TOWN WARRANT
THE STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

To the Inhabitants of the Town of New Durham in the County of Strafford, in said State qualified to vote in Town Affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town Hall in said New Durham on Tuesday, the eighth (8th) day of March, next at twelve of the clock, to act upon the following subjects:

Article 1. To choose all necessary town officers for the year ensuing.

And you are hereby further notified to meet at said Town Hall in said New Durham at seven o'clock in the afternoon to act upon the following subjects:

Article 2. To see if the town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to borrow such sums of money as may be necessary to pay current expenses in anticipation of taxes.

Article 3. To see if the town will clarify vote taken last Town Meeting granting State wages to Highway employees in regards to overtime, sick pay, retirement, or any other benefits granted State employees.

Article 4. To see if the town will rescind action taken last year regarding old dump site on Merrymeeting Road and vote to keep same as right-of-way to river.

Article 5. To see if the town will vote to discontinue use of the partisan ballot system at town elections and use instead the non-partisan ballot system. If adopted this article shall take effect at the Town Meeting of March, 1967. (By Request)

Article 6. In the event Article 5 is adopted, to see if the town will vote to authorize the Town Clerk to set up the proper procedures for the change to the non-partisan ballot system and notify the voters of the town of the changes to be made not later than January 1, 1967. (By Request)

Article 7. To see if the town will vote to have a complete re-appraisal of all the real estate in the town.

Article 8. To see if the town will vote to purchase a new grader and raise and appropriate \$17,000.00 on serial notes payable at \$1,500.00 per year starting in 1967 to pay for same.

Article 9. To see if the town will vote to repair shovel and raise and appropriate \$5,000.00 on serial notes payable at \$1,000.00 per year starting in 1967 to pay for same.

Article 10. To see if the town will vote to instruct the Selectmen to have a salt shed built and raise and appropriate \$1,000.00 for same as recommended by Budget Committee.

Article 11. To see if the town will vote to instruct the Moderator to appoint a committee of 3 to investigate the possibility of having a swimming beach in New Durham and to bring details and costs to 1967 Town Meeting. (By Request)

Article 12. To see if the town will vote to instruct the Zoning Committee to make further studies and report at 1967 Town Meeting.

Article 13. To see if the town will vote to replace 3 lights at Merrymeeting Lake with mercury vapor lights and increase the appropriation by \$75.00. (By Request)

Article 14. To see if the town will vote to install a mercury vapor light at intersection of Ridge Road and Route #11 and increase the appropriation by \$45.00. (By Request)

Article 15. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate such sums of money as are necessary to defray the expenses of town government for the ensuing year in accordance with the recommendations of the Budget Committee.

Article 16. To hear reports of any standing committees.

Article 17. To transact any other business that may legally come before the meeting.

CIVIL DEFENSE REPORT

Your Civil Defense has participated in all drills and tests held this year. The tests have not been public but were a check on the time involved in receiving warnings. The warnings are received on the Red Fire net phones which are covered twenty-four hours a day. This gives us very adequate coverage.

Program and progress reports have been filed with State Headquarters, making us eligible for surplus property and matching funds. Some surplus property was acquired for the Highway Department and a radio antenna was installed at the Fire Station.

Mrs. Virginia H. Legro, Director in charge of Women's Activities, gave an informative talk to the PT&F on Civil Defense.

Three members of the Radiological Monitoring team took a refresher course in the spring at the new Training Center in Gilford. This new center was opened during the past year and courses are held all winter. They include the following: Civil Defense Management and Organization; Radio Communications; Basic Survival; Essentials of Civil Defense; Shelter Manager; RADEF refresher, and Warning. All courses are open to both men and women and are oriented toward the Public Fall Out Shelter program.

The facilities of the Civil Defense Training Center are available to local Fire, Auxiliary Police, Rescue and other Civil Defense units for training. Courses in Medical Self Help and First Aid also will be scheduled for the Center this winter.

The Center is nearby and should not be too difficult to attend. Any one wanting more information concerning these courses may contact your local director.

Upon checking this list against our shelves, we found that we had more than three quarters of this literature already, and are now attempting to fill the gaps, as well as to supply other books on the recommended reading list. These books are in a special section for students.

The Bookmobile calls periodically, leaving us a large selection for young and old, and its staff is most helpful.

Our Librarian, Dorothy LaPointe, continues to serve most faithfully and well and we feel fortunate to have her.

Most of us who live in New Hampshire and the thousands of vacationists that visit us every year love the State for the variegated woodlands that encircle our clean lakes and clothe the hills and mountains. Most of us appreciate these values, but still there were enough careless people among us to cause over 880 grass and woodland fires to start in 1965. True this was a much dryer than normal year but this should have meant the use of extra care. Fortunately the fire fighting forces have held the line against such careless acts. It is up to each one of us to be ever mindful that a spark or flame is a potential fire.

WE MUST ALL BE CAREFUL

1. To teach our children the danger in lighting matches.
2. To never discard lighted smoking material from a car or while walking through fields or woods.
3. To safely dispose of rubbish preferably at the town dump. If you must burn rubbish or brush:
 - a. Always get a permit to burn from the warden.
 - b. Start your fire late in the day after 5:00 p.m.
 - c. If burning a field or brush have equipment and adequate help on hand. The heat from your fire creates its own draft to spread fire.

Our carelessness with fire is costing our State and Towns thousands of wasted dollars in suppression and hundreds of acres of destroyed woodlands. Yours never to enjoy.

Dear Mr. Nutter:

This will confirm the conversation which the members of this commission had with your board last year when we were in New Durham to examine several properties on which appeals for abatement had been filed, that we did not deem it practical to continue the appraisal of new properties from year to year any longer. The original appraisal in New Durham was made in 1958 and since that time, as you know, there have been some very pronounced increases in the value of certain types of property. Because of this it is not feasible to attempt to appraise new properties at prices which prevailed so many years ago. In view of this, we must inform you that we shall discontinue the assistance that we have been giving the town each year.

However, we do suggest that because of the considerable amount of individual parcels in New Durham and the large number of additions thereto annually, that the town seriously consider having all of its real estate appraised completely as soon as this can be done. In the event that your board and the budget committee decide that this matter shall be considered by the voters at the March Town Meeting, we enclose articles which may be used for insertion in the warrant. If the town votes at this year's meeting for a revaluation, we will make an exception and appraise new properties constructed since 1965.

As a matter of fact, because of previous commitments we would not be able to do the work in time for use in 1966 and, therefore, it would not be necessary to appropriate any money this year. In other words, the first article would merely propose that the town consider requesting the tax commission to assist it in appraising all

taxable real estate. If this were passed on favorably the work would receive priority over those towns which might vote similar assistance at a later date. We enclose herewith a synopsis of the manner in which complete appraisals are made by our staff, together with statistics indicating the result of this work over a period of years.

EQUALIZED VALUATION

Gentlemen:

In accordance with the provisions of Chapter 71:11 V, which are quoted on the enclosed summary, we have conducted an assessment-sales ratio study in your town to determine what in our opinion the average level of assessments was as of April 1, 1964.

We have computed individually and in total the percent of the assessed value to sales value of the parcels of real estate listed. For purposes of equalization of real estate in your town, effective for the next two years, we contemplate using this percentage raised to the next higher full percentage point. The equalized valuation of *real estate*, exclusive of public utility property in your town, is arrived at in the following manner:

<i>Gross Assessed Value</i>	<i>Ratio</i>	<i>Equalized Value</i>
\$2,916,673	÷ 54% x 100 =	\$5,401,246

We believe that the sales listed are representative of market values generally in your town. However, there may be unusual circumstances which apply to a particular piece of property listed which has not come to our attention. It is suggested, therefore, that you review the enclosed summary and advise us immediately of any such circumstances that would justify removal of a particular parcel from the survey.

Any employee has to spend a year at each step if he is just starting, but if he has worked five years at the time of pay increase then he goes to top of his wage scale. For example, take an employee who has worked less than four years as a truck driver. He would be in the third step at \$1.90 until three years were completed, then go to \$1.98 for a year and then to \$2.05 until another pay raise.
