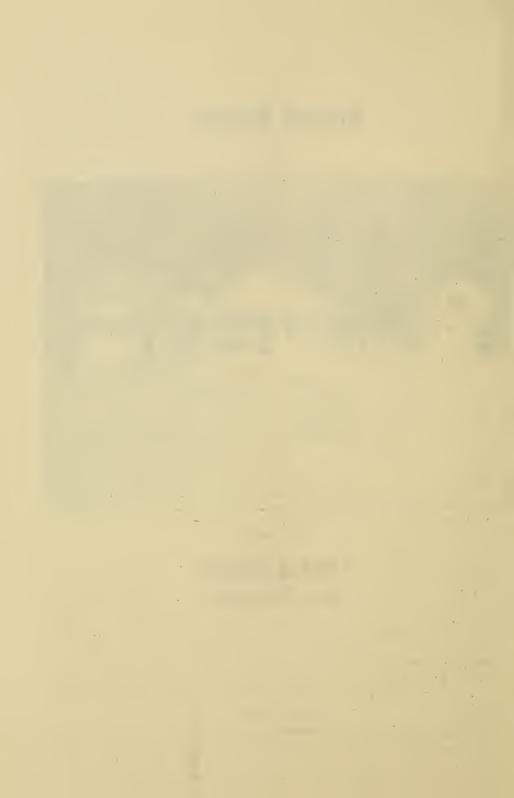

TOWN WARRANT

THE STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

To the inhabitants of the Town of Hebron in the County of Grafton in said State, qualified to vote in Town affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the Community Hall in said Hebron on Tuesday, the second (2) day of March, next, at five o'clock in the afternoon to act upon the following subjects:

- To choose all necessary Town Officers for the year ensuing. Polls open from 5:00 to 9:00 p.m.
 Business meeting will open at 7:00 p.m.
 A supper will be served at 5:30 for those who wish it. (\$2.75)
- 2. To hear the reports of any standing and/or other committees.
- 3. To see if the Town will authorize the Selectmen to borrow money in anticipation of taxes.
- 4. To see if the Town will vote to allow two percent cash discount on property taxes if paid within thirty days from date of tax bill.
- 5. To see if the Town will vote to raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray Town charges for the ensuing year and make appropriations for the same.
- 6. A. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate \$3,000.00 for the established capital reserve fund "Lake Shore Memorial."
- B. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$15,000.00 to purchase the McLane lots.
- 7. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate \$1,000.00 for some improvement on new beach lots if purchased.
- 8. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$1,000.00 for the Bicentennial celebration. This sum includes the second half of the the Town's share of the Area Bicentennial celebration; and appropriation of the Hebron Bicentennial Committee to republish "Recollections of Hebron", with additions.
- 9. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$500 for the purchase of air breathing apparatus for the Fire Department.

- 10. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$375.00 as the Town's share for the studies and operation of the Lakes Region Planning Commission. These funds may be used in conjunction with other State and Federal funds available for planning purpose.
- 11. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$5,000.00 for resurfacing approximately four-tenths (4/10) of the Hobart Hill Road.
- 12. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$5,200.00 to purchase a six (6) cubic yard highway spreader sander.
- 13. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$250.00 for the purchase and putting up of street name signs on all Town roads. (By petition.)
- 14. To see if the Town will vote to accept the proposed Beach Ordinance, a copy of which is posted with this Warrant.
- 15. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$3,000.00 to be added to the established capital reserve fund for a future refuse system.
- 16. To see if the Town will vote to spend the 1975 and 1976 Revenue Sharing allocation for the Regional Refuse Disposal District when established.
- 17. To see if the Town will raise and appropriate a sum of money as may be necessary to reconstruct the Town owned bridge on the North Shore Road and apply for and receive aid from the Federal Aid Off-System program. Upon completion, the State of N.H. will own and maintain the bridge. (Bridge #112/102).
- 18. To transact any other business that may legally come before this meeting.

PROPOSED BEACH ORDINANCE FOR THE TOWN OF HEBRON 1976

ARTICLE: I PREAMBLE AND TITLE.

In order to impose reasonable regulations on those who use, at their own risk, the beach adjacent to that area on the westerly side of Newfound Lake owned by the Town of Hebron, commonly known as the "Hebron Town Beach", this ordinance is adopted, hereinafter known as the "Hebron Town Beach Ordinance of 1976".

ARTICLE II: DUTY TO REGULATE.

The Selectmen of the Town of Hebron are hereby empowered to regulate the times the area owned by the Town may be used, and to prohibit use at other times. Use of said area when prohibited shall be a violation.

ARTICLE III: PARKING.

No vehicle may be parked or left at said Beach area without first having affixed to it a parking use permit, which shall be issued at no cost, annually, by the Town Clerk to any Hebron resident or tax paying property owners, or such other individual as the Selectmen may approve. Said permit shall be revoked as to any vehicle any of whose occupants violate any provision hereof.

ARTICLE IV: REGULATIONS AND MAINTENANCE.

The Selectmen are empowered to adopt such reasonable regulations as may be necessary for the orderly use of said Beach area, and may install or provide such facilities as may be necessary. They shall be responsible for the maintenance of said Beach area, and may delegate such responsibilities to the Town Road Agent, pursuant to R.S.A. 245:7 as they deem advisable.

ARTICLE V: PENALTY.

Violation of any terms of this ordinance shall be a violation within the meaning of R.S.A. Title LVIII, and fines collected pursuant thereto shall be for the use and benefit of the Town.

ARTICLE VI: SEPARABILITY.

If any section, subsection, paragraph, sentence, clause, provision, word or phrase of this ordinance is held to be invalid or unconstitutional by any court or any competent authority, such holding shall not affect, impair, or invalidate any other section, subsection, paragraph, sentence, clause, provision, word or phrase of this ordinance.

ARTICLE VII: EFFECTIVE DATE.

This ordinance shall take effect thirty (30) days from the date it is adopted by the Town.

REPORT OF THE FOREST FIRE WARDEN AND DISTRICT CHIEF

REPORT TO TOWNS

Upon the recommendation of town selectmen and city councils, the Division of Forests and Lands appoints a forest fire warden and several deputy forest fire wardens in each town and city every three years. The town or city warden is responsible for maintaining a force of men and adequate equipment to suppress any wildfire that occurs in his town or city during his term of appointment. The fire warden must authorize all open burning when the ground is not covered with snow. No open fires can be authorized between 9 a.m. and 5 p.m., unless it is raining, without the additional permission of the state district fire chief.

Any person wishing to kindle an open fire when the ground is not covered with snow must first obtain the written permission of the forest fire warden. Camp and cooking fires also require the warden's permission.

The Division of Forests and Lands, through its Forest Fire Service, assists all cities and towns in meeting these requirements by training the warden and deputy forces in wildfire suppression tactics, making hand tool suppression equipment available at fifty percent of cost, supplying pieces of Federal excess property for use as fire attack vehicles and sharing up to fifty percent of the cost of wildfire suppression costs.

Wildfire prevention is also a joint state, city or town program. Smokey bear is available from the Forest Fire Service for local fire prevention programs. Posters and Junior Ranger kits are available for distribution by local fire departments upon request to the Forest Fire Service. Each forest fire warden is expected to carry on a continuous wildfire prevention program within his town or city.
