#### THE FROST PLACE

In 1986 the Frost Place had its tenth resident poet, Christopher Gilbert, and its eight Festival of Poetry. A record number of visitors, over 4000, saw the house and walked the Poetry Trail. An art show of area artists and artisans also sold a record amount of work, with prices ranging from \$5.00 to \$250.00.

Irish poet Harry Clifton spent May, 1986, in the house, while New Hampshire poet McKeel McBride traveled to Ireland under Frost Place auspices.

Some forty-five participants attended the Poetry Festival in August, while some eighty people heard the Frost Day program in early July. Begun ten years ago in 1977, the Frost Place Board decided to celebrate the anniversary with the publication in 1987 of MOUNTAIN INTERVALS: POEMS FROM THE FROST PLACE 1977-1986, containing a selection of poems by the ten resident poets, edited by Donald Sheehan, and dedicated to the co-founder and first chairman of the Board, Evangeline Machlin.

### FRANCONIA HISTORY-MUSEUM COMMITTEE

Last spring was the sixth year the Franconia History - Museum Committee, Franconia Area Heritage Council, and the Town of Franconia sponsored the Lafayette Regional Sixth Grade Essay Contest. The First Place winner was Noah Thorp, for his essay on the "History of Franconia". He received \$25.00, "The History of Franconia" book by Sarah Welch, and a Bicentennial Bronze Coin for his efforts. Second Place went to Monica Martin for her essay on "Schools and Education" which included an oral history from Flora Belle Nelson. Her prize was also \$25.00 and a Bicentennial Bronze Coin. These essays are available for reading at the Abbie Greenleaf Library.

The essay contest is an important factor to the students who write the essays. They are left with a lasting impression about something that they have knowledge of, - their Town. For example, Monica Martin's essay contained an oral history. The ongoing efforts of the Franconia History - Museum Committee and the Franconia Area Heritage Council are to preserve the Town's history. These essays are one way that this is accomplished. Interested townspeople can also help preserve their histories by either writing biographies, documenting important artifacts, or by keeping family histories.

Last year Phyllis Herbert, Curator of the Franconia Area Heritage Council, completed the first chapter of the rewritten version of the "Early History of the Town of Franconia". The Franconia History - Museum Committee and the Franconia Area Heritage Council along with the Town have joined together to have her chapter put into a booklet. These booklets will be available by March, 1987. If anyone is interested in the booklet, they may see Ruth Vaill or Eileen Ball. You will not be disappointed with the extensive research and wonderful writing style of this first chapter.

The Old Man Room at the Town Hall has a collection of Old Man of the Mountain and Franconia related artifacts. It is open during the summer months on Saturdays from 10:00 A.M. to 12:00 Noon. It will be open for your convenience before the Town Meeting at 6:00 P.M. and after the Town Meeting for those of you who haven't seen the displays.

#### PLANNING BOARD

The Franconia Planning Board saw a very busy year in 1986 with more than 13 subdivisions accounting for 73 lots. Other business included lot line adjustments, right-of-way discussions and one gravel pit hearing. Though subdivision of land in Franconia in the past has been steady, it showed a significant increase this year. The Planning Board members worked well with individuals and developers in their informal presentations as well as formal hearings. We are pleased with the residents of the town for their renewed and refined interest in the town's development. More and more people have shown involvement by coming to our monthly meetings to voice their opinions and concerns that the town remain viable as a small, rural community.

The Planning Board has been aware for several years that changes need to occur on a regular basis to maintain updated zoning and subdivision regulations in accordance with new state regulations and for the best interests of the town. The hard work in these zoning changes began this summer when Board members gave extra time at extra meetings to establish and rewrite several sections of our zoning ordinance. These included manufactured housing, minimum lot size and frontage in each district, new considerations for motels, hotels, inns, bed and breakfasts, and Planned Unit Development (PUD). Though this work was very tedious and demanded much attention to detail, the Board was able to bring their proposals to public hearings, in November, January, and February, for open discussion and input from the public. The Board was very pleased to see excellent turnouts at these hearings and even more pleased to hear of an overall acceptance of the proposed changes by those in attendance. Many residents who could not attend hearings sent the Board letters, most of which were in agreement with the Board's proposals.

The Board does not perceive these zoning changes, presented at this year's Town Meeting, as a final step, but as a big step forward in upgrading and improving the zoning ordinance in the town. We have only to look at Lincoln and North Woodstock and their unchecked development of condominium units to know that Franconia should not go in this direction.

The Planning Board in the years ahead will endeavor to represent the town's people, and with their help, to plan properly for future growth.

I wish to personally thank all the members of the Board who have served on it this past year including Bob Ball, Ken Ford, Steve Heath, Ruth Vaill, Sonny Macaulay, Dwight Taylor, Butch Casey, Joe Nelson, and Fred Griffin. We wish to welcome Mr. Nelson and Mr. Griffin as new members, and to thank Mr. Casey, who left the Board, for his many years of service. It has been a pleasure to have worked with this Board and for the people of Franconia in 1986.

#### CONSERVATION COMMISSION

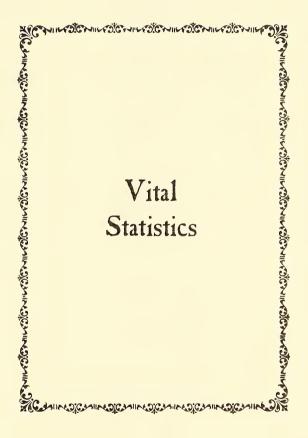
