

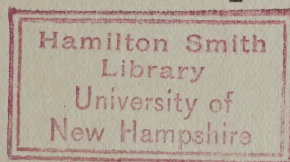

TOWN WARRANT

THE STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

(SEAL) To the inhabitants of the Town of Sunapee, in the County of Sullivan in said State, qualified to vote in Town Affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at I. O. O. F. Hall in said Sunapee on Tuesday, the ninth (9th) day of March, next, at nine of the clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects:

Article 1. To elect a Town Clerk for the year ensuing.

Article 2. To hear the reports of the Selectmen, Treasurer, Auditors, Agents and Committees or other officers heretofore chosen and pass any vote relating thereto.

Article 3. To bring in your votes upon the following question, "Is it expedient to revise the Constitution?"

Article 4. To elect one Selectman for three years and all other necessary Town Officers for the year ensuing and pass any vote relating thereto.

Article 5. To see if the Town will vote to raise \$4,000.00 to pay on its bonded debt and \$2,100.00 interest on its notes and bonds and pass any vote relating thereto.

Article 6. To see if the Town will vote to raise \$1,800.00 for Town Officers' Salaries, \$700.00 for Town Officers' Expenses, \$150.00 for Election and Registration, \$100.00 for Municipal Court, \$250.00 for Expenses and Repairs of Town Buildings, \$1,000.00 for the Police Department, \$100.00 for Bathing Beach, \$50.00 for Town Dump, \$20.00 for Vital Statistics, \$3,000.00 for the Fire Department, \$200.00 for the Health Department, \$1,200.00 for the Nurse Association, and pass any vote relating thereto.

Article 7. To see if the Town will vote to raise \$9,000.00 for Highways and Bridges, \$3,000.00 for Road Oil, \$2,000.00 for Tractor and Roller Maintenance, \$3,000.00 for Snow Removal and Sanding, \$1,700.00 for Street Lights, and pass any vote relating thereto.

Article 8. To see if the Town will vote to raise \$300.00 above that required by law for the Town Library, \$1,000.00 for Town Poor, \$300.00 for the care of its Cemeteries, \$5,000.00 for the Water Department, (including debt, interest and maintenance), and to set aside from the appropriation for Highway Work \$496.67 for Class V Town Road Aid and pass any vote relating thereto.

Article 9. To see what sum of money the Town will raise to assist the Fish and Game Club to advertise Lake Sunapee and pass any vote relating thereto.

Article 10. To see if the Town will allow a discount on taxes paid on or before June 15th of 2%, and on or before September 1st of 1% and pass any vote relating thereto.

Article 11. To see if the Town will instruct its Selectmen to hire money in anticipation of taxes and pass any vote relating thereto.

Article 12. To see if the Town will vote to raise \$3,500.00 for a larger water main extension to the Hitchcock estate and a water meter to be installed in pump house to meter water pumped per day as required by the Public Service Commission of New Hampshire and pass any vote relating thereto.

Article 13. To see what sum of money the Town will raise for White Pine Blister Rust Control and pass any vote relating thereto.

Article 14. To see if the people of the Town of Sunapee will vote to elect its officers by Australian ballot, except the office of Tax Collector, which shall be submitted by bid to the Selectmen.

Article 15. To see what action the Town will take about the Bathing Beach, raise and appropriate for the same, and pass any vote relating thereto.

Article 16. To see if the Town will vote to discontinue or re-lay the road leading from the New London road to the Springfield road in back of what is known as the Russell's Barn at Georges Mills, and pass any vote relating thereto.

Article 17. To see if the Town will vote to raise \$50.00 for maintenance of the Skating Rink and pass any vote relating thereto.

Article 18. To see if the Town will vote to remain on Eastern Standard Time throughout the year 1937.

Article 19. To see if the Town will vote to adopt Day-light Saving Time provided a reasonable number of towns in the state do the same.

Article 20. To transact any other business that may legally come before said meeting.

ENGINEERS' REPORT OF FIRE DEPARTMENT

In submitting this report of the Fire Department for the year ending December 31, 1936, we are glad to report that there has not been a large amount of property destroyed by fire. There were three buildings involved, which were total losses, and one set of buildings quite badly damaged. One life was lost in the fire at Georges Mills which destroyed a summer cottage, which was a very sad accident.

During the year, there was a motor hook and ladder truck installed at the central station, which was needed very much.

We were very lucky in not having any brush fires during the year; one call from out of town and a small one at Georges Mills, with no damage.

The Department is well equipped at the present time, with the exception of hose, and we are in hopes of being able to purchase a few hundred feet soon.

Alarms for the year—Six bell alarms, twenty-two stills and four out of town calls.

Property damage, \$5,000.00; insurance, \$3,550.00.

We wish to thank the taxpayers of the town for the generous financial support and the members of the Department for their cooperation and interest taken.

REPORT OF BOARD OF HEALTH

Only one disease, and that of scarlet fever, required quarantine during 1936. This case was well cared for, home fumigated and no bad results followed. Twelve analyses of our town water supply have been made by the State Board of Health during the year and every analysis has proven good. For the better protection of our public water supply, I am sure a good argument could be made to secure P. W. A. funds to sewer Lake Avenue and Garnet Street to the river, also to lay a sewer line from a point near Walter P. Wiggins' to the river. While this assistance can be had, why not get it?

The Public Health Nursing Division of the New Hampshire State Board of Health reports the following statistics of work done in this community in 1936: Child health clinics held 1, attendance 67, number defects found 123, number defects found corrected 9; number diphtheria immunization clinics held 1, number children receiving treatment 15; number times state nurses visited town 9.

"I give, bequeath and devise to the Town of Sunapee the sum of One Hundred Dollars, to have and to hold upon the following trusts, to wit: To invest and re-invest the same, to expend the rents, issues and profits thereof in the care, maintenance and upkeep of my cemetery lot in Eastman Cemetery in said Town of Sunapee."

REPORT OF
SCHOOL DISTRICT

SUPERINTENDENT'S REPORT

To the Sunapee School Board:

I herewith submit the annual report of the Superintendent of Schools.

Organization

In the Elementary School we have Grades 1 and 2 combined in one room and Grades 3 and 4 combined in another room. Grades 5 and 6 have been so large that it has been unwise to combine them. Grade 6, therefore, has been accommodated on the second floor and has been taught by the high school teachers. It is planned next year to place the sixth grade with the fifth in a single room. This arrangement will relieve the high school teachers of the sixth grade subjects, enabling them to devote their entire time to the junior and senior high school grades. It is becoming increasingly difficult for the high school teachers to handle work outside of their field especially since the extension of shop courses requires that the shop instructor shall devote more time to his work. General subjects which he has been handling will have to be taken over by the other teachers. It may also be possible to avoid some alteration of courses which is necessary now.

Industrial Curriculum

If one reads the school reports of past years he often comes across the expressed wish for the establishment of shop courses. We now have them. Few schools have better accommodations and equipment than are found in the Sunapee High School. We are now offering cabinet making for the freshman boys and mechanical drawing for the sophomores. It is planned to offer a course next year in "Practical Mechanics." This includes automobile mechanics, soldering, plumbing, woodworking, practical electricity, cold metal work, general repairs about the home and schools, finishing, sheet metal work, window repairing and concrete. The equipment for such a course is quite inexpensive. Ultimately we hope to add a course in automobile mechanics. This will require more machines and equipment. It is planned to add part of this equipment this year and the balance the following in order

to divide the expense. It will also be necessary to provide a large door into the basement so that automobiles may be driven into the shop.

Under Mr. Domina's direction the boys set up the machines which were purchased last year, rebuilt the tool room, and built a storage cabinet for partly finished projects. The boys have turned out some very creditable work. They have made several articles of furniture for the building, such as desks and cabinets, which otherwise would have had to be purchased at a much larger expense. The boys have also re-finished 125 desk tops on the second floor. Incidentally the boys have learned about the use of tools and different kinds of wood so that they will always be able to make articles of furniture for the house or do other odd jobs. The work in the shop has made some of the boys want to remain in school who otherwise might have left.

Mechanical drawing has been given this year as a regular course (5 double periods a week) with credit. The pupils have learned to make three-view and sectional drawings of all articles which they made. Blue-printing has also been taught. To provide facilities for making blue prints a small room has been built in one corner of the drawing room. This is provided with a sink, hot and cold water, and benches and shelves. It may also serve as an excellent room for work in photography. Except for the plumbing the construction has been done entirely by the boys.

Repairs

The hot water heater in the boiler room has been replaced by a larger and more efficient one. While the boilers are running there is an unlimited supply of hot water. This is much appreciated by the pupils when they take shower baths after basketball games. The last pupil now enjoys hot water as well as the first.

Teachers

Although our loss in teachers last summer was numerically small it was with sincere regret that we accepted the resignation of Miss Helen Fleming and Miss Dorothy Kennedy. They have given Sunapee pupils very efficient instruction for several years. The Primary room is now in charge of Miss Audrey Burnham, a graduate of the Sallem (Mass.) Teachers' College. The new teacher in the high school is Miss Alma Whitford, a graduate of Mt. Holyoke College.

Each year we have tried to have one special topic for consideration in teachers' meetings. This year we are considering character education. The pupils will probably forget many of the facts they study and lose some of the skills they acquire. They will not, however, so easily forget the ideals and attitudes which are developed during their school career. The kind of pupil we turn out is much more important than the subject content he may carry with him. The teachers in each town are meeting by themselves and are studying several professional books dealing with character education according to a prepared outline.

I wish again to express my appreciation of the constant cooperation of the School Board and Teachers.

You are hereby notified to meet at the I. O. O. F. Hall in said District on Tuesday, the ninth day of March, 1937, at one-thirty o'clock in the afternoon to act upon the following subjects:

Article 1. To choose a Moderator for the ensuing year.

Article 2. To choose a Clerk for the ensuing year.

Article 3. To choose a member of the School Board for the ensuing three years.

Article 4. To choose a Treasurer for the ensuing year.

Article 5. To choose one or more Auditors and such other Officers and Agents as the voters may judge necessary.

Article 6. To hear and act upon the reports of the School Board, Treasurer, Auditors and Committees heretofore chosen.

Article 7.
