

To the inhabitants of the Town of Northwood in the County of Rockingham in said State, qualified to vote on Town affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at Town Hall in said Northwood on Tuesday, the thirteenth day of March, next, at ten o'clock in the forenoon, and polls to close at six P. M., to act upon the following subjects:

1. To choose all necessary Town Officers for the year ensuing.

2. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray Town charges for the ensuing year and make appropriations of the same.

3. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to borrow money in anticipation of taxes.

4. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for Town highways.

5. To see if the Town will accept State aid for the construction of Class V roads, and raise and appropriate the sum of \$446.93.

6. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$55.00 for the care of cemeteries as provided in Chapter 68, Section 5, Laws of 1942.

7. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate \$920 for street lighting.

8. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$50.00 for the observance of Memorial Day.

9. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for the Northwood Public Library.

10. To see if the Town will vote a discount on such part of taxes as paid on or before July 15, 1945.

11. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for interest on temporary loans.

12. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$800.00 for the repair of the Bartlett Bridge, so-called.

13. To see if the Town will vote to pay during 1945 and thereafter until revoked the following schedule:

Use of teams, 8 hrs.,	12	00
The one man Road Agent, so-called, 8 hrs.,	8	00
Tractor drivers and road machine opera-

14. To see if the Town will transfer from unencumbered surplus, the sum of \$3,500.00 or part thereof as a Capital Reserve Fund for the purpose of Town road maintenance.

15. To see if the Town will vote to support United States membership in a general system of international cooperation, such as that proposed at the Dumbarton Oaks Conference, having police power to maintain the peace of the world.

16. To see if the Town will vote to place a street light on the State road, as near as possible to the head of Bow Street at Northwood Ridge. (By petition)

17. To transact any other business to come before said meeting.

This in an increase of ten per cent over last year, not including four pupils from Nottingham in Grade VIII at the Ridge School.

Forty-two Northwood pupils have enrolled at Coe-Brown Northwood Academy, Mr. Arthur E. Toll, Headmaster. Last year Robert Bailey was elected president of the Granite State Association of the Future Farmers of America. Murray Tasker was chosen vice president. He also won the second award in the Sears-Roebuck Achievement contest. This fall George Clark placed second in fruit judging and Frank O'Neal second in dairy judging in interscholastic contests at the University.

The report of Miss Margaret Macdonald, school nurse, shows 131 pupils examined last year. The dental clinic was sponsored as usual by the Harvey Lake Women's Club. "Blue Cross" hospitalization insurance has been made available to school employees on a voluntary payroll deduction plan. Two teachers have taken advantage of the state law to make provision for retirement benefits. The school lunch program has been made eligible to receive aid from the federal Food Distribution Administration in the form of cash payments. For a defense project, pupils in the schools collected twenty-seven bags of milkweed pods to make life jackets used at sea. Mr. J. W. Steward of the School Board made a gift of folding chairs for the Ridge School assembly hall.

The frame for educational changes after the war is even now being planned. Many members of the Services are already taking government correspondence courses from the Armed Forces Institute. The "G. I. Bill of Rights" contains liberal provision for re-educating the handicapped veterans and completing the education of those who might have been studying in schools and colleges except for their induction.

Educational leaders are advocating the raising of the compulsory age limit to eighteen years, with public education available on the junior college level or in regional trade schools. It is likely that a considerable amount of work-experience for young people will be combined with their academic training, as time goes on.

In our own state, some of the forward steps in school policy advocated by superintendents include a minimum salary limit for teachers, state aid for rural high school transportation (also supported by the state Grange), restoration of an adequate number of supervisory unions, fixing of salaries of State Board of Education administrative officers by the Board itself, and retirement provisions for superintendents as well as other state employees. Many of these measures could be provided for in an orderly way by means of allocating a reasonable millage proportion of the state tax for state aid to school districts and other needs of state-wide public education.

After the war, it is more than likely that the government will require a year of universal military train-Shall this be a full year of strictly military training. ing at some fixed time, say age seventeen regardless of high school graduation, or will there be an option as to time, place, auspices, and type of training? Shall this requirement include girls as well as boys, and will it make provision for the forty per cent of rejectees as well as those who are fit? Will all training be in military establishments, or will at least part of it be in civilian schools and colleges, factories, business establishments, hospitals, and summer camps? Will the program provide for a wide class of subjects valuable in both military and civil life, such as science and mathematics, languages, vocational and technical training, aeronautics, radio, nursing, information, and supply? Will the federal government utilize local facilities and encourage further development of education within the states, or will it go to the tremendous expense of setting up and maintaining a parallel system of education? It is for the American people to discuss these questions and make their wishes known.
