TOWN WARRANT

THE STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

To the inhabitants of the Town of Landaff in the County of Grafton in said State, qualified to vote in town affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town Hall in said Landaff on Tuesday, the 13th day of March, next at nine of the clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects:

1. To choose all necessary Town Officers for the year ensuing.
2. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray town charges for the ensuing year and make appropriations of the same.
3. To see if the town will vote to accept State Aid for highways, and raise and appropriate money for the same.
4. To see how much money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for the support of the Lisbon District Nursing Association.
5. To see if the town will authorize the selectmen to borrow money in anticipation of taxes.
6. To see if the town will vote a discount on such part of taxes as are paid on or before July 15, 1945.
7. To see if the town will raise and appropriate to the White Mountains Region Association, for the pur-

pose of publicizing and promoting the natural advantages and resources of the town together with other towns in the region, a sum not exceeding 10 cents per \$1,000 of the assessed valuation of the town for 1944.

8. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$200 for control of white pine blister rust.

9. To see what action the town will take in regard to buying a new truck.

10. To transact any other business that may legally come before said meeting.

Superintendent's Report

To the School Board and Citizens of Landaff:

I herewith submit my second annual report as Superintendent of Schools.

The total enrollment in your schools last year was 34. The average membership 30.18 and the percent of attendance 92.6. There were 9 pupils attending Lisbon High school.

The enrollment on January 15 was 31. There are

17 pupils at the Blue School and 14 at Scotland. This is one more pupil than you had in your schools at the same time last year.

The Scotland School is taught by Mrs. Minnie Church of Bradford, Vt. Mrs. Blanche Collins of Lancaster is teaching for the second year at Blue School.

A new blackboard was installed at the Scotland School. A new book case was built in one corner of the main room.

Playground equipment is needed at both schools. Electric lights and a chemical toilet would improve the Scotland school.

The teacher situation is critical. At the present time it is almost impossible to find a teacher who will accept a one-room school unless she can board in town and receive a salary equal to that of the village teacher.

The Hot Lunch Committee has been efficient in its purchase of foods this year. It is a real problem to find a dealer who will sell canned goods in carton lots. Many thanks to those people who have helped with and contributed to the hot lunch program.
