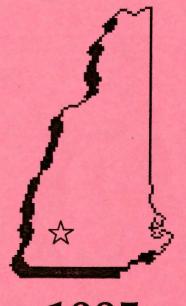
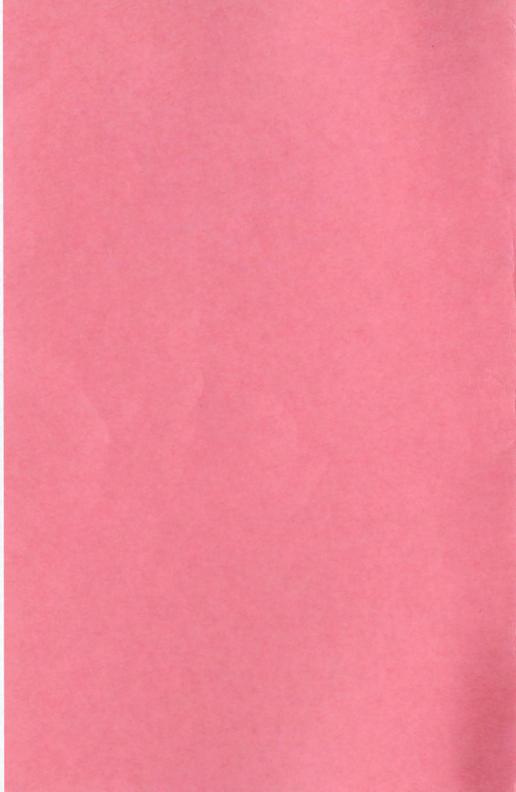

STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE TOWN WARRANT

To the inhabitants of the Town of Windsor in the County of Hillsborough in said State, qualified to vote in Town affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town Hall, White Pond Road, Windsor on Tuesday, the 12th of March 1996, the Town meeting to begin at 6:30 P.M. Polls will be open until 8:30 P.M. to act upon the following subjects:

- 1) To choose by ballot all necessary Town Officers for the ensuing year.
- 2) To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for the payment of Town charges including principal and interest on the Town's outstanding indebtedness, social security taxes, and any other legal obligations of the Town, or take any other action relative thereto.
- 3) To accept reports of Auditors and Agents heretofore chosen and pass any vote in relation thereto.

4) To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$12,170.00 for Police and Fire expenses, or to take any action relative thereto.

5) To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$2,500.00 for the continuation of construction on the Town Hall, or to take any action relative thereto.

The Selectmen recommend approval

6) To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$1800.00 for the operating expenses of the Town Hall, or to take any action relative thereto.

The Selectmen recommend approval

7) To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$500.00 for the upkeep of the Town cemeteries, or to take any action relative thereto.

The Selectmen recommend approval

8) To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$7000.00 for highways and bridges.

9) To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$500.00 to donate to the Hillsboro Rescue Squad, or to take any action relative thereto.

To aid your Forest Fire Warden, Fire Department and State Forest Fire Officials, contact your local Warden or Fire Department to find out if a permit is required. This also helps to prevent unnecessary response to a controlled burn.

MINUTES OF SCHOOL DISTRICT MEETING

March 14, 1995

The meeting was called to order at 6:30 p.m. by acting moderator Ronald Boyd.

Aricle 1. was postponed to the end of the meeting. Patrick Hines moved and Kevin Riley seconded the motion. All were in favor.

Aricle 2. To determine and appoint the salaries of the School Board and fix the compensation of any other officers or agents of the district. Eric Wilton moved to keep the salaries as they are. Dennis Calcutt seconded the motion. All were in favor.

Article 3. To hear the reports of agents, auditors, committees or officers chosen, and pass any vote relating thereto as printed in the annual report. It was noted that Linda McNamee has completed a course in special education. Dennis Calcutt moved to accept the reports as written. Linda McNamee seconded. All were in favor.

Article 4. To see what sum of money the District will raise and appropriate for the support of the schools, for the payment of salaries for School District officials, agents, and for the payments of statutory obligations of the District, or to take any action related thereto. Linda McNamee moved that we raise and appropriate the sum of fifty nine thousand six hundred sixty three dollars(59,663.00) for this purpose. Joan Cuddy seconded. All were in favor.

Article 5. To see if the school district will raise and appropriate the sum of four thousand, four hundred (\$4,400) to add to the expendable general trust fund created at the March ,1992 Annual District meeting for the purpose of paying for unanticapated tuition students or take any action related thereto. (Recommended by the School Board). The Town voted as follows: Eight(8) yes and Eleven (11) opposed. Motion was defeated. Linda McNamee voted to accept, and Joan Cuddy seconded. All were in favor.

Article 6. To see if the School District will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of four thousand, five hundred sixty eight dollars (\$4,568) to add to the 1994/95 fiscal appropriation for unanticipated tuition, or to take any other action in relation thereto. (Recommended by School Board). Linda McNamee moved to raise four thousand, five hundred sixty eight (\$4,568). Patrick Hines seconded. All were in favor.

Article 7. To transact any other new business that legally comes before said meeting. No new business was brought up. Linda McNamee moved and Joan Cuddy seconded. All were in favor.

Article 1. To choose by non-partisan ballot the following School District officials:

- A. School Board Memeber for ensuing three years
- B. Moderator for the ensuing year
- C. Clerk for the ensuing year
- D. Treasurer for the ensuing year
- E. Auditor for the ensuing year
