You are hereby notified to meet at the West Milan Town Hall in said district on the 11th day of March 1952 at 1:00 o'clock in the afternoon to act upon the following subjects :

2. To choose a clerk for the ensuing year.
3. To choose a member of the school board for the ensuing three years.
4. To choose a treasurer for the ensuing year.
5. To determine and appoint the salaries of the school board and truant officer, and fix the compensation of any other officers or agents of the district.
6. To hear the reports of agents, auditors, committees, or officers heretofore chosen, and pass any vote relating thereto.
7. To choose agents, auditors, and committees in relation to any subject embraced in the warrant.
8. To see what sum of money the district will raise and appropriate for the support of schools, for the salaries of school district officials and agents, and for the payment of statutory obligations of the district, and to authorize the application against said appropriation of such sums as are estimated to be received from the state equalization fund together with other income; the school board to certify to the selectmen the balance between the estimated revenue and the appropriation, which balance is to be raised by taxes by the town.
9. To see what sum of money the district will vote to raise and appropriate for high school transportation.
10. To transact any other business that may legally come before this meeting.

Estimated Income: The only known amount at this time is \$1,500.00 under the Noon Lunch Program. This is an off-set entry in the budget. Amounts received on state aid, December 1951, will also be deducted.

*The starred items are required by law to be raised as determined by the proper authorities. The district determines the salaries of district officers. The supervisory union board decides the local share of the superintendent's salary and other union expenses. The state treasurer reports the amount of the per capita tax. The retirement board assesses the amount of the teachers' retirement.

Report of Superintendent

To the Superintending School Committee and the Citizens of the Milan School District :

FOREWORD

Life's greatest mistake, according to a recent Gallup poll, is in not getting enough education. Pollers found that more men and women listed that omission than any other, as being responsible for their hardships.

"To neglect our school system would be a crime against the future. Such neglect could well be more disastrous to all our freedoms than the most formidable armed assault on our physical defenses. Where the schools are concerned, no external threat can excuse negligence; no menace can justify a halt to progress," said Dwight D. Eisenhower.

In these trying times our schools should devote themselves directly to the great fundamental purposes of education—the preparation of intelligent citizens who understand, believe in, and practice the ideals of democracy—the preservation of national unity; the development of a sense of responsibility for common welfare; and the maintenance of sound, wholesome community life.

Education for all the people is America's noblest contribution to civilization. Today there is a mounting tide of sentiment in behalf of better education. As surely as children grow, the schools must go on. Education cannot wait.

TEACHERS

There were no changes in the teaching staff of the district during the past year. The teachers are as follows: at Milan Village, Avis Croteau, principal—grades 6-8; Barbara Potter, grades 3-5; Marion Armstrong, grades 1-2; and at West Milan, Fannie Mullins, principal—grades 1-4 and Bessie Stiles, grades 5-8.

TUITION

We had, in September, 32 enrolled at Berlin High School. Of these; 7 are seniors, 6 are juniors, 9 are sophomores and 10 are freshmen. With 14 in grade 8 at Milan it would seem right to expect that the number of tuition pupils might increase next year. The tuition rate at Berlin for 1951-52 is \$200.00 per pupil.

BUILDINGS AND EQUIPMENT

During the summer months both schools were painted outside. This has added greatly to the appearance of the buildings, especially the one at West Milan. It was found that the furnace at West Milan was beyond repair and so it became necessary to install a new unit. It is hoped that the new circulating hot air furnace will provide much more satisfactory heating throughout the building. The blackboards at West Milan were painted green. At Milan Village, a new celotex ceiling in the lunch room has added much to the appearance.

The usual minor repairs, improvements and thorough summer cleaning were completed. The two buildings are fairly adequately equipped. A new set of encyclopedias was purchased for the upper room at West Milan. It has been the policy to try to add some needed equipment each year.

ENROLLMENT AND ATTENDANCE

There are, at this writing, 130 in the two schools; 41 at West Milan and 89 at Milan Village. This figure represents an increase of five of the corresponding period for a year ago.

The percentages of attendance were again rather low. The upper room at West Milan had the highest with 95.05; the others were all near 90. The State Department of Education considers 97 or better as worthy of special commendation so you can see that we fell rather short on the matter. There were but 52 cases of tardinesses for the two schools for the entire year. West Milan lead the way with but five for the building. This is a most com-

mendable record. The cooperation of the pupils, parents and teachers is urged in an effort to improve our percentage of attendance.

TRANSPORTATION

The transportation of both high school and elementary school pupils for the past three years has been carried on by Donald Hodgdon. This year marks the end of his three year contract.

Last March the district again appropriated for high school transportation at the rate of \$1.00 per week per person.

DEBT

The voters will note with interest the fact that the Milan School District is again debt free. With the payment of \$2,000.00 in July the indebtedness of the district was completely liquidated.

NOTES ON THE BUDGET

The school board's total budget for 1952-53 is \$30,861.50 as compared with a budget of \$32,741.63 for 1951-52. The 1951-52 budget included the annual payment on the note as well as the item of high school transportation. Other than these two items the budget is practically the same as for the preceding year with the exception of anticipation of higher costs for tuition and salaries.

The budget is to be reduced by an estimated income of \$1,500.00 from the National School Lunch Fund and by the amount the district will receive from state aid. (Milan received \$4,749.77 in December 1951.)

SPECIAL ARTICLE

A special article has been introduced into the warrant for the consideration of the voters. This article refers to the appropriation of money for high school transportation. You will recall that the district has appropriated \$1.00 per week per child for the past three years. The amount appropriated for 1951-52 was \$1,300.00.

CONCLUSION

It has been said that the people of the United States could be divided into three groups—the small group who makes things happen—the large group who watch things happen—and the enormous group who do not know what happens. I hope that the educational opportunities of our schools are such that our boys and girls will become a part of that small group who make things happen.

I take this opportunity to express my appreciation to the members of the school board, parents, teachers, and citizens for their support in our common effort to maintain good schools.
