Town Meeting Warrant

To the inhabitants of the Town of Monroe in the County of Grafton in said State, qualified to vote in Town Affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town Hall in said Monroe on Tuesday, the ninth day of March, next at ten of the clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects:

1. To choose all necessary Town Officers for the year ensuing.
2. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray town charges for the ensuing year and make appropriations of the same.
3. To see how much money the town will raise and appropriate for the Town Hall and other Town Buildings.
4. To see how much money the town will raise and appropriate for the Fire Department.
5. To see what action the town will take on raising money for the purpose of keeping a physician in town.
6. To see how much money the town will appropriate for the maintenance of sewers.
7. To see how much money the town will appropriate for Town Road Maintenance.

8. To see how much money the town will raise for street lighting.

9. To see how much money the town will raise for Libraries more than the law requires.

10. To see how much money the town will raise for the support of the poor.

11. To see how much money the town will raise for Old Age Assistance.

12. To see how much money the town will raise for Memorial Day.

13. To see how much money the town will raise for parks and playgrounds, including band concerts.

14. To see how much money the town will raise for cemeteries.

15. To see if the town will authorize the Selectmen to distribute the Inventory blanks at the time they appraise the property to be taxed.

16. To see what action the town will take in regard to real estate taken over for non-payment of taxes.

17. To see if the town will authorize the Selectmen to raise money on town notes if necessary.

18. To see if the town will raise the sum of \$400.00 to control White Pine Blister Rust.

19. To see how much money the town will raise and appropriate to the White Mountains Region Association, for the purpose of publicizing and promoting

the natural advantages and resources of the town together with other towns in the region.

20. To see if the town will raise and appropriate the required amount for State Aid Construction.

21. To see if the town will vote to raise the sum of \$800 to provide for the care of teeth, eyes, ears, nose and throat of all children of Monroe.

22. To see what action the town will take in regard to keeping a Recreational Director in town and make appropriation for the same.

23. To see what action the town will take in regard to paying for construction on new road above Monroe village when completed.

24. To hear reports of all committees and officers heretofore chosen and pass any vote relating thereto.

25. To bring in your ballots for delegate to Constitutional Convention to be held in Concord in May 1948.

26. To transact any other business that may legally come before said meeting.

Librarian's Report for 1947

Monroe Free Public Library has been open on an average of 12 hours per week as usual.

This year the librarian and trustees with the approval of the New Hampshire State librarian used \$200 of its money to hire a teacher in handicraft; the subjects taught in the adult classes were wood-carving and stenciling. The Library funds paid for eight lessons of wood-carving and eight lessons in stenciling. Twenty-six people joined the classes with an 86% attendance at classes. Each member of the class paid a small tuition fee to join and 25 cents each class to pay for use of tools and supplies. At the end of the eight lessons enough money was in the treasury to pay for two more lessons.

Since the term of ten lessons ended, the class has continued to meet every Monday evening and with the help of Mrs. Harriet W. Hinman have gone on with the wood-carving. The rug meetings that were held in the summer were paid for entirely by the members of the class who hired their own teacher unassisted by any outside aid.

The expense of running the library and expense of books have increased considerably this year; so we are asking for \$2,000.00 this year—\$1,200 to be used for the regular library expenses and \$800 to be used to hire teachers to continue the adult handicraft classes. As before, each member of the classes furnished their own material to work with. We hope the citizens of the town, both men and women will take advantage of these classes. It may prove a means of supplementing your income, perhaps in a

small way, but there are possibilities and a demand for hand work.

We thank the people who have given books and current magazines to the library. Remember to let us know your reading wants and we will try and supply them.

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town Hall in said district on the 9th day of March 1947, at 1:00 o'clock in the afternoon, to act upon the following subjects:

1. To choose a Moderator for the coming year.
2. To choose a Clerk for the ensuing year.
3. To choose a Member of the School Board for the ensuing three years.
4. To choose a Treasurer for the ensuing year.
5. To determine and appoint the salaries of the School Board and Truant Officer, and fix the compensation of any other officers or agent of the district.
6. To hear the reports of Agents, Auditors, Committees, or Officers chosen, and pass any vote relating thereto.
7. To choose Agents, Auditors and Committees in relation to any subject embraced in this warrant.
8. To see if the district will vote to make any alteration in the amount of money required to be assessed for the ensuing year for the support of public schools and the payment of the statutory obligations of the district, as determined by the school board in its annual report.
9. To see if the district will authorize the school board and two other legal voters of the district, appointed by the moderator, to act as a special committee to consider the feasibility of forming a cooperative secondary school district and to report to the district not later than May 1 its findings including building requirements, program of studies, capital investment, operational costs of such a district and such other matters as may be deemed material.
10. If the preceding article is adopted, to see if the district will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of not exceeding \$300 to cover the cost of preparation of the report and traveling expenses of the special committee.

TEACHERS AND PUPILS:

Two new members of the teaching staff were employed at the beginning of the 1947-'48 school year. Mrs. Mildred Daniell of St. Johnsbury, Vermont, a Normal School graduate with advanced work at the University of Vermont, was employed to teach grades 5 and 6, replacing Mrs. Dearborn. Miss Pauline Pushee of Lyme, N. H., a graduate of Plymouth Teachers College with a B. Ed. degree, was secured to teach grades 1 and 2, replacing Mrs. Hinman. Miss Leota Whitcomb was moved from grades 5-6 to teach grades 7 and 8 and is continuing with shop instruction. Any consolidated school system, such as that of Monroe, requires a great amount of administrative guidance. Miss Connolly, as Principal, is to be complimented for her efficiency in this phase of the school program. Under her planning, a well balanced guidance program is functioning, which includes a systematic testing schedule. As is true of the weak link in a chain, so is it true with a school system, it being no stronger than the weakest teacher. The success of the Monroe School faculty is due to the strength and loyalty of each member. The system is fortunate indeed to have such a group of efficient instructors on its staff. There is no weak link.

BUILDINGS AND GROUNDS:

Added athletic equipment on the playground, in

the form of basketball standards, was erected. A sound recorder-reproducer was purchased for the more efficient teaching of music and speech. The floor in the basement playroom, damaged last year by water seepage, has been made usable by the diligence of Mr. Wright, a custodian well deserving of praise in his efficient care of your excellent school plant. Money is included in the 1948 budget to remedy the cause of the damage done in the playroom by seepage in previous wet seasons.

As a new member in the field of education in your District, I have only praise for teachers, pupils, School Board members and citizens who have shown a most loyal and friendly spirit of cooperation. It is most gratifying to work under such conditions.
