8. To see what action the Town will vote to take in regard to building the bridge on the Valley Road, raise and appropriate money for the same, or take any action relating thereto. 9. To see what action the Town will vote to take in regards to buying new equipment for the Highway Department, raise and appropriate money for the same, or take any action relating thereto.

10. To see what action the Town will vote to take in regard to the maintenance of the Bathing Beach, raise and appropriate money for the same, or take any action relating thereto.

11. To see what action the Town will vote to take in regard to Memorial Day, raise and appropriate money for the same, or take any action relating thereto.

12. To see what action the Town will vote to take in regard to Old Home Week and the proper observance of the 175th Anniversary of the Incorporation of the Town, raise and appropriate money for the same, or take any action relating thereto.

13. To see what action the Town will vote to take in regard to the Community Christmas Tree, raise and appropriate money for the same, or take any action relating thereto.

14. To hear reports of the Water Survey Committee and see if the Town wishes to vote for any expansion of the water supply, raise and appropriate money for the same or take any action relating thereto.

15. To see if the Town will vote to extend the water main from the hydrant on the Stoddard road to the old railroad track, raise and appropriate money for the same, or take any action relating thereto.

16. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$100.00 for the Fire Hose reserve fund, or take any action relating thereto.

17. To see what action the Town will vote to take in regard to the fire escape for the Town Hall, raise and appropriate money for the same, or take any action relating thereto.

18. To see if the Town will vote to take any action in regards to drawing up regulations for the use of the Town Dump.

REPORT OF THE CEMETERY COMMITTEE

15. I move that the cemetery committee draw up regulations for the new cemetery including the price of lots, what may or may not be used for markers or monuments, grading, shrubery, perpetual care, etc.

Your committee, to whom was referred the subject of rules, regulations and disposing of lots in the new cemetery, respectfully submit the following report:

1. The cemetery shall be called and forever known as The Hillside Cemetery and shall be governed by the following rules and regulations until otherwise modified.

2. The sexton shall have charge of all interments in said cemetery and shall make and give to the Town Clerk within three days of said interment, a certificate setting forth the name of the person buried, designating the number of the lot in which buried and stating whether the person was a resident of the town, a removal from another cemetery and any other pertinent facts.

3. The Cemetery Committee shall act as agent in the selling of lots in the cemetery under the following conditions:

a. Price of all lots to be \$25.00 and at sale, the sum of \$200.00 must be deposited with the Cemetery Committee as a trust fund, the interest from same to be used for perpetual care of said lot, said transaction to take place before burial can be made. The Cemetery Committee shall give the person so purchasing, a certificate covering sale and an agreement covering perpetual care, setting forth the number of the lot. The certificate and agreement shall be signed by the Committee and the Town Clerk and recorded by the latter. The cemetery committee shall draw up the forms necessary.

b. Only one monument permitted per lot and same must be placed in the center of said lot. Markers must be of standard size (to be decided by the committee) and laid flush with the ground. The natural grade of the lot must not be changed.

c. Interment must be in cement vault.

d. A block of lots to be designated by the committee from time to time, may be sold for \$25.00 per lot without the foregoing regulations.

4. Proceeds from the sale of lots are to be kept in a general cemetery improvement fund, part of said fund to be used from time to time at the discretion of the committee for the upkeep, beautification and general improvement of the cemetery.

REPORT OF TOWN HISTORY COMMITTEE

January 7, 1954

The work of the Town History Committee can be summarized briefly as follows:

1. Sorting and filing of material forwarded by Mr. Maro Brooks. This was an accumulation of ten or more years' work of the former Committee. This was begun by the whole Committee with Mrs. Upton and Mrs. Johnson taking on the genealogies in particular. Records of several families have now been completed. Gifts and loans of Town Reports from Mrs. Charles Upton, Mrs. Lilla Upton, Charles Fogg, Fred O. Johnson, and Mrs. Frederic Gleason have made a complete set for the use of the Committee. A gift from Mrs. Hanson of a great number of Peterborough Transcripts dated in the early 1900s has been a source of much information. Mrs. Johnson's work on the Town Church history and Mrs. Stearns' work on the old houses on Main Street tie in closely with the general Town History. Folders for information have been sent to many families not already recorded. Some have been filled out, others have been neglected or ignored.

2. Sixteen townspeople have kindly consented to work on special topics.

3. A request for material through the Hancock column in the Peterborough Transcript, has brought one response from California. Mr. Stewart D. Weston has offered his father's old Town History "stuffed with clippings" concerning Hancock and its residents. His father, Mr. George F. Weston was born in Hancock in 1853.

4. May we ask for your cooperation. If you receive a genealogy folder please return it as soon as possible. If you have material, old papers, pictures, articles about Hancock and the residents, may we have them to use? They will be received gladly, and will be returned. Any member of the Committee will accept this material:

HANCOCK, 1953

Shall we drive around? Except for the hunting season, few walk. Let's have a look at what changes in the past year show on the landscape. With a full abundance of woodlands and brushgrown fields, naturally we should turn first to our wild animal life, then to man's activities.

Bill Hanson could have told us that with the record-breaking acorn crop last fall there would be more squirrels, mice and woodchucks, and consequently, foxes. Indeed, mouse traps snapped merrily this fall; the highways fairly danced with gray and red squirrels—the deer fattened nicely, too, and so did the partridge.

It could be plainly noted, amid aging maples and elms, that several barns are distinctly missing. Joe Russell from Peterborough—the one-man demolition expert—got busy on Paul Daly's and Hudsons' and is eyeing the Harringtons'. The Sheriffs' barn (the old Fowle place) was taken apart by Roy Finan and Bill Weston, while Dick Noyes had his leveling supervised by Perley Dunbar. Joe Quinn merely lowered his barn, taking off the top half. Farming isn't looking up and it's costly to prop up leaning buildings no longer useful.

But tangled are the trends of history, for it must be noted that the Lawrence Paquettes have added to their farm and so have David and Mary Rochford.

The old squared timbers of the Noyes' barn grace the expanded and embellished Eva-Moore ex-farmhouse, whose stone underpinnings were so artfully put in place by the town's top stone mason, Willis Johnson, who can pick a rock's face and base as well as any of the old vanished tribe of stone wall builders. Incidentally, after 12 years on the telephone exchange, the Evas' retirement from the switchboard was the occasion of a well attended reception in the Vestry.

To go on about the barns, some of the hand-hewn beams from Dalys' and some of the floor planking from the Hudsons' form the roof of a shed up at King Street Farm. And the Westons have some new structures from the salvage of the Sheriffs'.

It doesn't appear that Reg Hubbard, who is building his second house on Norway Hill, (it takes three, Reg, to get the perfect house) used any hundred year old barn timbers, or for that matter did the Merrills, who also built on the Hill. Nor did the McGreals or Howard Pierce (both of Peterborough) draw on old timbers for their new cabins up Nubanusit way. Ralph Rokes didn't use any in enlarging the Troeschs' place on the Old Dublin Road; the same goes for the new house abuilding for the Lambert Murphys by Errol Simonds, and for John Hill's, which he mostly built by himself. But right plunk in town stands the most conspicuous addition to our new structures; yet the smallest, for it measures but 4x4x8 feet. Dan Devens says if you turned out the neon light it would make a good sentry box, if the Russians should come. Dorothy Clark says, undoubtedly paraphrasing Aristotle, (and it stands right next to the Post Office) that telephoning is all right but people will always write letters.

Dropping in on Pauline Crowell is a good way to catch up on the year's events. Anniversaries she records, like the 50th of the Willis Footes, the 25th for the Bill Fishers, the Jules Pickerings, the William Westons, the Leslie Wrights and the Stuart Bradleys. Also one could note the last of the charming Gunther triplets and the animated Cathie Quinn wore bridal veils. All this and much more was in the Hancock column of the Peterborough Transcript. The burning of Fred Gleason's lumber mill; the incredible story of Willis Higgins catching a mink by the tail, were press agency dispatches that went out over the teletypes across the nation, set in motion by Nancy West.

It doesn't show on the outside, but several thousand dollars, probably six before they are through, were obligated this year for freshening up the interior of our landmark and pride, the Meeting House.

Among the Town's organizations, it appears, the Grange has been noteworthy; not for repainting but for increasing its membership to 85 and showing distinct signs of renewed life. This was the year the members of the Sportsmen's Club, still the liveliest group in Town, built a trout fly fishing pool on the land of Mrs. Harry Sheldon across from Foster Avery's, below the Old Cemetery. Peg Bergethon, helped by Barbara Wheeler, re-established the Girl Scouts. And so it goes...

Tom Kierstead was welcomed in March as our new Selectman. He was chosen at a Town Meeting, melodious and calm; no burning issues in the Warrant. The Town's finances are sound. It was no day to test the skill of Moderator Karl Upton; consequently Mildred could relax.
