#### TOWN OF LYMAN

#### **Town Meeting Warrant**

To the Inhabitants of the Town of Lyman, in the County of Grafton, and the State of New Hampshire, qualified to vote in Town affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town Hall in said Town on Tuesday, the 10th day of March, 1981, polls to open at ten-thirty o'clock in the forenoon and will not be closed before six o'clock in the afternoon in said Town Hall, to act on Article 1, the remaining articles to be considered at one o'clock in the afternoon.

ARTICLE 1. To choose all necessary Town Officers for the ensuing year.

NIAS

- ARTICLE 2. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of Thirty Thousand Three Hundred and Twenty Dollars (\$30,320.00) as may be necessary to defray Town charges for the ensuing year. All items marked by an asterisk in the budget are covered by this Article.
- ARTICLE 3. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of One Thousand Five Handred Ninety-four Dollars and Fifty Cents (\$1,594.50) for the Health Department (Health Officer and Overseer of the Poor \$60.00; North Country Home Health Agency \$392.00; White Mountain Mental Health \$642.50; Littleton Hospital Association \$500.00). All items marked by a dash in the budget are coverd by this Article.
- ARTICLE 4. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of Three Thousand Five Hundred Dollars (\$3,500.00) to defray the Town's share of the cost of the Lisbon Dump.
- ARTICLE 5. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of Six Hundred Dollars (\$600.00) for Town Cemeteries.
- **ARTICLE 6.** To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to transfer fifty percent (50%) of any 1980 annual net budget surplus funds to the Capital Reserve Fund established for the purchase of highway equipment.
- **ARTICLE** 7. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of One Thousand Two Hundred Dollars (\$1,200.00) as compensation for the Tax Collector.
- ARTICLE 8. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to sell and dispose of any real estate acquired by tax deed, by Advertised Sealed Bid only.
- **ARTICLE 9.** To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to borrow monies from time to time for current indebtedness of the Town for the ensuing year in anticipation of taxes to be collected for the year 1981 and paid therefrom.
- **ARTICLE 10.** To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to apply for, accept and expend money from State, Federal or other governmental unit or private source which becomes available during the year in accordance with the procedures set forth in R.S.A. 31:95-b.

- ARTICLE 11. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of Two Hundred Forty-eight Dollars (\$248.00) to defray the Town's share of operation expenses of the North Country Council.
- ARTICLE 12. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of Seven Hundred and Fifty Dollars (\$750.00) to defray the Town's share of operation expenses of the New Hampshire Municipal Association.
- ARTICLE 13. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of Seventy-six Thousand Four Hundred Sixty-seven Dollars and Ninety-four Cents (\$76,467.94) to maintain highways, equipment and Town share of T.R.A. All items marked by a cross in the budget are covered by this Article.
- ARTICLE 14. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of Two Thousand Seven Hundred Dollars (\$2,700.00) for the following purposes: Police Chief \$1,250.00; Dog Police \$50.00; mileage at twenty-three cents (23°) per mile not to exceed \$1,400.00.
- ARTICLE 15. If the above Article, namely Article 14, is adopted, to see if the Town will vote to authorize withdrawal from the Revenue Sharing Fund established under the provisions of the State and Local Assistance Act of 1972 for use as a setoff against the budget appropriation in the amount indicated.
- ARTICLE 16. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Tax Collector to receive part payments of real estate taxes in any year in the sum of Ten Dollars (\$10.00) or a multiple of ten, pursuant to the provisions of R.S.A. 80:52-a.
- ARTICLE 17. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of One Thousand Five Hundred Dollars (\$1,500.00) for the preparation of a tax map.
- ARTICLE 18. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of One Hundred Dollars (\$100.00) to assist in the support of the Lisbon Public Library.
- ARTICLE 19. To see if the Town will vote to approve the obtaining of the services of public accountants for the annual audit of the Town's accounts.
- ARTICLE 20. To see if the Town will vote to petition the Representatives and Senators who represent the Town in the General Court to support in the current session of the General Court, the concurrent resolution to amend the State Constitution to limit the annual increase in property taxes to five percent and to limit the annual increase in spending by the state or any city, town, or other governmental unit of the state to five percent. (This Article inserted upon written application of voters.)
- ARTICLE 21. To see if the Town will vote to take over the maintenance of the road from Ogontz Road to the West boundary of Mountain Meadows Association, a distance of three-tenths (.3) of a mile.
- ARTICLE 22. To hear the reports of agents, auditors, committees and officers heretofore chosen, and pass any vote relating thereto.

ARTICLE 23. To transact any other business that may legally come before the meeting.

## REPORT FROM THE LISBON FIRE DEPARTMENT

The major event of 1980 was the acquisition of the new Engine 1 replacing one that had served well for 28 years. Our department members completed over 300 hours of training with two new men becoming firefighters with the 18-hour training course. This training included work on the new pumper, Hurst tool and rescue equipment, and general firefighting.

The Hurst Tool, commonly called the "Jaws of Life" belongs to the Emergency Medical Service and is housed in Lisbon to be accessible to the surrounding area.

The Twin State Fire Mutual Aid System and the dispatch center at the Grafton County Sheriff's office have proven their value several times, and operating in conjunction with our excellent dispatch service, they give us fast and efficient means of covering emergencies.

We were called to Lyman a total of 11 times during the year, once for a chimney fire and 10 Life Squad calls. Whenever a call involves an automobile accident, a piece of fire apparatus is automatically dispatched as a precautionary measure but is not counted as a response unless fire is involved.

With the increase in use of wood burning, we place strong emphasis on proper installations and the use of smoke detectors and fire extinguishers in every home.

# REPORT OF FOREST FIRE WARDEN AND STATE FOREST FIRE SERVICE

Forest Fire Prevention: Your Business, Our Business, Good Business. Forest fire prevention slogans have been seen in association with Smokey Bear since the late nineteen forties when a national effort to check the spread of forest fires was implemented.

New Hampshire residents recognized that forest fire prevention and suppression was the responsibility of every citizen, a half century before this national campaign, when our legislature established our first forest fire laws in 1903. Since that date, the State has appointed a town/city forest fire warden who is responsible for forest fire law enforcement in his municipality.

All fires kindled out of doors when there is no snow on the ground must be approved in writing by the forest fire warden before being kindled. All forest fires must be suppressed by the warden and his deputies as soon as they are reported. The cost of fire suppression is shared jointly by the town/city and the State of New Hampshire, as are forest fire prevention and forest fire training costs.

This state and local municipality cooperative forest fire program has given New Hampshire one of the best forest fire records in the United States.

## GRAFTON COUNTY COMMISSIONERS

In an effort to communicate more directly with the taxpaying citizens of Grafton County, we, the Grafton County Commissioners, are writing to you through your individual town or municipal reports.

Due to inflated Nursing Home expenses with somewhat reduced revenues and rapidly increasing costs of welfare reimbursements to the State, our budget year ended very close to the line, with a \$3,620 surplus. Because of the Delegation's decision to use a two-year surplus in one budget year to allow citizens a reduced county tax in FY 1980, the 1981 fiscal year budget resulted in a heavier tax factor making up that decrease as well as offsetting reduced revenues and allowing for standard budget increases.

As with towns, the county welfare assistance programs are increasing and becoming more involved, especially with the current energy crunch and rapidly inflating economy. We also foresee a possible decrease in Federal and State contributions to social service programs which could have considerable impact on local budgets.

The sewage disposal system has progressed slightly, with planning completed and ready to go out for bid. If all goes well, we may be able to submit a final report next year.

The Commissioners worked closely with the Nursing Home Employee Council to set up a wage/benefit package more compatible to the State program for Glencliff employees. The Commissioners hope to work out a job description/wage scale plan for courthouse employees in the near future.

Grafton County is gradually converting from a bookkeeping machine system to a computerized system for all county accounts. Payroll was converted effective January 1, 1980, and vendor payment and receipt programs were recently added. Patient accounts and purchase order programs will be added later. The system is too new for comprehensive comments, but we anticipate constructive changes in the overall accounting and reporting system.

The Commissioners hold their regular meeting every Monday (except holidays) at 9:30 a.m. in the Commissioners' Office of the Grafton County Courthouse, followed by a second meeting at the Grafton County Nursing Home Complex at 1:00 p.m., which regularly includes visits to farm and jail facilities. Public and press are welcome, and, in fact, are encouraged to attend the meetings.

NCC greatly appreciates the support your Town has provided to the Council over the years. This support has enabled us to provide a good deal of local and area services. I am writing again to respectfully request that the Town include an amount of \$248. in the Town budget as its membership fee in the North Country Council for the period July 1, 1981 through June 30, 1982. Local financial resources are necessary in order to generate support from state and federal sources. I have enclosed a report for 1980 on NCC activities which I hope will be included in the Town Report.

The membership fee is based on a formula give 50% weight to both population and equalized assessed valuation. While the overall regionwide request remains the same as last year, individual town fees may fluctuate due to changes in the population and equalized assessed valuation of the town.

Over the years, NCC has worked on shaping a program that is responsive to both local needs and problems and those of the North Country region. With the varied background of the staff, we believe that the Council can assist your town in solving some of it's community planning and development problems. As budgets and resources become more limited in the future, a plan with realistic goals and priorties and framed with local input should provide guidance to the town in making informed decisions for the future.

# North Country Council, Inc. Town Report

In Lyman, the Council has assisted the Planning Board in reviewing a proposed subdivision.

North Country Council is the regional planning commission and economic development district serving the North Country. In 1980, North Country Council targeted its resources and expertise to fit the needs and problems of the towns and region we serve. In the community planning field, the Council has programmed a systematic way of handling requests from communities for assistance with a local community plan. By the end of 1981, the Council will have assisted six communities complete master plans. For its membership fee in the Council, a town can receive any of twenty-two types of assistance identified by NCC. Communities can contract with NCC to undertake special project programs which require a significant amount of time over and above the normal types of services. Sponsorhip of the Municipal Law Lecture series and membership on the Environmental Law Clinic affords the Council with the opportunity to secure necessary legal information on behalf of the town. The Council has been active in a number of regional issues such as transportation, economic development, land use, and housing. In transportation, the Council has supported the restoration of rail service to the Mt. Washington Valley area and initiation of communter air service in Berlin, assistance to the Whitefield Regional Airport, and improved highway and public transportation systems. In land use, the Council has published reports on the Role of Agriculture in the North Country, Managing Wetland, and several brief fact sheets.

The Council has accelerated its economic development program with the addition of a Business Development Director who is making direct contact with businesses to encourage them to locate in North Country communities who have identified new industry as a need. NCC has prepared a regional industrial brochure coupled with local area fact sheets as a tool to encourage planned economic growth. As a result of these efforts, several companies have expressed an interest in locating in the region. Efforts are underway to establish a Revolving Loan Fund as an incentive for prospective industry.

In rural development, assistance has been provided to a number of communities in areas such as wastewater treatment, solid waste, water supply improvement, and other necessary community projects. A special report on Rural Development is available.

Because of the Council's activity in energy, the Governor's Council on Energy granted NCC some funds which will enable the Council to assist three targeted communities to prepare a local energy plan. State and federal agencies and statewide groups continue to contact North Country Council for a North Country perspective on such varied issues as growth, forestry, environmental concerns, land use, and manpower training. For example, in June, the Council presented testimony to a special legislative committee on proposed changes needed in the state's planning and zoning legislation. Association with these groups provides NCC with the opportunity to share some of the regional and local concerns expressed by the towns with those state and federal agencies whose decisions will impact on the region. The Council continues to work with other regional councils in New England through the efforts of its President who serves as a Board member of the National Association of Regional Councils.

The efforts and accomplishments of the Council are a collection of the many contributions of local towns, other agencies, our fine staff, the Board of Directors, and the Executive Committee. We express our appreciation to the Town for its support and assistance during the year. North Country Council is an arm of local government in the North Country. I am writing on behalf of the Littleton Hospital Association to request that your 1981 Town Warrant include provision for \$500.00 in support of the Littleton Hospital. These funds will be used by the hospital solely for the purpose of buying capital medical equipment which has been requested by our medical staff members.

During the past year more than thirty-three thousand dollars worth of medical equipment was purchased and paid for in part by town appropriations from 1980. All of this expensive technologically advanced equipment is essential to keep our hospital prudently up-to-date with advances in medical treatments and surgical procedures.

As you can see from the inclosed report of our 1979-80 Annual Report, the Littleton Hospital has had an excellent year meeting the acute health care needs of area residents and visitors. We continue to attract highly talented physicians to our hospital so that an appropriate variety of community health needs may be met without traveling outside of the local area.

Of the total 12,000 patients treated here more than 10 were residents of your town. While this number may appear small compared to the total, I am confident that were you to inquire, you would find that each of them would say that their personal experience was worth the total of the amount requested as an appropriation this year.

An aspect of our operation which often escapes public attention is the amount of medical care provided without charge to the patient. Individuals from virtually every town in our service area shared in more than \$49,000 of "free care". Additionally, we wrote off about \$195,000 worth of uncollectable bills as bad debts. These costs of doing business severly restrict the money which might otherwise be available for capital purchases.

If your board would like me or another representative of the hospital to provide you further information at one of your meetings, please contact me. In any event, please place this request before your town meeting for consideration.

White Mountain Mental Health Center and TEMPO Workshop wish to request an appropriation at your 1981 Town Meeting. The request of \$321.25 is based on \$1.25 per capita (according to the 1975 State Census Statistics). The amount requested remains the same as last year.

The local money we generate becomes part of our operating budget. We receive monies from Federal and State sources, as well as "fee-for-service". The cost of delivering mental health and rehabilitation services cannot be shouldered by any one funding source. We are obligated by law to provide services on a sliding fee scale (ability to pay), as well as non-remunerative services such as twenty-four hour emergency service. Therefore, even though we have increased our fee collection, it would be unrealistic to expect that we could survive without the support of state and local monies. Additionally, we have entered our final year of Federal funding and, thus, the income from other sources becomes even more significant.

Despite the funding climate, the use of our services increased dramatically. We experienced a 19% increase in request for mental health services this year. We also realized an increase in attendance at our rehabilitation facility, TEMPO. This would appear to indicate a continued use and appreciation of our services. The need for mental health and rehabilitation services in our area is clearly established. The support given by your town will help to insure that we will continue to meet this need. I would be very pleased to respond to any questions you might have about White Mountain Mental Health or TEMPO Workshop.

Director's Report January - December, 1980

The following information will summarize the activities of White Mountain Mental Health Center and TEMPO Workshop during 1980. We ask that the citizens of our catchment area vote to approve \$1.25 per capita to help defray the cost of providing essential mental health and rehabilitation services. Our goal is to continue to provide sound and necessary services in an efficient and effective manner.

### White Mountain Mental Health Center

Clinical Activity:

Our level of services increased dramatically during calendar year, 1980. This would appear to indicate the accessibility and local appreciation of our services.

1979 - Clients enrolled - 506; number of sessions - 2434 1980 - Clients enrolled - 635; number of sessions - 4889 Increase - Clients enrolled - 129; number of sessions - 2455

Additionally, we continue to provide consultation to area hospitals, other health care providers and human service providers.

Services provided:

- 1. Outpatient counseling we have our central office in Littleton and three satellite offices to help extend the availability of our services. The services offered include individual counseling, marital therapy, family therapy, group therapy, and children's services.
- 2. Aftercare providing services to patients discharged from New Hampshire Hospital. This includes counseling, day activities and psychiatric follow-up to assist this population in returning to their communities.
- 3. Emergency services a 24-hour, 7-day a week program that meets the needs of those individuals requiring immediate crisis care.
- 4. Inpatient care hospitalization is provided with the cooperation of our local hospitals.
- 5. Social, psychological and psychiatric evaluations services which are provided to schools, court, state and federal agencies.
- 6. Psychiatric consultation consultation provided to individual clients, schools, courts, physicians and local hospitals.
- 7. Alcoholism services including direct service to clients, as well as consultative and preventive programs.
- 8. Sponsorship of DIAL a drug information and hot-line center which frequently functions as a drop-in center.
- 9. Consultation and Education indirect service to other health care providers. These include case consultation and in-service training to hospital personnel, schools, headstart, courts, nursing homes and boarding homes.

### T.E.M.P.O. Workshop

TEMPO is a rehabilitation facility which offers service to the developmentally and physically impaired. During 1980, we increased the number of clients served by 15%.

The services offered include the following:

- 1. Work Activities a program for severely impaired clients. This includes work related activities, teaching skills which are essential in daily living and general activities.
- 2. Sheltered Workshop this program is best described as sheltered employment. A work environment is structured such that it meets the needs of the individual client. The clients are paid for the work they perform. Additionally, we provide training around necessary skills for independent living.
- 3. Work Adjustment this program is designed to place the client in an independent work situation.

I hope that this information is helpful in giving you some insight into the services provided by our Agency. We are a non-profit organization affiliated with Northern New Hampshire Mental Health Center. We have an Advisory Council of 23 area citizens, with a broad geographic representation. Three of our council members sit on the 13-member Regional Board of Directors for Northern New Hampshire Mental Health Center. Once again, your understanding and support of our Agency will be greatly appreciated.

### NORTH COUNTRY HOME HEALTH AGENCY

North Country Home Health Agency provides services to people in their own homes who have health-related problems. Nursing visits are provided for the chronically ill, for care following hospitalization or for acute care in lieu of hospitalization. Physical Therapy and Speech Therapy are available to homebound patients. The Homemaker/Home Health Aides work with the nurses and therapists to assist with personal care, light housekeeping and meal preparation, and other health-related services aimed at keeping people independent in their own homes for as long as possible.

Occupational Therapy service was added this year, to teach patients to cope with the activities of daily living.

Our Family Assistant Program is designed to help parents strengthen child-rearing practices and cope with family related problems.

Our Public Health activities are aimed at prevention and early intervention of disease, and include child immunization clinics, well-child conferences, handicapped children's clinics, adult health screenings and child dental screenings. Monthly well-child and immunization clinics are now held in both the Littleton and Haverhill areas, and three times a year in Lisbon and Lincoln. Health promotions for the assessment of problems and newborn visits to infants and mothers are also made. There is no charge for any of the clinics, health promotions or newborn visits.

North Country Home Health Agency serves 15 towns in a 1200 sq. mile area. Its main office is 60 High St., Littleton, and there are satellite offices in Lincoln and Woodsville.
