

TOWN WARRANT

THE STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

To the Inhabitants of the Town of Brentwood in the County of Rockingham in said State, qualified to vote in Town Affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the Swasey School in said Brentwood on Tuesday, the eighth day of March, next at nine of the clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects:

1. To choose all necessary Town Officers for the year ensuing.

2. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray town charges for the ensuing year and make appropriations of the same.

3. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate \$410.04 for Town Road Aid.

4. To see if the town will authorize the selectmen to borrow \$45,000.00 in anticipation of taxes.

5. To see if the town desires to rebuild any roads this year, to designate such roads and make appropriation for the same.

6. To see if the town desires a complete property revaluation, to designate by whom and make appropriation for the same.

7. To see if the town will vote to adopt the Municipal Budget Act. (By Request.)

8. To see if the town will vote to authorize the repair of the Haigh Road so called from Skim Milk Road to Little River, a distance of approximately one-third mile, to put said road in passable condition. (By Petition.)

9. To see if the town will vote to buy a police radio and raise and appropriate \$475.00 for the same.

10. To see if the town will raise and appropriate the sum of \$2,000.00 to be added to the Capital Reserve Fund, established in 1965, for a new fire truck, fully equipped and

approved by the N. H. Board of Fire Underwriters. (By Petition.)

11. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$49.17 to join the N.H. Municipal Association.

12. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$53.60 to join the Rockingham County Community Action Program Inc.

13. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$178 for the annual budget of the Seacoast Regional Development Association.

14. To see if the town will vote to abandon the road leading from Route 125 in back of Mr. Sherman's to its junction with John Blocks Road so called.

15. To see if the town will vote to abandon the road leading from Deer Hill Road in back of Paul Thyngs to the County Road.

16. To see if the town will vote to abandon the road below Hollis Martins leading from the south road to the Little River in Kingston.

17. To transact any other business that may legally come before this meeting.

REPORT OF THE TOWN MEETING — MARCH 9, 1965

At a legal meeting of the Inhabitants of the Town of Brentwood on Tuesday, the ninth day of March, 1965 at ten o'clock of the forenoon, the following business was transacted:

A motion was made by Norman Smith and seconded by C. Francis Thorsell that the polls close at 7:00 P.M. — Passed.

A motion was made by Joseph Southwick and seconded by Norman Smith that the business meeting be held at 8:00 P.M. — Passed.

The warant was read by Moderator pro tem Russell A. Mason. The polls were then opened at 10:15 A.M. and closed at 7:00 P.M.

The business meeting opened at 8:35 P.M. The total number of votes cast was announced as 350. The following articles were read and voted on:

ARTICLE 1. The following were elected: Town Clerk, Elizabeth G. Waitt — 313 votes; Selectmen for three years, Freeman G. Newton — 114 votes; Treasurer, Betty M. Stevens — 321 votes; Tax Collector, Ruth J. Mason — 315 votes; Highway Agent, Hubert G. Wendell — 320 votes; Auditor, Doris J. Pailes — 292 votes; Firewards, two to be elected, Richard LeBreaux — 192 votes and Norman J. Byrne — 188 votes; Chief of Police, Joseph H. Southwick — 319 votes; Trustee of Public Library for three years, Helen Moul — 318 votes; Trustee of Trust Funds for three years, Lillian Greenleaf — 317 votes.

Question on ballot: To see if the Town will vote to rescind all zoning and building regulations now in force. (By petition.) Yes -129; No -187.

ARTICLE 2. Voted a budget of approximately \$163,789.59 less State and Federal Aid.

ARTICLE 3a. A motion was made by LeRoy Lake and seconded by Norman Smith to place Article 3a on the Warrant as follows: To see if the town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to borrow up to \$45,000.00 in anticipation of taxes. Passed. A motion was then made by LeRoy Lake and seconded by Norman Smith that Article 3a be passed. — Passed. A motion was also made and passed under this article that the 1965 Town Meeting be legalized by the Legislature.

ARTICLE 3b. A motion of no consideration was made and passed because this had been on the town ballot.

ARTICLE 4. Voted to allow the Selectmen to sell the Wadleigh land with the amendment that the proceeds be applied to the town budget.

ARTICLE 5. Voted that the town will appropriate and raise the sum of \$1,179.70 to reimburse the Brentwood Volunteer Firemen's Association for the siren.

ARTICLE 6. Voted that the town will establish a Capital Reserve Fund of \$2,000.00 per year towards the purchase of a new fire truck.

ARTICLE 7. Motion was made by Norman Smith and seconded by LeRoy Lake that the meeting be adjourned at 11:22 P.M. — Passed.

Motion made by C. Francis Thorsell and duly seconded that nominations cease. Voted in the affirmative.

The following three man committee was elected for three years by ballot: Donald Pailes, Alfred Jensen and C. Russell Waterman.

A motion was made by Herbert H. Gove and duly seconded the Cooperative Study Committee be retained. Voted in the affirmative.

Article 6. A motion by C. Francis Thorsell and duly seconded that the School District raise 3000 dollars to enlarge the playground of Swasey Central School. 80 votes cast on a standing vote — 41 for, 39 against.

Mrs. Arlene LeClair asked for a recount.

The moderator called for a written ballot.

Gardener Ladd called for the use of the check list.

Result of recount: 85 votes cast — 44 for, 41 against.

A motion was made by William Vahey and duly seconded that the School Board not start work on the playground until the Engineering Survey of the sewage problem is completed. Vote in the affirmative.

A motion was made by Mrs. Elizabeth Stevens and duly seconded that the custodian be given a rising vote of thanks for his work of caring for the school.

The District Clerk was asked to send a letter of appreciation to the members of the Cooperative Study Committee for their fine work. A motion was made by Frederick M. Gallant and duly seconded to thank the School Board for a fine year and to Russell A. Mason for the fine job of leading the meeting.

A motion was made by C. Francis Thorsell and duly seconded to adjourn the meeting at 11:35 P.M.

SUPERINTENDENT'S REPORT

To the Citizens of Brentwood:

This past year has certainly been an active one in Brentwood. More major educational issues were debated and resolved in this short time than in any other equal period in the history of local education.

It began with a decision to vote against becoming a part of the Sanborn Regional School District organization and ended up with a vote of approval for the Exeter AREA plan.

Between these two votes, your school board and planning committee member, Mr. Donald Pailes did a tremendous amount of work. These individuals deserve much credit, especially since they originally favored and recommended to you the Sanborn Regional arrangement — such flexibility is indeed a true sign of maturity and dedication. Brentwood is very fortunate to have such people.

Another unusual development was Principal Hanson's unexpected resignation just prior to the opening of school in September. He left to accept a full-time administrative position in Newton with a substantial increase in salary. We were extremely fortunate, however, to have Mr. Donald Virgin available as an immediate replacement. Mr. Virgin came to Brentwood with considerable teaching experience in Dover and with administrative experience in Sandown, Newington, and Somersworth.

The sudden resignation of our school custodian last spring was also unexpected. However, we were fortunate to find a qualified and competent replacement in Mr. Norwood Sargent.

School opened this year with an enrollment of 174 pupils and with two new staff members. Mrs. Grace Cleveland was elected to teach Social Studies in the upper grades. Mrs. Cleveland, a graduate of Mansfield State College in Pennsylvania did her practice teaching in Tioga, Pennsylvania. Mr. Charles Goyette, a graduate of New England College, was employed to teach Science. Although Mr. Goyette did not have any formal practice teaching, his experience in private tutoring and teaching Sunday school classes has more than made up for this.

As in the past, most students are maintaining a high scholastic rating and their enthusiasm in extra-cururicular activities is second to none. A recent study made by our office indicated that, on the average, Swasey School students are reading at least one grade level above the national norm. The newly won athletic trophies on display in the front hall show the school's accomplishments in non-academic areas as well.

This report would be incomplete without a few words relative to the new National Elementary and Secondary School Education Act of 1965 (ESEA). This act was the first major legislation of national significance to be enacted by the 89th Congress. Keyed to "poverty" ESEA has five major provisions in it.

Title II authorizes distribution of \$100 million to the states for acquisition of library resources, including textbooks and audio-visual materials. This title establishes the Supervisory Union as the acting agent rather than the district. Our Union No. 14 was allotted \$6,075.00 and on December 15, 1965, we submitted a proposal to spend the entire amount in order to establish an audio-visual center in the Union with its possible location at Sanborn Seminary.

Title III provides another \$100 million for grants to local school districts for the establishment of supplementary educational centers. An extremely wide range of activities may be authorized under this title. The terms, however, require that the school authorities must cooperate with other eduvational and cultural interests in the community in working out projects.

Title IV provides money for regional educational research and training facilities. Grants will be awarded to institutions of higher education and the non-profit agencies to undertake programs which will benefit public schools.

Title V makes available \$25 million to strengthen State Departments of Education.

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In summary then, the title which seems to apply most directly to Brentwood is Title II. It is with this that your school administrators will be primarily concerned.

I wish now to thank everyone, especially your school board and Mr. Virgin for their support and understanding through such a difficult and rapidly changing year.

Immunization clinics were again available to school and preschool children. The plan is to have them every fall with the hope that parents of five-year-olds will bring these children for their necessary vaccination and booster shots.
