The State of New Hampshire

To the inhabitants of the Town of Northwood in the County of Rockingham in said State, qualified to vote on Town affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town Hall in said Northwood on Tuesday, the twelfth day of March, next, at ten o'clock in the forenoon, and polls to close at six P. M., to act upon the following subjects:

1. To choose all necessary Town Officers for the year ensuing.
2. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray Town charges for the ensuing year and make appropriations of the same.
3. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to borrow money in anticipation of taxes.
4. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for Town highways.
5. To see if the Town will accept State Aid for the construction of Class V roads and raise and appropriate the sum of \$497.30.
6. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$55.00 for the cemeteries.
7. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate \$940.00 for street lighting.

8. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$100.00 for the observance of Memorial Day.

9. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for the Northwood Public Library.

10. To see if the Town will vote a discount on such part of taxes as paid on or before July 15, 1946.

11. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for interest on temporary loans.

12. To see if the Town will receive State Aid to reconstruct the Horace Bartlett Bridge, so-called, and raise and appropriate the sum of \$1,900.00.

13. To see if the Town will vote to buy a power grader and raise and appropriate the sum of \$2,325.00.

14. To see if the Town will vote to observe Old Home Day and raise and appropriate the sum of \$75.00.

15. To see if the Town will raise and appropriate the sum of \$400.00 for a Memorial Tablet to its soldiers and sailors of World War II.

16. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate a sum not exceeding one one-hundredth of one per cent ($1/100$ of 1%) of the assessed valuation based on the assessment of 1945 for the purpose of publicizing and promoting the natural advantages and resources of the Town, together with other towns in the Merrimac Valley Region Association, the sum of \$75.00.

17. To see if the Town will vote to accept a lease from the State of New Hampshire of the Mary E. Waldron Park.

18. To transact any other business to come before said meeting.

Last spring at the Academy in interscholastic competition, Robert Bailey won the Hubbard First Prize of one hundred New Hampshire chicks and also the second Sears-Roebuck Achievement Award of over \$50. William O'Neal also was awarded fifty chicks.

Miss Margaret Macdonald, R. N., School Nurse for the last fifteen years, left at the end of the school year to accept another position. Her work for last year included examining 127 pupils, administering the audiometer hearing test, and organizing clinics for diphtheria immunization and dental work. Although fourteen pupils were treated in the former, another toxoid clinic will be held this winter on account of the prevalence of diphtheria in the state. Twenty-nine pupils were treated in the Dental Clinic, sponsored by the Harvey Lake Women's Club.

This month, January 12, marks the 200th anniversary of the birth of Johann Heinrich Pestalozzi, Swiss educational pioneer. Instead of the prevailing methods of education for the few, consisting in memorizing printed words without regard for their meaning, beaten in by continual floggings, this great man exemplified education for the common people, inculcated by kindness, and including such humanities as music, drawing, history, geography, and nature study, as well as improved methods in the three R's, taught by trained teachers. In a deserted convent, he gathered and cared for a group of refugee children, such as roam in Europe today. His genius is largely responsible for interesting and friendly schools, to which children are willing and eager to go.
