TOWN WARRANT THE STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

To the inhabitants of the Town of Hill in the County of Merrimack in said State, qualified to vote in Town Affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town Hall in said Hill on Tuesday, March 11, 1980 at 2 P.M. to vote on the following subjects:

1. To choose all necessary Town Officers for the ensuing year.

POLLS WILL BE OPEN AT 2 P.M. AND WILL NOT BE CLOSED BEFORE 7 P.M.

THE BUSINESS MEETING TO CONSIDER THE REMAINING ARTICLES OF THIS WARRANT WILL OPEN AT THE TOWN HALL IN SAID HILL ON SATURDAY, MARCH 15, 1980 AT 1 P.M. TO ACT UPON THE FOLLOWING ARTICLES:

- 2. To see what sum the Town will vote to raise and appropriate to defray the general government expenses of the Town for the ensuing year.
- 3. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to borrow on behalf of the Town by the issuance of notes in compliance with the provisions of the Municipal Finance Act, a sum not to exceed \$200,000.00 in anticipation of taxes for the year 1980, said notes to be payable from taxes within one year from the date of issuance, and to determine the rate of interest thereon, and to take such other actions as may be necessary to effectuate the issuance, negotiation, sale, and delivery of such notes as shall be in the best interest of the Town of Hill.
- 4. To see if the Town will vote to appropriate Revenue Sharing receipts for the calendar year 1979 amounting to \$4,625.00 and place this amount in the Capital Reserve Fund-Replacement of 1973 GMC Highway Truck.
- 5. To see if the Town will vote to appropriate anticipated Revenue Sharing Receipts for the calendar year 1980 amounting to \$3,200.00 and apply this amount toward the cost of revaluing the Town.
- 6. To see if the Town will vote to accept and enforce Chapt. 466 RSA pertaining to dogs.
- 7. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate a sum not to ex-

ceed \$26,000.00 for the purchase of a second hand grader and to authorize a committee consisting of the Board of Selectmen, the Road Agent and five other voters to oversee the purchase of said grader.

- 8. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to withdraw from the accured income of the Ferrin Fund the sum of \$2,000.00 and to apply said sum toward the cost of the grader referred to in Article 7 above.
- 9. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate a sum not to exceed \$24,000.00 by the issuance of serial notes under and in compliance with the previsions of the Municipal Finance Act, and to authorize the Selectmen to issue and negotiate such notes and to determine the rate of interest thereon, and to take such other actions as may be necessary to effect the issuance, negotiation, sale and delivery of such notes as shall be in the best interest of the Town of Hill. The above sum of \$24,000.00 is to be applied toward the purchase of the grader referred to in Article 7 above.
- 10. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$2,515.00 for the purpose of installing a burglar alarm system in the Town Hall.
- 11. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$1,500.00 for the purchase of fire hose.
- 12. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to sell at public auction to the highest bidder a 1960 Ford Fire Dept. tank truck and a 1967 Dodge Fire Dept. pickup truck and to further authorize the Selectmen to place the proceeds from the sale of these two vehicles in a Capital Reserve Fund Fire Equipment.
- 13. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to withdraw the sum of \$2,000.00 from the accured income of the Ferrin Fund and to deposit said sum in Capital Reserve Case Loader.
- 14. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to withdraw the sum of \$1,000.00 from the accrued income of the Ferrin Fund and to deposit said sum in Capital Reserve-Replacement 1976 Chevrolet Pickup Truck,
- 15. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to withdraw the sum of \$500.00 from the accrued income of the Ferrin Fund and to deposit said sum in Capital Reserve Police Cruiser.

- 16. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to make application for, accept and expend on behalf of the Town all gifts, advances, grants in aid or other funds as may now or hereafter be available or forthcoming from the United States Government, State of New Hampshire, or any other federal, state or local agency as provided under RSA 31:95B.
- 17. To see if the Town will vote, under the terms of RSA 238 to discontinue and subject to gates and bars the following town roads:

REPORT OF FOREST FIRE WARDEN AND STATE FOREST FIRE SERVICE

Prevention and control of forest fires is handled through a cooperative effort between town/city fire organizations and the State Forest Fire Service.

Since 1903, when the first forest fire laws were passed by our Legislature, the State Forester has appointed someone in each municipality as a Forest Fire Warden and charged him with the responsibility of forest fire prevention and control within his town/city. This person may ask the State Forester to appoint as many Deputy Forest Fire Wardens as may be necessary to efficiently carry out his charge.

The State Forester has divided the State into ten forest fire districts with a full time District Forest Fire Chief in each district. The State organization is charged with assisting the municipal forest fire organization in any way possible.

State personnel conduct fire training schools, assist with forest fire suppression, fire cause investigation, prosecution of fire law violators and forest fire prevention programs. Forest fire suppression equipment is purchased through State bulk purchasing ability and sold to local forest fire organizations at one-half cost. Excess military property is obtained and turned over to town/city fire departments at no cost to local departments for conversion into fire suppression units. This cooperative arrangement between State and municipality has resulted in one of the best forest fire records in the United States with less than one-half acre of woodland burned in each fire reported.

REPORT FROM THE OFFICE OF THE SUPERINTENDENT OF SCHOOLS

To the Citizens of Hill:

The cost of education today is a topic on all our minds. Being able to provide for the educational needs of all our students in times of rising inflation is an issue your School Board and Administration discusses often.

The proposed budget appears in an entirely new format for the first time. It is a result of a revision of all school district accounting procedures. Chapter 71, Section 24 of the Revised Statutes Annotated prescribe that school districts shall keep uniform accounts in a manner prescribed by the Department of Revenue Administration. To this end, our State Department of Education has worked with the Business Administrator from School Administrative Unit Eighteen to develop a budgetary accounting system that will be uniform with federal reporting procedures and provide the local education agency (a school district) with a clearer picture of programmed budgeting.

According to the Commissioner, Dr. Robert Brunelle, this program accounting system provides the basis for complete accounting for all district receipts, disbursements, for systematic development of program budgeting, and for the accumulation and dissemination of program oriented costs.

As you review the proposed school budget, you will notice that there are six areas where significant increases occur; namely tuition to Franklin High School up \$10,335.00, tuition to special education programs up \$7,164.00, fuel up \$1,920.00 and transportation of our students up \$5,931.20, transportation of handicapped students up \$4,207.00 (which will be reimbursed from the State) and capital projects up \$18,220.00. These increases account for a major portion (\$47,777.20) of the \$51,470.00 total budget increase.

The cost of providing education at the Jennie D. Blake School alone has only increased slightly over last year.

In order that you may better understand the new format and accounting procedures, we provide you with comparative costs for each item in the budget. You will be able to compare prior year expenditures 1978-79 with the present operating budget 1979-80 with the proposed 1980-81 budget requests. The dollar change indicates the amount of increase -- decrease of proposed budget over current operating budget.

Goals for the Jennie D. Blake School

The School Board adopted the following goals as a result of the input gained from the community and professional staff.

To increase educational services to students through the effective implementation and management of:

Title VII Reading Improvement Program (by 1980)

Title I Remedial Reading Program (an ongoing activity)

Title IV-C Rural Prescriptive Clinic - A Learning Disabilities Program (by 1981)

Pupil Placement Services - Procedures for Programming Special Needs Students (an ongoing activity)

Review and evaluation of grade reporting system (by 1982)

Testing Program

Twice each year students in the Jennie D. Blake School grades two through six are given standardized tests. The Stanford Diagnostic Reading and Mathematics tests are administered in September and again in June for the purpose of determining strengths and weaknesses of each child and to measure how much growth has taken place in a school year.

A brief review of the September 1979 results shows the following:

Mrs. Carol Wilson has been hired on a part-time basis to coordinate and find volunteers to work in the school with youngsters having special learning needs. She has gone beyond this commitment and is contributing much extra time coordinating the services of six regular and four part-time volunteers.

In summary, we want to express to the residents of Hill our thanks for their support of the school district, and to the School Board for their many hours attending meetings and supporting of sound educational practices.

The Jennie D. Blake School enters the 1980's with nothing short of high hopes for the future. Capitalizing on our goal for more community involvement, the Blake School has been the recipient of over 500 volunteer hours through January 1980. Through the efforts of Carolyn Wilson, our volunteer coordinator, we have been able to expand our curriculum to include arts and crafts mini-courses and incorporate some of the enormous amounts of talent found in Hill.

Mrs. Georgette Huckins has returned for her fifth year at our school. Mr. Paul Skelton and myself are in our second year. Mrs. Karen Soule is the new Resource Room Teacher, Mrs. Donna Newton is our Teacher-Aide, Mrs. Martha Gilchrist returns as our School Nurse and Mrs. Sarah Brophy is our new School Psychologist. Mrs Nancy Byers and Mrs. Marjorie Wallace have returned in the lunch room and Mr. and Mrs. Paul Lovett work as our custodians.

Our programs are supported by itinerant personnel. Title I is a reading program for Grades 1, 2, and 3 and Mrs. Sue Ackerson returned for her second year as our Title I Tutor. Mrs. Ackerson has found it necessary to resign and our new replacement is Mrs. Ann M. Dunne. Our Title VII Tutor is Miss Barbara Locke and the Title VII program serves students in grades 4 and 5. Ms. Lisa Stevens of the Rural Prescriptive Clinic is a Learning Disabilities Specialist who assists our students two mornings a week.

This is the first year in our new math series and we are very pleased with the results we have seen thus far. We are continuing to place emphasis on spelling and grammar skills. One of our goals is to establish proper study habits in our pupils since many of our students have trouble studying properly. We will be setting up workshops with parents next fall to review basic study skills taught in the school and practiced at home.

Extra curricular activities continue to play a major role in providing a well rounded education. Our Christmas show was presented to a standing room only crowd and had a repeat performance at the Merrimack County Nursing Home. The school very much appreciates the efforts of Mrs. Osro Morrill and Mrs. Brenda Cummings in obtaining a curtain for the stage.

Our basketball team comprised of fourth through sixth graders has been playing other teams from the area. Our Ski Club is off to a late start due to the weather.

We have many people to thank this year: the Hill School Board and the School Administrative Unit Staff for their encouragement and assistance, our school volunteers who have shared so many hours with us, and all the parents and townspeople for their continued support.

A balance sheet disclosing the financial condition of the general fund at June 30, 1979 is presented in Exhibit A-1. The unreserved fund balance (deficit) amounted to (\$522) at June 30, 1979. A statement of the changes in fund balance is shown in Exhibit A-2.

Statements of estimated and actual revenues, appropriations and expenditures are included in Exhibits A-3 and A-4, respectively. As indicated therein, revenues in excess of estimates amounted to \$4,661, while expenditures exceeded appropriations by \$5,183, resulting in a 1978-79 budget deficit of \$522.

FINANCIAL STATEMENTS

A balance sheet of all the special revenue funds is presented in Exhibit B-1. These funds include the school lunch program fund and the Comprehensive Employment and Training Act funds. The special revenue fund balances totaled \$3,215 at June 30, 1979. A statement of revenues, expenditures and changes in fund balances is contained in Exhibit B-2.

Trust and Agency Fund

A balance sheet and statement of revenues, expenditures and changes in fund balance of the trust and agency fund is presented in Exhibits C-1 and C-2, respectively. This fund consists of the Capital Reserve Fund and contains a balance of \$2,181 at June 30, 1979.

GENERAL COMMENTS

Overdraft of Appropriations and Application of Municipal Budget Law

As indicated by the general fund statement of appropriations and expenditures, there was a net overdraft of budgetary appropriations totaling \$5,183 for the 1978-79 fiscal year.

The provisions of the State of New Hampshire Municipal Budget Law (R.S.A. 32:10a) require that when circumstances arise during the year which make it necessary to expend money in excess of an appropriation, which may result in an overexpenditure of the total amount appropriated, the school board, upon application to the State Board of Education, may be given authority to make such expenditure.

In a communication from the State of New Hampshire Department of Education, dated August 28, 1978, the status of State support for education of handicapped children for 1978-79 was explained as follows:

"H.B. 16 has become law and is identified as Chapter 30 of the Laws of 1978. It amends Chapter 186-A of the Revised Statutes Annotated, which deals with the education of handicapped children. The new legislation was effective July 1, 1978. It includes an appropriation of \$2,889,671 as State support for special education for the 1978-79 fiscal year.

Section 8 of the act reads as follows: Funds Application. Notwithstanding any other provision of law to the contrary, the local school districts are specifically authorized to apply for and expend such state aid to which they are entitled in accordance with the provisions of this act without authorization by a school district meeting.

We construe this to mean that if it is necessary to do so, a school district may, during 1978-79, spend more than was

originally voted as the total school district appropriation for this year. The additional spending may not, however, exceed the amount which the district receives as its share of the \$2,889,671 appropriated as state support under the provisions of Chapter 30."

The amount of State revenues in 1978-79 for education of handicapped children was \$4,610. Inasmuch as the total net overdraft of budgetary appropriations was \$5,183, the District did not comply with the municipal budget law in connection with the provisions of Chapter 186-A of the Revised Statutes Annotated, dealing with the education of handicapped children as outlined above and did over expend its budget by \$573 for other purposes.
