TOWN WARRANT

THE STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

To the Inhabitants of the Town of Landaff in the County of Grafton in said State, qualified to vote in Town affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at Town Hall in said Landaff on Tuesday, the eleventh day of March, next at nine of the clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects:

1. To choose all necessary Town Officers for the year ensuing.

2. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray town charges for the ensuing year and make appropriations of the same.

3. To see if the town will vote to accept State Aid for highways, and raise and appropriate money for the same.

4. To see how much money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for support of the Lisbon District Nursing Association.

5. To see if the town will authorize the Selectmen to borrow money in anticipation of taxes.

6. To see if the town will vote a discount on such part of taxes as are paid on or before July 15, 1947.

7. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$400.00 for control of white pine blister rust in Landaff. 8. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate to the White Mountains Region Association, for the purpose of publicizing and promoting the natural advantages and resources of our town, together with other towns in the region, a sum not to exceed 10 cents per \$1,000.00 of the assessed valuation of the town for 1946.

9. To transact any other business that may legally come before said meeting.

Given under our hands and seal, this eleventh day of January, in the year of our Lord nineteen hundred and forty-seven.

SUPERINTENDENT'S REPORT

To the School Board and Citizens of Landaff:

I herewith submit my fourth annual report as Superintendent of Schools.

The total enrollment in your schools last year was 31. The average membership was 24.86 and the percentage of attendance 95.6. There were 11 pupils attending Lisbon High School.

The enrollment on January 15 was 38. There were 21 pupils at the Blue school and 17 at Scotland. This is 14 more than you had in your schools at the same time last year. You have been very fortunate to retain the services of Mrs. Annie Atwood at Scotland School and Mrs. Veda Aiken at Blue School. Mrs. Atwood has been very successful in bettering conditions at the Scotland school. Mrs. Aiken has the Blue school well organized and the children are making excellent progress.

Repairs and alterations at the Blue school were: a new fence, new cupboards and bookcases, bulletin boards, three new doors, steel ceiling renailed and the interior walls and the roof patched. At Scotland School the building was painted inside and out, two new windows were installed, the yard was graveled, the brush was cut, and minor repairs were made.

The future of your schools is very uncertain. It appears that for the next few years there will not be enough teachers to fill positions in the smaller towns. The teachers' colleges are graduating about one-third the demand. Many married teachers are giving up teaching. To exist, the small school must be prepared to make its positions more attractive than those of the large school. The answer to this problem is high salaries and good working conditions for those teachers who enjoy working in small communities.

Landaff is to be congratulated on the improvement of its buildings. You are one of the few districts to attempt repairs while the scarcity of materials still exists. Your school board has done very well under difficult circumstances.

The work in your community is pleasant. Your school board and teachers are cooperative and are working for the best interest of the children of Landaff.
