To the Inhabitants of the Town of Lee, in the County of Strafford, in said State, qualified to vote in Town Affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at Town House in said Lee on Tuesday, the eleventh day of March next, at ten of the clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects:

- 1. To choose all necessary Town Officers for the year ensuing.
- 2. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray town charges for the ensuing year and make appropriation of the same.
 - 3. To choose Delegates to the Constitutional Convention.
- 4. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary for the maintenance of highways, state aid and trunk line roads.
- 5. To authorize the Selectmen to borrow money in anticipation of taxes.
- 6. To raise one thousand (\$1,000) dollars for Trunk Line Construction.
- 7. To raise one thousand (\$1,000) dollars to complete "Special No. 16" road at Wadleigh Falls.

- 8. To raise four hundred (\$400) dollars for the control of the White Pine Blister Rust.
- 9. To see if the Town will authorize the Selectmen to buy snow-fence and raise a sum of money therefor.
- 10. By petition of Winifred G. Johnson and nine others: To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to appoint one Highway Agent for the town.
- 11. By petition of Winifred G. Johnson and nine others: To see if the Town will vote to buy snow removal equipment and raise a sum of money therefor.

REPORT OF THE SUPERINTENDENT OF SCHOOLS.

To the School Board and Citizens of Lee:

In the ten years since the adoption of the present school law in 1919, notable progress has been made in education throughout the state. One notable feature of that progress is equalization, whereby the strong communities help the weak ones to obtain approximately equal privileges. School District of Lee is one of the towns that profits by this state aid. Another feature of this decade of school progress is the lengthening of the school year throughout the state to 36 weeks, with a 3.2% increase in average attendance at the same time. In other words, we have added one and onethird years to the average schooling of children in the small towns by furnishing eight full years of 36 weeks each. Moreover, high school enrollment has increased one-third, or nearly seven times as fast as elementary enrollment. Normal school enrollment has increased from 240 to 294, with a decrease in per capita cost to the state from \$324 to \$135 per stu-This has enabled an increase in the proportion of trained teachers from 63% to 83% of the total number. Small districts may now have the satisfaction of knowing that they are able to give their boys and girls an education that can compare favorably with that furnished in larger neighboring communities.

Slate blackboards have been installed at North Lee. If similar equipment is placed in the South Lee schoolhouse next summer, all three buildings will then possess this advantage. I recommend that grading be done around the front of the South Lee schoolhouse.
