SCHOOL BOARD.

We submit herewith various statistics which are of interest to parents, pupils and tax-payers.

The large number of names on the roll of honor is gratifying and indicates that interest in the schools the community ought to feel.

The system of supplying free text books is working well, bringing about better classification, and supplying proper books to those who have been heretofore unable to have them. It is a right step in advance in educational methods in the state and properly goes hand in hand with the town district system.

It is as much for the general benefit of the citizens of the villages that the children in outlying districts shall be well educated as for their own. Our nation's welfare depends on education, and it is cheaper to bring up a child well than to take care of the ignorant criminal in later years.

New Hampshire has reason to be proud of its schools.

Our teachers during the past year have been able and zealous, and good progress has been made.

The school houses are in a very good condition, though repairs will be needed from time to time.

There should be a larger attendance at the annual school meetings and the affairs of the district more thoroughly discussed. The ladies have the right to vote and ought most certainly to exercise that right. A mere handful of citizens do not care to transact all the business at the school meetings and they should not be compelled to or allowed to do so.

By a comparison of the statistics given with those of preceding years it will be seen that there has been a small but steady growth in the number of scholars and in the average attendance. This increase, however, has been in the lower grades. At the beginning of the year 84 pupils were registered in the First Primary department and it became absolutely necessary to establish another school, which we did before the next term, finding accommodations by dividing the Primary room with a partition of wood and glass.

The teachers have been faithful and attentive to their duties

and the scholars have made excellent progress under their instruction.

We make no individual comments but feel assured their efforts have been appreciated by those who have visited the schools and inspected their work. The building, such as it is, is in a very good state of repair except that it needs painting inside and out. The general repairs for the coming year will be small.

Last Spring Adams K. Tilton Post, G. A. R. of this town presented the school with a large United States flag, which we gratefully acknowledged in the name of the district. The practice now becoming quite universal, of displaying a flag over the building during school hours is a beautiful custom and tends to inspire patriotism and reverence of country in the young.

After three years service as your Committee we are pleased to turn the school affairs over to such an efficient Board as has been elected. We have endeavored to the best of our ability to keep up a high standard in our schools, and have made such changes from time to time as our judgments dictated. There has been no deterioration in our schools and we hope some advancement.
