WARRANT FOR TOWN MEETING TOWN OF MADBURY, N. H.

March 9, 1965

To the Inhabitants of the Town of Madbury, County of Strafford, and the State of New Hampshire qualified to vote in Town Affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town Hall in said Madbury on Tuesday, the 9th day of March, A. D., 1965, at 8:00 o'clock in the evening to act upon the following articles.

ARTICLE 1. To choose the following Town Officers:

A town clerk for the ensuing year.

A selectman for the ensuing three years.

A treasurer for the ensuing year.

A collector of taxes for the ensuing year.

Two auditors for the ensuing year.

A trustee of trust funds for the ensuing three years.

ARTICLE 2. To choose all other town officers.

ARTICLE 3. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the selectmen to borrow money in anticipation of taxes.

ARTICLE 4. To see if the Town will vote to raise \$315.18 for Class V highways to match the sum of \$2,101.20 to be contributed by the State.

ARTICLE 5. To see what action the Town will take on retaining the money collected from the Government for

- the Hook Mill Road, as partial payment for a new bridge at Mill Hill.
- ARTICLE 6. To see if the Town will vote to appropriate the sum of \$6,000.00 to go with the Hook Mill Road money for a new bridge at Mill Hill Road such sum to be raised through issuance of bonds or notes.
- ARTICLE 7. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$120.00 for the Seacoast Regional Development Association.
- ARTICLE 8. To see if the Town will raise and appropriate the sum of \$125.00 to be used in co-operation with State and Federal funds for the control of White Pine Blister Rust, within the confines of the Town.
- ARTICLE 9. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$50.00 to provide registration fee at the University of New Hampshire for person(s) designated by the Board of Selectmen to enroll in the special course on Regional Development and Economic Growth.
- ARTICLE 10. To see if the Town of Madbury, New Hampshire, will authorize the selectmen to convey to Public Service Company of New Hampshire an electric transmission line easement 100 feet wide and 188 feet long across the northwesterly end of Town land of the Boston and Maine Railroad to the middle of Pudding Hill Road, for a consideration of \$700.00.
- ARTICLE 11. To see if the Town will authorize the selectmen to take legal action to recover the Town's state aid money that was put in the Oyster River general fund.
- ARTICLE 12. To see what action the Town will take on the proposed budget for the current year.

ARTICLE 13. To transact any other business that may legally come before the meeting.

RECORD OF TOWN MEETING

March 10, 1964

ARTICLE 1. Balloting for town officers:

For Town Clerk for the ensuing year voted that the Moderator should cast one vote for Lucile D. Hutchins. This being done, Lucile D. Hutchins was declared elected for the ensuing year.

For Selectman for the ensuing three years, voted that the Clerk should cast one ballot for Harry C. Cheney. Jr. and this being done, Harry C. Cheney, Jr. was declared elected for the ensuing three years.

For Treasurer for the ensuing year, voted that the Clerk should cast one ballot for John W. Printy, and this being done, John W. Printy was declared elected for the ensuing year.

For Collector of Taxes for the ensuing year, voted that the Clerk should cast one ballot for Dorothy S. Dugan and this being done, Dorothy S. Dugan was declared elected for the ensuing year.

For Auditors for the ensuing year, voted that the Clerk cast one ballot for Enid V. James and Barbara Houston and this being done, the two named were declared elected for the ensuing year.

For Trustee of Trust Funds for the ensuing three years, voted that the Clerk cast one ballot for Georgia G. Armitage and this being done, Georgia G. Armitage was declared elected for the ensuing three years.

ARTICLE 2. Voted that the Selectmen choose and appoint all other necessary town officers.

- ARTICLE 3. Voted to authorize the Selectmen to borrow a sum or sums not exceeding in the aggregate of \$20,000.00 in anticipation of taxes for the ensuing year and to issue in the name of and on the credit of the town, negotiable notes therefor, said notes to be paid in the current municipal year from taxes collected during the current municipal year.
- ARTICLE 4. Approved article to raise and appropriate the sum of \$317.54 for Class V highways to match the sum of \$2,116.91 to be contributed by the state.
- ARTICLE 5. Approved article to raise and appropriate a sum not exceeding \$2,434.45 for the purpose of making improvements to the following Class V roads within the town: Drew and Freshet.
- ARTICLE 6. This article to see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$120.00 for the Seacoast Regional Development Association was passed without action.
- ARTICLE 7. This meeting by vote petitioned the Selectmen to improve town roads, by a special town meeting on roads, to be called by the Selectmen, in the evening, prior to road work in spring, to consider action on bond issue for roads.
- ARTICLE 8. The proposed budget for the current year was amended to include an appropriation of \$375.00 for the toilet facilities at the Town Hall to be installed at the discretion of the Selectmen.

Approved a total budget of \$19,732.54.

ARTICLE 9. To transact any other business that may legally come before the meeting.

A motion was made and seconded to raise town salaries.

Voted to adjourn for voting on Articles 10 and 11. Adjourned 12:00 noon.

FIRE DEPARTMENT REPORT

To the Citizens of Madbury:

Although the drought conditions were severe in 1964, our fire record remained close to the annual average.

There were 11 alarms. 4 were in buildings, 6 were brush fires, and 1 car fire. We received 2 calls to assist Dover at brush fires.

Assistance from the Dover Fire Department was received at the Dover Sand and Gravel Garage, and at Colprit's Nursery. In both cases damage was moderate.

The equipment is in good condition. Repairs consisted of replacement of the clutch in the Chevrolet, and 2 tires for the International truck.

New equipment consisted of 200 feet of $1\frac{1}{2}$ inch hose. We installed a Tone Alerting Radio system which when completed will be paid for by the Fire Department, and matching funds from Civil Defense.

A Dry Hydrant has been installed on Perkins Road. The cost is to be shared by the Fire Department and interested citizens.

The Department has held it's regular monthly meetings, and some extra meetings for training. A station watch, with daily check of the equipment during the winter months was organized.

Please continue to co-operate in obtaining permits for open fires and incinerators.
