(TOWN WARRANT)
STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

To the inhabitants of the Town of Troy in the County of Cheshire, qualified to vote in town affairs.

You are notified to meet at the town hall in said town on Tuesday, the twelfth of March next, at nine-thirty o'clock in the forenoon to act on the following subjects:

Article 1. To choose a town clerk, one selectman for three years and all other necessary town officers.

Article 2. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray town charges for the ensuing year, and make appropriation of the same.

Article 3. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary for repairing town highways and bridges.

Article 4. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$ for the construction of the road, provided the State shall appropriate the sum of \$ for the same purpose, it being understood that if said appropriation is made by the State and the town accepts said special aid, that the town shall not be entitled to state aid for Class II roads.

Article 5. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary for the support of the poor.

Article 6. To see if the town will vote to install a street light near the home of William and Anna Fleming, and raise and appropriate a sum of money for the same.

Article 7. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate a sum of money for street lighting.

Article 8. To see if the town will vote to allow a discount on all taxes, excepting poll taxes, paid before dates to be designated at this meeting.

Article 9. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate a sum of money for the support, and housing of the fire department.

Article 10. To see what action the town will take relative to the disposition of the money appropriated under Article 12 in the Warrant used at the Town Meeting in March, 1934.

Article 11. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate a sum of money to be set aside as a sinking fund, to pay for the water bonds at maturity.

Article 12. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate a sum of twenty-five hundred dollars (\$2,500.00) or more to go as far as possible in completing water extension at North Troy, as per Article 12 of 1934 Town Warrant, and to have same complete by August 1st, 1935.

Article 13. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate a sum of money for the purpose of employing a district nurse.

Article 14. To see if the town will vote to instruct the selectmen to borrow money to pay town charges.

Article 15. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate a sum of money for the observance of Memorial Day.

Article 16. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of one hundred and fifty dollars (\$150.00) for the establishment of a Cemetery Trust Fund to provide care of the Dr. Mary A. Harris lot. Dr. Harris was the donor of the town clock to the town of Troy.

Article 17. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of fifty dollars (\$50.00) for the purpose of purchasing and marking the plot of land used as the first burial ground in Troy.

Article 18. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of one hundred dollars (\$100.00) for a survey of the Richmond and Troy town line and the erection of permanent markers.

Article 19. To see if the town will vote to approve of the proposed change in the Richmond and Troy Town Line, according to Chapter 56 of the Public Laws.

Article 20. To see if the town will vote to allow the American Legion to use the town hall one Friday night each month without pay.

Article 21. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate a sum of money for the care and improvement of cemeteries.

Article 22. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of three hundred dollars (\$300.00) in addition to the amount required by law for public library.

Article 23. To see if the town will raise and appropriate the sum of fifty dollars (\$50.00) for the purpose of advertising the resources and natural advantages of the town, said sum to be expended under the direction of the selectmen, or take any other action relating thereto.

Article 24. To see if the town will appoint a zoning commission to consist of five members, to recommend boundaries for zoning districts in said town and to recommend approximate regulations therefor in accordance with the provision of Chapter 42, of the Public Laws.

Article 25. To see if the town will vote to appropriate a sum of money for the expenses of the zoning commission if the town votes to appoint such commission under the preceding article.

Article 26. To see if the town will accept state aid for construction of the Class II road known as _____ and raise and appropriate or set aside for said purpose the sum of \$ _____ ; or will accept state aid for construction of Class V roads and raise and appropriate or set aside for said purpose the sum of \$ _____ .

Article 27. To see if the town will vote to adopt the provisions of the Municipal Budget Act.

Article 28. To see if the town will vote to widen Main street near the Monadnock Hotel.

Article 29. To hear the reports of agents, officers or committees heretofore chosen, and take any action relating thereto.

Article 30. To transact any other business that may legally come before said meeting.

At the annual town meeting held in March 1934, the sum of \$5,000 was appropriated to extend the water system on North Main street to a point opposite the Thomas M. Lahiff house at North End.

Shortly after town meeting the water commissioners with the assistance of the superintendent, ascertained the cost of material for said project and found that the material alone would cost approximately \$3,800.00 and not seeing their way clear to complete the project with the balance of the money appropriated, drew up plans and specifications and submitted them for bids to three reliable contractors and in reply received a bid from the R. H. White Construction Company of Auburn, Mass., for the sum of \$6,688.00, plus and additional sum of \$5.00 per cubic yard of rock or ledge excavation which, assuming 70% such excavation would ultimately bring the cost to between \$14,000.00 and \$15,000.00.

The second bid was from the Robie Construction Company of Manchester, New Hampshire who made a lump sum bid of \$15,536.00.

The third contractor who was requested to submit a bid, namely F. E. Newcomb of Newport, New Hampshire, advised us that he could not undertake the project at that time.

Your board of Water Commissioners after considering these bids thought they were too high, so requested the superintendent to submit a bid for the project. He submitted a lump sum bid of \$10,000.00 and estimated that if he could be award-

ed the contract on a cost plus 10% basis, the minimum cost would be \$7,000.00 and the maximum cost would be \$12,000.00.

After receiving these various bids your board of water commissioners decided that they could not proceed with the project with the limited amount of money appropriated, so a meeting was called to which the signers of the petition for the extention and the board of selectmen were invited to be present. After discussing the matter at considerable length, it was decided that nothing could be done on the project with the amount of money available.

At our next meeting it was suggested that we try and obtain help from the Transient Camp in Keene, and a letter was written to the officials of that organization who in return sent an inspector to look over the project. In a short time a letter was received informing us that our application had been refused on the grounds that they did not have the necessary facilities for transporting the transients from Keene to Troy.

The board then consulted our town counsel as to the advisability of using the \$5,000.00 as far as it would go, and we were advised that it was illegal to use the money unless it would complete the project for which the money had been appropriated.

Your Board of Water Commissioners can not recommend the expenditure of any such amount of money as appears necessary to make this installation for the following reasons:

1. The annual revenue would probably not exceed \$60.00 and very likely be considerably less. Assuming the project can be done for \$12,000.00 and the town would be able to finance this with 4% bonds the annual cost for the interest alone would be \$480.00. Subtracting the estimated income of \$60.00 leaves an annual deficit of \$420.00. In addition there would of course result an increased maintenance expense.

2. The State Highway Department has made a survey for an improved highway over this street. We have a blue print of

this project in which the location and grade of the present highway is changed to such an extent that if this proposed water extension should be installed at this time, it would necessarily have to be relocated to a considerable extent, if and when the State Highway project was made. In such a case the cost of relocating the water main would fall on the town.

REPORT OF SUPERINTENDENT OF SCHOOLS

To the School Board and Citizens of Troy:

I herein submit my first annual report as superintendent of schools, this being the thirty-fifth in the series under union supervision.

Necessarily the statistics of this report are taken from the registers and office records delivered to me last July.

During the few months since my induction to the office as superintendent of your schools, I have found your school board very helpful, the parents cooperative, the schools well organized and taught by an able corps of teachers.

As we continue our work together, let us remember: (1) "The school is agent of the state in preserving itself." (2) "Education is not a charity but a part of the national defense," (3) "Education is the author of national ideals, the moulder of the soul of America."

With this vision of our public trust, may we, school officers and teachers, realize more than ever before our obligations (1) to the highest welfare of each individual child and (2) develop an appreciative attitude toward the tax payer of the American home.

Not only must we develop the so-called skills in our schools but also those fundamental requisites essential to the highest type of American citizenship. This implies the cooperation of the school, the home and the church.

An additional year has been added to the high school which makes a regular four year high school and has been approved as such by the Commissioner of Education.

The total enrollment for the present year (1934-35) is 275, an increase of nineteen over last year.

Mr. Ivah Hackler, a graduate of New Hampshire University, was elected to the teaching staff in September.

Miss Margaret Harris, R. N., continues to carry on the health activities. Her report shows the work that has been accomplished.

The distribution of free milk to needy children has been continued the present year through the help of state and federal aid. This distribution is expected to continue until June 1.

The distribution of cod liver oil continues under the direction of Miss Harris.

Miss Catherine R. Graves, teacher of second grade, having resigned in December, Mrs. Ruth Gray was elected to the position for remainder of school year.

About 250 home and official visits were made, chiefly follow up work among the school children to arrange with their parents for the correction of defects and when necessary, to accompany them to physicians or hospitals for treatment.
