## TOWN WARRANT

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### THE STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

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To the Inhabitants of the Town of Grafton in the County of Grafton in said State, quaified to vote in Town Affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at Grafton Town Hall in said Grafton on Tuesday, the sixth day of March, next at nine of the clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects:

1. To choose all necessary Town Officers for the year ensuing.

2. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray town charges for the ensuing year and make appropriations of the same.

3. To vote, by secret ballot. on the proposals of the Planning Board.

POLLS CLOSE AT 6 P.M.

Business meeting on all other articles to begin at 7:30 P.M.

4. To hear the report of the Budget Committee and act thereon.

5. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the following sums of money for their respective purposes as listed below:

(1) For Old Home Day	\$ 50.00
(2) For Improvement to Huff Beach	50.00
(3) For Tree Removal and Railings	1,100.00

(4)	For Patching and Oiling Roads	2,000.00
(5)	For an Emergency Highway Appropriation under the control of the Selectmen	1,000.00
(6)	For Refurbishing the Town Hall	1,500.00

6 To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$15,000.00 for the purpose of maintaining highways and bridges.

7. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$1,127.58 and thereby receive \$7,517.17 from the State for Town Road Aid.

8. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$1,000.00 for culverts.

9. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to borrow money in anticipation of taxes.

10. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to convey any real estate acquired by Tax Collectors Deed.

11. To see if the Town will vote to increase the Salary of the Treasurer by \$100.00 to bring it in line with other town offices. Present salary being \$250.00

12. To see if the Town will vote to allow the Selectmen to pursue the action instituted by the Attorney Generals Office in regards to the Volna Kilton Trust, with the purpose of authorizing the Trustees of the Trust Fund u/w Volana E. Kilton to use so much of the annual interest of said Trust as may be necessary, in their discretion, to provide the residents of the Town of Grafton with health and medical services with special consideration to be given to the health and medical needs of the elderly and needy of the Town.



13. To see if the Town will vote to appropriate \$12,000 from the Federal Revenue Sharing Fund, established under the provisions of the State and Local Assistance Act of 1972, for the purchase of a new truck with a body not less than six yards. The balance of the Federal Revenue Sharing to be used for the purpose of purchasing additional Highway equipment.

14. To see if the Town will vote to hear the report of the Town Hall Committee and take any action thereon.

15. Pursuant to a petition of ten or more legal voters: To see if the Town will vote to accept the road leading in back of Kilton Pond as a Town road from where the Town road now ends to the cottage of Eugene Beard and assume the Summer and Winter maintenance of the same, once easements are received.

16. Pursuant to a petition of ten or more legal voters: To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen and Trustees of the Kilton Fund to:

- (1.) Allow the Kilton Fund Proceeds to pay for the annual levy on the Town of Grafton by the Mascoma Area Health Council.
- (2.) Allow the Kilton Fund Proceeds to pay for a training course for ambulance personnel to serve the people of the Town of Grafton.
- (3.) Allow the Kilton Fund Proceeds to pay for the promotion of health needs for the residents of the Town of Grafton.

17. To take any vote to transact any further business that may legally come before said meeting.

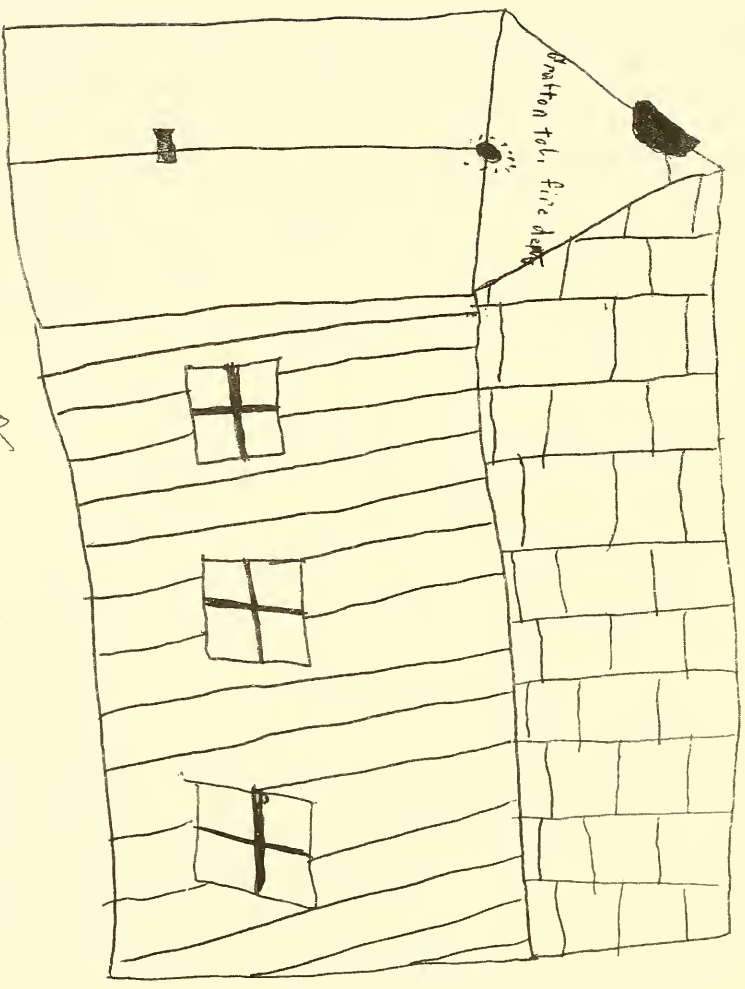

REPORT OF THE FOREST FIRE WARDEN  
AND DISTRICT CHIEF

In New Hampshire, forest fire control is a cooperative State-Town program. The Town Forest Fire Warden, appointed by the Director, Division of Resources Development upon recommendation of the Selectmen and the State's District Forest Fire Chief, is responsible for fire suppression and other related duties. The State shares equally with the town in the cost of most forest fires, except illegal and careless fires, which are charged to the responsible party. The State further provides fire detection services, prevention programs, fire training for town wardens and crews, and back up equipment for fire suppression.

By authority of the State, the Town Forest Fire Warden controls all outside burning in his town except backyard cooking fires. Any person wishing to kindle a fire when the ground is not covered with snow must obtain a fire permit, free of cost, from the Town Forest Fire Warden. No permits will be issued for fires between 9:00 A.M. and 5:00 P.M. unless it is raining, except for commercial purposes.

Please be careful when using fire. Remember it can be a extremely useful tool when under control but once allowed to run wild it can become a disastrous and devastating force. Only YOU can prevent a forest fire.

## MASCOMA AREA HEALTH COUNCIL

Mascoma Area Health Council, founded in April of 1969 is completing its fourth year of service to the towns of Canaan, Enfield, Grafton and Orange. Two nurses, each working half time, provide full time visiting nurse service to the area.

The Council also operates monthly free Well Child Conferences for children from birth to age 6, at which any child may receive regular complete physical examinations, all immunizations, and vision and hearing tests. Under the schedule at present in effect, the child is seen by our nurses just after birth, and then at the clinics at 3, 5, 7, 9 and 12 months, at 18, 24, and 30 months, and at age 3, 4, 5 and 6 or more frequently when justified. Parents accompany their children to these clinics; any trouble discovered is discussed with them and referred for further testing and treatment. Follow-up visits are made by the nurses. For any child who will not see a private physician, the Council provides the physical examination necessary for entrance to kindergarten or first grade. It is also under contract to supervise the health of the children in the Headstart program.

Nutritionists are also available at each clinic, to discuss and teach nutrition for child and family. These nutritionists are also available to help older people who need it, on special diets, etc.

In the summer of 1972 the Council made a start on a long hoped for dental program, and 135 children had their teeth cleaned and received fluoride treatments, and children and parents received counselling on proper dental care. Unfortunately the State of New Hampshire funds supporting this program ran out; we hope to have it again when new State budgets have been voted on.

Except for several grants from the State of New Hamp-

shire, received in its first years, the Council depends for support on the four towns served, each of which contributes on the basis of its population. While the Council must of necessity make a charge for its services other than the clinics, these services are available to everyone regardless of ability to pay.

At present our nurses are Mrs. Gertrude Clark of Grafton and Mrs. Toni Sadowsky of West Lebanon. During the past year they made 1,450 visits to area residents for nursing or health promotion, counselling and support.

The Council is governed by a board of directors elected from the four towns, and its medical policies and practices are supervised by a Medical Advisory Board consisting of area physicians and several volunteers.

The Council maintains its office in the Health Room at Mascoma Valley Regional High School, with its own telephone (632-7234) . It is heavily dependant on, and grateful to, the Methodist Churches of Canaan and Enfield and the School, which provide space for its clinics, and to the School for its office space there. A pamphlet describing the Council and its work and service is available on request. Its monthly meetings (first Monday, 7:30 P.M. at the School) are open to the public, and visitors and volunteers are welcomed.

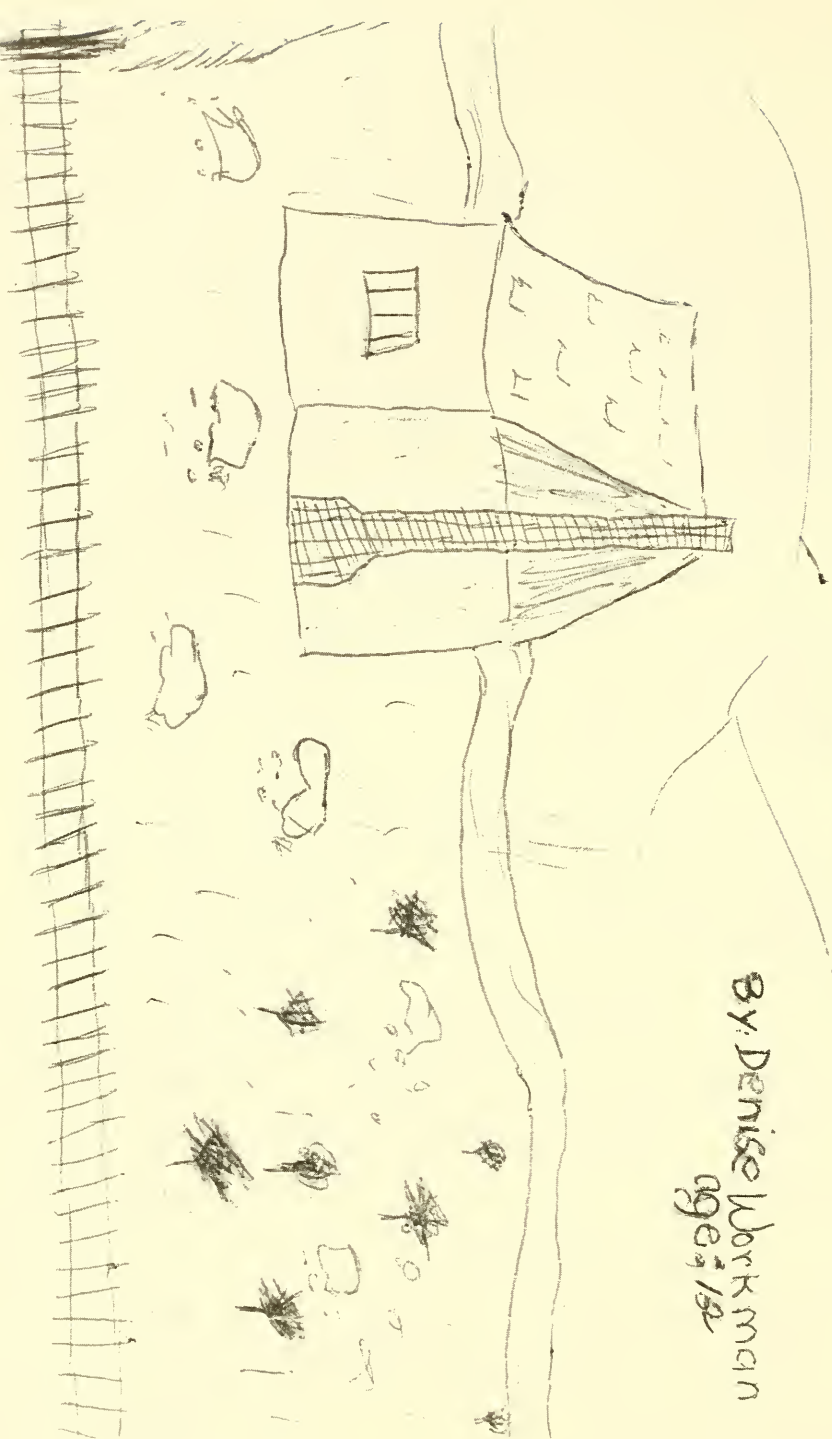

## REPORT OF TOWN HALL COMMITTEE

As this Committee was formed, according to the Town Warrant, "to study the land and buildings and make recommendations for improvements which would best suit the needs of the town", we thought it within our scope to offer three plans for comparison and consideration.

### PLAN 1

To make recommendations for improvements and alterations to the existing building. Dimensions for the main room from the building: 26x54½ ft.

Proposal:

1. New floor and strengthening of present floor joists and any necessary repairs to foundation.
2. Replace 5 windows that are larger than the windows in the front end of the building.
3. Combination windows for conservation of heat.
4. Install heating system under floor for greater utilization of heat.
5. Renew interior walls and ceiling.
6. Improved lighting.
7. Change entrance to woman's toilet in hallway.
8. Eliminate both unused chimneys.
9. Place entrance at front of the building using bricks, (if feasible) from chimneys to make an attractive outdoor entrance.
10. Remove partitions separating main room from present kitchen and Selectmen's Office.
11. Build a 16x26 ft. addition on the south end of the building for a kitchen and Selectmen's/Town Clerk's Office.

12. Recommend contacting land owner, John Wilson, to see if the town can purchase some frontage adjacent to the present property on the east side to make a proper approach to a parking lot, made suitable by leveling land and trucking in fill. Recommend a "U" type entrance and exit around the building.

## PLAN 2

Leave the building and grounds as they are with minor interior updating and no additions.

## PLAN 3

New building with adequate parking facilities with room for expansion. The first step was to see if the Committee could locate suitable land on Route 4, centrally located, which would be acceptable for a new building. Several landowners were approached but the only one interested in selling was Arvid Wahlstrom, owner of Ruggles Mine. He agreed to sell an estimated 4 acres located on the site of the Ruggles Mine sheds between Grafton Village and Grafton Center. He offered to level the land to make it suitable for building for \$8,000., this agreement to terminate ten days after town meeting. He has since indicated that should the town be interested in buying, he would be willing to negotiate.

In order to obtain firsthand a working idea of the size building we believe would be adequate for the needs of the town, the committee met with Reginald Barney, a former native son, who graciously took us on a tour of the Assembly of God Church in Canaan. We learned that Robert Bruce, a Canaan contractor, had built the church and a telephone call confirmed that he had the plans. Mr. Bruce agreed to meet with us at the Grafton town hall in September. As we had to make a start on some preliminary plan of the type structure we thought would be needed before we could get an estimate of cost, we drew up a tentative floor plan for a basement and

top floor and showed this to Mr. Bruce at the meeting. At that time he believed he would be able to put up the building to include a full concrete basement, tile floor, wiring, lights, 2 toilets, kitchen, furnace room, with 2 zone furnace, storage rooms, Selectmen's office, Town Clerk's office, hall with hard wood floor and gothic ceiling, stage, etc., size 40x70 ft. for a price of \$35,000. This was included in our report published in the Mascoma Week last fall. Mr. Bruce looked over the present building and was reluctant to quote a figure for the alterations, additions, repairs, etc., we recommended as he was not interested in doing the work. He did offer to submit, free of charge, plans and quotations of materials for the proposed new building at a later date.

After this meeting, your Committee decided to investigate possibilities of Federal money which might be available to assist the town if they decided to adopt Plan 3. Letters were sent to Congressman James Cleveland and to Urban Renewal in Manchester. We thought if the town could incorporate in this building a room which would be suitable for the use of a Doctor or a Nurse to be used as a small clinic for the area, we might encourage a Doctor to settle in Grafton and take advantage of the Kilton Fund. Therefore, this possibility was stressed in our inquiries. Mr. Cleveland very helpfully contacted various Agencies on our behalf but the replies were all in the negative, until January 2, when a letter was received from Mr. Cleveland's office indicating the possibility of Federal assistance. The Committee is currently investigating this lead and will report to the town if anything develops. We also met with the Civil Defense Representative from Concord hoping some help might be obtained from that source. After learning the way, the Committee decided this would not be feasible.

The plans promised by Mr. Bruce have been submitted. However, after drawing up the plans and estimating fully the cost of supplies, labor, etc. he has told us instead of the tentative price of \$35,000 the cost will be \$52,000, which

amounts to about \$10.00 a square foot as opposed to the current building costs of \$20.00 a square foot. So as current costs go, this is still a bargain for this size building. We were very disappointed to learn this cost was so much greater than the original quotation.

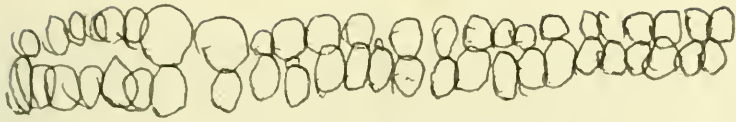
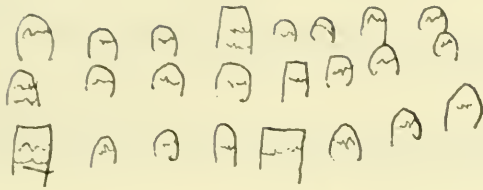
The National Bank of Lebanon gave us a rundown of the payments which would be required on an estimated loan of \$50,000 spread over a period of 20 years at 5% interest rates. This will be turned over to the selectmen for appraisal. As the estimated cost is so much greater than we anticipated, this figure is unrealistic.

In order to get other estimates, we wrote letters in November containing self-addressed stamped envelopes to Trumbull and Nelson of Hanover, and Woodward & Sons of New London. To date no replies have been forthcoming from either company.

Should there be any information which would be of benefit to the town between now and town meeting, we will make an effort to make it known.

# ORDINANCE FOR REGULATING MOBILE HOME PARKS AND TRAILER PARKS

Town of Grafton

Vote—Yes or No

In the interest of stabilizing taxes and helping to prevent increases, this ordinance is proposed for the Town of Grafton. Experience has shown that an unfair tax burden is placed on townspeople for increased school and community service costs where there are no regulations governing mobile home parks and trailer parks.

1. This ordinance does not affect any existing mobile home or trailer owners, or persons who wish to install non-commercial mobile home or trailer facilities privately and for their own use. The ordinance shall apply within the limits of the Town of Grafton.
2. No firm or entity shall establish or operate a mobile home park or trailer park within the limits of the Town of Grafton without a permit.
3. Before any permits for a mobile home park or trailer park shall be issued, the Planning Board shall certify to the Board of Selectmen that the proposed mobile home park or trailer park will not be injurious or detrimental to the neighborhood in which it is to be situated.
4. Mobile home parks or trailer parks will be permitted subject to approval of application as submitted to the Planning Board. Such application shall be accompanied by a text and map describing the proposed location of the park, the lot layout, plans for water supply and sewage disposal, for garbage and thrash disposal, for drainage, for street layout and construction.
5. Regarding mobile home parks, any plan must meet or exceed the following standard:
  - a. It shall be located on a minimum area of 5 acres; each lot must contain not less than 20,000 square feet and shall have a frontage of at least 1,000 feet on a public or private street having a width of at least 50 feet.
  - b. No lot shall contain more than one mobile home or trailer. No mobile home or trailer shall be placed closer than

150 feet to an existing residence.

- c. Each lot shall be clearly marked.
- d. Front yard setbacks shall be at least 25 feet. Rear yard setbacks shall be at least 25 feet. Side yard setbacks shall be at least 15 feet.
- e. Sanitary facilities must meet or exceed all applicable standards of the State Water Pollution Board and the Town of Grafton.
- f. No principal buildings other than mobile homes or trailers shall be located in a mobile home park or trailer park.
- g. In all mobile home parks and trailer parks, roadways shall be well drained, gravelled, and hard-surfaced or paved. All roadways shall be maintained in good condition and shall be lighted at night. Suitable areas shall be set aside for recreational purposes.

6. Definitions:

*Mobile Home*: Any vehicle used or so constructed as to permit its being used as a conveyance and as a dwelling or sleeping place for one or more persons and provided with running water and sanitary facilities.

*Trailer or House Trailer*: A mobile home which does not have a toilet and bathtub or shower.

*Mobile Home Park or Trailer Park*: Any non-private plot of ground upon which three or more mobile homes or trailers are located.
