscal year provided that such expenditure be made for purposes for which a school district may appropriate money and that such expenditure not require the expenditure of other school district funds.
- 7. To see if the District will accept reports of agents, auditors and committees.
- 8. To see if the District wishes to take any other action which may legally come before the meeting.

### A LOOK AHEAD Observations About Tomorrow

Our principals and teachers are doing a very commendable job of keeping the community, especially the parents of their students, updated about the progress and improvement of school programs. They are sharing their successes, an easy, exciting, and fulfilling experience when things are going well, and they are going well. Achievement and SAT scores continue in the high range.

We cannot take joy from these successes, however, because a major task of change and adaptation lies ahead. We cannot congratulate ourselves on our talents when half of our talents are withering and won't be in demand in the 21st century. There must be new and better ways to do things in a world which will be different from that in which we now live if, indeed, the futurists know what they are talking about.

We have more than a little hope that we can identify some of the needs of the future. At the core of this hope is a new awareness of children and of their ability to learn and how to make their learning experience more effective. We also will not be abandoning all that we are currently doing. We are, after all, still employing some old but proven methods because they are still getting good results.

It is comforting to note indications that necessary change will be gradual and not explosive, realizing we have already crossed the threshhold of the use of technology in education. We have a long way to go but no longer is technology as mystifying and threatening as it once appeared to be.

What are some of the predictions of these futurists?

First, our teachers are going to achieve greater status in our society, including higher salaries. Even some teacher unions are demanding greater accountability in their ranks, considering it vital to maintaining respect for the profession. Teacher education programs are expanding to five years in many of our universities and are requiring a subject matter major. Furthermore, we will see increased standards for entering, continuing, and exiting the professional education program.

Second, technology will be incorporated into our instructional delivery systems. Teachers will begin to use these modern tools, not only to assist the instructional and learning experience, but to help to better organize their classrooms and that myriad of administration detail and record-keeping, essential to successful schools. We must seek ways to deal with the cost of technology so that it can be available for access by all of our students. Without it, the future could be bleak, with technology leaving behind those who have been left behind before, but at a faster pace.

Third, schools will be used for life-long learning, training, and re-training. Adult education will be an important means of providing job training programs essential to adapting to the changing needs of the business and industrial workplace. In this regard, we will have to insure that schools will be open when adults can attend them.

Fourth, our schools must prepare our students for rapidly changing job markets, including lengthening the school year and re-organizing our instruction systems. Our students must learn those traits regarded by employers to be more important to their business than anything else...traits such as dependability, industriousness, flexibility and self-discipline.

Finally, there will be new partnerships in the business, industry, education triangle. If, by partnership, we mean greater resources (dollars) coming over to the public sector from the private sector, then I cannot be optimistic. While many businesses do contribute greatly appreciated gifts to schools, I don't think we can expect to see managers and stockholders diverting more substantial amounts from their company earnings to our schools. If, on the other hand, companies can realize a benefit from this kind of investment, its involvement would be more assured. Increased sales or advertising are obvious benefits pursued by business but are not that apparent in coalitions with schools. Solutions to the educational needs of workers, however, may be the bridge to create a genuinely enthusiastic partnership and one which will increase the flow of resources from company to school.

Will our schools be up for this challenge of the future? I believe they will because of a new wave of support from the public we serve and it's there because our schools have shown a new accountability and respectability. It is our intention to keep it in place.

I extend my gratitude and that of the educational family in the Timberlane District for the opportunity and privilege to serve.

### **AUDITOR'S OPINION**

In our opinion except that omission of the General Fixed Asset group of accounts results in an incomplete presentation as explained in the above paragraph, the combined financial statements and the combining fund and account group financial statements referred to above present fairly the financial position of the Hampstead School District at June 30, 1985 and the results of its operations for the year then ended, in conformity with generally accepted accounting principles applied on a basis consistent with that of the preceding year.

Our examination was made for the purpose of forming an opinion on the combined financial statements taken as a whole. The combining fund and account group financial statements and supplemental schedules listed in the table of contents are presented for purposes of additional analysis and are not a required part of the combined financial statements of the Hampstead School District. The information has been subjected to the auditing procedures applied in the examination of the combined financial statements and, in our opinion is stated fairly in all material respects in relation to the combined financial statements taken as a whole.
