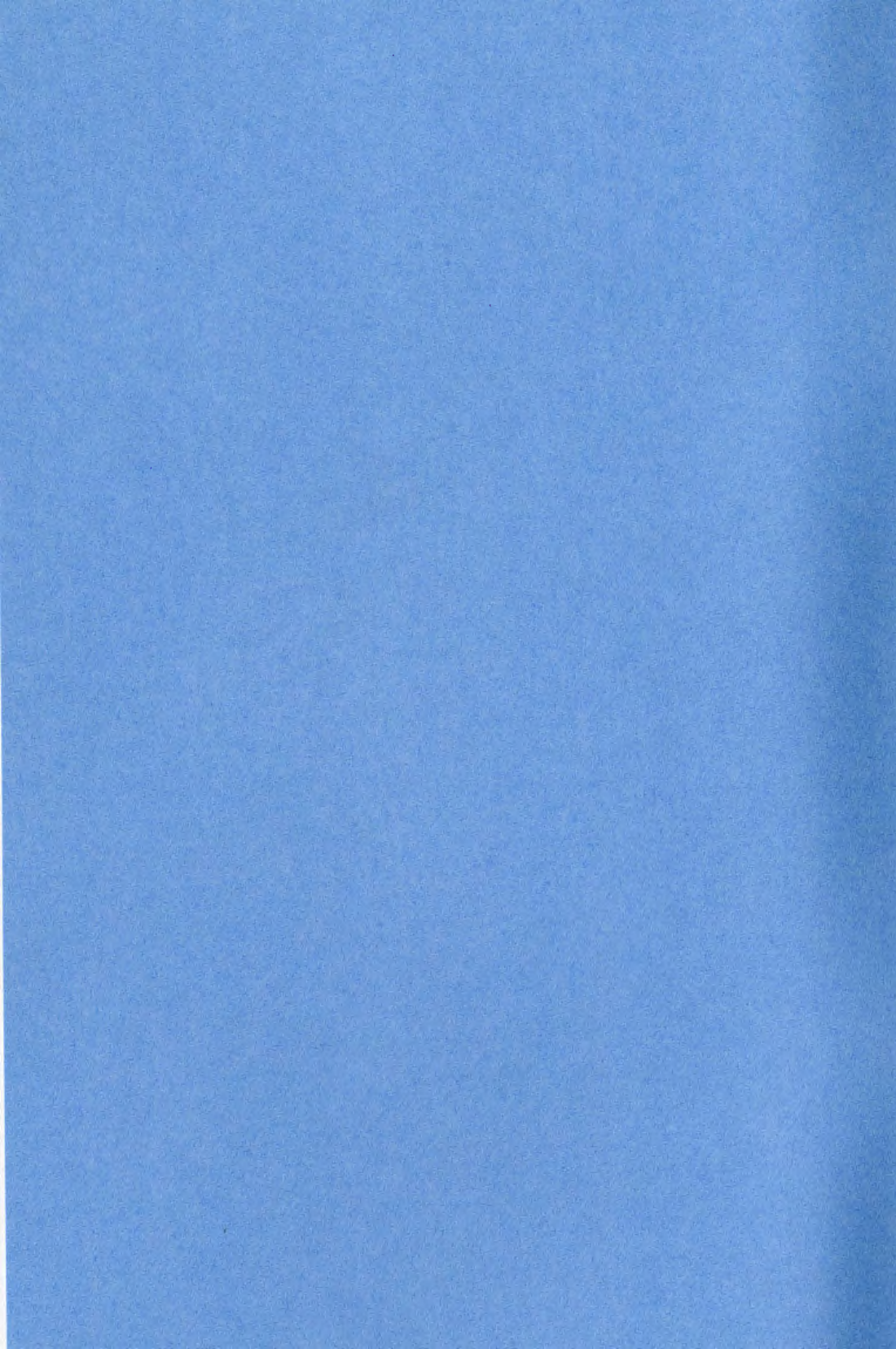

1. To choose by ballot all necessary Town Officers for the year ensuing.
2. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for the payment of Town charges including principal and interest on the Town's outstanding indebtedness, social security taxes and any other legal obligations of the Town, or take any other action in relation thereto.
3. To hear reports of Auditors and Agents heretofore chosen and to pass any vote in relation thereto.
4. To see if the Town will vote to authorize indefinitely, until rescinded, the board of Selectmen to transfer tax liens and to sell tax deed property by advertised sealed bid, public auction, or to otherwise dispose of it as justice may desire.
5. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$12,630.00 for Police and Fire expenses, or take any other action in relation thereto.
6. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$5,000.00 for the continuation of construction the new Town Hall, or take any other action in relation thereto.
7. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$1,800.00 for upkeep of the Town Halls, or take any other action in relation thereto.
8. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of 125.00 Dollars for street lighting; or take any other action in relation thereto.
9. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate

the sum of \$500.00 for the upkeep of the Town Cemeteries, or take any other action in relation thereto.

FOREST FIRE WARDEN & RANGER REPORT

In calendar year 1994, our three (3) leading causes of fires were No Permit, Children and Rekindles of fires where the fire was not properly extinguished.

Violations of RSA 224:27 11, the fire permit law, and the other burning laws of the State of New Hampshire are misdemeanors punishable by fines of up to \$2,000 and/or a year in jail. Violators are also liable for all fire suppression costs.

To aid your Forest Fire Warden, Fire Department and State Forest Fire Officials, contact your local Warden or Fire Department to find out if a permit is required. This also helps to prevent unnecessary response to a controlled burn.
