Snow Disposal Ordinance

Any person found shoveling snow into a town road or plowing snow across the road, so as to impede normal plowing operations, will be subject to a penalty not to exceed \$25.00 for each offense.

Burning Regulations

TO REPORT A FIRE DIAL 483-2521

The State of New Hampshire requires that written permits be obtained for all open fires at all times when the ground is not snow covered.

Permits may be obtained from the Forest Fire Warden, Mr. Martin Sullivan, for grass, brush, campfires, etc. Permits must be obtained on the day burning is to be accomplished. Burn when there is no wind, on rainy days and damp days, in a safe place and in accordance with the term of the permit. Burn before 9:00 am and after 5:00 pm. Keep some buckets of water close by; if wind develops, promptly extinguish the fire. All fires must be extinguished before you depart the scene.

Parking During Snow Storm

A. From November 2 to April 1 of each year no person shall park any motor vehicle on any public highway between the hours of 11:00 pm and 8:00 am or at any time in such manner as to impede snow removal operations.

B. Any vehicle parked in violation of section A hereof may be towed by the road agent, the chief of police or their agents or by independent contractors engaged by the road agent or the chief of police; any vehicles so towed shall be stored and released to the owner only upon payment of the cost of towing and storage by the owner.

C. Any person violating section A hereof shall be subject to a penalty not to exceed twenty-five dollars for each offense.

Dog Ordinance

A. RESTRAINT: All dogs shall be restrained from running at large within the limits of the town, except when they are on the owner's or keeper's property or being used for hunting or training purposes.

B. PENALTY: Any person or persons, firm or corporation violating any provisions of this ordinance shall, upon conviction, be fined not more than fifteen dollars (\$15.00) for each offense.

THIRD: Are you in favor of the adoption of Warrant Article No. 3 as proposed by the Planning Board, for the Town Zoning Ordinance as follows:

Amend the Zoning Map to rezone the parcel of land beginning at the intersection of Raymond Road and Chester Road; proceeding along Chester Road, southeasterly to Bunker Hill Road to a point which is the easterly boundary of Map 7, Lot 12; along the eastern most boundary of said lot, and Map 7, Lot 10 and Map 7, Lot 4 to a point on the south side of Eaton Hill Road; then westerly along

Eaton Hill Road to the intersection of Raymond Road; then along Raymond Road to the point of the beginning; changing the current zoning from a Commercial 2 and Residential 2 district to a Commercial 2 zone in its entirety.

FOURTH: Are you in favor of the adoption of Warrant Article No. 4, as proposed by the Planning Board, for the Town Zoning Ordinance as follows:

Amend Article 2.02 Words and Terms, (14) Building Height to read Building and/or Structure height: Vertical distance measured from the average elevation of the proposed finished grade at the front of the building or structure to the highest point.

FIFTH: Are you in favor of the adoption of Warrant Article No. 5, as proposed by the Planning Board, for the Town Zoning Ordinance as follows:

Amend Article 3.14 Watershed Protection Regulations to delete Section (5) Underground Storage Regulation and restate such regulation as a new Article 3.19 Underground Storage Regulations.

SIXTH: Are you in favor of the adoption of Warrant Article No. 6, as proposed by the Planning Board, for the Town Zoning Ordinance as follows:

a. Amend Article 2.02 Words and Terms to add a definition of municipal buildings; Municipal Building: A building used principally for governmental functions such as; town offices, fire department, police department and the like.

b. Amend Article 4.05 "R" Rural District Section (2) Uses, 4.06 "R-1," Residential-One District and "R-2," Residential-Two District Section (2) Uses, 2.1 Applicable to the R-1 District, 2.2 Applicable to the R-2 District, 4.07 "C-1" Commercial-One District and "C-2" Commercial-Two District Section (2) Uses, 2.1 Applicable to the C-1 District, 2.2 Applicable to the C-2 District, 4.08 "I" Industrial Section (2) Uses and Appendix A to allow municipal buildings as a permitted use in all districts.

SEVENTH: Are you in favor of the adoption of Warrant Article No. 7, as proposed by the Planning Board, for the Town Zoning Ordinance as follows:

Amend Article 4.07 Section 2.2 Permitted Uses Applicable to the C-2 District and Appendix A to allow churches as a permitted use in the C-2 District.

EIGHTH: Are you in favor of the adoption of Warrant Article No. 8, as proposed by the Planning Board, for the Town Zoning Ordinance as follows:

Amend Article 7.01, Building Code and Building Permits General, Section (1) to delete reference to the BOCA Code, 1987 edition and to adopt the BOCA Code 1990 edition.

NINTH: Are you in favor of the adoption of petitioned Warrant Article No. 9, for the Town Zoning Ordinance as follows:

Amend the Zoning Map to rezone the area of land bounded on the south by Route 101, on the east by Hooksett Road, on the north

by a line running 1,800 feet north of and parallel to, Old Candia Road and Wellington Road and on the west by the easterly boundary of the industrial zone from its existing designation as an R-1 District to a C-2 district. (By Petition) (Recommended by the Planning Board)

ARTICLE FOUR: Are you in favor of the adoption of Warrant Article No. 4 as proposed by the Planning Board for the Town Zoning Ordinance as follows:

A) Amend Article 2.02 **Words and Terms**, (17) **Clustered Residential Development** by deleting the term "Residential" from "Clustered Residential Development": to state **Clustered Development** and adding language which includes commercial and industrial buildings within the definition of a clustered development, so that the definition reads as follows:

17) **Clustered Development:** Two or more buildings whether single family detached or multi-unit or commercial/ industrial, "clustered" or "grouped" on a lot or group of contiguous lots closer than would otherwise be permitted by the minimum lot size, frontage and yard requirements of this Ordinance.

B) Amend Article 3.11 **Clustered Development**, (2) **General Requirements**, subpart (a), by adding new language requiring that any clustered commercial or industrial development must be on a conforming lot, so that Article 3.11 (2) (a) reads as follows:

a) The tract of land in a single or consolidated ownership at the time of application shall be at least 20 acres in size for a residential development and a conforming lot for commercial/industrial development.

C) Amend Article 3.11 **Clustered Development**, (2) **General Requirements**, subpart (b), by adding the requirement that a proposed clustered development is subject to the Site Plan Review Regulations, so that Article 3.11 (2) (b) reads as follows:

b) The proposed project shall be subject to approval by the Auburn Planning Board under the Subdivision Regulations and Site Plan Review Regulations of the Town of Auburn, New Hampshire.

D) Amend Article 3.11 **Clustered Development** (2) **General Requirements**, subpart (c) by deleting the term "residential" from the term "clustered residential development" to state "clustered development", so that Article 3.11 (2) (c) reads as follows:

c) Minimum frontage of the clustered development shall be one hundred (100') feet on a class V or better town road, which may consist of two (2) separate fifty (50) foot private right-of-ways into an existing public street(s).

E) Amend Article 3.11 **Clustered Development** (3) **Specific Design Requirements** by deleting subparts (a) through (j), inclusive and any reference thereto.

F) Amend Article 3.11 **Clustered Development** (7) **Project Review** by deleting it in its entirety to avoid language inconsistent with the requirement of Article 3.11 (3) that a Clustered Development is subject to the Site Plan Review Regulations.

ARTICLE FIVE: Are you in favor of adoption of Warrant Article No. 5, as proposed by the Planning Board, for the Town Zoning Ordinance as follows:

Amend Article 7.00 **Building Code and Building Permits**, to add Article 7.10 **Smoke and Fire Detectors**, requiring that all new construction for single family and two (2) family homes shall be equipped with 110 volt hard wire smoke detectors, with a minimum of one per floor, including the attic. All smoke detector circuits will be tied into a common light circuit, unless future plans include provisions for a central alarm system, so that Article 7.10 reads as follows:

Article 7.10 Smoke and Fire Detectors

All new construction for single family and two (2) family homes shall be equipped with 110 volt hard wire smoke detectors, with a minimum of one per floor, including the attic. All smoke detector circuits will be tied into a common light circuit, unless future plans include provisions for a central alarm system.

ARTICLE SIX: Are you in favor of adoption of Warrant Article No. 6, as proposed by the Planning Board, for the Town Zoning Ordinance as follows:

Amend Article 3.12 **Manufactured Housing**, to also permit manufactured housing in the "R", Rural District and the "R-1", Residential-One District, so that the first sentence of Article 3.12 reads as follows:

3.12 Manufactured Housing

Manufactured Housing shall be permitted in the R-2 (Residential-Two district, the R-1 (Residential-One) district and in the R (Rural) district.

ARTICLE SEVEN: Are you in favor of the adoption of Warrant Article No. 7, as proposed by the Planning Board, for the Town Zoning Ordinance as follows:

A) Amend Article 2.02 **Words and Terms**, (27) **Floodway** by adding the requirement that with respect to special flood hazard areas, the term **Floodway** shall be defined by amended Article 3.15 **Floodplain Development Regulations**, so that Article 2.02 (27) reads as follows:

27) **Floodway:** The area subject to regular flooding, the limits of which are determined by the normal annual high water mark of any lake, pond, river or other major waterway. With respect to special flood hazard areas, the term "Floodway" shall be defined by Article 3.15 **Floodplain Development Regulations**.

B) Amend Article 3.06 **Activity in Floodway**, by deleting the existing language and substituting the requirement that there shall be no development within a floodway in any district, as the terms development and floodway are defined in amended Article 3.15 **Floodplain Development Regulations**, so that Article 3.06 reads as follows:

3.06 Activity in Floodway

In any district, there shall be no development, as it is defined in Article 3.15 **Floodplain Development Regulations**, within the floodway.

C) Amend Article 3.12 **Manufactured Housing**, by adding the additional requirement that Manufactured Housing comply with the amended Article 3.15 **Floodplain Development Regulations**, so that the last sentence of Article 3.12 reads as follows:

All Manufactured Housing shall comply with and be sited in accordance with ANSI A 225.1, NFPA 501 A, BOCA Building Code, Housing and Urban Development Part 3280, National Electric Code, Article 3.15 **Floodplain Development Regulations**, and the National Plumbing Code. In the event of a conflict in the above codes the more stringent shall apply.

D) Amend Article 3.15 **Special Flood Hazard Areas**, by deleting the Article heading and changing the heading to **Floodplain Development Regulations**, by deleting the entirety of the existing language under Article 3.15 and by replacing it with language regulating development of all lands designated as special flood hazard areas by the Federal Emergency Management Agency in its Flood Insurance Rate Map dated April 2, 1986. (The full text

of these changes are on file at the Town Clerk's office and shall be posted at the polls on Election Day).

E) Amend Article 4.04 **District Regulations – General**, by adding the requirement that any and all uses allowed under the zoning ordinance must comply with amended Article 3.15 **Floodplain Development Regulations**, so that Article 4.04 reads, in relevant part, as follows:

2) Any and all uses allowed herein shall also be subject to all other applicable ordinances and regulations of the Town of Auburn, including but not limited to Article 3.15 **Floodplain Development Regulations**, and to the Statutes or regulations of the State of New Hampshire.

F) Amend Article 6.12 **Variances**, by adding the requirement that the granting of a variance within a special flood hazard area meet the additional standards recited in subpart (9) **Variances and Appeals** of Article 3.15 **Floodplain Development Regulations**, so that Article 6.12 reads, in relevant part, as follows:

6.12 Variances

Any variance shall be only for the minimum relief required to alleviate the hardship justifying the variance and shall expire if construction is not commenced within one year of the authorization. In authorizing a variance, the Board may attach such conditions and safeguards as it deems necessary or appropriate to protect the abutters, the neighborhood and/or the Town as a whole. Additional provisions relative to the granting of a variance within a special flood hazard area are contained in Article 3.15 **Floodplain Development Regulations**.

G) Amend Article 7.01 **General**, by adding the requirement that any building or structure erected in any zoning district must comply with Article 3.15 **Floodplain Development Regulations**, so that the first sentence of Article 7.01 reads, in relevant part, as follows:

7.01 General

No building or structure shall be erected in any zoning district, unless in compliance with Article 3.15 **Floodplain Development Regulations** and each of the following:

H) Amend the Appendices to the Ordinance by adding Appendix C, containing the Flood Insurance Rate Maps, dated April 2, 1986.

(The purpose of Warrant Article No. 7 is to bring the Town of Auburn Zoning Ordinance into compliance with National Flood Insurance Program requirements).

ARTICLE EIGHT: Are you in favor of the adoption of the following petitioned Amendment to the Zoning Ordinance:

To see if the Town will vote to amend the Zoning Ordinance of the Town of Auburn by changing the lot requirements in Section 4.05 "R", **Rural District**, of the Zoning Ordinance and Zoning Map to a minimum lot size of 2 acres and a minimum frontage of 200 feet to conform to the lot requirements of Article 4.06, "R-1", **Residential-1 District**, and "R-2", **Residential-2 District**, of the Zoning Ordinance.

(By Petition) (Not recommended by the Planning Board)

The adjourned business meeting was called to order by the Moderator, C. Donald Stritch, at 1:00 pm on Saturday, March 17, 1990.

The Moderator announced that Article 21 would be taken out of order and discussed before Article 18. Also, Article 27, not having the required number of registered voters on the petition, would not be considered.

ARTICLE NINE: To see if the Town will vote to accept such Trust Funds as may come during the year and Trust Funds as have not been previously accepted.

Louis Gamache moved, Anna Davis seconded. Passed.

ARTICLE TEN: To see if the Town will vote to use the income of the H.B. Burnham Fund for the schools or library.

David Griffin moved the fund be used for the library. Walter Jamroz seconded. Passed.

ARTICLE ELEVEN: To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to accept gifts, for the use of the Town as may now or hereafter be forthcoming.

Louis Gamache moved, Bruce Mitchell seconded. Passed.

ARTICLE TWELVE: To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to borrow money in anticipation of taxes.

Frank Edelmann moved, David Rogers seconded. Passed.

ARTICLE THIRTEEN: To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to dispose of any or all property acquired by tax deed, by public auction or sealed bid, with right to reject all bids.

Eva Lunnie moved. Barbara Lee seconded. Passed.

ARTICLE FOURTEEN: To see if the Town will authorize the Selectmen to make application for and to receive and spend such advances, grants-in-aid, or other funds for Town purposes as may now, or hereafter be forthcoming from Federal, State, local or private agencies.

Frank Edelmann moved. Mary Griffin seconded. Passed.

ARTICLE FIFTEEN: To see if the Town will appropriate the sum of sixteen thousand five hundred seventy-five dollars (\$16,575) for the Auburn Police Department to purchase a cruiser. (Recommended by the Budget Committee) (Amount included in the Budget).

Chief Edward Picard moved. John Davis seconded. Earle Wingate moved to amend Article Fifteen to read fourteen thousand five hundred and seventy (\$14,570). Paul Sanford seconded. It was explained that further negotiations resulted in the lowering of the price of the cruiser. Vote on Article Fifteen as amended was in the affirmative. Amount appropriated for the Auburn Police Department to purchase a cruiser was fourteen thousand five hundred and seventy dollars (\$14,570.00).

ARTICLE SIXTEEN: To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of eleven thousand dollars (\$11,000) for the purchase of a stand-by power unit, for the Fire Department. (Amount included in the Budget) (Recommended by the Budget Committee).

Bruce Phillips moved Article Sixteen and Daniel Lawrence seconded. Article Sixteen passed.

ARTICLE SEVENTEEN: To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of Ten Thousand Dollars (\$10,000) for the purchase of a used forestry tank truck. (Amount included in the Budget) (Recommended by the Budget Committee).

Moved by Martin Sullivan and seconded by Daniel Lawrence. Passed.

At this point Harry Flanders, our State Representative addressed the meeting.

ARTICLE TWENTY-ONE: To see if the Town will vote to appropriate the sum of twenty-five thousand dollars (\$25,000) for the purchase

of a small front end loader to replace the existing unloader. (Recommended by the Budget Committee) (Amount included in the budget).

Article moved by Kurt Cameron, seconded by Charles Kellett. Voters were invited to view a prospective piece of equipment located outside. After discussion, John Davis moved to vote on the question, and Richard Shackelton seconded the motion. Vote on whether to cease discussion was in the affirmative. Vote on Article was in the affirmative.

ARTICLE EIGHTEEN: To see if the Town will vote to appropriate the sum of ten thousand dollars (\$10,000) to purchase two containers, for storage, and trucking of recyclables. (Amount included in the Budget) (Recommended by the Budget Committee).

Article moved by Deborah Anderson and seconded by Alan Plouffe. Article Eighteen passed.

ARTICLE NINETEEN: To see if the Town will vote to establish a Solid Waste Commission. The Commission shall consist of five persons appointed to a 3-year term by the Board of Selectmen with one of the members being a representative of the Board of Selectmen. The first four appointed members of the Commission shall be appointed such that two members serve a term of 3 years, one member serves a term of 2 years, and one member serves a term of 1 year. The purpose of the Commission shall be to advise the Board of Selectmen on matters pertaining to Solid Waste Management, including the operation of the solid waste and recycling facility, and the regulation of solid waste disposal and recycling in the Town of Auburn.

Moved by Charles Kellett, seconded by Bruce Phillips. Charles Kellett explained the Article. Article Nineteen passed.

ARTICLE TWENTY: To see if the Town will vote to appropriate the sum of fourteen thousand dollars (\$14,000) to be used for the purchase and installation of a baler with baling supplies, and to use these funds, or part thereof, for any matching grants that may come available. (Recommended by the Budget Committee) (Amount included in the Budget).

Article moved by Deborah Anderson and seconded by Charles Kellett. After discussion, William Anderson moved to vote on the question, seconded. Motion to vote passed. Vote on Article Twenty was in the affirmative.

ARTICLE TWENTY-TWO: To see if the Town will vote to adopt a plan for extending to employees of the town the benefits of Title II of the Federal Social Security Act (Old Age, Survivors, Disability and Health Insurance) as authorized by Chapter 101 of the Revised Statutes Annotated amended by Chapter 302 and 322 of the Laws of 1955 and to raise and appropriate the sum of twelve thousand two hundred seventy-five dollars (\$12,275) to defray the town's share of the cost thereof. (Recommended by the Budget Committee) (Amount included in the Budget).

If a plan for Social Security coverage is adopted, to see if the town will authorize the selectmen to execute on behalf of the town the necessary agreement with the State of New Hampshire to carry into effect the plan and to see if the town will designate the Board of Selectmen as the officer to be responsible for the administration of the plan.

Louis Gamache moved the Article and Mary Griffin seconded. After discussion, John Davis moved to vote on the question, seconded by Mary Griffin. Motion to vote was passed. Vote on Article was in the affirmative.

ARTICLE TWENTY-THREE: To see if the Town will vote to authorize the collection of an additional motor vehicle registration fee and the creation of a Town Reclamation Trust Fund in accord with RSA 149-M:13-a. The additional fees levied as follows:

- A) The fee for heavy vehicles, including mobile homes and house trailers, heavy trucks and truck-trailers whose gross weight exceed 18,000 pounds, and buses shall be \$5.00.
- B) The fee for automobiles, light vehicles including trucks, and commercial motorized vehicles including tractor trailers, shall be \$3.00.
- C) The fee for special use vehicles including all-terrain vehicles, agricultural and farm vehicles, and historic vehicles and for 2-wheeled vehicles including mopeds, motorcycles, and non-motorized car and boat trailers, shall be \$2.00

(Of the above-stated fees, \$.50 shall be retained by the Town Clerk for administrative costs and remaining amount shall be deposited into the Reclamation Trust Fund for the purpose of paying collection and disposal fees for the Town's motor vehicle waste).

Moved by Charles Kellett and seconded by Alan Plouffe. After discussion, Dennis McCarthy moved to vote on the question, seconded by Richard Miller. Vote on motion to cease discussion passed. Vote: Article was defeated.

ARTICLE TWENTY-FOUR: To see if the Town will vote to appropriate the sum of fifty-thousand dollars (\$50,000) to build a salt barn. (Recommended by the Budget Committee) (Amount included in the Budget).

Moved by Joseph Stacy, and seconded by James Andrus. After discussion, Odilon Proulx moved to table Article Twenty-Four, and Arthur Gosselin seconded the motion. Vote on motion to table Article was in the affirmative and Article Twenty-Four was tabled.

ARTICLE TWENTY-FIVE: To see if the Town will vote to appropriate the sum of \$50,000.00 (fifty thousand dollars) to purchase, install, and contract service for a computer system for the Town Government and its departments. (Recommended by the Budget Committee) (Amount included in the budget).

Article moved by Charles Kellett and seconded by Columbine Cleaves. The Computer Advisory Committee was commended for their extensive study. After discussion, Kathy Perras moved to vote on the question, seconded by Bruce Phillips. Motion to cease discussion passed. Vote on Article Twenty-Five was in the affirmative.

ARTICLE TWENTY-SIX: We, the undersigned, request the Town of Auburn to appropriate monies to pave approximately 1500 feet of Lovers Lane, that portion which is Class V south of Bunker Hill Road. Money requested for paving is nineteen thousand dollars (\$19,000). (By petition) (Money not included in the Budget).

James Headd moved to appropriate one million three hundred and seventy-two thousand, nine hundred and seventy-seven dollars (\$1,372,977) to defray Town charges and legal obligations for the ensuing year. Seconded by Paul Sanford.

Vote was in the affirmative to cease discussion on the amendment.

Vote on the amendment was in the affirmative, and the proposed appropriation was decreased by \$17,000 (seventeen thousand dollars).

Kay Topliff moved to vote on Article Twenty-eight as amended. Daniel Lawrence seconded. Vote to cease discussion on appropriation was in the affirmative.

Vote on Article to appropriate \$1,355,977 (one million, three hundred fifty-five thousand, nine hundred seventy-seven dollars) passed.

The amount of \$1,355,977 (one million, three hundred fifty-five thousand, nine hundred seventy-seven dollars) was appropriated.

ARTICLE TWENTY-NINE: To transact any other business that may legally come before the meeting.

Laura Murphy moved to take Article Twenty-six off the table for rediscussion. Seconded by John Murphy. Vote was negative and motion was denied.

John Davis moved to adjourn. Seconded. Meeting adjourned at 5:40 pm.

Report of the Auburn Recreation Commission

The Recreation Commission completed another busy year. The Commission sponsored an After School Ski Program, ran the Summer Program, published the Town Newsletter, enhanced the Recreation Area, improved the baseball field at the school and sponsored a 6-week Soccer Clinic.

An After School Ski Program at Pat's Peak was organized and sponsored by the Recreation Commission. Approximately 50 kids from Readiness through High School enrolled and skied Wednesday afternoons at Pat's Peak in January and February.

The Summer Program ran for four weeks in July with about 60 children in attendance. Participants enjoyed a swim day on Wednesdays at Calef Lake, thanks to the continued generosity of Bill Cooper, owner of Calef Lake Campgrounds. In addition, activities included sports, arts, crafts, and weekly field trips.

The Commission continued to work on the Recreation Area. The dugouts were completed under the direction of Ray Bolduc and the Little League. The grass grew on the Soccer Field thanks to the labors of Lucy Rhodes. It was even mowed several times. The Recreation Commission sponsored a six-week Soccer Clinic to teach some basic skills to the interested youth in the community. Plans are under way for a Soccer League in 1991.

Ray Bolduc coordinated the refurbishment of the backstop at the baseball field at the Auburn Village School. This field is used by Little League teams, the school teams and adults in the town. The Recreation Commission felt it was an improvement that was badly needed and it would benefit a large percent of the town population.

The Senior Trip was coordinated by Yvonne Crocker. The Seniors went to the Christa McAuliffe Planetarium and went to lunch in Concord.

The quarterly newsletter was published by Doug Tibbetts. He managed to communicate town news to all residents. This is one publication that most people enjoy getting in their mailboxes.

Olde Home Days was given money for the fireworks display, the chemical toilets, and for the underground utilities that were put in at the school for upcoming Olde Home Days events.

The Recreation Commission has reduced its budget by 30% in view of the present economic conditions. Perhaps we will be a little less visible in 1991, but we will continue to offer recreation to all age groups in the town.

Auburn School District Meeting March 16, 1990

The Auburn School District Meeting was called to order at 8 p.m. on March 16, 1990, at the Roy Seavey Gymnasium by C. Donald Stritch, Moderator.

The Moderator called on Rev. Hubert J. Topliff for the invocation. In the absence of Marcia Trombly, School District Clerk, Mary F. Griffin was elected Clerk Pro Tempore.

Mr. Stritch explained that the red cards would be used at the time of voting.

Article 1: To hear the report of agents, auditors and committees or officer chosen and pass any vote relating thereto.

Mr. Robert Raymond moved that Article 1 be adopted as printed in the Warrant. Second by Mr. Martin Sullivan. Vote was taken and Article 1 was passed.

Article 2. To see if the District will vote to authorize the School Board to apply for, accept and expend, without further action by the School District Meeting, money from the state, federal or other governmental unit or a private source which becomes available during the 1990-91 fiscal year provided that such expenditure be made for purposes for which a School District may appropriate money and that such expenditure not require the expenditure of other School District funds.

Mr. William Wood moved that Article 2 be adopted as printed in the Warrant. Second by Mr. William Anderson. Vote was taken and Article 2 passed.

Article 3: To see if the district will vote to discontinue the Auburn Capital Reserve Fund created in 1972 for the purpose of financing construction and reconstruction of school buildings and the acquisition of land for school buildings; said funds, with accumulated interest to date of withdrawal to be transferred to the district's general fund.

Mr. Raymond moved that Article 3 be adopted as printed in the warrant. Mr. Bruce Mason seconded. Explanation was given. Vote was taken and Article 3 was adopted.

Article 4: To see if the district will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of Thirteen Thousand Dollars (\$13,000.00) to reconstruct the new heating exhaust system of the Auburn Village School. (Not recommended by Budget Committee).

Mr. Alex Komaridis moved that Article 4 be adopted as printed. Mrs. Patrice Kilham seconded. Mr. Komaridis explained the purpose of the article. Much discussion followed. Motion was made by Mrs. Anna Davis that discussion on the article cease. Second by Mr. Richard Shackelton. Vote was taken. Yes - 78, No - 63. This was not a 2/3 vote and discussion continued. Motion was made by Mrs. Debbie Raiche to table the article. Second by Mr. Wilfred Drolet. Vote was taken and the Motion to Table was passed.

Article 5: To see if the District will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of One Hundred Twenty Three Thousand, Nine Hundred Ninety Eight Dollars (\$123,998.00) to fund the cost items related to an increase in teachers' salaries and benefits attributable to the Collective Bargaining Agreement being entered into by the Auburn School Board and the Auburn Education Association for the 1990-91 fiscal year. Such sum of money represents the additional costs attributable to an increase in salaries and benefits over those obligations payable under the prior Collective Bargaining agreement. (Recommended by the Budget Committee).

Mr. Alex Komaridis moved that Article 5 be adopted as printed in the Warrant. Second by Mr. Mason. Discussion followed. Mr. Mason moved the question. Mr. Jackson Henry seconded. Vote was taken to cease discussion. Motion passed. Vote was then taken on Article 5. Hand vote was taken. Mr. Stritch requested that Mrs. Cox and Mrs. Allard take the count. Yes - 77, No - 75. Due to the closeness of the vote a second vote was called for and count was taken. The result of this count was Yes - 77, No - 76. At this time the Moderator called for a paper ballot vote. The result was Yes - 74, No - 89. Article 5 was defeated.

Article 6: To see what sum of money the District will vote to raise and appropriate for the support of schools, for the payment of salaries and benefits for school district officials and agents other than benefit and salary increases to teachers, and for the payment of statutory obligations of the District.

Mr. James Headd moved that the budget in the amount of \$3,894,897.00 be adopted. Second by Mr. Albert Samson. Discussion followed. Mr. William Thomas moved to amend the article to add \$123,998.00 to the budget figure of \$3,894,897.00. Mr. Walter Petuck seconded. Discussion followed. Mr. Mason moved the question. Mr. Anderson seconded. Ballot vote was taken on the amendment with the results as follows: Yes - 39, No - 121. The amendment was defeated.

Motion was made by Mr. Samson that 5 1/2% or \$66,212.00 be added to the \$3,894,897. for teacher raises and benefits. Discussion followed. Mr. John Davis moved the question. Second by Mrs. Jacqueline Wood. Vote was taken on the amendment and the motion to amend the article was passed.

The Moderator called for further discussion on Article 6 in the amount of \$3,961,109.00. Explanations were given on several points of the budget. Mr. James Andrus called for the question. Second by Mr. Ray Krohn. Motion carried.

Vote was taken on Article 6 in the amount of \$3,961,109.00 The Article was adopted.

Mr. Richard Miller moved to adjourn the meeting. Motion was seconded. Vote was taken and the motion was passed.

The 1990 Annual School District Meeting was closed at 10:55 p.m.

Independent Auditor's Report On Financial Presentation

We have audited the accompanying general purpose financial statements of the Auburn School District and the combining and individual fund financial statements of the School District as of and for the year ended June 30, 1990, as listed in the table of contents. These financial statements are the responsibility of the School District's management. Our responsibility is to express an opinion on these financial statements based on our audit.

We conducted our audit in accordance with generally accepted auditing standards. Those standards require that we plan and perform the audit to obtain reasonable assurance about whether the financial statements are free of material misstatement. An audit includes examining, on a test basis, evidence supporting the amounts and disclosures in the financial statements. An audit also includes assessing the accounting principles used and significant estimates made by management, as well as evaluating the overall financial statement presentation. We believe that our audit provides a reasonable basis for our opinion.

As described in Note 1B, the general purpose financial statements referred to above do not include the General Fixed Asset Account Group, which should be included to conform with generally accepted accounting principles. The amount that should be recorded in the General Fixed Asset Account Group is not known.

In our opinion, except that omission of the General Fixed Asset Account Group results in an incomplete presentation, as explained in the above paragraph, the general purpose financial statements referred to above present fairly, in all material respects, the financial position of the Auburn School District at June 30, 1990, and the results of its operations for the year then ended, in conformity with generally accepted accounting principles. Also, in our opinion, the combining and individual fund financial statements referred to above present fairly, in all material respects, the financial position of each of the individual funds of the School District at June 30, 1990, and the results of operations of such funds for the year then ended, in conformity with generally accepted accounting principles.

Superintendent's Report

AUBURN

As I recall events and activities of the 1989-90 school year several important issues concerning the Auburn School District should be summarized. The entire staff at the school and members of the community have contributed in various efforts related to a successful year.

The continuation of the building project went quite smoothly and the students were able to enjoy the opening of the new building in September of 1989. The new Home Economics and Industrial Arts programs have enhanced the learning experience for the junior high students.

The Auburn School Board is most concerned about the ongoing growth of the community and the need to study the School District's overall future. A Long Range Planning Committee has been studying for the past year and has focused their attention on the educational needs of all students from Kindergarten through grade 12.

The annual enrollment has shown a steady increase at the elementary level for the past several years.

The District has diligently applied their elementary minimum standards and Auburn is in very favorable condition in meeting these standards for the 1990-91 school year.

Significant transitions in administration occurred this past year. A new Assistant Principal was employed last summer, and completed his first year at the Auburn Village School.

Dr. Kenneth Severson, Assistant Superintendent for School Administrative Unit #15, resigned effective June 30, 1990, and Dr. John Handfield was employed to serve in this position.

Auburn students gained recognition in the Odyssey of the Mind competitions once again, both at the state and national level. Students, parents, and coaches are to be commended on their participation and achievements in this worthwhile program.

After careful consideration the School District budget for 1989-90 was extremely close, but we were able to maintain a good financial climate.

The Board recently signed a new three year tuition agreement with the Manchester School District for high school students beginning July 1, 1990, and ending June 30, 1993.

During the 1989-90 school year the Auburn School District provided special education services to 85 students. Six of those were enrolled in preschool programs. Five students attended private special education day schools. Nineteen students attended public schools in other districts, including 15 high school students. Five high school aged students completed the objectives of their programs and graduated. The special education needs of the remaining 55 students were met at the Auburn Village School. The number of students served at Auburn Village increased by nine while the total number served increased by only one.

The District's ability to meet the needs of more students in their neighborhood school is a result of adding a self-contained special education program, and increasing the Special Education Coordinator position to full time. The scope and quality of services has reduced the need to place some students in programs outside the community.

As a note of general information the Auburn School Board meets on a regular basis once a month and when necessary has special meetings which are held at the Auburn Village School. These meetings are officially posted in three locations in town. These are public meetings and we encourage citizens' attendance.

I extend thanks to the Auburn School Board members, Principal Raymond Bourque, all school staff members, and the members of the community for their support throughout the past school year.

School Board Chairman's Report

Early in June 1990, the School Board spent several days with the school administration talking philosophy and developing a number of goals that we concluded would enable us to continue to improve our educational system over the next several years. Goal setting is, of course; extremely important to the success of any organization. The process does require us, however, to temper our unbridled idealism with the realities of economic limitations and time constraints. We must continue to strive to reach our goals but must, at the same time, be patient.

Here are three of the goals that your School Board feels are important to the future of the Auburn School System:

1. Develop lesson plans within the curriculum and utilize teaching strategies that address the fact that different students learn in different ways. Simply put, many of us learn better by doing or observing rather than just listening. We need to recognize the different learning styles that students have.
2. Develop a comprehensive computer education program that will provide students with computer-assisted instruction at all levels. A second objective is to prepare our junior high school graduates to meet basic computer literacy standards as they enter high school.
3. Expand the program of enrichment activities that helps build the self-esteem of students and generates a sense of pride in school and community. We are committed to making our entire community more aware of what is happening at the Village School and equally committed to encouraging more of our community to become involved with these activities.

We are very encouraged by the enthusiasm shown by the staff toward achieving these goals and we are optimistic about the future. Now, more than ever, all segments of our community need to realize that our educational system is our future; it really is our greatest asset.

The Auburn Planning Board

Although 1990 featured a lethargic growth rate in the town of Auburn which fueled an economic downward trend in building, the Auburn Planning Board took full advantage of the slow pace to review and update existing regulations and board policies. The update of the Auburn Master Plan as prepared by the engineering firm of Dufresne and Henry, Inc. and Gerald I. Coogan AICP was approved and presented to the town on February 28, 1990.

The Planning Board agenda also consisted of the updated 1990 Capital Improvements Program; a program which solicits a five year monetary improvement schedule from such town agencies such as the Auburn Volunteer Fire Department, the Auburn Recreation Commission and the Auburn Police Department. Such a program places the town in a position, so as to foresee future capital expenditures.

Included in their agenda was the review of the Auburn Zoning Ordinances, Auburn Building Codes, Auburn Zoning Map, Impact Fees and the selection of Normandeau Associates for the review of submitted plans which consist of and/or encroach upon wetland areas. Each year the Planning Board reviews articles which may warrant amendments, such as clarification in article definition, rezoning of the town map or updating building codes.

The Planning Board meets each Wednesday evening at 7:00 and morning office hours are held each Friday from 9:00 to 11:30.

REPORT OF THE SOUTHERN NEW HAMPSHIRE PLANNING COMMISSION

All dues-paying members of the Southern New Hampshire Planning Commission are offered a wide range of services, resources and technical assistance by a professional planning staff who, from time-to-time, are assisted by specialized consultants on an as-needed basis. Under the direction of your representatives, the staff develops and carries out planning programs that require a regional perspective, as well as those which pertain more directly to your community.

Local planning assistance requests are generally received from your Planning Board and/or the Board of Selectmen. With the concurrence of the Commission, certain general studies are conducted, notifications made and training workshops held that are considered essential for all member municipalities.

Services that were performed for the Town of Auburn during the past year are as follows:

1. Provided testimonies, some in support and some in opposition, to the House and Senate committees of the 1990 Legislative Session on a few bills which pertain to planning and zoning. SB 337; SB358; SB 359; HB 1121; HB 1119; and HB 1375 dealing with impact fees deserve a special mention.
2. Co-sponsored the Municipal Law Lecture meetings. The town officials were invited to attend those meetings.
3. Conducted a six-hour training workshop for the planning board members. Representatives from the Auburn Planning and Zoning boards were invited to that workshop.
4. Using the GIS ARC/INFO, prepared a computerized map for the town showing developmental constraints. The Planning Board has been provided with a map, and the data has been stored in the electronic files of the Commission.

Visiting Nurse Association of Manchester & Southern New Hampshire, Inc.

The Visiting Nurse Association has been providing the residents of Auburn with a full range of home health services since 1965. The VNA Board of Trustees and staff take this opportunity to reaffirm their commitment to excellence in health care, and to the provision of services designed to ensure that being cared for at home is safe, comfortable and convenient.

Over the past year the VNA has forged ahead with new endeavors. In January of 1989 the VNA formally acquired the former Greater Manchester Child Care Association (GMCCA) to insure that affordable quality child care services would continue to be available in our community. Shortly after the acquisition of the center, a major renovation project of the physical facility began. From March to the present, hundreds of skilled tradesmen representing 13 labor unions and many local businesses have come forward offering time and materials for the project.

The VNA's programs have continued to thrive and expand. VNA home care and community health services are provided through its affiliates.

VNA Home Health & Hospice Services, Inc. is Medicare and Medicaid certified, provides intravenous and enteral therapies; skilled nursing care; physical, occupational and speech/language therapies; nutrition counseling and medical social services; certified home health aides; Hospice care for the terminally ill; and long-term care for the elderly and the handicapped. Medical equipment, such as beds and wheelchairs, is also available. Payment for service includes health insurance, and private payment. Fees are explained to our patients at the first visit to the home and for those unable to pay the usual fees, adjustments are made on an individual basis.

VNA Personal Services, Inc. provides private duty nurses, home health aides, homemakers, companions, personal care assistants and child care in the home.

VNA Community Services, Inc. provides free Immunization Clinics for all age groups monthly and free Blood Pressure screening clinics. Watch your local paper for date and place. Foot Care clinics are held monthly at our 194 Concord Street office by appointment and blood pressure checks are done weekdays from 1:30-4:00pm. Occupational Health programs are provided to business and industry on site. Parent-Child Health Services include the Teenage Pregnancy Program, the Parent-Baby (ad) Venture Program for children at risk of abuse and neglect, the Child Care Connection for child care providers, and the Training Program concerned with preventing drug and alcohol use among adolescents in high schools.

VNA Child Care Center provides a full range of state-licensed child care, tailored to each child's needs. Programs include Infant/Toddler (ages 6 weeks to 36 months); Preschool (ages 3-5); and Kindergarten (age 5). The center also provides Extended Care, which is a before- and after-school program for children grades 1 through 6, and special full-day programs during some holidays, school conference days, and school vacations. The summer session provides creative, fun programming for children ages 3 to 11. As needed, VNA also offers families a continuum of coordinated health and social services, both directly from the VNA and through working arrangements with other community resources.

Town appropriations, grants, United Way allocation and donations are a vital part of the funds that help to defray the cost of unpaid services. A representative(s) of the town of Auburn serving on the VNA Board of Trustees is Robert N. Lord, MD.

Auburn Police Department

The Auburn Police Department saw many changes in 1990. After much front page publicity, the department took new direction as Lt. Picard became Chief Picard. It was a very busy year for the department with over 4,000 cases reported to us. 1990 saw the arrest of many individuals responsible for some of the burglaries here in Auburn. The persistent work of our officers and help from the public, made these arrests possible.

The department would like to take this opportunity to ask all of you for your help. Some of the things you can do to help us better serve you are really quite simple. We ask that you be aware of your surroundings. Note that suspicious motor vehicle riding up and down the street, getting the license plate if possible. Carry a pen and paper in your car and jot down any license plate that looks suspicious to you. We ask that you watch your neighbor's home. The more people that get involved in this endeavor the better we can do our job. It is a fact that crime increases as the economy continues to fall. With our increased visibility and your help, we can combat this problem together. Keep in mind that when you go on vacation or will be out of your home for any period of time, contact the station and request a house check be placed on your home.

In March of 1990, Auburn Police, along with State Police, made an arrest of several people in the Parker/Milne mansion arson case. In April, officer Earl Ackley left the department to pursue a new career in Florida. Officer Gary Karolian also resigned for personal reasons. In May the department hired Shaun Mulholland as a part-time police officer. Shaun is a senior at UNH and plans to pursue a full-time law enforcement career upon graduation in the spring of 1991. Norma Picard resigned from the clerical staff and is currently employed by N.H. Electric Co-op. In October the department hired Thomas Wickey, in the position of part-time police officer. Tom has eight years experience as a full-time police officer with the Manchester Police Department and is presently employed in the insurance business.

Report of the Auburn Volunteer Fire Department

There were 162 total emergency calls in 1990. The 70 fire calls included: 7 chimney fires, 2 structure fires, 10 brush fires, 3 appliance fires, 5 vehicle fires, 10 false alarms, 7 mutual aid calls, 5 calls for wires down, 3 burner problems, 10 good intent calls, 6 smoke investigations and 2 assists to the Police Department. The 92 rescue calls included 60 in-house calls, 25 motor vehicle accidents, 6 water rescues and 1 false alarm.

Training-wise, it was a very busy year for the Auburn Fire Department. In February, a speaker from the State informed the firemen of the new Commercial Driver Licensing laws. Another speaker presented a Defensive Driving program. Monthly crew training during the year consisted of topics such as hose, firestreams, tools, ventilation, salvage, overhaul, ladders, ropes, radio communications, forcible entry and self contained breathing apparatus.

An Incident Command course was offered in March. All the firemen attended the several weeks of classes and learned how to set up at an emergency scene and how to take command of the scene.

Courses in CPR, refresher EMT, EOA and cardiac defibrillation were held in Auburn and were taught for the most part by Auburn instructors to rescue personnel to keep up their qualifications. Training sessions were offered in vehicle extrication, water rescue and hypothermia.

Members of the Fire Department attended classes at Meadowood Fire School in Keene and the National Fire Academy in Maryland. In November, a water shuttle drill was held and the firemen control burned two sheds and a chicken coop.

In the spring, all the fire and rescue equipment owned by Auburn was marked with State assigned colors. It was a big project but should prevent equipment from being lost to other "AVFD" departments.

Several members have been refurbishing and customizing a recently obtained tractor cab into a tanker for the town. Central Station was resided in vinyl and Station One had the siding cleaned and restained.

New equipment for 1990 included pagers so that all firemen will have one. The department purchased three resuscitators for CPR training. Audio-visual equipment was purchased for use during the many training classes offered in Auburn. A breathing air test kit was obtained to measure the carbon monoxide, carbon dioxide, hydrocarbons and moisture of the air in the survivairs. The McDonald/First Alert fire video was purchased by the fire department and can be borrowed free at the Video Coop.

The fire department participated at Olde Home Days and helped with the Sun Valley playground. During winter months, the skating rink was flooded for community skating. During Fire Prevention Week in October, presentations and demonstrations were performed at the schools in Auburn. The week's finale was an Open House at Station One. The firemen helped Channel 11 with their fund drive in March and played volleyball to benefit the Easter Seals Society. Every eight weeks a group from the department donate blood at the Red Cross in Manchester.

Smooth operation of departmental matters and policies are conducted by the fire department officers. All apparatus and equipment, buildings and grounds are maintained by the firemen. The firemen are dedicated and well-trained, qualified volunteers.

When reporting an emergency, remain calm, speak clearly and remain on the telephone until the dispatcher has all the necessary information. Remembering to follow this advice can make a difference for rapid response to your emergency.

Report of the Town Forest Fire Warden

For the fifth consecutive year, no notable brush fires were reported in the town of Auburn. Statewide, 489 fires burned 473 acres in New Hampshire in 1990 as compared to 550 fires scorching 554 acres in 1989. In 1988, 498 fires burned 509 New Hampshire acres.

The leading cause of brush fires continues to be open fires ignited without permits. Written permission must be obtained in order to legally kindle an outdoor fire when there is no snow cover. During the "dry" times of the year, usually in the summer and fall, open fires are banned completely and extra care must be taken to prevent accidental brush fires.

Children playing with matches and the careless disposal of smoking material are other prime causes of brush fires. Through public awareness and education, fires started by these means can be prevented.

Fire permits are issued only on the day of the burn and when safe conditions exist. Open fires are never to be left unattended. Other times and factors apply so contact a Forest Fire Warden for information.

Persons burning without a permit can be subject to a \$1,000 fine, 1 year in prison and charged for the cost of the fire suppression according to RSA 224:27.

Please continue to help prevent brush and forest fires.

Report of the Solid Waste Commission

While the Solid Waste Commission (SWC) has basically been in existence for over two years, it was not formally operating as a Commission until mid-1990.

In 1990, the SWC appropriated about \$235,000, including warrant articles. Most of this amount was used to upgrade the incinerator plant, which has been operating for over 13 years – and neglected for most of that time.

The SWC accomplished the following in 1990:

- Virtually replaced the entire incinerator and improved the physical plant
- Purchased a skid steer loader, baler, and two 50 cu. yd. containers
- Instituted new recycling programs for batteries, cardboard, clothing, compost, paint cans, and tin cans
- Made clear, environmentally-safe bags available for household trash
- Continued hauling recyclables, including aluminum, brass, copper, glass, paper, scrap steel, and tires

Overall, these actions have lead to extending the useful life of the incinerator, provided for a general housecleaning of the physical plant and grounds, instituted more efficient operations both in running the incinerator and handling recyclable wastes, and helped create a healthier environment through reduced air pollution and proper source separation.

Now that a strong foundation is in place at the Auburn Recycling & Disposal Facility through plant improvements, new capital equipment, and recycling separation, we can now embark on a path of continuous improvement, including:

- Simplified operations
- Reduced operating expenses
- Reduced recycling costs, and ultimately
- Lowered overall waste management costs to the town

There are NO major capital expenditures in the SWC's 1991 budget; however, this year's SWC's goals include:

- Reduce incinerator and recycling operating expenses
- Work with commercial trash haulers
- Institute plastic recycling (in fact, we are collecting plastic jugs and soda bottles now)
- Improve incinerator and physical plant

The members of the SWC are Debbie Anderson, Kurt Cameron (Alternate), Louis Gamache (Selectmen's Representative), Larry Gould, Charlie Kellett (Chairman), and Terri Poor.
