(TOWN WARRANT)

THE STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

To the inhabitants of the Town of Troy, in the County of
Cheshire, qualified to vote in town affairs.

You are notified to meet at the Town Hall in the said
town on Tuesday, the ninth day of March next, at ten o'clock
in the forenoon to act on the following subjects:

Article 1. To choose a clerk for the ensuing year.

Article 2. To choose a treasurer for the ensuing year.

Article 3. To choose a selectman for the ensuing three
years.

Article 4. To choose all other necessary town officers.

Article 5. To raise such sums of money as may be neces-
sary to defray town charges for the ensuing year, and make
appropriation of the same.

Article 6. To raise such sums of money as may be neces-
sary for repairing town highways and bridges.

Article 7. To see if the town will vote to apply for state
aid and permanent improvement of highways in accordance
with an act of the legislature of 1905.

Article 8. To see if the town will vote to raise and ap-
propriate a sum of money for state aid maintenance.

Article 9. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate a sum of money for trunk line maintenance.

Article 10. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary for the support of the poor.

Article 11. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate a sum of money for street lighting.

Article 12. To see if the town will vote to allow a discount of two per cent upon all taxes, excepting poll taxes, paid previous to July 5th of the current year, and instruct the collector to collect all poll taxes before June 1st, 1926.

Article 13. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate a sum of money to apply to outstanding notes.

Article 14. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate a sum of money to pay the interest on the water bonds.

Article 15. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate a sum of money for the maintenance of the water system.

Article 16. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate a sum of money to be set aside as a sinking fund to pay off the water bonds at maturity.

Article 17. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate a sum of money for permanent improvement of sidewalks.

Article 18. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of twenty five hundred dollars (\$2500.00)

toward the purchase of a motor fire engine not to exceed a total cost of seven thousand dollars (\$7000.00) balance to be paid in three yearly payments. Also to choose a committee of five to investigate and purchase the same.

Article 19. To see if the town will vote to extend the main water pipes of the town water system from the end of the main pipe near the dwelling occupied by James Dunn on Prospect street to the premises of Michael Venn, and also along the highway leading past the dwelling of Henry Marotte to the dwellings of Edward L. Stone.

Article 20. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate a sum of money for the purpose of employing a district nurse.

Article 21. To see if the town will vote to instruct the Selectmen to borrow money to pay town charges.

Article 22. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate a sum of money for the observance of Memorial Day and choose a committee to have charge of the same.

Article 23. To see if the town will vote to allow the American Legion to use the town hall one Friday night each month without pay.

Article 24. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of two hundred dollars (\$200.00) for the care and improvement of cemeteries.

Article 25. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of four hundred dollars (\$400.00) in the control of the white pine blister rust in the town of Troy.

Article 26. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of one hundred dollars (\$100.00) in addition to the amount required by law for public library.

Article 27. To hear the reports of agents, officers or committees heretofore chosen, and take any action relating thereto.

Article 28. To transact any other business that may legally come before said meeting.

REPORT OF SUPERINTENDENT OF SCHOOLS

To the Troy School Board:

I herewith submit my eighth annual report as Superintendent of Schools, the twenty-sixth under union supervision.

At the close of the school year it became apparent that there were to be two changes in the high school, but we were able to retain the entire teaching force in the primary building.

In the selection of a candidate for principal of the high school we decided that it would be advisable to secure, if possible, a young man who had at least a year or two of teaching experience, knowing that such a candidate would command a considerably higher salary than we have been paying in this position. We were fortunate in securing such a candidate in Mr. Merton E. Laverty, a graduate of Colby College, who has served two years as sub-master of the York, Maine, high school.

For assistant in the high school as teacher of French and English, Miss Alice M. Brouillard, a graduate of the three year course at Keene Normal School was secured, and for the position of supervisor of Music, Miss Geneva Jean Howe, also a graduate of Keene Normal School, was chosen.

The high school enrollment is 39, twelve larger than last year, and the total enrollment for the building is one hundred. This number fills the building practically to capacity.

With a probable enrollment in the high school next year of from 40 to 45, and with an eighth grade of 36 replacing one of 25, and a seventh grade of 39 replacing one of 36 it seems very probable that there will be over 120 pupils at the high school building next year, with not less than 36 pupils in any room. As we have one room now with a seating capacity of

only twenty-five, some arrangement must be provided to care for the extra pupils in next year's eighth grade.

When the high school numbered only about twenty it was possible to move the seats and change the high school room to the small room on the first floor, but this is no longer possible with a high school of forty pupils.

The condition at the primary building remains about the same as last year. Two rooms there last year had an enrollment of sixty-three pupils. This year one of those rooms has sixty-four, and the other sixty-one. This number is at least twenty-five more than one teacher should have if the proper individual attention is given to each pupil.

Considering the large number of pupils in these rooms the work accomplished has been especially good. In fact the work of the primary school for a number of years has ranked very high in spite of the large number of pupils assigned to each teacher.

The rural school at West Hill continues with the same enrollment as last year, sixteen. Excellent work has been done in this school right along, and in fact, few rural schools can make a better showing than this little school. It well illustrates the recent statement of Commissioner Butterfield that there are but two essentials for a good school, "a learning pupil and a teaching teacher."

Last year the Troy schools received close to \$5,000 from the state aid fund, and with the present excellent teaching force this allowance should be slightly increased another year. The appropriations for another year should not vary greatly from last year, except that there should be a larger allowance for high school tuition, and some appropriation should be made to care for the increase at the high school.

During the past year the Parent-Teacher association has continued its helpful work, and I am sure both parents and teachers now recognize the great benefit of this organization.

At this time I desire to express my hearty appreciation of the cordial support I have received from teachers, pupils, parents and members of the school board in attempting to secure the best possible results in our schools.
