#### State of New Hampshire

To the inhabitants of the Town of Center Harbor in the County of Belknap in said State, qualified to vote in Town Affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at Center Harbor Town House in said Center Harbor on Tuesday, the twelfth day of March, next at two of the clock in the afternoon, to act upon the following subjects:

- 1. To choose all necessary Town Officers for the year ensuing.
- 2. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray Town Charges for the ensuing year and make appropriations of the same.
- 3. To see how much money the Town will vote to raise for the Highway Department which includes care and maintenance of Sidewalks, Wharf Area and Fountain.
- 4. To see if the Town will vote to raise the sum of \$3,500. maintenance of the Center Harbor Volunteer Fire Department.
- 5. To see if the Town will vote to raise money in the amount of \$2,500. for Welfare and Town Poor.
- 6. To see if the Town will vote to raise money for Parks and playgrounds, including Band Concerts and the hiring of a qualified Life Guard at the Town Beach, and if so how much.
- 7. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$2,100.00 for Street Lighting throughout the Town.
- 8. To see if the Town will vote to accept State Aid Assistance for Class V Roads, the Town to raise, \$253.16 and the State will contribute \$1,687.71.

- 9. To see if the Town will vote to raise money for aid to the Laconia Hospital and if so, how much.
- 10. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$2,000. for continuing the Piper Hill Road Project.
- 11. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$2,000. for continuing the Canney Hill Road Project.
- 12. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$191.65 which is 1/200th of 1% of the equalized valuation of the Town, to the Lakes Region Association, for the purposes of publicizing and promoting the natural advantages and resources of the Town, in cooperation with other towns in the Lakes Region. (By Request)
- 13. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the installation of a Street Light or Blinker at Thompson Corner, so called, and two Street Lights on the Waukewan Road as need may appear.

  (By Request)
- 14. To see if the Town will vote to close that portion of the Town Road occupied by a part of the Marine Railway of Winnipesaukee Steamship Company, Inc.

(By Request)

15. To see if the Town will vote to hire a full time policeman, if so to raise and appropriate money therefore and establish the method of selecting officer.

(By Request)

- 16. To see if the town will raise and appropriate the sum of \$2,000.00 for providing a water supply for the Fountain, Fire House and Library. (By Request)
- 17. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to sell property acquired by Tax Collector's Deed.
- 18. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to hire money in anticipation of taxes.
- 19. To choose agents or committees in relation to any article of this Warrant and to hear reports of any here-to-fore chosen.

- 20. To see if the Town will vote to establish By-laws, ordinances or regulations for controlling the use of the Town Dump, Public Wharves or Landings and the Public Buildings and premises.
- 21. To see if the Town will vote to accept, from the Dr. Leonard B. Morrill Memorial Park Association Inc., the Dr. Morrill Memorial Fund to be administered agreeably to its provisions, also to accept for the use of the Town all other assets now in possession of said Association.
- 22. To transact any other business that may legally come before said meeting.

### Forest Fire Warden's Report

#### PREVENTING FOREST FIRES IS OUR RESPONSIBILITY

Costs of suppressing carelessly set outdoor fires in New Hampshire in 1962 cost the persons responsible \$5,545. In the same period, the cost to the cities and towns for control of such fires for which no responsibility could be placed cost another \$24,634. What utter waste of tax money and what shameful and needless loss of timber and esthetic values in the 2200 acres burned. Residences, farm, and other business places were threatened with possible total destruction.

Carelessly set man caused fires can be prevented if every citizen remembers his responsibility in regard to any source of fires in the open. We can help to keep our fire loss low by remembering these simple rules.

- 1. Dispose of burnable waste at the town dump.
- 2. If waste or brush is to be burned on the premises, obtain a permit from the forest fire warden. Seasonal permits may be issued for approved incinerators and sites.
- 3. Burn safely by picking a clean site, avoiding dry windy weather and preferably burning late in the day.
- 4. Have something to keep the fire under control—pails of water, garden hose, sprinkling can, broom for grass fires or shovel will help.
- 5. Be sure your fire is dead out before you leave it.
- 6. If the fire gets out of control or if you see a fire out of control, report promptly to your warden or fire department. Continue to fight it until help arrives.

There is potential danger when matches fall into the hands of children. It is never to early for parents to install in the child's mind a respect for fire.

Keep our town safe from fire.
