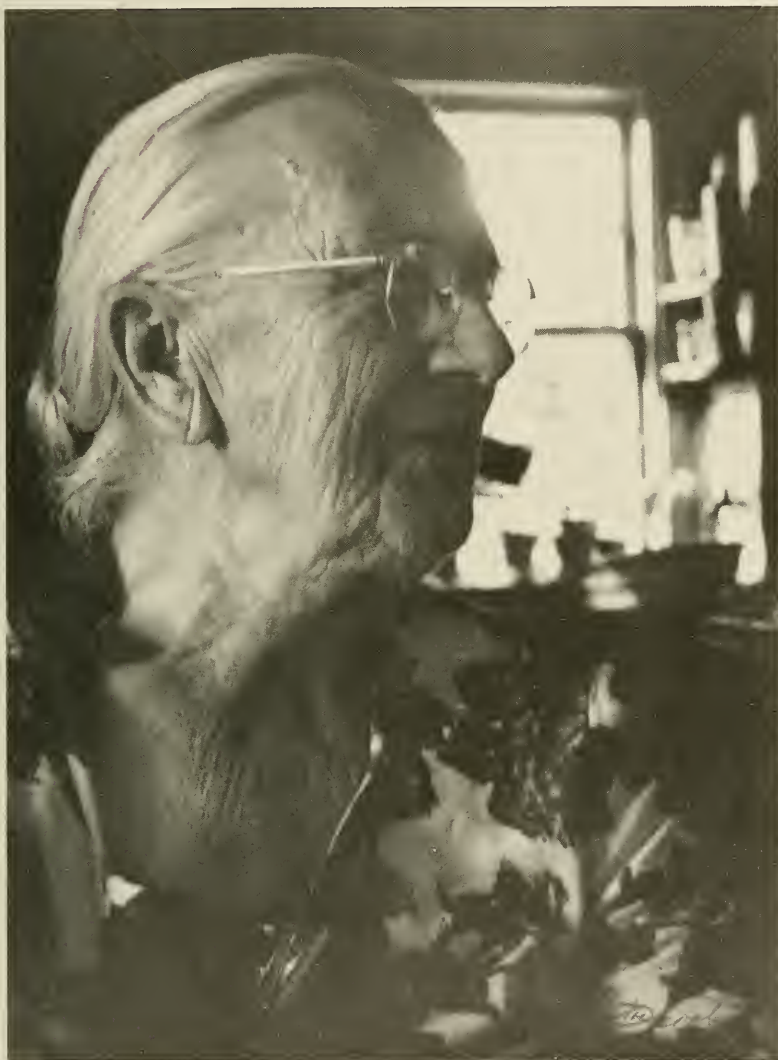

Ruth Ethel Clement Farr

1884 - 1972

Ruth Ethel (Clement) Farr, known to many as Ruth Ethel, was born in Deering on her family homestead (no longer standing) located on Clement Hill. Orphaned at an early age, she subsequently became a ward of the Bartlett family and lived on the Bartlett Farm in North Deering.

As heir to the Bartlett estate, upon the death of Abby Bartlett, Ruth Ethel used a part of her inheritance to buy the farm of her uncle, Richard Clement. There, on Dickey Hill Road, she indulged in her love of the outdoors, growing vegetables, flowers and fruits.

She later married and then moved to Lebanon for a few years, but upon the death of her husband, she returned to Deering to live in a small house alongside Route 149. Ruth Ethel then began raising chinchillas and started a boarding house for pets on whom she lavished devotion and affection.

Often fondly remembered as "a diamond in the rough", Ruth Ethel was nevertheless a woman of culture. Although an avid reader of catholic taste, she was especially fond of poetry and music.

SELECTMEN'S REPORT

The financial statement for the year 1976 reveals another modest surplus with respect to Town expenditures. This surplus was more than offset, however, by the substantial increase in the Town's share of expenses for County and School operations, considerably above expectations.

Although the budget for 1977, with regard to anticipated Town expenses, is essentially unchanged from 1976, the Town's share for County and School expenses may be again subject to upward revision.

The project initiated two years ago to renovate the Town Hall has been vigorously pursued. New quarters for Town Offices located upstairs to the rear of the Town Hall are now ready for furnishing. Two new heating systems have been installed, one to provide heating requirements for the aforementioned offices, the other, a larger unit, to provide heat for the ground floor assembly hall area. Renovation of the office space formerly used by your Selectmen is scheduled for completion during the month of March and will provide a suitable working space for the Town Clerk and Tax Collector. It is essential that this program of renovation be continued to provide more adequate and safer facilities for the use of the townspeople. Article 12 of the present warrant corresponds to this continuing effort.

Under Article 4 we have endeavored to combine all articles which pertain to current expenses and operating costs of the Town. An increase of \$1,000. for maintenance of Town buildings is being requested, reflecting anticipated greater use of the facilities of the Town Hall by Town Officials, Town Committees, residents and non-residents of the Town, now that adequate heating systems have been provided.

The Board of Selectmen feels very strongly that this is the time to purchase a new highway grader due to the age, condition, costs of repair and maintenance of our present grader which is 10 years old. The purchase price would be \$70,200. We anticipate paying for this as follows:

If Article 13 is passed we would then recommend that Item 3 of Article 14 (\$9,000. for road sealing); Article 16 (\$5,000. to Capital Reserve account) and Article 17 (Revenue Sharing) be voted down. This would leave a net figure of \$1,320. to be raised by new taxes.

TOWN WARRANT

To the inhabitants of the Town of Deering in the County of Hillsborough, in said State, qualified to vote in Town Affairs,

GREETINGS:

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town Hall in said Deering on Tuesday, the 8th day of March next, at one of the clock in the afternoon to act upon the following subject:

Article 1. To choose all necessary Town Officers for the ensuing year. Polls will open at 1:00 P.M. and will remain open until 7:00 P.M. (The polls may be continued to be open following the above hour by vote of the Meeting, but may not be closed before the hour of 7:00 P.M. - RSA 39:2).

Additionally, you are hereby notified to meet at the Town Hall in said Deering, on Thursday, the 10th day of March next, at seven of the clock in the evening to act on the following Articles (RSA 39:2a).

(All Articles hereinafter are submitted by the Selectmen unless otherwise noted.)

Article 2. To see if the Town will vote to accept the reports of the Town Officers, Agents, Committees, and Auditors for the year 1976.

Article 3. To see if the Town will vote to rescind its action taken at the 1972 Annual Town Meeting whereby it was voted to have two sessions for the annual Town Meeting.

Article 4. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the following sums of money: Town Officers Salaries \$8,000.; Town Officers Expenses \$8,200.; Election and Registration \$500.; Town Buildings and the purchase of office equipment \$4,000.; Social Security Payments \$2,600.; Insurance \$4,000.; Damages and Legal Expenses \$1,200.; Dumps and Trash Removal \$8,500.; Vital Statistics \$25.; Street Lighting \$1,100.; Library \$35.; Town Poor \$1,800.; Old Age Assistance \$1,200.; Aid to Permanently and Totally Disabled \$750.; Cemetery Care \$500.; and to raise and appropriate such sums of money as may be necessary to defray Town charges for the year 1977 or to take any other action relating thereto.

Article 5. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to borrow money in anticipation of Taxes.

Article 6. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to auction property taken by Tax Collector's Deeds.

Article 7. To see if the Town will vote to continue membership in the Central New Hampshire Regional Planning Commission and raise and appropriate the sum of \$429. for the Town's share of the operating costs of said Commission, or to take any other action relating thereto.

Article 8. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$370. for membership in the Monadnock Region Association, or to take any other action relating thereto.

Article 9. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$300. for the current operating expenses of the Planning Board and the sum of \$250. for the current operating expenses of the Conservation Commission, or to take any other action relating thereto.

Article 10. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$500. for continuing and making corrections to the Town Tax Map, which is required by RSA 31:95a or to take any other action relating thereto.

Article 11. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$8,500. for the Police Department, the sum of \$4,000. for the Fire Department, and the sum of \$200. for Civil Defense, or to take any other action relating thereto.

Article 12. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$7,500. to continue the renovation of the Town Hall, including the refurbishing of the new town offices and the installation of a fire escape at the rear of the building, or to take any other action relating thereto.

Article 13. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$27,320. for a new Highway Grader and authorize the withdrawal of \$12,000. for this purpose from the Revenue Sharing Fund established under the provisions of the State and Local Assistance Act of 1972 with the balance to be raised by taxation.

Article 13a To see if the Town will authorize the withdrawal of \$22,500. from the Capital Reserve Fund to be used towards the purchase of a new Highway Grader, or to take any other action relating thereto.

Article 14. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the following sums for Highway Purposes: (1) \$33,000. for road maintenance; (2) \$11,500. for the General Expenses of the Highway Department; (3) \$9,000. for road sealing; and to raise by State Grant, Highway Subsidy, and appropriate the sum of \$13,980.51 to be used for the maintenance of Town Highways under the provisions of RSA 241:14 as amended, or to take any other action relating thereto.

Article 15. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$1,130.39 to secure Town Road Aid (State Share \$7,535.96), or to take any other action relating thereto.

Article 16. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$5,000. for the Capital Reserve Fund for Highway Equipment, or to take any other action relating thereto.

Article 17. To see if the Town will vote to appropriate and authorize withdrawal from the Revenue Sharing Fund established under the provisions of the State and Local Assistance Act of 1972 for use as setoffs against budget appropriations in the amount indicated; and, further to authorize the Selectmen to make pro-rata increases in the amounts if estimated entitlements are increased or pro-rata reductions in the amounts if the estimated entitlements are reduced, or to take any other action relating thereto.

Article 18. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$200. for the support of the Hillsboro Rescue Squad and the sum of \$50. for the Weare Rescue Squad or to take any other action relating thereto.

Article 19. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$250. for contributions to neighboring Towns which provide nursing services to the residents of Deering or to take any other action relating thereto.

Article 20. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$4,000. for publishing the Deering Town History or to take any other action relating thereto.

(Submitted by Petition)

Article 21. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$795. as a contribution to the Fuller Public Library of Hillsboro or to take any other action relating thereto.

Article 22. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$1.00 and to authorize the Selectmen to enter into a lease agreement with the New Hampshire Water Resources Board to lease for a period of fifty (50) years a certain parcel of land adjacent to Reservoir Dam on the Deering Reservoir, or to take any other action relating thereto.

Article 23. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to accept a Road to be named Blueberry Hill Road, as shown on Plan entitled "Blueberry Hill Subdivision, prepared by DiBernardo Associates as drawing #73-461, dated July 21, 1975", as a Town Road or to take any other action relating thereto.

Article 24. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to apply for and accept grants of Federal or State

Aid, or both, relative to disasters, civic improvement, highway safety, and the detection, deterrence, and apprehension of crime or criminals, any or all, as may be available, and to do all things necessary to carry out this Article, or to take any other action relating thereto.

Article 25. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Board of Selectmen to accept or purchase on behalf of the Town any Federal or State surplus fire or highway equipment, or to take any other action relating thereto.

Article 26. To see if the Town will vote to ratify the following Ordinances enacted by the Board of Selectmen:

ORDINANCE RELATING TO VEHICULAR TRAFFIC

Be it ordained that in order to preserve the town highways that all Town of Deering roads be closed to trucking (pickup trucks under 8,000 lbs. gross vehicle weight; emergency vehicles, fuel delivery vehicles; food, fodder and feed delivery vehicles, milk vehicles, road agent vehicles and school buses excluded) during the period from March 1st to May 15th, or until declared open by the Selectmen.

CONDITION OF EXTERNAL PROPERTY ORDINANCE

Be it resolved and ordained that the following provisions shall apply to the condition of external property in the Town of Deering:

1. No junk yard or place for storage of discarded machinery, vehicles, or other scrap materials shall be maintained in any district unless the storage area for this material is fenced so that it is not visible from any street.

2. No owner or occupant of land in any district shall permit fire or other ruins to be left, but shall remove same to ground level within two years.

3. No abandoned vehicle shall be left exposed on any property for longer than one year.

A fine of not less than \$10.00 for each day of violation or neglect or refusal to comply with this ordinance shall apply. or to take any other action relating thereto.

Article 27. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$325. as a contribution to the Contoocook Valley Mental Health Center or to take any other action relating thereto.

Article 28. To see what photograph or picture the Town will vote to place on the cover of the next annual Town Report, or to take any other action relating thereto.

Article 29. To transact any other business that may legally
be brought before this meeting.

NATIONAL BICENTENNIAL COMMITTEE

Deering celebrated the Nation's Bicentennial in several different ways. The first event, in May, was a concert "Tunes that Washington Knew" in the Deering Community Church featuring harpsichordist Suzanne Cleverdon and violinist Daniel Banner. Mr. B. Kenneth Merrifield, in a Colonial Army uniform, assisted by displaying title cards while "The Battle of Trenton" was played. The harpsichord was a beautiful instrument made in New Hampshire with its sound-board painted by a New Hampshire artist. After the concert refreshments were served in the Parish Hall. This event was sponsored by five local families, the Monadnock Region Committee on the Bicentennial and the New Hampshire Commission on the Arts.

A series of Square Dances on Wednesday evenings during July and August was sponsored by the Deering National Bicentennial Committee. Jean Bartlett was in charge of the series and her time and effort are appreciated.

The Children's Day was held in August. Despite the rainy day the children had a good time due largely to the efforts of a committee headed by Joan Burke.

The Bicentennial Old Home Day was held on August 31. In the morning there was a flag-raising ceremony. The Women's Guild held their annual fair that day. Local craftsmen and businesses displayed their wares on the Common and a chicken barbecue was served at noon by the Sno-Knights. A band concert was given in the early afternoon by the Hillsboro-Deering High School Band, and in the evening a dance completed the day's festivities. Thanks are due to Malcolm Murchison for the craft display and to Ronald Elliott for conducting the dance. The Deering photographs prepared for the Deering Bicentennial were again on display.

The profit from the Tom Rush Concert in late August was given to this committee to help with the expense of preparing and pub-

lishing a town history and this committee is grateful for his contribution.

The Monadnock Region Committee on the Bicentennial has also contributed to the history project.

Members of the Deering Guild made a block for the Monadnock Region Bicentennial Quilt which was on display in Deering on Old Home Day. The block depicted the reverse of the Deering Bicentennial Medal.

The Committee is indebted to Peggy Nugent for crocheting a red, white and blue afghan, using the Deering seal as a central motif. The proceeds from its sale went to the committee treasury.

The 1974 Town Bicentennial Committee donated the remainder of its funds for the publication of a town history.

The Deering Lake Improvement Association, the Night Riders Inc. and the Deering Celebration Account donated funds for the summer activities.

Work is going forward on the history with Evangeline Poling as the editor. More taped interviews with interested parties have taken place and more research has been conducted.

We hereby express our thanks to all who have so generously contributed time, information and effort to bring Deering's celebration of the Bicentennial to fruition and to those who have helped with historical information.

N.H. REGIONAL PLANNING COMMISSION

At the end of 1976 and six years of operation, the Central New Hampshire Regional Planning Commission had completed several studies of a regional as well as a local assistance nature.

During 1976 the Commission completed the following studies: an historic preservation report listing significant historic sites by community, a community facilities inventory for each community, a study outlining the impact of institutional tax exempt properties within each community. Currently the Commission is preparing a future land use study, a housing needs update study and an economic base study, all from a regional perspective.

In January the Commission delivered to the Town a set of photographic enlargements which were requested by the Selectmen and which serve as a base for the Town tax map.

During September and October of 1976 the Commission co-sponsored a series of seminars dealing with the legal aspects of planning. Several officials from Deering attended and the entire series received favorable comment.

In addition, the Commission provided assistance in the development of a plan for the Town Common area as well as responding to questions from the Planning Board and Conservation Commission in order to assist them in their activities. The Commission is also assisting the Planning Board in the completion of their work on a Comprehensive Plan.

The Commission is anxious to help any member Towns on planning or related problems but can only do so when help is requested. Therefore, to get the most return we must feel free to use their services. Town officials may call the office for help at any time. Others should contact either of your Commissioners, both of whom are actively involved in the work of the Commission. Mr. Nugent is a member of the Executive Committee.

In 1976 the Town of Hillsboro joined the Central Region. This is advantageous to both Deering and Hillsboro because our two Towns are tied together in so many ways.

PLANNING BOARD REPORT

The Planning Board of Deering has met regularly on the second Wednesday of every month with the exception of August of 1976. Additional meetings were held throughout the year with other members of the Town Plan Committee pursuant to the study and final drafting of the Town Plan.

The regular meetings of the Board commence at 7:30 p.m. and end at 10:00 p.m. During the good and warmer months of the year we have met at the Town Hall. In the winter, meetings have been

held in the Parish Hall of the Deering Community Church. The refurbishments to the Town Hall, as voted by the Townspeople at the last Annual Meeting are nearly completed and the Planning Board expects that it will be meeting in the new offices by spring. The Planning Board wishes to express their thanks to the Board of Selectmen for their making a reality, at last, of decent office space available for the Town Officers and the Town Committees.

Officers elected for the year were: Dr. James Carew, Chairman, Willis Merrill Vice Chairman, Beverly Yeaple Secretary. Willis Merrill was reappointed to the Planning Board for another five year term. David Feather, Robert Nugent, John Snow and Tom Allen are the other regular members of the Planning Board. Two alternate members were appointed to the Planning Board by the Board of Selectmen and they are Ronald Elliott and John Ramsay.

During the past year seven subdivisions were approved and three others are still under considerations. One Public Hearing was held in December relative to a subdivision.

The By-Laws of the Planning Board were revised and amended to include provisions for two alternate members of the Board.

Members of the Planning Board also attended various lectures on the Legal Powers of Planning Boards as provided by the Central N.H. Regional Commission in the fall of 1976. Again, The Regional Commission has given substantial and worthwhile assistance to the Planning Board in the formation of a Town Plan.

We invite your interest, your concerns, your presence at the Planning Board meetings so that the Planning Board can be cognizant of all the constructive ideas of the citizens of Deering.

CONSERVATION COMMISSION REPORT

At the 1975 Town Meeting 3 roads were approved by the voters for scenic designation. They were Old Henniker Road, Old Francestown Road and a section of Clement Hill Road.

Widespread interest in the appearance of the Town's highways and byways was evidenced by the larger than usual number of participants in the annual Clean-Up Day in May. After a busy morning nearly 70 old and young persons were served lunch in Sherwood Hall, Deering Community Church, by members of the Commission. The Commission extends thanks to all who worked that day, either on the roadsides, or furnished trucks, or helped serve the lunch.

Marguerite Dutton and Bob Nugent attended a hearing in Concord on a dredging petition by Harry Traulsen, who wished to establish a trout pond on his property.

Peter Kulbacki's attendance at the Youth Conservation Camp in Bear Brook Park was sponsored by the Commission. On his return he gave a very interesting report at a Commission meeting.

Several members attended a meeting of the Hillsboro Conservation Commission to hear a report of his legislative activities, by one of our legislators, Howard Humphrey. They also enjoyed an illustrated review of some of the Hillsboro Commission's projects.

At the request of the Commission a landscaping plan for Deering Center was developed by the Town Plan Committee, in time for the Commission to set out 2 red maples as a Bicentennial activity. They were placed on the Town Common near the church lane. Frank Perrault, a forester, assisted in transplanting them from the Dutton Farm which donated them.

Villa Ramsay resigned during the year and the Commission wishes to express its appreciation to her for her work on the Commission the past 4 years. Louise Crossman of West Deering is welcomed as her replacement.

During the year the Commission has worked closely with the Planning Board in the preparation of a Town Plan.

HEALTH OFFICER'S REPORT

Water samples taken from Deering Lake in 1976 proved the high quality of the lake water once again. The Town of Deering and its summer residents at the lake can be proud of this fact and it would appear that a genuine effort is being made by all to maintain the water from pollution.

However, another type of pollution has invaded our public waters called "noise pollution" in the form of high powered non-baffled motor boats. The Health Officer is of the opinion that when a high-powered boat on Deering Lake can be heard from his home

one mile away sounding like a stock car raceway, then this is *noise pollution!* Local and State officials are aware of this nuisance and have assured the Health Officer that corrective measures were underway. It is hoped that the individuals involved in this matter will show consideration toward others who reside at the lake or merely use the water for their recreation, by eliminating this problem.

It was a pleasure to find the "dam site" well-policed during the summer season, thanks to the Selectmen and also Mr. Roy Eldridge who did a great job!

Signs have been erected at the dam in accordance with Town Ordinances to the effect that there will be "No Camping" and "No Dogs" allowed at the beach area. These measures will help to improve the area greatly.

The Health Officer visited several areas where violations of the health standards were observed but is pleased to state that in most cases appropriate corrective action was taken.

As a member of the Medical Needs Committee of the Hillsboro Chamber of Commerce, I am happy to relate that there will be a medical doctor again in Hillsboro beginning in February, 1977. He will have temporary offices on W. Main Street until fall of 1977; at which time the Hillsboro Medical Center will open at a location nearby. The Committee is most encouraged by this fact as well as the tentative staffing of the Center by various medical group specialists from Concord and Peterborough, an office for the Visiting District Nurse, emergency entrance and treatment room, X-ray and laboratory facilities and ample parking.

May this New Year, 1977, bring health, happiness and prosperity to all.

REPORT OF THE FOREST FIRE WARDEN AND DISTRICT CHIEF

Since its beginning in 1893, the State Forestry Department has recognized the fact that forest fire prevention and suppression is a joint state and town or city responsibility. Local authorities recommend names of persons to the State Forester, who appoints one person as town or city fire warden and several other persons as town or city deputy fire wardens to a three year term.

The local forest fire warden controls the kindling of all outside fires, when the ground is not covered with snow, by issuing a written permit for kindling a fire. Permits are only issued at such times and in such places as the fire warden deems as safe.

The State Forest Fire Service trains the local forest fire organization in modern forest fire prevention and suppression tactics. The State also provides backup personnel and equipment for suppression and prevention activities.

The combination of State and local forces has resulted in one of the smallest acreage loss due to forest fires in the United States for the past 20 years.

Please take time to look at it and express your feelings to one of the Selectmen or any member of the Planning Board. The first step in carrying out this part of the plan took place when the Conservation Commission, in conjunction with the Selectmen and the Planning Board, planted two maple trees on the north side of the Common alongside the Church Road this fall.

The Committee wishes to thank all those who took part in preparing the plan and hopes that all interested Deering residents will study it and offer constructive criticism.

MINUTES OF THE TOWN MEETING

MARCH 2, 1976

A legal meeting of the inhabitants of the Town of Deering qualified to vote in Town Affairs was called to order at 1 PM on March 2nd, 1976.

To choose all necessary Town Officers for the ensuing year.
Total ballots cast 136.

Selectman for three years — Peter H. Beane 56, Whitney S. Yeaple 80. Elected.

Town Clerk & Treasurer — Clara T. Rich 129.

Tax Collector — Eleanor B. Fitzpatrick 121.

Trustee of Trust Funds for Three Years — Joan M. Hemmenway 120.

Library Trustee for Three Years — Joan C. Burke 124.

Auditors — Marjorie A. Heath 122, Dorothy J. Wood 120.

On March 4th, 1976 at 7:05 PM Articles two through 37 were voted. The Meeting was opened with a Prayer, followed by the Salute to The Flag. It was voted that this Town Meeting or any recess or adjournment thereof, not pass over any article nor reconsider any vote except for technical corrections.

Article 2. It was voted to accept the reports of the Town Officers, Agents, Committees, and Auditors for the year 1975.

Article 3. It was voted to raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray Town charges for the year 1976 and make appropriations for the same.

Article 4. It was voted to raise and appropriate the sum of \$8,000. for Town Officers Salaries and \$8,200. for Town Officers expenses.

Article 5. It was voted to raise and appropriate the sum of \$750. for election and registration expenses.

Article 6. It was voted to raise and appropriate the sum of \$3,000. for the upkeep of the Town Hall and other Town Buildings, and the purchase of office equipment, and to raise and appropriate the sum of \$1,000. for the purpose of painting the exterior of the Town Hall.

Article 7. It was voted to raise and appropriate the sum of \$147. for White Pine Blister Rust Control.

Article 8. It was voted to raise and appropriate the sum of \$10,000. to continue implementation of the repairs and improvements to the Town Hall, consisting of replacing the heating system, relocating the Selectmen's Offices to the unfinished area on the second floor at the rear of the building, refinishing and refurbishing this area to provide suitable office space and meeting rooms and rebuilding the stairway from the first floor to the second floor rear to include safe railings, stairs, landings, and a fire escape doorway and outside landing where the window is now located.

Article 9. It was voted to raise and appropriate the sum of \$2,200. for Social Security Payments for Town Employees.

Article 10. It was voted to raise and appropriate the sum of \$8,500. for the Police Department and the sum of \$4,000 for the Fire Department.

Article 11. A 50 to 30 negative vote to purchase a Police vehicle.

Article 12. It was voted to raise and appropriate the sum of \$4,000. for Insurance.

Article 13. It was voted to raise and appropriate the sum of \$1,200 for Damages and Legal Expenses.

Article 14. It was voted to raise and appropriate the sum of \$8,500. for contributions to neighboring Towns which permit the use of their refuse disposal facilities by Deering Residents and Tax-payers.

Article 15. It was voted to raise and appropriate the sum of \$25. for Vital Statistics.

Article 16. It was voted to raise the following sums for Highway purposes and appropriate money for the same. (1) \$15,500. for Summer Roads; (2) \$17,500. for Winter Roads; (3) \$11,500. for the General Expenses of the Highway Department; and (4) \$9,000. for Road Sealing, and to raise by State Grant, Highway Subsidy, and appropriate the sum of \$14,197.06 to be used for the maintenance of the Town Highways under provisions of RSA 241:14 as amended.

Article 17. It was voted to authorize the Selectmen to apply for, contract for, and accept grants for Federal or State Aid, or both, relative to disasters, civic improvement, highway safety, and the detection, deterrence and apprehension of crime or criminals, any or all as may be available, and to do all things necessary to carry out this article.

Article 18. It was voted to authorize the Selectmen to make withdrawals from the Revenue Sharing Fund established under the provisions of the State and Local Assistance Act of 1972 for use as set-offs against budget appropriations in the amount indicated; and, further, to authorize the Selectmen to make pro-rata reductions in the amounts if estimated entitlements are reduced or pro-rata increases in the amounts if the estimated entitlements are increased.

Article 19. It was voted to raise and appropriate the sum of \$5,000. for the Capital Reserve Fund for Highway Equipment.

Article 20. It was voted to raise and appropriate the sum of \$1,157.05 to secure Town Road Aid.

Article 21. It was voted to raise and appropriate the sum of \$1,100. for Street Lighting.

Article 22. It was voted to raise and appropriate the sum of \$35. for the Library.

Article 23. It was voted to raise and appropriate the sum of \$1,800. for Town Poor, \$1,200. for Old Age Assistance, and \$750.

for Aid to Permanently and Totally Disabled.

Article 24. It was voted to continue membership in the Central New Hampshire Regional Planning Commission and raise and appropriate the sum of \$442. for the Town's share of the operating costs of said Commission.

Article 25. Negative vote on Monadnock Region Association.

Article 26. It was voted to raise and appropriate the sum of \$200. for the care of Cemeteries.

Article 27. It was voted to raise and appropriate the sum of \$200. for the current operating expenses of the Conservation Commission.

Article 27a. It was voted to designate Old Henniker Road, from East Deering Road to the Henniker Town Line as a Scenic Road under provisions of RSA 253:17 and 18.

Article 27b. It was voted to designate Old Francestown Road, from Pleasant Pond Road to Bartlett Hill Road as a Scenic Road under provisions of RSA 253:17 & 18.

Article 27c. It was voted to designate that part of Clement Hill Road from the western end of North Road to the eastern end of Clement Hill Road where it meets North Road (the loop running past the Young property, formerly Baghdoyan) as a Scenic Road under provisions of RSA 253:17 & 18.

Article 28. It was voted to raise and appropriate the sum of \$200. for Civil Defense.

Article 29. It was voted to raise and appropriate the sum of \$500. for continuing and making corrections to the Town Tax Map.

Article 30. It was voted to raise and appropriate the sum of \$300. for the current operating expenses of the Planning Board.

Article 31. It was voted to authorize the Selectmen to auction property taken by Tax Collector's Deed.

Article 32. It was voted to authorize the Selectmen to borrow money in anticipation of Taxes.

Article 33. It was voted to have Mrs. Jacobi take care of the Cover of next years Town Report.

Article 34. It was voted to raise and appropriate the sum of \$250. for Rescue Squads. \$200. for Hillsboro and \$50. for Weare Rescue.

Article 35. Negative vote on Maintaining Codman Hill Road.

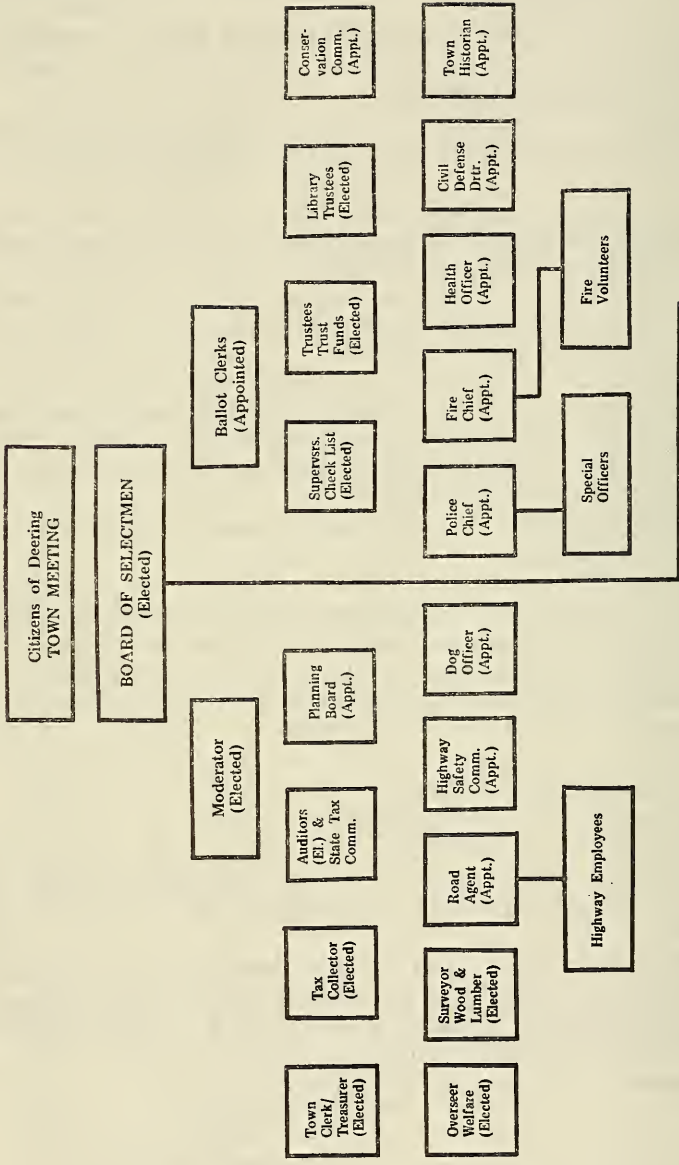
Article 36. It was voted to authorize the Board of Selectmen to accept or purchase on behalf of the Town any Federal or State surplus Fire or Highway equipment.
