SELECTMEN'S REPORT

Our annual report on the current status of your town and on accomplishments during the past year, together with some things we believe might well be considered during 1963, is hereby submitted.

During the past year the following projects have been carried out:

A new safe for important town records was purchased and installed in the Clerk's office.

The Fire Department has purchased a radio in our secondary fire truck.

Also the new fire alarm decoder has been installed, tying Stoddard to the area Mutual Aid system. In this connection some difficulty with finance has been experienced in that the basic understanding by the town was that one half of these costs were to be covered by Civil Defense money which now does not appear likely. However, we feel the new set-up when fully working is quite worthwhile.

We are again, together with your appointed committee, requesting estimated costs for heating the Town Hall by providing a floorplan of the building to possible heating contractors. However, we still believe in order to provide specifications to the possible bidders that they may bid competitively, the town should decide first just what type and how much heat is required. There is a big difference in both cost and results if the intent is to heat only temporarily for one or two meetings, or to heat the building many times over long periods during cold weather.

It was necessary as the result of a heavy truck bending the stringers, to replace the bridge at Granite Lake during the past year. The bridge was shored temporarily during the sum-

mer months because of the traffic and rebuilt in the late fall to high standards, with the provision that it might in the future if needed be made a two-way bridge at little cost.

This bridge at best was in very poor condition, the old stringers having been in at least 25 years and were second-hand when put in. The truck owners were very cooperative, providing more and heavier stringers together with equipment and material so that they provided 25 to 30% of the cost of building the new, much stronger bridge.

Finally, we believe the town should give consideration to the possible painting, both inside and out, together with some inside repair work, of the Town Hall during 1963.

TOWN WARRANT

To the Inhabitants of the Town of Stoddard in the County of Cheshire in said State, qualified to vote in Town Affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at The Town Hall in said Stoddard on Tuesday, the twelfth day of March, next at seven of the clock in the afternoon, to act upon the following subjects:

1. To choose all necessary Town Officers for the year ensuing.

2. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray town charges for the ensuing year and make appropriations of the same.

3. To see what sums of money the Town will vote to raise for Highways and Bridges for the ensuing year and make appropriations of the same.

4. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise for Snow Removal for the ensuing year and make appropriations of the same.

5. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of Two Hundred Seventy Nine Dollars and Thirty Nine Cents (\$279.39) for T.R.A.

6. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for the general expenses of the Highway Department.

7. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for the maintenance of public landings.

8. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of One Thousand Five Hundred Dollars (\$1,500.00) for the general maintenance of the Fire Department.

9. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of Seventy Nine Dollars (\$79.00) as its fair share of the operating costs of the Elliot Community Hospital.

10. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of One Hundred Forty Seven Dollars and Eighty Four Cents (\$147.84) to advertise the Town, said money to be paid to the Monadnock Region Association, for the purpose.

11. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for street lights.

12. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for the maintenance of the Library.

13. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to borrow money in anticipation of taxes.

14. To see if the Town will vote to accept the provisions of the Municipal Budget Act.

15. To see if the Town will vote to petition the State Tax Commission to make a complete reappraisal of land and buildings within the Town to equalize valuation in accordance with the law, and raise money for this purpose.

16. To hear reports of Committees and take any action thereon.

17. To see if the Town will vote to install heat in the Town Hall and to see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for the same, or take any action relating thereto.

18. To see if the Town will vote to adopt the Non-Partisan ballot for the election of Town Officers, as specified under the Law.

19. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for the maintenance of the Police Department.

20. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for the maintenance of the Town dump.

21. To see if the Town will vote to ratify, approve and confirm the action of our fire department in joining our Town to the Southwestern N. H. District Fire Mutual Aid System in 1958, and in agreeing that our Fire Department may give and receive outside aid as provided in R.S.A. 154 as ammended.

22. To see if the Town will vote to paint the Town Hall and to raise and appropriate the necessary money for the same.

23. To transact any other business that may legally come before said meeting.

To the Inhabitants of the School District of Stoddard qualified to vote in district affairs :

You are hereby notified to meet at the School House in said district on the sixth day of March 1963 at eight o'clock in the afternoon to act upon the following subjects :

1. To choose a Moderator for the ensuing year.
2. To choose a Clerk for the ensuing year
3. To choose a Member of the School Board for the ensuing three years.
4. To choose a Treasurer for the ensuing year.
5. To determine and appoint the salaries of the School Board and fix the compensation for any other officers or agents of the district.
6. To hear the reports of Agents, Auditors, Committees or Officers chosen and pass any vote relating thereto.
7. To choose Agents, Auditors and Committees in relation to any subject embraced in this warrant.
8. To see what sum of money the district will raise and appropriate to send the seventh and eighth grade pupils to a school in another district.
9. To see what sum of money the district will raise and appropriate to provide a teacher's helper.
10. To see what sum of money the district will raise and appropriate for the support of schools for the salaries of school district officials and agents, and for the payment of statutory obligations of the district, and to authorize the application against said appropriations of such sums as are estimated to be

received from the State Foundation Aid Fund together with other income; the School Board to certify to the selectmen the balance between the estimated revenue and appropriations, which balance is to be raised by taxes by the town.

11. To see if the district will raise and appropriate the sum of \$1,150.00 as a deficiency appropriation to pay the salary of a helping teacher; this money to be paid to the District Treasurer by June 1, 1963.

12. To see if the district will vote to enter into a contract with another school district to pay tuition in excess of the State average.

13. To see if the district will vote to authorize the School Board to make application for and to accept, on behalf of the district, any or all grants or other funds for educational purposes which may now or hereafter be forthcoming from the United States Government or from the State of New Hampshire for the school year 1963-64.

14. To transact any other business that may legally come before said meeting. Given under our hands at said Stoddard this fourteenth day of February 1963.

By comparison, our enrollment has increased by four and our census report indicates that we can expect an equal number in 1963-64.

When a primary classroom of a single grade exceeds twenty-five in number, we feel that in order to provide adequate instruction to these youngsters the class should be divided. When a single room contains eight grades, which incidentally is quite a rare occurrence these days, and the number enrolled

reaches twenty-five an extremely difficult teaching situation arises. The School Board recognized this problem this fall to the extent that they felt there was more than justification for a teachers aid, which was the only solution to the problem under the existing plant facilities. We were extremely fortunate in securing the services of Mrs. Elizabeth Dussault, and at this writing feel that the accomplishments of both the teacher and pupil have grown because of this action.

It is not enjoyable for me to feel it necessary to make statements that are not entirely palatable to the total citizenry. However, as a professional educator, I feel it my duty to point out that the above action is of a "stop-gap" type and that the real solution to the over-all problem is to face the fact that Stoddard is probably not going to be able to operate a one-room school many more years, and should probably study how best they can obtain an education for their youngsters either on a tuition basis or by joining with other districts in a co-operative effort.

The School Board, in recognition of the problem our youngsters face on entering the ninth grade, has placed in the school warrant an article relative to sending our youngsters in grades seven and eight to another school on a tuition basis. Let me point out here that this is in no way a criticism of the teacher; she has and continues to do an extremely competent job. It does however, reflect criticism on the system under which she is employed. None of us like to see our institutions of long standing start to disintegrate, but when that institution can no longer adequately do the job for which it was originally intended, we probably should give some serious thought to modernizing the structure of the institution involved; and that is the sole intent of this article.

It has been a pleasure, as usual, to work with all the people in Stoddard who are directly or indirectly interested in the education of Stoddard's youth.

ANNUAL REPORT OF SCHOOL NURSE

January 1962 to January 1963

To Mr. Norman Hartfiel, Superintendent of Schools; School Board, Teachers and Parents:

I am submitting the following account of the school nursing program.

A physician administered complete physical examinations to twenty-seven pupils. Individual reports of defects found were sent to the parents concerned. It is hoped that the physical examinations will become a regular part of the health program.

Twenty-nine pupils had eye examinations.

Since an audio meter was not available, twenty-nine pupils had their hearing tested by the method of listening to a spoken voice.

In January of 1962, eleven pupils received the fourth injection of anti-polio vaccine and five pupils completed the series of three anti-polio vaccine injections. During the summer of 1962, ten pupils received the oral polio vaccine series.

The tuberculosis intradermal test was given to twenty-four pupils with no reaction.

Nursing care was administered throughout the year to pupils as needed and all necessary home visits were made.
