2. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate a sum of money to fight the Dutch Elm Disease.

3. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate \$225.65 for the purpose of uniting with the 45 other towns in the White Mountains Region Association in the cooperative development and promotion of the North Country.

4. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the selectmen and town treasurer to borrow money to defray the expenses of the Town in anticipation of taxes, for the year ensuing.

5. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$200.00 for culvert, gravel, ditches and cutting bushes on road to Stratford Bog.

6. To elect two auditors for the ensuing year, or to see if the Town will vote to petition the State Tax Commission to have an audit made by the Division of Municipal Accounting; and make an appropriation to cover the cost of same.

7. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the selectmen to extend any water line for the best interest of the town, and finance same with a long term note if necessary.

8. To see if the Town will vote to instruct the selectmen to appoint all other town officers as required by law, not elected by the Nonpartisan Ballot.

9. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of six thousand dollars (6,000.) to cover the cost of installing a chlorination system on the water supply as required by law.

10. To hear reports of agents, officers and committees heretofore chosen and to pass any vote relative thereto.

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11. To transact any other business that legally may come before this meeting.

12. To choose by Non-partisan Ballot the following town officers:

- (a) Town Clerk
- (b) Selectman for ensuing three years.
- (c) Town Treasurer
- (d) Trustee of Trust Funds for three years.

The polls will remain open until (6:00) P.M.

Board of Selectmen Stratford, New Hampshire Gentlemen:

Submitted herewith is the report of an examination and audit of the accounts of the Town of Stratford for the fiscal year ended December 31, 1961, which was made by this Division in accordance with the vote of the Town. Exhibits as hereafter listed are included as part of the report.

SCOPE OF AUDIT

Included in the examination and audit were the accounts and records of the Board of Selectmen, Treasurer, Tax Collector, Town Clerk, Water Department, Trustees of Trust Funds, North Stratford Library and Baldwin Trust Fund Income Account.

FINANCIAL STATEMENTS

Comparative Balance Sheets—December 31, 1960—December 31, 1961: (Exhibit A-1)

Comparative Balance Sheets as of December 31, 1960 and December 31, 1961, are presented in Exhibit A-1. As indicated therein the Surplus decreased by \$270.16, from \$15,326.22 to \$15,056.06, in 1961.

Analysis of Change in Financial Condition: (Exhibit A-2)

An Analysis of the change in financial condition of the Town during the year is made in Exhibit A-2, with the factors which caused the change indicated therein. These were as follows:

Comparative Statements of Appropriations and Expenditures—Estimated and Actual Revenues: (Exhibits A-3 & A-4)

Comparative statements of appropriations and expenditures, estimated and actual revenues for the fiscal year ended December 31, 1961, are presented in Exhibits A-3 and A-4. As indicated by the budget summary (Exhibit A-4), a revenue deficit of \$3,798.62, less a net unexpended balance of appropriations of \$3,307.88, resulted in a net budget deficit of \$490.74.

Summary Statement of Receipts and Expenditures: (Exhibit B-1)

A summary statement of receipts and expenditures for the fiscal year ended December 31, 1961, made up in accordance with the uniform classification of accounts, is included in Exhibit B-1. Proof of the Treasurer's balance as of December 31, 1961, is indicated in Exhibit B-2.

AUDIT PROCEDURE

The accounts and records of all town officials charged with the custody, receipt and disbursement of public funds were examined and audited. Vouchers and cancelled checks were compared with supporting invoices and payrolls as well as entries in the books of record. Receipts were checked by source insofar as possible and totals of receipts and expenditures verified. Book balances were verified by comparison with reconciled bank balances made from statements obtained from depository banks. Verification of uncollected taxes was made by mailing notices to delinquent taxpayers as indicated by the Collector's records. The amounts of uncollected and unredeemed taxes as indicated in this report are therefore subject to any changes which may be necessitated by the return of verification notices.

GENERAL COMMENTS

Current Surplus:

The current surplus (excess of total assets over current liabilities) decreased by \$1,270.16, from \$17,326.22 to \$16,056.06, in 1961, as shown herewith:

Surety Bonds:

The surety bond of the Town Clerk should be increased from \$1,000.00 to \$2,000.00, and the bond of the Town Treasurer from \$10,000.00 to \$15,000.00, in order that the amount of the bonds may be more proportional to the amount of funds received by and in the custody of these officials.

Conclusion:

The provision of Chapter 184 of the Laws of 1955, require that this report or the summary of findings and recommendations (letter of transmittal) shall be published in the next annual report of the Town.

We extend our thanks to the officials of the Town of Stratford for their assistance during the course of the audit.

Gentlemen:

Submitted herewith is the report of an examination and audit of the accounts of the Stratford School District for the fiscal year ended June 30, 1961, which was made by this Division in accordance with the vote of the District. Exhibits as hereafter listed are included as part of the report.

SCOPE OF AUDIT

Included in the examination and audit were the accounts and records of the School Board and the School District Treasurer.

FINANCIAL STATEMENTS

Comparative Balance Sheets: (Exhibit A)

Comparative Balance Sheets as of June 30, 1960 and June 30, 1961, are presented in Exhibit A. As indicated therein, the Net Debt decreased by \$6,092.62 during the fiscal year ended June 30, 1961.

Analysis of Change in Financial Condition: (Exhibit B)

An analysis of the change in financial condition of the School District during the fiscal year is made in Exhibit B, with the factors which caused the change indicated therein. These were as follows:

Comparative Statements of Appropriations and Expenditures— Estimated and Actual Revenues: (Exhibits C & D)

Comparative statements of appropriations and expenditures, estimated and actual revenues for the fiscal year ended June 30, 1961, are presented in Exhibits C and D. As indicated by the Budget Summary (Exhibit D), a revenue surplus of \$7,301.17, less a net overdraft of appropriations of \$6,998.87, resulted in a net budget surplus of \$302.30.

Summary Statement of Receipts and Expenditures: (Exhibit E-1)

A summary statement of receipts and expenditures for the fiscal year ended June 30, 1961, made up in accordance with the uniform classification of accounts, is included in Exhibit E-1. Proof of the Treasurer's balance as of June 30, 1961, is shown in Exhibit E-2.

Statement of Building Fund Account: (Exhibit G)

A statement showing the activity in the Building Fund account during the fiscal years 1959-60 and 1960-61, is presented in Exhibit G.

Statement of Bonded Debt: (Exhibit H)

A statement of the outstanding bonded indebtedness of the District as of June 30, 1961, showing annual debt service requirements, is contained in Exhibit H.

GENERAL COMMENTS

Current Surplus:

It is noted that the current surplus (excess of total assets over current liabilities) increased from \$209.68 to \$302.30 during the fiscal year as shown herewith:

School Tax Account:

During the fiscal year ended June 30, 1961, the School District received from the Town of Stratford the total amount of the 1960-61 School Tax of \$81,979.05, plus the amount of a deficiency appropriation of \$5,859.86 which was made by the annual School District meeting in March, 1961. Therefore the amount of the 1961-62 School Tax which the District will receive during the fiscal year ending June 30, 1962, will be reduced by the amount of the deficiency appropriation, \$5,859.86, which was received prior to June 30, 1961.

Conclusion:

The provisions of Chapter 184 of the Laws of 1955, require that this report or the summary of findings and recommendations (letter of transmittal) shall be published in the next annual report of the School District.

We extend our thanks to the officials of the Stratford School District for their assistance during the course of the audit.

REPORT OF THE

SUPERINTENDENT OF SCHOOLS

1961-1962

To the School Board and Citizens of Stratford:

As I prepare my annual school report I am reminded that during the past several years great concern has been shown in these reports that the parents and townspeople would understand and promote the aims and objectives of the school program. Three lines of thought have shaped the efforts of the School Board:

- (1) What is for the best interest of the children?
- (2) What must we do to meet the requirements of the State Department of Education for the enriched program for an approved high school and assure us of continued state aid? (This year \$25,490.28)
- (3) What is within reach of the voters of this district both in what they want for their children and the ability of the district to pay?

Quite plainly as shown by the vote at the 1959 meeting the district believed it was for the best interest of the children to add the new construction and to continue to maintain a high school. The validity of this position is justified by the showing the school is making today. Not only has our high school been officially approved as a Comprehensive (highest rating) High School but thanks to excellent teachers our children receive benefits along lines of instruction which haven't been available before. Added this year are shop, physical education as such with regular classes, and library. The music offering, also, has been expanded this year. New last year were Home Economics and art. Also, with the addition of a teacher more time and attention can be given to the traditional subjects of Mathematics, Science, English, Social Studies and the Commercial Courses.

Nor have the elementary and primary grades been neglected. Standardized tests show that the young people do well on the average and are well up to their scholastic and mental abilities. The physical education classes offered to these younger pupils have made a real contribution to their health and physical development. The real need at present is to find some way of arranging these classes so as to have one grade to a teacher. At present there are six grades to five teachers at North Stratford, and three grades to a teacher at the Hollow.

Quite extensive grading needs to be done at the high school both around the buildings and on the ballfield. Part of this has already been started and will be completed during the year. Black surfacing will be done as money becomes available.

It is my considered opinion that our schools this year both in personnel and in academic offerings are the best yet. I believe the district is beginning to get the better schools that have been planned through the past several years. Also, I believe the School Board members are to be commended for the interest and intelligent efforts they have contributed to accomplish these goals. It has been a privilege to work with them.

Thank you for this opportunity to report.
