### SEWER FUND

The Sewer Fund, including small amounts transferred from sewer rentals surplus, now amounts to \$52,949.35, of which \$5,584.53 is income earned by these funds, held by the Trustees.

During the year, an obligation was set up by special town meeting against this fund for building a section of sewer to serve the proposed parochial school. The town found this project justified this procedure, but it does not materially reduce the future need for the Sewer Fund to carry out its primary purpose. That is to supply key funds to qualify the town for a grant in the event that grants for public works again become available as a part of a relief public works program.

The town's best interest will best be served by continuing to transfer town surplus funds to cover this new obligation and also to continue to gradually increase the net amount of the Fund.

#### HIGHWAYS AND BRIDGES

The Highway Department having enjoyed one of its most highly productive years, offers the following facts as a summary in order that the townspeople may be guided as to the type of program they deem necessary to assure the comforts and pleasures that only good roads can offer. The construction program, one of initial interest to both townspeople and the department, produced during the year, 7.1 miles of newly surfaced rural roads under Town Road Aid (T.R.A.), a program subsidized by State Highway funds to the extent that they provide approximately seven dollars to each dollar provided by the town. In addition to the above, the Department now has 6.3 miles of graveled road base prepared to further extend surfaced roads in our rural areas. This accomplishment is the net result of having good equipment at its disposal.

The construction of Pinkerton Street Hill also proved of vital interest to both townspeople and the department in as much as it eliminated one of the most hazardous areas in our main highway system. This project was made possible through funds made available under Town Road Aid (T.R. A.) apportionment "B" program where the State subsidized one dollar to each dollar provided by the towns.

The appropriations for sidewalks was confined to replacement only. It may appear on the surface as one of little gain, but one of actual need in order to avoid the complete loss of those we have.

The income of the department in addition to a substantial savings effected on the Pinkerton Street project made it possible to end the fiscal year with an attractive cash balance.

## TOWN WARRANT

#### STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

To the Inhabitants of the Town of Derry qualified to vote in town affairs:

You are hereby instructed to meet at the Veterans Memorial Building, in said Town, on the second Tuesday of March next, at ten o'clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects:

By vote of the Selectmen, the polls for this meeting will remain open from ten o'clock in the forenoon until six o'clock in the afternoon, and as much longer thereafter as the Town, at the opening of the meeting, may vote.

- 1. To elect a selectman for three years, Town Clerk, Treasurer, Collector of Taxes, Library Trustees, Trustees of the Trust Funds, Cemetery Trustee, Auditors and other necessary Town officials for the year ensuing.
- 2. To vote to raise and appropriate such sums of money as may be necessary for the maintenance of the poor, for laying out and repairing highways, for building and repairing bridges, for the suppression moths, for police department and municipal court, for hydrant service and electric lights, for salaries of Town Officials, for the Board of Health, for the expense of the Town Hall, for support of the libraries, for State and County taxes, for the observance of Memorial Day, for aid to the Derry Visiting Nurse Association, for playground purposes and for band concerts, for co-operating with the State and Federal governments in the control of insect pests and white pine blister and for all necessary charges arising in said Town, and pass any vote relating thereto.

- 3. To see if the Town will authorize the Board of Selectmen to sell and convey any real estate acquired through deeds from the Collector of Taxes or as reimbursement for assistance furnished to citizens, and pass any vote relating thereto.
- 4. To see if the Town will authorize its Selectmen to incur debts for temporary loans in anticipation of taxes of the municipal year in which such debts are incurred and made payable therefrom, by such vote, and pass any vote relating thereto.
- 5. To see if the Town will direct the Collector of Taxes to allow a discount to all persons paying their taxes within such period as the Town shall limit, to fix the rate of such discount, and pass any vote relating thereto.
- 6. To see if the Town will vote to approve the recommendation of the Budget Committee that the sum of \$500.00 be taken from the income of the MacGregor Park Fund and expended during the summer of 1954 for band concerts at said MacGregor Park, and pass any vote relating thereto.
- 7. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate a sum not exceeding \$650.00 to the Merrimack Valley Region Association for the purpose of publicizing and promoting the natural advantages and resources of the Town in co-operation with the other thirty-seven communities, and pass any vote relating thereto.
- 8. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$1,193.81 for aid under apportionment A to match a State appropriation amounting to \$7,958.73 for the purpose of construction and reconstruction of Class 5 highways, and pass any vote relating thereto.
- 9. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$7,480.00 for aid under apportionment B to match an appropriation by the State of \$7,480.00 for the purpose of construction and reconstruction of that portion of the Chester

Road extending from the traffic circle at Derry Village to Nesmith Street, and pass any vote relating thereto.

- 10. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to purchase and acquire title, in the name of the Town, to centrally located real estate for the purpose of establishing a central public parking space, and for this purpose to authorize the Selectmen to use the capital reserve funds in the hands of the Trustees of the Trust Funds placed there for the definite purpose of establishing a public parking lot, and for this purpose to authorize the Selectmen to borrow, upon the notes of the Town issued in accordance with Chapter 258 of the laws of 1953 entitled "Municipal Finance Act" a sum not in excess of \$12,000.00, and pass any vote relating thereto.
- 11. By petition, to see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$500.00 to be used by the Derry Little League Baseball Organization for the purpose of completing the playing field for the youngsters of our Town, and pass any vote relating thereto.
- 12. To see if the Town wishes to adopt the recommendation of the Budget Committee that \$6,489.60 be transferred from parking meters receipts to the Police Department for the purpose of patrolling the meters, and that the sum of \$2,400.00 from the parking meters receipts be transferred to the Highway Department for the purpose of cleaning about the meters, and that the balance of said receipts be transferred to the Trustees of the Trust Funds to be added to the capital reserve fund for the purpose of acquiring a public parking lot, and pass any vote relating thereto.
- 13. To see if the Town will authorize the Selectmen to borrow, upon the negotiable notes of the Town issued in accordance with Chapter 258 of the Laws of 1953 entitled "Municipal Finance Act" a sum not exceeding \$23,000.00 for the purpose of paying the balance of the Town's share for rebuilding that section of the Chester Road extending

from the traffic circle in Derry Village to Nesmith Street, said notes to be repaid in five equal, annual installments, and pass any vote relating thereto.

- 14. By petition, to see if the Town will vote to name the baseball field used by the Derry Little League as "William C. O'Hara Memorial Field" in recognition of the support and encouragement given to the youth of our community by the late William C. O'Hara.
- 15. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$5,000.00 to be added to the capital reserve fund established for the purpose of construction of a sewer and disposal plant for the Town, and pass any vote relating thereto.
- 16. To hear the reports of agents, auditors and committees heretofore chosen, and pass any vote relating thereto.
- 17. To appoint any necessary committees on any article embraced in this warrant.
- 18. To transact any other business that may lawfully come before such meeting.

To the Trustees of the Derry Public Library: The 49th annual report is herewith submitted:

A very decided rise in circulation for 1953 has been noticed in both adult and junior reading. We hope this increased interest may continue during the coming year.

The new 1953 Encyclopedia Britannica is a fine addition to our reference department.

At the beginning of the school year the Principal of the Hood school was interviewed as a means of closer relationship between the school and library. All Junior High teachers met in the library to inspect the material that was available for use in their library assignments, maps, phamphlets, magazines and books were loaned for the year. We feel we have a major part in helping the students with their work.

Our usual educational activities have been carried on during the past year. The regular classes have continued from last year. One new class formed in dress designing. The Arts and Crafts held their annual two day exhibit in June. In August the Garden Club used the reading room for a flower show. Both exhibits were well attended.

Many interesting Arts and Crafts monthly meetings have been held with the following programs, Art in the home, Painting as a hobby, Collecting as a hobby, Making of Christmas cards, History of candlemaking and the December meeting was especially interesting it being a concert by the Bell ringers from Bedford, Mass. This meeting refreshments were served. The monthly meetings will be resumed in March. These meetings are open to all who wish to attend.

Book-Week was a busy time. Exhibits of new books and pictures were arranged around the room. All elementary schools were visited, stories told or read to the children. Children were urged to visit the library, listen to more stories and music on the recording machine. Brownie troops were invited as a group and we had special music and stories for them. As a result of our efforts with the children 126 new names were added to our files during the last two weeks of November. These new cards have been well used. Book jackets, book marks etc. were sent to each school as a reminder of the Book-Week activities.

Many new children's books were added. The lower grades getting the larger share. The books for the smaller children wear out so fast that we have to discard many of them. The coming year we will try and buy more for the 4-5-6 grades.

Our Christmas decorations were greatly admired by our patrons. Mrs. Edith Lang and the Garden Club committee having charge of the arrangements.

### HISTORY OF LITTLE LEAGUE IN DERRY

Back in February 1953 a group of interested men got together and held a meeting at the Legion Hall which was open to anyone willing to help form a Little League in Derry. There was a movie of Little League and all boys interested in baseball were there to see the movie. After the movie a meeting was held and the following officers were elected: President, Woodrow Manning; Vice President, Alfred Dick; Secretary, William DeRemer; Treasurer, Rev. Robert Henderson. Managers were Kans Barrieau, Eddie Holm, Roland Pressey, Lowell Hamer.

A lot of planning had to go into forming the league and getting a playing field. The President Woodrow Manning appointed Ralph DesRosier as player agent as his job was to auction the players off as each manager was allowed so many points to use in bidding for players.

The league was able to obtain four sponsors which were: Klev. Bros. Shoe Co., Derry Police Assoc., Eagles' and Lawrence Live Poultry, which the league officers are very grateful to because without them the league wouldn't have been possible. After a great deal of work by a great many interested persons in town, both by their work and lending of their equipment, the field was finally ready for the league to start. The officers of the league are grateful to all those who helped ready the field.

Finally, on May 31, 1953, the league opened with a double header which was preceded by a parade down Broadway to the field by the Youth Marine Drum Corps and all the players in uniform. After a short speech and throwing out of the first ball by Senator Benjamin Adams and raising of the flag, the league was under way with about a thousand people present.

The season continued very successfully with never under two hundred present at any game which were played every Monday and Thursday with a double header every other Sunday.

The league ended the last of August with the Klev. Bros. team of the Red Sox coming out on top, and Mr. Louis Kleven sending his winning team to Boston to see a Red Sox game.

Near the end of the season all the boys in the league had a game from which all proceeds went to the Jimmy Fund.
